HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is provided by the one hundred and sixty-eighth section of the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter called the "said Act"), that the Governor-General may from time to time, by Order in Council, authorize any local authority or Harbour Board to reclaim from the sea areas, not exceeding five acres in extent, in any case where he considers that the reclamation will not affect navigation and is for the benefit of the public.

And whereas the Whangarei Harbour Board (hereinafter called "the Board") is desirous of reclaiming from the sea certain land near the Waiarohia Stream, in Whangarei Harbour, and the said reclamation is of such a nature as aforesaid, and the Board has applied to the Governor-General in Council for an order authorizing the execution of the said harbour-works:

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor-General in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation, and is for the benefit of the public:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby authorize and empower the Board to reclaim from the sea near Waiarohia Stream, in Whangarei Harbour, the land shown edged in red on plan marked M.D. 7128, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, such reclamation to be carried out and constructed in accordance with plan marked M.D. 7128, subject to the provisions of the said Act.

And whereas it is desirable to amend such regulations: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby amend the said regulations of the twenty-sixth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, in the manner set out in the Schedule hereto.

REGULATION 5 is hereby amended by adding the following proviso thereto:—

Provided, further, that in all the rivers and their tributaries in the Hawke's Bay Provincial District it shall be lawful to use a hand-net, the area of the mouth of which shall not exceed 8 square feet.

Clause 1 of the Second Schedule to the said regulations is hereby amended by deleting all words after the word "exceed" in line two thereof, and substituting in lieu thereof the words "8 square feet."

WHEREAS by section thirty of the Rabbit Nuisance Act, 1928, it is enacted that the Governor-General may, by Order in Council, on petition in that behalf signed by a majority of the persons qualified to be enrolled on the ratepayers' list of any proposed district, constitute and declare any area of land of not less than one thousand acres a rabbit district under and for the purposes of Part II of the said Act:

And whereas, in pursuance of the provisions of the said section thirty of the said Act, a petition has been received praying that the area of land described in the Schedule hereto

Regulations relating to Passenger-services under the Transport Licensing Act, 1931.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, 10th this day of April, 1933.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Transport Licensing Act, 1931, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations and amendments thereto as to passenger-services dated the fifteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, the twenty-seventh day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, the eighth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, and the twenty-sixth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, and published in the *Gazette* on the seventeenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, twenty-eighth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, eleventh day of August, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, and the twenty-ninth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, respectively, and doth hereby make the following regulations in lieu thereof; and doth hereby declare that such revocation shall take effect, and the regulations hereby made shall come into force, on the date of the publication of this Order in Council in the *Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

REGULATION 1.—PRELIMINARY.

(1) These regulations may be cited as the Transport Licensing (Passenger-services) Regulations, 1933.

(2) In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,—

“The said Act” means the Transport Licensing Act, 1931;

“Authorized person” means any member of the Police Force or the Commissioner, or any person appointed by the Commissioner or a Metropolitan Authority in terms of section 54 of the said Act;

“License” means a license to carry on a passenger-service;

“Licensing Authority,” in relation to a transport district, means a Licensing Authority appointed therefor pursuant to the said Act, and includes a Metropolitan Authority;

“New certificate of fitness” means a certificate of fitness intended to take effect on the expiration of a certificate of fitness previously granted in respect of the same vehicle;

“Passenger,” in relation to a passenger-service vehicle, does not include the driver thereof;

“Variation,” in respect of a passenger-service license, includes any amendment or revocation of any of the terms or conditions of such license or any addition of new terms and conditions thereto pursuant to section 34 of the said Act.

REGULATION 2.—APPLICATION FOR A NEW LICENSE (OTHER THAN A TEMPORARY LICENSE) TO CARRY ON A PASSENGER-SERVICE.

(1) Every application for a passenger-service license, other than for a renewal of such a license, and other than for a temporary license, shall be made in duplicate in the Form A set out in the Schedule hereto, or to the effect thereof, and in each case shall be accompanied by the respective fee hereinafter prescribed.

(2) Applications for a new passenger-service license or for a variation of a passenger-service license shall be made at least two months before the quarter-day immediately preceding the date on which it is desired that the new service is the variation shall take effect:

Provided that this clause shall not be deemed to prohibit a Licensing Authority from dispensing with the foregoing requirement and dealing with any application for a passenger-service license, or variation thereof, at any time which it deems fit or convenient, subject always to compliance with section 25 of the said Act.

