WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the twenty-seventh day of March, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and gazetted on the first day of April then instant (hereinafter referred to as "the said Order"), the Copyright Act, 1913, was extended to the foreign countries therein mentioned, subject to the provisions set out in the said Order:

And whereas it is desired to extend the said Order to the Federated Malay States:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the Copyright Act, 1913, doth hereby direct as follows:—

1. The Copyright Act, 1913, including the provisions as to existing works, shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act and of this Order, apply—

- (a) To works first published in the Federated Malay States in like manner as if they had been first published within New Zealand;
- (b) To literary, dramatic, musical, and artistic works the authors whereof were at the time of the making of the work subjects of the rulers of the Federated Malay States, in like manner as if the authors had been British subjects;
- (c) In respect of residence in the Federated Malay States, in like manner as if such residence were residence in New Zealand.

2. Where any musical work to which this Order applies has been published before the date of this Order, but no contrivances by means of which the work may be mechanically performed have before the said date been lawfully made or placed on sale within New Zealand, copyright in the work shall include all rights conferred by the said Act with respect to the making of records, perforated rolls, and other contrivances by means of which the work may be mechanically performed.

3. In the application to works to which this Order applies to section three, subsection two (d), and section twenty-five of the Copyright Act, 1913, the commencement of this Order shall be substituted for the commencement of the said Act in section twenty-five, subsections seven and eight, wherever that expression occurs.

4. Where any person has, before the date of this Order, taken any action whereby he has incurred any expenditure or liability in connection with the reproduction or performance of any work in a manner which at the time was lawful, or for the purpose of or with a view to the reproduction or performance of a work at a time when such reproduction or performance would, but for the making of this Order, have been lawful, nothing in this Order shall diminish or prejudice any rights or interest arising from or in connection with such action which are subsisting and valuable at the said date unless the person who, by virtue of this Order, becomes entitled to restrain such reproduction or performance agrees to pay such compensation as failing agreement may be determined in accordance with the provisions of the Copyright Act, 1913.

This Order shall come into operation on the sixth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, which date is in this Order referred to as the commencement of this Order.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Public Works Act, 1928, and of all other powers in any-wise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby grant to Maria Mary Farley, Zoe Kathleen Badham, and Edward Dudley Cust Badham, all of Karekare, Boardinghouse Proprietors (hereinafter with their successors and assigns referred to as "the licensees"), a license, subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth, to take and use from a stream situated in Section S.E. 45, L.T.P. 2947, Block VII, Waitakeri Survey District (hereinafter referred to as "the said stream"), in the North Auckland Land District, for the purposes hereinafter set forth, a stream of water (hereinafter referred to as "the said water") not exceeding five cubic feet per second at any one time; and also to lay, construct, put up, place, and use the electric lines hereinafter described on the conditions hereinafter set forth: Provided that nothing herein shall be held to guarantee that the said stream contains sufficient water to supply the volume of water hereinbefore referred to; and all rights hereby granted shall be subject to all existing rights heretofore granted under the Mining Acts or otherwise.

CONDITIONS.

I. REGULATIONS.

This license is subject to the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1927 (hereinafter called "the regulations"), the Electrical Wiring Regulations, 1927, and any regulations made or to be made in amendment of or in substitution for the Electrical Supply Regulations or the Electrical Wiring Regulations.

2. PLANS.

The licensees shall forward for the approval of the Minister of Public Works (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister")—

- (a) Full detailed drawings and specifications of the diverting weirs :
- (b) Drawings showing how and in what manner the water is diverted :
- (c) Contour-plans showing difference in level of water due to the construction of the headworks :
- (d) Drawings giving full particulars of any tunnels, aqueducts, and pipe-lines used in conveying the water from the headworks to the power-station :
- (e) Drawings showing the arrangement of the generating, switching, and transforming plant in the power-station.

3. UTILIZATION OF THE WATER AND LOCATION OF HEADWORKS.

The said water shall be used under this license solely for the purpose of generating electricity: Provided that nothing herein shall be deemed to restrict or limit any existing right of the licensee to use the said water for any other purpose. The said water shall be taken from the said stream situated in Section S.E. 45, L.T.P. 2947, Block VII, Waitakeri Survey District, as indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 84316 (hereinafter referred to as "the said plan"), deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington.

4. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF WORKS.

The licensees are hereby authorized, subject to the conditions herein contained, to construct, maintain, and use the following works for the purposes of this license, the position of the said works being indicated on the said plan :—

- (a) Headworks consisting of dam and necessary intakes :
- (b) Pipe-line leading from head-race to the power-house hereinafter referred to; also tail-race from the power-house to the said stream or adjacent stream :
- (c) Power-house with all necessary equipment, including water-turbines, generators, transformers, lightning-arresters, switchboards, switches, exciters, and other appliances for generating and storing electricity :
- (d) Transmission and other lines on Section S.E. 45, L.T.P. 2947, Block VII, and across the intervening roads, as shown by means of red lines on the said plan :
- (e) Such further transmission and other lines within the premises of the licensees as may from time to time be required. Any extensions or alterations of lines pursuant to this paragraph shall be made only after compliance with the provisions of clauses 21, 22, and 23 of the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1927.

