A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto forms part of land taken for the purposes of the Whangarei-Kamo Railway, and it is considered desirable to allocate such land to the purposes of roads:

Now, therefore, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by section two hundred and twenty-six of the Public Works Act, 1928, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto shall, upon the publication hereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*, become roads, and that the said roads shall be under the control of the Onerahi Town Board, and shall be maintained by the said Board in like manner as other public highways are controlled and maintained by the said Board.

Altering Boundaries of Hauraki Plains West Drainage District, County of Hauraki Plains.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 30th day of January, 1933.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority contained in section three of the Land Drainage Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby alter the boundaries of the Hauraki Plains West Drainage District by including in such district the area of land described in the First Schedule hereto; and doth hereby declare that the boundaries of the said drainage district, with such alteration as herein provided for, shall be those described in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

AREA INCLUDED IN HAURAKI PLAINS WEST DRAINAGE DISTRICT.

ALL that area of land in the Auckland Land District, Hauraki Plains County, bounded as follows:—

Commencing at the north-western corner of the Hauraki Plains West Drainage District, and following the western boundary of that district to the south-western corner of Section 8 of Block X of Wharekawa Survey District; thence due west across a road and the Waitakaruru-Maukoro Canal to a point on centre-line of the road on the left bank of the aforesaid canal; thence along centre-line of this road to a point due east of the south-eastern corner of Section 30 of Block IV of Piako Survey District; thence by a right line joining the last-mentioned two points and along the south-eastern boundaries of Sections 30 and 7 of Block IV of Piako Survey District and the south-eastern and south-western boundaries of Section 3 of Block VIII of Piako Survey District to the western corner of the said section; thence by a right line following the centre-line of a drain through Section 2 of Block VIII of Piako Survey District to the western boundary of the said section, and along its western boundary a distance of 630 links to the north-western corner of the same section; thence across a public road to the south-eastern corner of Section 5 of Block III of Piako Survey District, and along the boundaries between road and Sections 5 and 4 of Block III, Section 9 of Block VII, and Sections 3 and 1 of Block III of Piako Survey District to the western corner of the last-mentioned section; thence along the northern side of the road between Waitakaruru 1b 2 and 1c 3g 3 Blocks to and across a road passing through the

last-mentioned block, and again along the northern side of the road between Waitakaruru 1C 3G 3 and 1B 2 Blocks and the northern side of the continuation of the same road through the Waitakaruru 1B 2 Block to junction with the Pokeno-Waitakaruru-Paeroa Road; thence due north to the centre-line of the said road, along its centre-line to the left bank of the Waitakaruru Stream and along the left bank of this stream to a point due west of the point of commencement; thence by a right line joining these two points.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

HAURAKI PLAINS WEST DRAINAGE DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District, Hauraki Plains County, bounded as follows:—

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the twenty-first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and published in the *Gazette* of the thirtieth day of the same month, at page 217, the Opotiki County Council (hereinafter called "the Council," in which term is to be construed, unless the context requires a different construction, its successors or assigns), was licensed to use and occupy part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark at Kutarere, Bay of Plenty, in order to erect and maintain a wharf thereon in accordance with the plans marked M.D. 5007, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, for the term of fourteen years computed from the twenty-first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen :

And whereas the Council has applied for a license under the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), for a further term of fourteen years, and it is advisable to grant the same :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the Council as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the Council

to use and occupy that part of the foreshore as shown on plan M.D. 5007, so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of maintaining the said wharf, such license to be held and enjoyed by the Council upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, and doth hereby prescribe that the dues and rates prescribed by Order in Council of the twenty-first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, shall be charged and taken by the Council for the use of the said wharf.

SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term—

“Foreshore” means such parts of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides;

“Low-water mark” means low-water mark at ordinary spring tides;

“Minister” means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto necessary for the erection of the said wharf as shown on the plan marked M.D. 5007, and deposited as aforesaid.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the Council shall pay to the Minister an annual rental of 1s., payable on demand.

4. All persons shall, at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharf, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, over, and out of the said wharf without payment.

6. The Council shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit from the wharf and maintain at its own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof; and upon the Minister leaving at or posting to the last-known address of the Council in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring the Council within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to make good or repair the same, the Council shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The master of all vessels discharging ballast at the said wharf shall have all such ballast taken away and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The Council shall not erect, or suffer to be erected, on the said wharf, any buildings or structure whatever, except with the consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The Council shall keep a separate account of the receipts and expenditure on account of such wharf and premises, and shall cause such account to be balanced to the thirty-first day of March in every year, and shall send a copy of such account, when balanced, to the Minister, and shall supply any particulars in reference thereto as may be required by the Minister.