REGULATION 3.—APPLICATIONS FOR CERTIFICATES OF FITNESS.

(1) Every application for a certificate of fitness in respect of a passenger-service vehicle, other than a new certificate of fitness, shall be made in triplicate in the Form B set out in the Schedule hereto, or to the effect thereof, not less than fourteen nor more than twenty-eight days before the date on which issue of the certificate is desired.

(2) (a) If the vehicle is to be used in terms of a passenger-service license, the application, including an application for a new certificate of fitness, shall be made to the Commissioner of Transport.

(b) If the vehicle is not to be used in terms of a passenger-service license the application shall be made to the District Engineer of the Public Works Department for the district within which the garage of the vehicle is situated.

REGULATION 4.—OTHER LICENSES.

The application for a certificate of fitness may be made before the vehicle is licensed under the Motor-vehicles Act, 1924, or under the Heavy Motor-vehicle Regulations, 1932, but no such certificate shall be issued until all licenses prescribed for that vehicle and then due in respect thereof have been issued.

REGULATION 5.—LICENSING PROCEDURE.

(1) The Chairman, or in his absence the Acting-Chairman, shall preside at each meeting of any Licensing Authority.

(2) Any suitable officer of the Public Service may from time to time be appointed to be the Secretary of any Licensing Authority other than a Metropolitan Licensing Authority. A Metropolitan Licensing Authority may from time to time appoint any suitable person to be its Secretary for the purpose of these regulations.

(3) Any person who wishes to make any representation or statement at any meeting of a Licensing Authority shall, not later than one clear day before the date of the meeting, notify the Secretary of his desire so to do and of the description of the person or body on whose behalf the statement or representation is to be made.

(4) The Licensing Authority may in its proceedings act upon such information as it thinks fit, whether such information would be evidence legally admissible in judicial proceedings or not.

(5) With the permission of the Licensing Authority (but not otherwise) any person may be represented at the proceedings by counsel, solicitor, or other agent.

(6) The Licensing Authority may require any person to transcribe or summarize any oral statement in writing either during or after the proceedings.

(7) In any case when the consent of a Metropolitan Authority is required to the granting of a license in terms of subsection (4) of section 26 of the said Act, the Secretary of the Licensing Authority whose function it is to grant such license (hereinafter in this clause referred to as the “appropriate Licensing Authority”) shall, on receipt of the application for the license or variation thereof requiring such consent, send a copy of the application to the Metropolitan Authority. As soon as the determination by the latter is given concerning the portion of the application which requires its consent its Secretary shall forthwith send a copy of the determination certified as correct to the Secretary of the appropriate Licensing Authority, whereupon the latter may issue the license or variation of license in terms of such consent.

REGULATION 6.—PASSENGER-SERVICE LICENSES.

(1) A passenger-service license shall be in the Form C set out in the Schedule hereto, or to the effect thereof.

(2) It shall be a duty of each Secretary to forward without delay to the Commissioner a record of every determination of the Licensing Authority in reference to a license and a copy certified as correct of each license granted and of each variation, suspension, or revocation thereof.

(3) The copies forwarded to the Commissioner in terms of the last preceding clause shall be recorded, and that record shall be the register of passenger-service licenses which is required to be kept by the Commissioner in terms of section 32 of the said Act.

(4) A deviation from the prescribed route shall not be deemed a breach of the terms of the license if and so long as such deviation is for the reason that the prescribed route is under repair or is otherwise temporarily unsuitable for use; and, when the deviation continues for more than seven days, if the prior approval in writing of the Chairman of the Licensing Authority has been given to the use of the substituted route.

(5) No approval of the Chairman given as provided in the last preceding clause hereof shall have any effect after the date of the next meeting of the Licensing Authority; but, if the need for deviation still exists, it shall at such meeting be authorized by a variation of the license pursuant to section 34 of the said Act.

(6) At all times complete and correct lists of the time-tables and fares for the time being in force for the service in which any passenger-service vehicle is used shall, while the vehicle is so used, either be framed and displayed in conspicuous places on the vehicle or be made immediately available for any passenger on request to the driver.