5. MAINTENANCE OF WORKS.

The licensees shall maintain the works used under this license in proper working-order during the continuance of such license.

6. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of twenty-one years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensees shall thereupon cease and determine, but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensees of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

7. RENTAL.

The licensees shall in respect of this license pay to the District Electrical Engineer, Public Works Department, Hamilton, a yearly rental at 4s. per kilowatt of maximum output generated during each and every year from 1st April, 1932, with a minimum of £1 8s. per annum. The output either shall be recorded by means of a watt-hour meter installed by the licensees, or, failing such installation, it shall be determined on the maximum capacity of the generating plant installed. The present plant is rated at 110 volts 63 amperes.

8. GRANTING OF OTHER WATER-RIGHTS.

Nothing herein shall prevent the Governor-General in Council from granting to any person or body corporate other than the licensees a license to take water from any portion of the said stream, except at the place where the licensees are by this license empowered to take it: Provided that no such license shall so operate as to enable such person or body corporate to reduce the natural fall between the headworks and tail-water, or the volume of the water which the licensees are by this license authorized to take from the said stream.



## 9. VARIATION IN CONDITIONS OF LICENSE.

The terms and conditions of this license may from time to time, at the request or with the consent in writing of the licensees, be altered by the Governor-General by Order in Council.

## 10. SURRENDER OF LICENSE.

The licensees may at any time, with the consent of the Minister, surrender this license, and shall thereupon remove from the ground (if so required by the Minister) all removable equipment, machinery, buildings, poles, transmission-lines, and other plant herein authorized to be installed or provided. If the licensees fail or neglect so to remove the said plant within twelve months after being required so to do, such equipment, machinery, buildings, poles, lines, and other plant shall, without payment of compensation, vest in and become the property of the Crown.

## 11. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraph (c) of clause 5 of the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1927.

The generating and transmission voltage shall be approximately 110 volts between the terminals.

## 12. CROWN NOT LIABLE TO PAY COMPENSATION.

Nothing in this license shall be held to impose any liability upon His Majesty the King or upon the Government of New Zealand to pay compensation to any person, corporate body, or local authority by reason of the exercise by the licensees of the authority hereby granted; but the licensees shall be liable for any loss or damage which any person, corporate body, or local authority may sustain as the result of the exercise by the licensees of any of the powers granted by this license.

## 13. BED OF STREAM NOT LEASED.

Nothing herein shall be held to constitute a lease from the Crown of the bed of the stream shown on the said plan, nor shall the provisions of Part IX of the Property Law Act, 1908, apply to this license.

## 14. CHARGES FOR ELECTRICAL ENERGY.

The charges for electrical energy shall not exceed 1s. per unit for lighting purposes, and 6d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes: Provided that "lighting purposes" shall include the operation of motor generators for lighting purposes.

## 15. DEFAULT.

If the licensees fail or neglect to observe any of the conditions or obligations imposed by this license, then and in any such case the provisions of clauses 229 and 230 of the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1927, shall apply to the breach of any such condition or obligation.

## 16. ALTERATIONS TO WORKS.

In the event of the licensees at any time desiring to make alterations to the works involving a departure from the location or type of construction shown on the approved plans, they shall first submit for the Minister's approval plans showing such new location and [or] type of construction as it is proposed to adopt, and, with such approval, the alterations may be carried out.

## 17. INSPECTION OF WORKS.

The Inspecting Engineer of the Public Works Department or any other person empowered in that behalf by the Minister shall at all times, both during and after the construction of the works, have free access to and liberty to inspect such works in order to ensure that the provisions of this license are given due effect to.

## 18. CONTRACT BETWEEN LICENSEES AND CROWN.

This license shall be deemed to constitute a contract as between the licensees and His Majesty the King, and may be enforced by and against either party accordingly.

## 19. REQUIREMENTS OF ELECTRIC-POWER BOARD AND WAITEMATA COUNTY COUNCIL.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the licensees shall not by virtue of these presents be entitled to lay, construct, put up, place, or use the electric lines hereby authorized, except subject to such conditions (not inconsistent with the provisions of this license or of the regulations) as may from time to time be imposed by the Waitemata Electric-power Board and the Waitemata County Council.

## 20. RAILWAYS AND TELEGRAPH DEPARTMENTS' LINES.

The licensees shall rectify to the satisfaction of the Government Railways Board or the Minister of Telegraphs, as the case may be, any interference or disturbance caused by the erection or operation of the licensees' system that affects the

satisfactory working of telegraph-lines which are the property of the Railways Department or the Telegraph Department, and which were erected prior to the licensees' lines.

## 21. TIME FOR SUBSTANTIAL COMPLETION OF WORKS.

The licensees shall substantially complete the works hereby authorized within a period of one year from the date of this license, or within such further time as the Minister may allow in the event of the work being delayed by strikes, lock-outs, breakdowns, or other unavoidable causes not due to any neglect by the licensees.

## 22. PURCHASE OF INSTALLATION BY ELECTRIC-POWER BOARD OR CROWN.

Subject to the provisions of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, or any Act passed in amendment thereof or in substitution therefor, any Electric-power Board whose district or outer area shall include the area within which are erected the lines described in clause 4 hereof, or the Crown, shall have the right, at any time during the currency of this license, to purchase and take over the licensees' installation at a valuation to be agreed upon between the said Board or the Crown, as the case may be, and the licensees; and, failing such agreement, at a valuation to be fixed by a single arbitrator to be appointed pursuant to the provisions of the Arbitration Act, 1908, and thereupon the Governor-General may by Order in Council revoke this license.

NOTE.—A cloudy month, with moderate north-westerly and south-easterly winds prevailing. The approximate mean temperature for the month was nearly a degree below the average. Total bright sunshine, 217.4 hours, 46 per cent. of the possible, and three sunless days. Rainfall for the month was 8 per cent. below the normal. Mean dew-point at 9 a.m., 49.5°; and mean vapour pressure, 0.354 in.

ERRATUM.—November sunshine should read 60 per cent. of the possible.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER OF DECEMBER, 1932.

General.—The first half of the month was, for the most part, cool and rather stormy, in marked contrast with the second half, during which warm and muggy but relatively quiet weather prevailed. The North Island, south of Auckland, and also Nelson and Marlborough, experienced a very dry month, and water supplies are in some places very low. Most of Canterbury and North Otago had more than the average rain and, in addition, the weather there after the first week was generally humid, with a tendency for thunderstorms. The growth of pastures has been checked in the areas of low rainfall mentioned, and for the dairy-man conditions have deteriorated somewhat since November. There are still, however, ample supplies of feed, and stock are in good condition. Most crops, including wheat, are also doing well, though root crops are rather patchy in parts of the North Island and in Central Otago. Hay crops are abundant and are being harvested under favourable conditions. Shearing has suffered very few setbacks from the weather.

Rainfall.—The Auckland and Coromandel Peninsulas had approximately the normal rainfall for December, but the remainder of the North Island only about half of it. Nelson and Marlborough experienced a similar shortage. In western districts of the South Island and most of Otago the distribution was irregular, the variations from average generally being small, with those on the side of low rainfall predominating. In South Canterbury and about Oamaru the average was considerably exceeded.

Temperatures.—Temperatures were, on the whole, rather below normal, more especially in eastern districts. The departures were, however, seldom large, and parts of western districts and the higher country had rather warmer weather than usual.

Sunshine.—The amount of sunshine was generally about average. Napier with 267.4 hours had the most, while Tauranga followed with 254.5 hours.

Pressure Systems.—The month began with cold southerly winds, following the passage of a depression at the end of November. On the 3rd a fresh but rather shallow depression crossed the Dominion from west to east. Although southerly gales followed it in some places on the 5th, this disturbance produced only scattered rains. It was of interest, however, because from the 5th to the 7th when the general direction of the wind was south-west, north-easterlies frequently blew in parts of Canterbury and North Otago. The weather was very humid, and numbers of thunderstorms, with heavy down-pours and some hail, occurred in the districts concerned.

Between the 8th and 10th a rather deep cyclonic depression followed by a slight secondary crossed northern Otago. Northerly gales blew in Cook Strait as it approached, while a southerly gale in rear of the centre caused some damage at Greymouth on the 9th. Christchurch and Banks Peninsula experienced a southerly gale on the 11th. This storm caused the most general rains in the month, and many of the falls were heavy. In Southland there was some flooding on the 10th.

Another shallow depression passed rapidly on the 14th and was followed by a fairly intense anticyclone. This moved to the east of the Dominion on the 16th, and pressure remained high there almost to the end of the month. During this period very sultry, cloudy, and muggy weather prevailed, pressure being low and conditions rather disturbed in tropical regions from Northern Australia to the Cook Islands. Depressions which had been deep and vigorous in Australia lost energy as they approached New Zealand. Had the warm, moist air then covering the New Zealand area been invaded by a strong current of cold air from the South, general and heavy rains would have occurred, but these were conspicuous by their absence. Though rain occurred on most days the amounts were very irregular, and many places received very little. Shallow depressions passed on the 19th, 22nd, 26th, and 30th. The period from the 22nd to the 26th was particularly warm and humid, and although a southerly change on the 27th lowered temperatures, the weather still remained muggy.