12. The Council shall appoint all officers necessary for the working and management of the said wharf.

13. The rights, powers, and privileges hereby conferred shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the 21st day of January, 1933, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority, and the Council shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

14. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Council three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last-known address of the Council in New Zealand.

15. The Council shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the part of the Council.

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16. In case the Council shall—

- (1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty consecutive days;

then, and in either of the said cases, this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the Council or any other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the *Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the Council and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

17. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the Council shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove any structure thereon entirely from the site and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of the revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and if the Council fails so to do, the Minister may cause the said structure to be removed and the site so restored, and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the Council.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in me by sections one hundred and eighteen, one hundred and nineteen, one hundred and thirty-five, and one hundred and thirty-six of the Public Works Act, 1928, and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling me in this behalf, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby authorize the Christchurch City Council to reconstruct Riccarton Avenue in the City of Christchurch firstly described in the Second Schedule hereto; and I do also declare that the cost thereof shall be borne by the Christchurch City Council and the Riccarton Borough Council in the following proportions, viz.: The Christchurch City Council shall pay ninety (90) per centum and the Riccarton Borough Council shall pay ten (10) per centum of such cost respectively, provided that the contribution of the Riccarton Borough shall not exceed the sum of seven hundred and sixty pounds (£760): And I do also hereby vary the warrant dated the seventh day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, and published in *Gazette* No. 38 of the tenth day of the same month, vesting the control of North Park Road, Riccarton Avenue, Dean's Avenue, and Moorhouse Avenue, in the Christchurch City Council, and apportioning the cost of maintenance in so far as such warrant relates to the apportionment of the cost of maintenance of Riccarton Avenue and North Park Road (Harper Avenue) secondly described in the Second Schedule hereto, by directing that the cost of maintaining the said Riccarton Avenue and North Park Road (Harper Avenue) shall be borne by the Christchurch City Council, the Riccarton Borough Council, and the Waimairi County Council in the proportions set forth in the First Schedule hereto: And I do further direct that any contribution hereby required to be made as aforesaid by the Riccarton Borough Council and the Waimairi County Council shall be paid from time to time in the proportions prescribed in the First Schedule hereto out of the funds of the said Councils within a period of one month after demand in writing made by or on behalf of the Christchurch City Council; and all such payments shall be made from time to time to the Town Clerk, Christchurch, for and on behalf of the Riccarton Borough Council and the Waimairi County Council.

Exempting Crown Lands from Certain Provisions of the Mining Act, 1926.

BLDISLOE, Governor-General.

WHEREAS by section twenty of the Mining Act, 1926, it is, *inter alia*, enacted that the Governor-General may from time to time by notice in the *Gazette*, exempt any Crown lands from mining, or from any specified mining purposes, or from that Act, or any specified provisions of that

Act, and that the lands to which any such notice relates shall be specified therein by words of particular description:

And whereas it is desirable that the Crown land specified in the Second Schedule hereto shall, subject to all existing registered mining privileges, be exempted from the provisions of the Mining Act, 1926, and its amendments, set out in the First Schedule hereto:

Now, therefore, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by section twenty of the Mining Act, 1926, and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling me in that behalf, do hereby exempt the land particularly described in the Second Schedule hereto from the provisions of those sections of the Mining Act, 1926, mentioned in the First Schedule hereto, subject to all existing registered mining privileges; and do also hereby declare that such exemption shall take effect from the date of the publication of this notice in the *Gazette*.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

THE Mining Act, 1926.—Sections 70, 77, 81, 87, 89, 100, 106, 129, 144, 154.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Nelson Land District containing approximately 3,610 acres, and bounded by a line commencing from the south-west corner of the land described in the *N.Z. New Zealand School of Mines.—Scholarship Regulations.

Mines Department,
Wellington, 31st January, 1933.

1. Six scholarships are offered annually for competition by students attending schools of mines within the Dominion—three for the South Island, and three for the North Island.

2. The scholarships will be granted to those candidates who comply with the conditions and obtain the highest percentage of marks, which must not be less than specified in Regulation 9.

3. Holders of scholarships are required to attend during the University session at the University of Otago (no class fees will be charged on subjects contained in the curriculum of the Otago School of Mines), and during the long recess are also required to engage in approved practical work at one of the mines or batteries in the Dominion, or in the field with the New Zealand Geological Survey Department.

4. The scholarships will be of the annual value of £42 15s. each to successful candidates, who, while attending classes at the University of Otago, have to reside away from their homes, and of £25 13s. to successful candidates who are able to reside at their homes while attending the University classes.

5. The scholarships will be tenable for four years.

6. The scholarships will be open to all students as aforesaid who are not less than sixteen years of age on the day appointed for receiving applications, and who shall have attended regularly at any school of mines within the Dominion for not less than two years at least 80 per cent. of the lectures in each subject of the examination course: Provided that the

Minister may grant such exemption from the provisions of this regulation as he thinks reasonable in any case where it was not practicable for a student to attend 80 per cent. of the lectures in a subject in which he wishes to be examined, or where no lectures were held in that subject at the school of mines at which he was a student.

7. The examinations will be held in or about the month of December in each year, on days which will be duly announced.

8. The examination will embrace six of the following subjects:—

- (1) Mathematics.
- (2) Elementary Mechanics.
- (3) Theoretical Chemistry.
- (4) Practical Chemistry and Quantitative Analysis.
- (5) Electricity.
- (6) Mechanical Drawing.
- (7) General and Mining Geology.
- (8) Metallurgy of Gold and Silver.
- (9) (a) Coal-mining; or (b) Metal-mining.
- (10) Winding, Haulage, and Pumping.
- (11) Ventilation.
- (12) Land and Mine Surveying.

Subjects 1, 2 or 3, and 5 are compulsory for all candidates, and each candidate must state in his application the branch of mining he intends to take up.

9. No scholarship shall be awarded to any candidate who does not obtain 70 per cent. of the marks in each of the six subjects.

10. The examination must be passed as a whole.

11. Applications from candidates, accompanied by a fee of £1, and by a certificate from the Director of the School of Mines, stating the number of lectures which the student has attended in each subject, must reach the Mines Department, in Wellington, not later than the 1st November in each year.

12. Candidates must present themselves for examination on the day fixed, as provided in Regulation 7.

13. The Minister of Mines retains to himself the right of cancelling any scholarship should the holder attend irregularly or be reported for idleness or bad conduct.

14. Holders of scholarships having to pay more than £5 for their return railway (second-class) or steamer fare to Dunedin will be refunded by the Mines Department any excess over the sum of £5, but such refund will only be made once in each year.

Receipts for each fare paid in excess of 5s. (other than railway fares) must accompany each application for a refund.

15. These regulations supersede the regulations published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 3rd May, 1928.

16. Any candidate who qualified for a partial pass under the regulations referred to in the preceding clause must complete the whole examination not later than December, 1934.

Scales of Charges on the N.Z. Government Railways and Lake Wakatipu Steamer Service amended.

IN pursuance of all powers and authorities enabling it under the Government Railways Act, 1926, and its amendments, the Government Railways Board hereby resolves that on and after the 5th day of February, 1933, the General Scale of Charges and the Goods Local Rates Scales of Charges in force on the New Zealand Government Railways open for traffic made on the 4th and 5th days of November, 1931, respectively, and published in the *Gazette* on the 13th day of November, 1931, and the Lake Wakatipu Steamer Service Scale of Charges made on the 8th day of June, 1932, and published in the *Gazette* on the 9th day of June, 1932, shall be amended in the manner hereinafter set forth, that is to say,—

GENERAL SCALE OF CHARGES.

(1) The classified rates for the conveyance of the classes of goods specified in paragraph 4 hereof, as the said rates are set forth in Regulation 69 of the said General Scale of Charges, shall be reduced by fifteen per centum in each case.

GOODS.—LOCAL RATES SCALES OF CHARGES.

(2) Where in the said Goods—Local Rates Scales of Charges provision is made for the conveyance of any of the said classes of goods between specified points at local rates, the charges for the conveyance of such goods shall be computed at the appropriate local rate or at the classified rate as reduced by paragraph (1) hereof, whichever shall be the cheaper.

LAKE WAKATIPU STEAMER SERVICE SCALE OF CHARGES.

(3) The scheduled rates for the conveyance by the Lake Wakatipu steamer service of the classes of goods specified in paragraph 4 hereof, as the said rates are set forth in Regulations 22 and 25 of the said Lake Wakatipu Steamer Service Scale of Charges, shall be reduced by fifteen per centum in each case.