(7) It shall be an offence under these regulations for the holder of a passenger-service license to carry or permit to be carried on any vehicle described in the license any number of passengers in excess of the seating-capacity or standing-capacity shown for that vehicle on the license.

(8) Every application under section 34 of the said Act by the licensee for the amendment or revocation of any of the terms or conditions of a passenger-service license shall be in Form L set out in the Schedule hereto, or to the effect thereof, and in each case shall be accompanied by the respective fee hereinafter prescribed.

REGULATION 7.—TEMPORARY LICENSES.

(1) Every application for a temporary license shall be made in duplicate direct to the Licensing Authority in the Form D set out in the Schedule hereto, or to the effect thereof, and in each case shall be accompanied by the respective fee hereinafter prescribed. The application shall be made at least ten days before the date on which, if the application be granted, the applicant proposes to commence the temporary passenger-service to which the application relates: Provided that this condition shall not be deemed to prohibit a Licensing Authority, or the Chairman or Acting-Chairman thereof, from dispensing with the foregoing requirement and dealing with any application for a temporary passenger-service license at any time it or he deems fit.

(2) A copy of every temporary license, certified as correct by the Secretary of the Licensing Authority issuing it, and of the relative certificate of fitness or any permit authorizing the use of a vehicle without a certificate of fitness shall, during their currency and while the vehicle is in use, be carried on each vehicle in respect of which they were issued.

(3) Within three days after the expiry of any temporary license the holder thereof shall deliver or cause to be delivered the license and relative permit and any duplicate or copy thereof in his possession to the Secretary of the issuing Licensing Authority for cancellation.

REGULATION 8.—CERTIFICATES OF FITNESS AND PERMITS.

(1) Every certificate of fitness for a passenger-service vehicle shall be issued in the Form E set out in the Schedule hereto or to the effect thereof.

(2) Every permit for the use of a passenger-service vehicle without a certificate of fitness shall be issued in the Form F set out in the Schedule hereto or to the effect thereof.

(3) Any such permit may without notice be revoked by the Commissioner or his Inspector at any time.

(4) The certificate of fitness or permit for the time being in force in respect of a passenger-service vehicle other than a vehicle used only under a temporary license shall be framed and displayed thereon in a conspicuous place at all times while the vehicle is in use.

(5) Where a vehicle in respect of which a certificate of fitness or a permit has been issued and is in force is sold or otherwise disposed of to a person who proposes to use it as a passenger-service vehicle, such person shall, within seven days thereafter, notify to the Commissioner, in the Form M set out in the Schedule hereto, the fact of such disposal, the name and address of the previous owner, and particulars as to the other matters set out in the said form: Provided that such notification shall not be required if within the said period of seven days the new owner makes application in the prescribed form for a certificate of fitness in respect of such vehicle.

REGULATION 9.—RENEWALS.

(1) Application for renewal of a passenger-service license may be made in duplicate in the Form G set out in the Schedule hereto or to the effect thereof.

(2) Application for a new certificate of fitness may be made in triplicate in either the Form B or Form H set out in the Schedule hereto or to the effect thereof.

(3) Every application for renewal of a passenger-service license or for a new certificate of fitness shall be made not less than fourteen nor more than twenty-eight days before the day of which such license or certificate expires.

(4) Every application for renewal of a license shall for all purposes of these regulations (other than the form of the application) be deemed an application for a new license.

REGULATION 10.—REVOCATION, SUSPENSION, AND SURRENDER OF LICENSE, CERTIFICATE OF FITNESS, OR PERMIT.

(1) The holder of any license which has expired or which is lawfully revoked, suspended, or amended, or of any license for a service authorized to be discontinued, shall, upon request by the Secretary of the Licensing Authority which issued it, return to him within three days of such request the license and any document or plate in evidence of its issue; and if the license is amended a new license incorporating the amendment shall be issued, or the original license with the amendment endorsed on it and duly signed shall be returned as soon as possible to the licensee.

(2) (i) If the certificate of fitness or permit for any vehicle is lawfully revoked or has expired the owner of the vehicle shall, upon being officially notified of this fact, immediately forward the revoked or expired certificate or permit to the Commissioner of Transport.

(ii) If the certificate of fitness for any vehicle is lawfully suspended, the owner of the vehicle shall, upon being notified of this fact, immediately forward the suspended certificate to the office of the Public Works Department from which it was issued; but, unless the suspension is followed by revocation, the certificate shall be returned to the owner immediately the period of suspension expires.

(iii) The revocation or suspension of a passenger-service license shall be in the Form I set out in the Schedule hereto or to the effect thereof, and the revocation or suspension of a certificate of fitness shall be in the Form J set out in the Schedule hereto or to the effect thereof.

REGULATION 11.—TRANSPORT APPEAL BOARD.

(1) The Minister shall from time to time, as occasion may require, by public or private notice, require the persons or bodies entitled to make nominations of members of the Transport Appeal Board to nominate one or more suitable persons to the number specified in the notice for appointment to the Board.

(2) All such nominations shall be in writing signed by the nominator (being an individual) or signed on behalf of the nominator (being a corporate body or unincorporated association of persons) by some presiding member or principal executive officer of the nominator, and shall be delivered to the Minister on or before a date to be specified in that behalf by the Minister in the notice aforesaid.

(3) If no suitable nominations are received for the appointment of a person to represent any persons or bodies as aforesaid, the Minister may likewise require more nominations to be made.

(4) Any suitable officer of the Public Service may from time to time be appointed to be the Secretary of the Board.

(5) The Board may, in the hearing of an appeal, accept such evidence as it thinks fit, whether such evidence would be legally admissible in judicial proceedings or not.

(6) With the permission of the Board, but not otherwise, any party to an appeal may be represented by counsel, solicitor, or other agent.

(7) The Board shall conduct its sittings in public.

(8) Every appeal to the Transport Appeal Board from any decision of a Licensing Authority shall be commenced by petition in the Form K set out in the Schedule hereto or to the effect thereof, and shall be delivered in duplicate (either personally or by registered letter addressed to the Commissioner of Transport) within twenty-one days after the date of the determination appealed against.

(9) A copy of any correspondence or other documents relating to the subject-matter of the appeal shall be attached to the petition.

(10) A copy of the petition, and of all documents attached thereto as required by the last preceding paragraph, shall be served by the appellant on the Licensing Authority concerned.

(11) The Commissioner shall forward the papers relative to the appeal to the Appeal Board, and shall notify such local authorities, bodies, and persons as in his opinion are directly concerned in the subject of the appeal of its having been made, and of the time and place fixed for the hearing.

(12) The Appeal Board may decline to proceed with the hearing of any appeal unless and until the foregoing provisions have been complied with, and until security to its satisfaction against the cost of the appeal has been provided by the appellant.

(13) A copy of every appeal and of the determination of the Transport Appeal Board thereon shall as soon as practicable after the termination of the proceedings be sent by the Secretary of the Appeal Board to the Commissioner of Transport, who shall thereupon notify the determination to the appellant, the appropriate Licensing Authority, and every other body and person who in the opinion of the Commissioner is directly concerned.

(14) Save as hereinbefore provided, the Appeal Board shall determine its procedure in such manner as it thinks fit.

(15) Any subpoena, order, or other document requiring to be signed by the Appeal Board shall be valid and effective if signed by the Chairman, or, in his absence, by any member of the Appeal Board.

REGULATION 12.—ALLOWANCES FOR MEMBERS OF LICENSING AUTHORITIES AND TRANSPORT APPEAL BOARD.

(1) (i) For each day or part of a day occupied by him in travelling from or to his usual place of residence to or from the sittings of the Transport Appeal Board, or of a District Licensing Authority, or the Central Licensing Authority, or

occupied by him at the sittings of the Board or Authority, as the case may be, there shall be paid—

- (a) To every member of the Transport Appeal Board other than the Chairman thereof a fee of £2 14s.
- (b) To every member of a District Licensing Authority or the Central Licensing Authority other than the Chairman or Acting-Chairman thereof a fee of £1 14s.
- (c) To the Chairman or Acting-Chairman of a District Licensing Authority or the Central Licensing Authority a fee of £2 11s.
- (ii) For each hour or part of an hour during which he is occupied or engaged in the business of a District Licensing Authority or the Central Licensing Authority, otherwise than as aforesaid, there shall, subject to the approval of the Commissioner of Transport, be paid—

(a) To the Chairman or Acting-Chairman of a District Licensing Authority or the Central Licensing Authority a fee at the rate of 7s. 6d. per hour.

(b) To any member of a District Licensing Authority or Central Licensing Authority other than the Chairman or Acting-Chairman thereof a fee at the rate of 5s. per hour :

Provided that none of the fees the payment whereof is authorized by this paragraph shall be payable in respect of any time forming part of a day in respect of which the fees authorized by paragraph (i) hereof are payable.

(2) (i) In addition to the payments authorized by clause (1) of this regulation there shall be paid to each member of the Transport Appeal Board, a District Licensing Authority, and the Central Licensing Authority, respectively, for each day or part of a day on which he is occupied or engaged on the business of the Board or Authority and while so occupied or engaged is absent from his usual place of residence a further allowance by way of board and lodging expenses of £1 2s. 6d. per day.

(ii) For the purpose of calculating this allowance the term "day" shall be deemed to comprise twenty-four hours, and the day shall be deemed to commence at the hour of departure from the usual place of residence of a member of the Board or Authority.

(iii) Where a member of the Board or Authority leaves and returns to his usual place of residence the same day actual and reasonable expenses only shall be paid.

(3) The allowances payable in terms of the foregoing clauses of this regulation shall be in addition to any locomotion expenses payable pursuant to section 13 of the said Act.

(4) The provisions of this regulation shall not apply to any member of a Metropolitan Authority.

(5) The provisions of this regulation shall not apply to any person who is an officer in the service of the Government, but any such persons shall receive while absent from his usual place of residence the same travelling expenses and allowances as are paid in the like circumstances to such person as an officer of the Public Service or under the terms of his appointment.

(6) No claim of any person for any payment under this regulation or under section 13 of the said Act shall be recognized unless such claim sets out the days or hours claimed for and is accompanied by the certificate of such person stating that on the days or hours claimed for he was engaged about the business of the Board or Authority, as the case may be, and incurred the expenses set out in the claim.

(7) Such certificate shall be in the following form :—

I [*Full name*], hereby certify that I was travelling from or to my usual place of residence to or from sittings of the [*Name of Board or Authority*] on the days or hours shown in this voucher, and that I am entitled to the payments and incurred the expenses and made the disbursements indicated in the claim.

REGULATION 13.—ALTERING, DEFACING, OR PARTING WITH A PASSENGER-SERVICE LICENSE, CERTIFICATE OF FITNESS, OR PERMIT, AND ISSUE OF DUPLICATES THEREFOR.

(1) For the purpose of this regulation "document" means any passenger-service license or variation thereof, certificate of fitness, or permit to use a passenger-service vehicle without a certificate of fitness, and includes a duplicate of a document.

(2) No person shall—

(a) Save by direction of the Issuing Authority, alter or deface any document, and any document so altered or defaced shall be void ; or

(b) Without authority of the Licensing Authority or the Commissioner, lend or part with any document issued to him.

(3) Upon the return of any document rendered illegible or spoilt by weather or other such cause, or upon proof to his satisfaction that a document has been destroyed, stolen, or lost, the Commissioner of Transport may, upon application of the person to whom the document was issued, and upon

payment of a fee of 2s. 6d., issue a duplicate of such document. Every duplicate so issued shall have the word "Duplicate" written or printed thereon, and the production of a duplicate document shall be of the same effect as the production of the original document.

REGULATION 14.—INTERRUPTIONS IN SERVICE.

All unavoidable interruptions of a passenger-service which are likely to continue for more than twenty-four hours shall be promptly reported in writing to the Licensing Authority by which the relative license was granted, and shall be publicly notified at least once in a newspaper circulating in the district served. Both notifications shall fully explain the cause of the interruption and its probable duration.

REGULATION 15.—FARES AND TICKETS.

(1) It shall be a condition of every license (whether inserted therein or not) that the following provisions shall apply in respect of any fare paid by a passenger or prospective passenger who subsequently does not complete the full journey for which the fare is paid, and applies for a refund of the whole or portion of the fare :—

(a) Application for the refund shall be made to the licensee within three months after the date of payment of the fare :

(b) Payment of the refund will not be obligatory if the amount of the refund would be less than 2s. 6d. when computed as hereinafter prescribed :

(c) Except when the claim for refund is due to the failure of the licensee to run a trip at the time prescribed by the license or to make room available for the passenger on a vehicle used in the service, the licensee may deduct from the amount computed as described in paragraph (d) hereof 10 per cent. of that amount ;

(d) When application is made to a licensee for a refund of a fare or portion of a fare paid in respect of a journey which was not fully completed by the applicant, the amount to be refunded shall, subject to the provisions of paragraphs (a), (b), and (c) hereof, be computed as follows :—

(i) The full amount of the fare shall be refunded if no part of the respective journey was completed ; or

(ii) The full amount of the fare shall be refunded less deduction of the regular authorized single fare for that portion of the respective journey which was completed.

(2) It may be made a condition of any passenger-service license that the licensee shall cause to be issued to every passenger using his service a ticket bearing particulars of the place of commencement and of termination of the passenger's journey and the fare received from the passenger. If the license includes such a condition a counterpart of each ticket issued shall be retained by the licensee for at least six months from the date of its issue, and shall during the period of its retention be produced on demand to the respective Licensing Authority or to any authorized person.

REGULATION 16.—REGISTER OF AUTHORIZED SIGNS FOR PASSENGER-SERVICE VEHICLES.

(1) The Commissioner may keep a register of distinguishing words, letters, numbers, colours, marks, or devices (hereinafter together termed "authorized signs") to be placed or painted on or affixed to passenger-service vehicles, and such register may, in addition, contain such further particulars as the Commissioner thinks fit to identify any vehicle in respect of which has been allotted any authorized sign as hereinafter prescribed.

(2) The applicant for or the holder of a passenger-service license may apply in writing to the Commissioner for permission to have placed or painted on or affixed to any vehicle or vehicles used in the service any authorized sign or signs.

(3) The application shall set forth the nature and the full particulars of the authorized sign or signs which the applicant desires to have placed or painted on or affixed to the said vehicle or vehicles, and the part or parts thereof upon which the same are to be placed or affixed.

(4) The Commissioner may in his discretion grant or refuse any such application.

(5) No person, unless he has obtained permission from the Commissioner so to do, shall place or paint on or affix to any passenger-service vehicle, or shall drive or use or cause to be driven or used a passenger-service vehicle which has placed or painted thereon or affixed thereto, any authorized sign or signs which have been entered in the register as aforesaid.

(6) The Commissioner may at any time, in his discretion, by notice in writing to the applicant, revoke any permission granted under this regulation on the ground that the authorized sign or words, letters, numbers, colours, marks, or devices

which are in his opinion so closely similar thereto as to be likely to cause confusion were in use by another person for a like or similar purpose before such permission was granted, or on the ground that the authorized sign has become insufficiently distinctive to receive the protection of this regulation, or on any other ground.

(7) The benefit of any permission granted under this regulation shall not be transferable.

REGULATION 17.—CONDITION OF PASSENGER-SERVICE VEHICLES.

(1) The owner of any passenger-service vehicle shall at all times while such vehicle is in use keep the same in a safe and suitable condition for the carriage of passengers, to the satisfaction of the Commissioner or his Inspectors, and in accordance with any regulations that may hereafter be made and may for the time being be in force under the said Act in relation to the construction and condition of passenger-service vehicles.

(2) The owner of any passenger-service vehicle shall submit the same to the appropriate Inspector for examination whenever required so to do by the Commissioner, the Licensing Authority, or an Inspector, and shall not use the same or permit the same to be used for the carriage of passengers at any time while the certificate is revoked by the Commissioner or suspended by the Commissioner or an Inspector.

REGULATION 18.—PROHIBITION OF USE OF CERTAIN VEHICLES ON ROUTES WITH ACUTE BENDS.

Unless the Licensing Authority expressly agrees thereto by inserting a term in the appropriate license, it shall not be lawful to use any vehicle under a passenger-service license over a route which is of such description that owing to the size, design, or construction of the vehicle it is impossible for the latter to be driven round all bends and turnings on the route without stopping or backing.

REGULATION 19.—INSPECTION AFTER ACCIDENTS.

(1) It shall not be lawful to use any passenger-service vehicle after the happening thereto of any accident of such a nature as to cause or be likely to cause any structural damage thereto unless and until it has been resubmitted for inspection to an Inspector.

(2) In addition to the notice required by section 50 of the said Act to be given to the Commissioner, notice of every accident affecting a passenger-service vehicle shall be forthwith given by the owner to the person who issued the current certificate of fitness or permit for the vehicle, and if the owner fails to give such notice he shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations.

REGULATION 20.—ASSISTANCE IN LOCATING CERTAIN PERSONS.

Any owner of a passenger-service vehicle or holder of a license shall, if required by any authorized person, give any information which it is in his power to give which may lead to the identification of any person who was driving or using such vehicle at any time specified by the inquirer.

(8) Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore to the contrary, the whole or any portion of any fee or fees payable under this regulation may, on the certificate of the Commissioner of Transport, be refunded or remitted on either of the following grounds, namely:—

(a) That the application in respect of which the fee or fees are payable has been withdrawn, or that other action in respect of the application has been nullified or curtailed, and that in consequence the work and expense of the Department, or Board, or Authority, has been reduced to an extent justifying the refund or remission; or

(b) That the passenger-service or the vehicle in respect of which the fees are payable is used for only the occasional carriage of passengers, or is used for the carriage of passengers to such a limited extent that the full fees payable under this regulation would be disproportionate having regard to the amount of the passenger business.

REGULATION 22.—OFFENCES AND PENALTIES.

(1) Every person who—
(a) Knowingly supplies any false or misleading information in or concerning any application made in terms of these regulations; or

(b) Omits or refuses to supply any information herein required,—
shall be deemed to have committed a breach of these regulations.

(2) Every person who—
(a) Fails to comply with any condition, duty, or obligation imposed by the said Act and for which no penalty is therein provided; or

(b) Offends against or fails to comply with or commits a breach of any of these regulations,—
shall be liable for every such breach to a fine not exceeding £10.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Exhibitions Act, 1910 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby authorize the holding of a public exhibition of works of industry and art, to be conducted by the Wellington Show Association (Incorporated), in the Association's Buildings, Wellington, from the seventh day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, to the twenty-second day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three (both dates inclusive), and to be known as the Wellington Winter Show and Industrial Exhibition, and doth hereby declare the said exhibition to be an exhibition within the meaning of the said Act, and doth hereby suspend, subject, however, to the conditions set out in the Schedule hereto, all the provisions of the Shops and Offices Act, 1921-22, the Factories Act, 1921-22, and the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and of all awards and industrial agreements in force under the last-named Act, in so far as such provisions relate to the hours of commencing or ceasing work or to the issue of permits for overtime or extended hours, or to holidays or half-holidays, or to the closing of shops to any person, and so far as such provisions relate to hours of work done or business conducted or service carried out in or upon the premises aforesaid during the period aforesaid by or on behalf of the bodies conducting the said exhibition, or by or on behalf of any exhibitor of works of industry or art at the said exhibition, or by any person employed in or about the said exhibition.

SCHEDULE.

1. EIGHT hours shall constitute a day's work in or about the exhibition, and, with the exception set out in clause 2 hereof, such hours shall be worked consecutively.

2. No person shall be employed in or about the exhibition for more than four hours without an interval of at least three-quarters of an hour for a meal.

3. Any person employed during any day in or about the exhibition who is employed on such day in excess of eight hours, or before the hour of 8 a.m., or after the hour of 10.30 p.m. (whether such excess employment is in or about the exhibition or otherwise), shall be paid for such excess employment at not less than one-half as much again as the ordinary rate for the first two hours and at not less than twice the ordinary rate thereafter, and any person employed in or about the exhibition on any day that would, but for the provisions of this Order in Council, have been a whole holiday for such person by virtue of any Act or of any award or industrial agreement, shall be paid for all work done on such day at not less than twice the ordinary rate, whether such work is performed wholly in or about the exhibition or otherwise.

4. No female shall be employed in or about the exhibition after the hour of 10.30 p.m.

5. For the purposes of the enforcement of an award or industrial agreement any provision of which has been suspended by this Order in Council, any officer of the industrial union or association concerned who is authorized in writing in that behalf by such union or association shall be entitled to interview at his place of employment any person employed in or about the exhibition under that award or industrial agreement, at such time or times as may be agreed upon by and between such officer and the employer of such person, and for this purpose any such officer shall be entitled at any reasonable time to have access to the Register of Passes issued by the Wellington Winter Show Association (Incorporated).
