Samoa Post and Telegraph Amendment Order, 1933.

BLEDISLOE, Governor-General. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 27th day of March, 1933.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IS Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, and in pursuance of the authority to make regulations for the peace, order, and good government of the Territory of Western Samoa conferred upon him by the Samoa Act, 1921, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby order as follows:-

1. This Order may be cited as the Samoa Post and Telegraph Amendment Order, 1933, and shall be read with and form part of the Samoa Post and Telegraph Order, 1920 (hereinafter referred to as "the

principal Order").

2. This Order shall come into force on the first day of April, one

thousand nine hundred and thirty-three.

3. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the principal Order, the Radio Regulations, 1932, as published in the New Zealand Gazette of the twenty-first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two (hereinafter referred to as "the said regulations"), shall, in so far as the same are applicable and subject to the provisions of this Order, apply to Samoa.

4. In the application of the said regulations to Samoa and also (so far as applicable) in the application to Samoa of sections one hundred and ninety-nine to two hundred and one (inclusive) of the Post and

Telegraph Act, 1928-

- (i) All references to the Minister of Telegraphs shall be construed as references to the Administrator, and all powers, discretions, and duties conferred or imposed on the Minister of Telegraphs shall be exercised and discharged by the Administrator:
- (ii) All references to a District Radio Engineer, to a Radio Inspector to the General Post Office, and to the Secretary of the General Post Office, at Wellington, respectively, shall be construed as references to the Superintendent of the Apia Radio-station:

(iii) All references to the Post and Telegraph Department and the officers thereof shall be construed as references to the Samoan Public Service and the officers thereof:

(iv) All references to New Zealand as a territorial designation shall be construed as references to the Territory of Western Samoa:

(v) The Territory of Western Samoa shall be deemed to be a radio district having assigned thereto the number 6:

(iv) References to the Gazette shall be construed as references to the Western Samoa Gazette.

5. A certificate of any class referred to in Regulation 23 of the said regulations issued in New Zealand, and in force under the said regulations, shall enure under this Order as if it had been issued in Samoa under the said regulations as hereby applied to Samoa.

6. Regulation 73 of the said regulations is modified in its application

to Samoa so that-

(i) In lieu of the words "For an ordinary license, £1 10s. per

(ii) In fieu of the words For an ordinary license, £1 10s. per annum," shall be read the following words: "For an ordinary license, £1 5s. per annum"; and
(ii) In lieu of the words "For an ordinary license, 2s. 6d. per calendar month or fraction thereof," shall be read the following words: "For an ordinary license, 2s. 1d. per calendar month or fraction thereof.'

7. Regulation 73 of the said regulations is further modified in its

application to Samoa by adding thereto the following words:-

"Provided that if prior to the commencement of any licensing year the Administrator, by notice published in the Western Samoa Gazette, so directs, the fee in respect of that licensing year for an 'ordinary license shall be 5s. for the whole year or any portion thereof."

8. Regulation 109 of the said regulations is modified in its applica-

tion to Samoa by adding thereto the following words:—

Amending Warrant declaring Open Seasons for Imported and/or Native Game in certain Acclimatization Districts in so far as it affects the Waimate Acclimatization District, and declaring an Open Season for Native Game in the Waimate Acclimatization District.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921–22, I, James Alexander Young, Minister of Internal Affairs of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby amend the Warrant dated 17th March, 1933, made under the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921–22, and published in New Zealand Gazette, No. 16, of the 20th idem, at page 462, by deleting all that portion of such Warrant included under the heading "Waimate Acclimatization District," and do hereby declare the period from the 1st day of May to the 31st day of July, 1933 (both days inclusive), to be an open season in the Waimate Acclimatization District, as described in New Zealand Gazette No. 17, of 12th March, 1925, at page 754, for the taking or killing of the following native game—viz., grey duck, spoonbill duck, and black swan, and the period from the 1st day of May to the 7th day of May, 1933 (both days inclusive), to be an open season in the said district for the taking or killing of the following native game—viz., paradise duck—subject to the following conditions. to the following conditions.

CONDITIONS.

1. LICENSES to take or kill such native game in the said district will be issued to any person on payment of the sum

of ten shillings (10s.) each; and the Secretary of the Waimate Secretary in that behalf, is hereby authorized by such Secretary in that behalf, is hereby authorized to sign and issue the said licenses.

2. No person shall in any one day take or kill native game exceeding in any person shall in any one day take or kill native game.

No person shall in any one day take or kill native game exceeding in number twenty-five head in all of grey duck, spoonbill duck, paradise duck, and black swan, or take or kill more than five head of paradise duck, or take or kill more than ten head of black swan.
 No person shall commence shooting earlier than one hour before sunrise or continue shooting later than one hour after sunset on any day during the open season.
 No person shall use live birds of any species as decoys, nor shall use artificial decoys so that more than twenty-five artificial decoys are used at any one time (whether by one or several persons) on any particular water within an area of

artineial decoys are used at any one time (whether by one or several persons) on any particular water within an area of less than one hundred yards square.

5. No person shall use or cause to be used any motor-vehicle in connection with the taking or killing of native game: Provided that this condition shall not be so construed as to prohibit the use of any motor-vehicle for the purpose of travelling either generally or to or from a rendezvous.

6. Any person committing a breach of any of these conditions is liable on conviction to a fine of £20.
