WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the fifth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, and published in the *Gazette* of the eighth day of that month (hereinafter referred to as "the said Proclamation"), an area of national-endowment land containing fifteen thousand five hundred and fifty acres, more or less (hereinafter referred to as "the said area"), situate in Blocks IX, X, and XIII, Wangapeka Survey District, Blocks VII, VIII, XI, and XII, Owen Survey District, and Block I, Tadmor Survey District, Nelson Land District, and certain other lands were set apart as provisional State forests in terms of section thirty-four of the War Legislation and Statute Law Amendment Act, 1918, and section two of the State Forests Amendment Act, 1919:
