A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section thirty-five of the Public Works Act, 1928, it is provided that in the case of any land taken, purchased, or acquired for a Government work, and not required for that purpose, the Governor-General may, on recommendation by the Minister, by Proclamation declare such land to be Crown land subject to the Land Act, 1924, and thereupon the land may be administered and disposed of under that Act accordingly:

Now, therefore, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by section thirty-five of the Public Works Act, 1928, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare the land described in the Schedule hereto to be Crown land subject to the land Act, 1924.

Amended Regulations regarding the Disposal of Land acquired by the Crown under the Native Townships Act, 1910, and its Amendments.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 10th day of April, 1933.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section twenty-two of the Native Townships Act, 1910 (hereinafter referred to as “the said Act”), His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby amend, in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereto, the regulations under the said Act made and gazetted on the dates set forth in the Second Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as “the said regulations”).

FIRST SCHEDULE.

1. CLAUSE 9 of the said regulations is hereby amended by omitting therefrom paragraphs (c), (d), and (e), and substituting the following new paragraphs:—

- (c) The license to occupy shall provide for the payment of the balance of the price in the manner prescribed in paragraphs (c), (d), (e), (f), (g), and (h) of subsection (1) of section 6 of the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1926, with such modifications as may be necessary;
- (d) The half-yearly instalments of purchase-money and of interest payable under the license shall be calculated and paid in accordance with the table in the Second Schedule to the regulations under the Land Act, 1924, made on the 11th day of October, 1926, and gazetted on the 21st day of October, 1926;
- (e) Every license issued to a purchaser pursuant to the provisions of clause 9 hereof as herein amended shall be, with the necessary modifications, in the Form No. 3 in the Third Schedule to the regulations referred to in the last preceding paragraph.

2. Clause 13 of the said regulations is hereby amended by omitting therefrom the words “not later than the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two,” and substituting the words “during the currency of his lease.”

3. Clause 16 of the said regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words “not later than the 31st day of December, 1932,” wherever they occur therein, and substituting the words “during the currency of his lease.”

4. Clause 17 of the said regulations is hereby amended by omitting therefrom the words “not later than the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine,” and substituting the words “during the currency of his lease.”

5. The provisions of section 99 of the Land Act, 1924, with respect to the registration of licenses, and the provisions of section 119 of the said Act with respect to the registration of forfeitures of licenses, are hereby applied, so far as applicable, to all licenses that have been issued pursuant to the said regulations, or to section 33 of the Native Land Amendment and Native Land Claims Adjustment Act, 1927, or to section 25 of the Native Purposes Act, 1931, and to all licenses that may be issued hereafter pursuant to the said regulations and section 25 of the Native Purposes Act, 1931.

6. The Schedule to the said regulations is hereby amended by omitting therefrom the Form No. 2.

Amending Regulations under the Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act, 1915.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 10th day of April, 1933.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act, 1915 (hereinafter referred to as the "said Act"), His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby amend in the manner set forth herein the regulations under the said Act (hereinafter referred to as the "said regulations") made on the eighth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, and published in the *Gazette* of the eighteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, and the regulations made on the twenty-third day of February, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, and published in the *Gazette* of the first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight.

AMENDING REGULATIONS.

1. THE said regulations are hereby amended by deleting form No. 7 in the First Schedule to the said regulations and substituting the form in the First Schedule hereto.

2. The regulations made on the 23rd day of February, 1928, are hereby amended by omitting the form No. 6 prescribed therein, and substituting the new form in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Form No. 7.

THIS DEED, made the _____ day of _____, 19____, between (hereinafter called "the grantor," which expression, where not inconsistent with the context, shall include each of the parties aforesaid and executors, administrators, and assigns) of the one part, and His Majesty the King (hereinafter called "the grantee") of the other part:

Whereas the grantor the true owner and in possession of the stock and other chattels mentioned and described in the First Schedule hereto: And whereas the grantor has applied for an advance under the provisions of the Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act, 1915, and the Minister of Lands has authorized the granting of such advance, and the grantor has agreed with the grantee to secure in manner hereinafter appearing the payment to the grantee of all moneys so advanced or which are now or may at any time hereafter become due, owing, or payable by the grantor to the grantee (including rent, interest, or other charges falling due upon the land leased from or held under security to the grantee and described in the First Schedule hereto), and the grantor in consideration of all such moneys has also agreed to appoint the grantee the agent of the grantor for the purposes and upon the terms hereinafter appearing:

Now, this deed witnesseth that, in pursuance of the said agreement and in consideration of the premises, the grantor do hereby assign, transfer, and set over unto the grantee all and singular the stock mentioned and described in the First Schedule hereto and branded, earmarked, and/or marked as follows: And also all and singular the pigs, sheep, cattle, and horses which shall at any time hereafter during the continuance of this security be in, upon, or about or belonging to the lands mentioned in the First Schedule hereto, or any other lands which may now or hereafter during the continuance of this security belong to or be used or occupied by the grantor(s), whether worked in conjunction with the lands mentioned in the First Schedule hereto or otherwise. And also any other pigs, sheep, cattle, and horses which may now or shall at any time hereafter during the continuance of this security belong to the grantor(s) wherever the same may be depasturing. And all the natural increase of any of the said stock, pigs, sheep, cattle, and horses. And all the wool which shall during the continuance of this security grow upon any sheep comprised in or for the time being bound by this security, and that both before and after such wool is shorn. And all the milk, including milk-products, which shall be produced during the continuance of this security from any cows comprised in or for the time being bound by this security (excluding, however, the milk used or required by the grantor(s) for his (their) personal or household consumption). And also the brands, earmarks, and marks shown in the margin being the registered brands, earmarks, and marks of the grantor, and the exclusive right to use the same for branding, earmarking, or marking stock, as well as all instruments for the

time being and from time to time used by the grantor for branding, earmarking, or marking stock. And also all and singular the implements of husbandry, farming plant, and other chattels mentioned and described in the First Schedule hereto. And also all chattels of what nature or description soever which shall hereafter be acquired by the grantor whether in addition to or in substitution for the said implements, plant, and chattels or any of them and shall be used in or about the business of _____, farmer, or grazier, carried on or to be carried on by the grantor upon the lands mentioned in the First Schedule hereto or upon any other lands as aforesaid. To hold unto the grantee by way of mortgage for securing the payment by the grantor to the grantee of all moneys now advanced or which are now or which may at any time hereafter become due, owing, or payable by the grantor to the grantee under these presents (including rent, interest, or other charges falling due upon the land leased from or held under security to the grantee and described in the First Schedule hereto).

And this deed further witnesseth that it is hereby covenanted, agreed, and declared by and between the parties hereto as follows:—

1. The grantor will, on demand, pay to the grantee at the office of the Commissioner of Crown Lands at _____ the whole or any portion of the balance due upon the account current between them the grantor and the grantee, and also all other moneys (if any) which may for the time being be owing by the grantor to the grantee and secured by these presents: Provided that upon the transfer, otherwise than pursuant to the will or on the intestacy of the grantor, of the lands described in the First Schedule hereto or of the whole or any part of the grantor interest therein, all principal moneys hereby secured shall become immediately due and payable to the grantee:

2. All moneys owing by the grantor to the grantee at the date of the execution by the grantor of these presents shall be included in the said account current, and if the grantor shall at any time have more than one current account open with the grantee all the provisions hereof shall apply to all such current accounts.

3. The interest payable by the grantor upon the balance for the time being of the said account current shall be at the rate of _____ per centum per annum, and shall be payable on all sums properly charged by the grantee to the grantor on such account from the respective dates upon which the same shall have been so charged to the grantor in the books of the grantee. Such interest as aforesaid shall be payable on the first day of January and July in each and every year.

4. All costs, charges, and expenses incurred by the grantee in or about the preparation, execution, registration, renewal of registration, or release of these presents, or of any other security for the payment of the moneys intended to be hereby secured or of any part thereof, or in or about the exercise or enforcement or attempted exercise or enforcement of any power, right, or remedy conferred upon the grantee by law or by these presents, or otherwise reasonably incurred by the grantee owing to default in payment of any moneys intended to be hereby secured, or the breach of any covenant on the part of the grantor herein expressed or implied, or with a view to the protection or preservation of the property comprised in this security, shall be deemed to be part of the principal moneys owing under and secured by these presents, and shall bear interest accordingly, computed in each case from the time when the same shall be respectively incurred.

5. The books of the grantee shall be *prima facie* evidence of the amount for the time being owing on the security of these presents and of all other particulars entered in such books, and shall be admissible as evidence accordingly in all Courts of Justice and before all persons acting judicially.

6. This security shall be deemed to be a running and continuing security irrespective of any sums which may from time to time be paid to the credit of the account current of the grantor with the grantee, and, notwithstanding that such account may appear at any time to be in credit, and notwithstanding any settlement of account, or the release or discharge of any security or mortgage collateral herewith, or any other matter or thing whatsoever, so long as any moneys are owing hereunder by the grantor to the grantee this security shall remain in full force and effect, and shall not be deemed to have been released or discharged or in any way vacated until a memorandum of satisfaction thereof shall have been executed by the grantee.

7. All moneys received by the grantee on behalf of the grantor from sales of stock, wool, milk, milk-products, produce, or chattels may be appropriated as the grantee may determine towards the reduction of the indebtedness for the time being of the grantor to the grantee (including rent, interest, and other charges due and falling due upon the land leased from or held under security to the grantee by the grantor, and described in the First Schedule hereto), and the entries in

the books of the grantee shall be conclusive evidence of such appropriation.

8. The grantor will brand, earmark, and mark with the registered brands, earmarks, and marks of the grantor aforesaid such of the pigs, sheep, cattle, and horses mentioned and described in the First Schedule hereto as are not already so branded, earmarked, and marked, and also all pigs, sheep, cattle, and horses which during the continuance of this security shall be brought by the grantor upon the lands mentioned in the First Schedule hereto or upon any other lands that now are or at any time hereafter shall be the property of or occupied or used by the grantor, and any other pigs, sheep, cattle, and horses which shall at any time hereafter belong to the grantor wherever the same may be depasturing, and also the natural increase of any of the said pigs, sheep, cattle, and horses. The words "will brand" herein shall have the meaning assigned to them by statute, with such extension as is hereby given to them.

9. The grantor will not (whether in the ordinary course of business or not) sell or dispose of or mortgage, charge, or otherwise encumber the stock and chattels for the time being comprised in this security or any of them, or remove any of the same from the lands mentioned in the First Schedule hereto, without the consent in writing of the grantee first had and obtained, and the proceeds of every sale shall, unless the grantee otherwise directs, be paid by the purchaser to the grantee.

10. If any of the pigs, sheep, cattle, or horses hereby assigned or for the time being subject to this security shall during the continuance of this security die or be lost the grantor shall and will forthwith replace the pigs, sheep, horses, or cattle so dying or lost with other stock of the like nature and of equal value.

11. The grantor shall maintain and keep the dairy stock hereby assigned at the best possible standard of efficiency, and for that purpose the grantor shall retain annually at least 20 per centum of the best of the heifer calves (progeny of such stock), and rear them in accordance with the best practice of dairy-farming.

12. The grantor will during the continuance of this security render and deliver to the grantee whenever required returns in writing setting forth the numbers, ages, sexes, and other particulars of the stock, and the particulars and descriptions of all other chattels for the time being bound by these presents. And it is hereby declared that the covenant implied herein on the part of the grantor to give and afford all reasonable assistance to enable the grantee, his agents or servants, to view the state and condition of the said stock shall be deemed to include a covenant to muster the said stock whenever required so to do in the notice to be given under the said implied covenant.

13. The grantee shall have the full and absolute power of determining the mode and time and place of the sale and disposition of all stock, wool, milk, milk-products, produce, or other chattels subject to the provisions of these presents.

14. The grantor will not, without the consent in writing of the grantee, give any lien or any other security over the wool growing or to grow upon the sheep hereby assigned or for the time being subject to this security, or over any of the milk, milk-products, crops, produce, or chattels grown and raised upon or on the lands mentioned in the First Schedule hereto, or any other lands now or hereafter owned or occupied or used by the grantor, whether worked in conjunction with the scheduled lands or otherwise.

15. The grantor will from time to time, when required so to do by the grantee, execute and give to the grantee a lien or other security in the usual form under the statute relating to such matters for the time being in force over the wool growing or to grow upon the sheep hereby assigned or for the time being subject to this security, or over the milk, milk-products, produce, or chattels mentioned in paragraph 13 hereof, or any of the same, with a view to collaterally securing the moneys intended to be hereby secured, such lien or other security to be prepared by the grantee at the expense of the grantor, and to contain such covenants, provisoes, and conditions for the protection of the grantee as the grantee shall think fit.

16. The powers conferred by statute upon grantees of entering and taking possession of chattels assigned by instruments by way of security, and of shearing the wool assigned by instruments by way of security over wool, shall be exercisable by the grantee in respect of the stock, wool, and other chattels for the time being subject to this security at any time whether or not default shall have been made by the grantor in the payment of any of the moneys intended to be hereby secured, and whether or not any of the other events shall have happened upon which any of the said powers are made exercisable by statute, and the provision implied herein by statute for the retention and use by the grantor of the chattels assigned by these presents is hereby modified accordingly.

17. If and whenever the grantee shall become entitled to exercise the power of sale herein implied the grantee may at any time and from time to time, at the expense in all things of the grantor, remove the stock and chattels hereby assigned or any of them to such place or places as the grantee may deem most convenient for the purpose of any sale or resale in exercise of the said power of sale.

18. Nothing herein contained shall be deemed to oblige the grantee to make any further advances.

19. No delay or omission on the part of the grantee to enforce any covenant or exercise any of the powers hereby conferred shall be taken to imply a waiver thereof, nor shall the grantee be answerable or responsible for any loss which may happen in or about the exercise by the grantee or his agent of the powers hereby conferred, or any of them, in the event or on the occasion of such exercise at any time hereinbefore contemplated, or at any time or on any occasion when he may reasonably be induced to believe that he is entitled to exercise the powers aforesaid.

20. This security and the security or securities mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto are held by the grantee as collateral securities for the moneys or some part of the moneys expressed or intended to be hereby secured.

21. The grantor(s) will duly and punctually pay, perform, observe, and keep all moneys, covenants, conditions, and agreements contained in any security collateral herewith.

22. If the grantor(s) shall fail or neglect to pay any rent, interest, rates, or other charges which may become due in respect of, or which may be secured or charged upon, any land upon which any stock comprised in this security may for the time being be depasturing, it shall be lawful for the grantee to pay the same or any part thereof, and any sum which shall have been so paid by the grantee shall be deemed to have been advanced to the grantor(s) on the security of these presents.

23. All the covenants, provisoes, agreements, and powers directed by statute to be implied either in instruments generally, or in instruments by way of security, or in instruments by way of security over stock shall be implied herein, modified only so far as the same or any of them are modified by these presents either expressly or by necessary implication.

24. And this deed further witnesseth that the grantor doth hereby irrevocably while any moneys shall remain owing on the security of these presents nominate, constitute, and appoint the Commissioner of Crown Lands for the time being for the Land District of _____, or the person who shall for the time being be acting as Commissioner of Crown Lands for the said district, to be the attorney of the grantor for and in the name or otherwise on behalf of the grantor to do, execute, and perform all and every act, matter, deed, and thing which shall or may be deemed necessary or expedient for more fully and perfectly transferring, assigning, and assuring unto the grantee or to any purchaser from the grantee under the power of sale herein implied all and singular the stock, chattels, brands, wool, milk, milk-products, and premises or any of them hereby assigned or assured or expressed so to be or intended to be included in this security, or the stock, chattels, wool, milk, milk-products, and premises reduced into possession by the grantee pursuant to the power in that behalf herein expressed or implied, or for carrying into effect the covenant for further assurance on the part of the grantor herein implied, or for carrying into effect the covenant to execute and give to the grantee a lien or security over wool, milk, milk-products, or other produce or chattels when so required by the grantee.

And this deed further witnesseth as follows:—

25. The grantor hereby appoint the grantee as agent of the grantor to effect all sales of pigs, sheep, cattle, horses, wool, milk, butter, cream, butterfat, or produce which the grantor desire to sell, and the grantor shall not sell any of such pigs, sheep, cattle, horses, wool, milk, butter, cream, butterfat, or produce other than through the agency of the grantee unless with the written consent first obtained of the grantee.

26. The grantee shall be entitled in effecting such sales as aforesaid to employ such firms, persons, or agents as he may in his discretion think fit, and to pay all commissions, charges, and expenses incurred in connection with such sales, and to deduct the same out of the proceeds of such sales.

27. The grantee shall receive all proceeds of such sales as aforesaid, and shall credit the grantor with the balance of the proceeds of such sales (if any) after payment of all expenses incurred in the current account, but it shall be entirely in the discretion of the grantee whether any of such proceeds shall be readvanced to the grantor: Provided always that the grantee may in his absolute and uncontrolled discretion pay such portion of such proceeds as he thinks fit to the grantor, and such payment shall not be treated as an advance or readvance, and repayment of such sum shall not require to be made by the grantor nor shall it be secured by these presents: Provided further that in such case the grantee will

on making such payment state in writing to the grantor that such sum is not to be deemed to be an advance or readvance and repayment of the same is not secured by these presents.

28. All powers and duties conferred by these presents upon the grantee or directed or implied by statute shall (on behalf of the grantee) be exercisable and may be performed in his own name by the Commissioner of Crown Lands for the time being for the Land District.

29. The grantor shall deliver all milk and/or butter, and/or cream, and/or butterfat, the produce of the cows in or for the time being bound by this security (excluding the milk, butter, or cream required by the grantor for personal consumption), to the at , or such other company or firm as may be subsequently appointed by the grantee in writing, and shall give to the grantee an irrevocable order on the said company to receive the whole or such portion of the gross amount payable by the said company for the purchase of the said milk, and/or butter, and/or cream, and/or butterfat, as the grantee may from time to time direct.

MEMORANDUM OF MORTGAGE.

(hereinafter called "the mortgagor"), being registered as proprietor of an estate [Here state nature of the estate or interest], subject, however, to such encumbrances, liens, and interests as are notified by memoranda under-written or endorsed hereon, in piece of land situated in the [District, county, hundred, or township], containing [Here state the area, exclusive of roads intersecting the same, if any], be the same a little more or less [Here state rights-of-way, privileges, or easements, if any, intended to be conveyed; if the land to be dealt with contains all that is included in an existing grant, or certificate of title, or lease, refer thereto for description and diagrams; otherwise set forth the boundaries in chains, links, or feet, and refer to plan thereof on margin of or annexed to the lease, or deposited in the Registry Office].

Whereas the mortgagor ha , applied for an advance under the provisions of the Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act, 1915, and the amendments thereof, from His Majesty the King (hereinafter called "the mortgagee"), and the Minister of Lands has authorized the granting of such advance.

Now, therefore, in consideration of all moneys now advanced or which are now or which may at any time hereafter become due and owing or payable by the mortgagor to the mortgagee, the mortgagor doth hereby covenant with the mortgagee as follows :-

1. That the mortgagor will upon demand pay to the mortgagee all the said moneys now advanced and further advances and all other moneys which may be owing by the mortgagor to the mortgagee under these presents (including rent, interest, or other charges falling due upon the land leased from or held under security to the mortgagee and above described), and also will upon demand pay the balance due upon the account current between them, the mortgagor and the mortgagee: Provided always, and it is hereby declared that the words "further advances" and the words "upon demand" whenever herein used shall have the meaning given to them respectively by the Chattels Transfer Act, 1924, and also that the words "will upon demand pay the balance due upon the account current between them" shall (*mutatis mutandis*) have the meaning given to them by the Chattels Transfer Act, 1924.

2. That the mortgagor will pay interest, on the balance for the time being of the said account current, at the rate of pounds per centum per annum, on the first day of

January and July in each and every year. All moneys owing by the mortgagor to the mortgagee at the date of the execution by the mortgagor of these presents shall be included in the said account current, and if the mortgagor shall at any time have more than one current account open with the mortgagee all the provisions hereof shall apply to all such current accounts.

3. That the mortgagor may at any time, without previous notice of intention so to do, repay the whole or any portion of the moneys advanced.

4. That the mortgagor will forthwith insure, and so long as any money remains owing on this security will keep insured, all buildings and erections for the time being situate on the said land against loss or damage by fire, in the name of the mortgagee, to their full insurable value, in the State Fire Insurance Office or other reputable insurance office to be from time to time approved by the mortgagee, and will duly and punctually pay all premiums and sums of money necessary for the purpose of keeping every such insurance on foot; and will, not later than the forenoon of the day on which any premium falls due, deliver the receipt therefor to the mortgagee, who shall also be entitled to the exclusive custody of all policies of insurance.

5. That the mortgagor will from time to time, so long as any money remains owing on this security, well and substantially repair, and keep in good and substantial repair and condition, all buildings or other improvements erected and made upon the said land; and that the mortgagee may at all times be at liberty, by himself, his agents or servants, to enter upon the said land to view and inspect the said buildings and improvements.

6. That if the mortgagor fail or neglect to insure or keep insured the said buildings and erections as aforesaid, or to deliver any premium receipt as aforesaid, or to repair the said buildings and improvements, or to keep them in good and substantial repair and condition as aforesaid, then and in any such case, and as often as the same shall happen, it shall be lawful for but not obligatory on the mortgagee, at the cost and expense in all things of the mortgagor, to insure the said buildings or any of them in such sum as aforesaid or in any less sum, or to pay such premium, or to repair the said buildings and improvements and keep them in good and substantial repair and condition.

7. That in the event of the said buildings and erections or any of them being destroyed or damaged by fire, all moneys received by the mortgagee under any insurance in respect of such destruction or damage shall be applied at his sole option either in or towards rebuilding or repairing the buildings and erections so destroyed or damaged, or in or towards payment of the principal, interest, and other moneys for the time being covered by this security, notwithstanding that the same or any of them may not have accrued due under the terms of these presents.

8. That all moneys expended by the mortgagee in and about effecting or keeping on foot any insurance as aforesaid, or in repairing or keeping in repair any of the said buildings and improvements as aforesaid, or in attempting to exercise or enforce any power, right, or remedy herein contained or implied in favour of the mortgagee, shall be payable to him by the mortgagor on demand, and until paid shall be charged on the said land, together with interest at the rate of per centum per annum computed from the date or dates of such moneys being expended.

9. That in the case of lands held under lease or license the mortgagor will at all times punctually pay the rent or other payments reserved by, and faithfully perform and observe all the covenants and conditions contained in, the lease or license herein mentioned; and that if he/they fail or neglect so to do it shall be lawful for but not obligatory on the mortgagee so to do at the cost and expense in all things of the mortgagor; and all moneys so expended by the mortgagee shall be payable to him by the mortgagor on demand, and until paid shall be charged on the said land together with interest at the rate of per centum per annum computed from the date or dates of such moneys being expended, and in the meantime such sums of money with interest at the rate aforesaid shall be added to the sum expressed to be hereby secured.

10. That the mortgagor will at all times cultivate and manage the mortgaged land in a skilful and proper manner, and according to the rules of good husbandry, and will comply with the provisions of the Noxious Weeds Act, 1928, and the Rabbit Nuisance Act, 1928, and the amendments thereof respectively, and will promptly pay all rates, taxes, and other outgoings payable in respect of the said land above described.

11. That the covenants, powers, and provisions implied in mortgages by the Land Transfer Act, 1915, are modified or negatived in so far as they are inconsistent with or repugnant to these presents.

12. That the mortgagor will duly and regularly pay, perform, observe, and keep all moneys, covenants, conditions, and agreements in the said memorandum of mortgage No. (prior mortgages), and on the part of the mortgagor to be paid, performed, observed, and kept, and that if he/they fail or neglect so to do it shall be lawful for, but not obligatory on, the mortgagee so to do at the cost and expense in all things of the mortgagor; and all moneys so expended by the mortgagee shall be payable to him by the mortgagor on demand, and until paid shall be charged on the said land together with interest at the rate of per centum per annum computed from the date or dates of such moneys being expended and in the meantime such sums of money with interest thereon at the rate aforesaid shall be added to the sum expressed to be hereby secured.

13. That the power of sale and incidental powers in that behalf conferred upon mortgagees by the Land Transfer Act, 1915, shall be implied herein, with this modification: That they may be exercised without any notice or demand whatsoever if and whenever the mortgagor make default for fourteen days in the full and punctual payment of any moneys hereby secured, or the interest thereon, in accordance with the respective covenants for payment thereof herein contained; or if and whenever the mortgagor make default in the faithful observance and performance of any other covenant or condition on his/their part herein contained or implied.

14. And it is hereby declared that this memorandum of mortgage is intended to be collateral with a certain mortgage of stock and chattels bearing even date herewith and made between the parties hereto, whereby certain stock and chattels were assigned by way of mortgage to the said mortgagee.

15. That the mortgagor will not fell, cut, lop, burn, or destroy or remove, or permit or contract for the felling, cutting, lopping, burning, destroying, or removing of any bush, timber, or timber-like trees now or at any time during the continuance of this security standing or growing upon the said land, without the previous written consent of the mortgagee, and so far as such consent may authorize: Provided always—

- (a) That such consent may be given upon condition that all or any proceeds of the operations consented to shall be receivable by the mortgagee on account of the moneys hereby secured, and/or that the mortgagee be a party to any contract affecting such operations or providing for the removal or disposal of any such bush, timber, or timber-like trees or the produce thereof;
- (b) That the receipt by the mortgagee of any such proceeds or the joinder of the mortgagee in any such contract shall not be deemed to render the mortgagee liable to account as a mortgagee in possession;
- (c) That if the mortgagee is a party to any such contract it shall not be obligatory upon the mortgagee to enforce or exercise any rights or powers thereby conferred on the mortgagee, or to take any steps or proceedings under such contract, unless the mortgagee shall think fit, and the mortgagee shall not be liable for any loss occasioned by delay or omission in any such respect, nor shall such delay or omission prejudice this security;
- (d) That nothing contained in this clause shall prevent the mortgagor without the necessity of any consent from felling and cutting such bush, timber, or timber-like trees as may be necessary to provide to a reasonable extent timber or other wood for use upon the said land for any agricultural, pastoral, household, road-making, fencing, or building purpose or other purpose of farming or husbandry.

16. All the powers and duties conferred by these presents upon the mortgagee or directed or implied by statute shall, on behalf of the mortgagee, be exercisable and may be performed in his own name by the Commissioner of Crown Lands for the time being for the Land District.

17. That upon the transfer otherwise than pursuant to the will or on the intestacy of the mortgagor of the lands hereby mortgaged or of the whole or any part of the mortgagor interest therein all principal moneys due hereunder shall become immediately due and payable to the mortgagee.

It is hereby agreed and declared that any entry on the said land above described by or on behalf of the mortgagee under the powers in that behalf contained or implied in the said collateral mortgage of stock and chattels for all or any of the purposes therein authorized shall not be deemed to be an entry into possession of the said land under the powers in that behalf herein contained or implied.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 24th day of April, 1933.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned under the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), the Te Aroha-Thames Valley Co-operative Dairy Company, Limited, of Te Aroha (hereinafter called "the company," in which term is to be construed, unless the context requires a different construction, its successors or assigns), has applied to the Governor-General in Council for a license under the said Act to occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark at Te Aroha, Waihou River, in order to construct a shipping-jetty thereon, and in accordance with the one hundred and seventy-first section of the said Act, has deposited plans in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, marked M.D. 7126, showing the area of foreshore intended to be occupied:

And whereas it has been made to appear that the said shipping-jetty will not be or tend to the injury of navigation, and it is expedient that a license should be granted to the company under the said Act for the purpose aforesaid:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the company as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the company to use and occupy that part of the foreshore, and land below low-water mark immediately contiguous thereto, which is particularly shown and delineated on the plans so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of using the shipping-jetty aforesaid in connection therewith, such license to be held and enjoyed by the company upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the terms—

"Foreshore" means such parts of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides:

"Low-water mark" means low-water mark at ordinary spring tides:

"Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto necessary for the maintenance of the said shipping-jetty at the site shown on the plans marked M.D. 7126.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the company shall pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £2 10s. in advance, payable on the 1st day of April in each year, the first of such payments to be made on the company being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. All persons shall at all reasonable times, and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said shipping-jetty, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all persons in the Government service acting in the execution of their duties, shall, at all times, have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, over, and out of the said shipping-jetty without payment.

6. The company shall maintain the above-mentioned shipping-jetty in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at the company's own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said shipping-jetty and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last-known registered office of the company in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such shipping-jetty, requiring the company within a

reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the company shall, with all reasonable speed, cause such defect to be removed, or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the company to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The master of all vessels discharging ballast at the said shipping-jetty shall have all such ballast taken away and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges, conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years, from the 1st of April, 1933, unless, in the meantime, such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the company shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege, without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, and the company may be required to remove the shipping-jetty at the company's own cost, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the company three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last-known registered office of the company in New Zealand.

12. The company shall be liable for any injury which the said shipping-jetty may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the company's part.

13. In case the company shall—

(1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;

(2) Cease to use or occupy the said shipping-jetty for a period of thirty consecutive days;

(3) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions;

(4) Be in any manner wound up or dissolved,—then, and in any of the said cases, this Order in Council and every license, right, power, or privilege thereby conferred, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the company or other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the *Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the company, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

14. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the company shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said shipping-jetty entirely from the site, and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and, if the company fails so to do, the Minister may cause the said shipping-jetty to be removed and the site so restored, and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the company.

15. The erection of the said shipping-jetty shall be sufficient evidence of the acceptance by the company of the terms and conditions of this Order in Council.

Provided that if an owner is of opinion that none of the principal means prescribed is the most suitable in his case, he may apply to the Board for permission to use some other means, and the decision of the Board shall be final as to the means to be adopted.

2. Not later than seven days after the service of such notice on an owner of land all trapping on his land shall cease, and thereafter for a period of three months from the date of service of the notice the owner shall not, except with the written permission of the Board and subject to the conditions specified therein, trap rabbits or allow rabbits to be trapped on his land.

3. Every person committing a breach of these regulations shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £10.

NOTE.—A cloudy month, with strong north-westerly winds, which not too frequently reached gale force. The windiest February since 1915. Rainfall was 40 per cent. above the normal. Total bright sunshine, 164.7 hours, 42 per cent. of the possible, and four sunless days. Lightning was seen on four days, and a heavy thunderstorm occurred in the early hours of the morning of the 15th. Mean dew-point at 9 a.m., 55.5°; and mean vapour pressure, 0.439 in.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER OF FEBRUARY, 1933.

General.—The weather in February was more appropriate to a spring than a late summer month in the prevalence of strong westerly winds. It was generally warm, with an absence of extreme temperatures. Except in low-lying eastern districts, the rainfall was very heavy. Many places recorded double the average fall for February. In consequence, there has been an excellent growth of grass in most districts. Stock are in very good condition, milk yields are being maintained, and crops are generally turning out well. Haymaking and harvesting have been interfered with to some extent by the continued wet weather. The north-westerly winds, also, interfered with harvesting on the eastern side of the ranges, and caused some loss of fruit.

Rainfall.—On the whole, the month was a very wet one, many places, as has been remarked, having had double the normal February total. On the low levels in Hawke's Bay, Marlborough, Canterbury, and eastern Otago, however, the falls were below average. This was especially the case on the Canterbury Plains.

Temperature and Sunshine.—On the average the temperature was about one degree above normal, but the departures varied considerably. February is usually our sunniest month, but this year such was far from being the case.

Pressure Systems.—The month began with a fairly vigorous depression approaching from the west. Strong northerly winds blew on the 1st and north of Cook Strait. Heavy rain fell on the west coast of the South Island. On the 3rd a southerly change gradually extended over the Dominion, and the depression appeared to be moving away when it suddenly deepened and became stationary. Rain became almost general, except in the southern half of the South Island, and from Nelson and Marlborough northwards heavy falls occurred from the 3rd to the 4th. On the early morning of the 4th damage was caused in the Rotorua and Bay of Plenty districts by a severe south-easterly gale. The same influence that led to the stormy developments of the 3rd and 4th resulted in an unusual type of depression forming west of the Auckland Peninsula, which did not move away until the 8th. Heavy rain continued to fall in the North Island during this period, and thunderstorms were very numerous. These began in the far North on the 6th, a number of animals being killed by lightning at Mangapai, and were very severe about Auckland and in the Thames and Waikato districts on the 7th. At some places they were reported again on the 8th. On the same day Central Otago experienced thunderstorms and heavy downpours.

On the 9th a change took place in the type of weather, the first of two severe westerly spells which were experienced during the month setting in on this day. Deep depressions passed on the 10th and 14th. Much heavy rain fell on the west coast of the South Island, especially on the nights of the 10th and 14th. There was thunder in the Greymouth district on the night of the 10th and a south-westerly gale blew on the coast. On the night of the 14th and the morning of the 15th a series of particularly severe thunderstorms occurred in Westland, western and northern Canterbury, Nelson, Marlborough,

and southern Wellington. The amount of damage to telephone and telegraph services was almost unprecedented. Power-lines, also, suffered considerably. At one place in North Canterbury several horses were killed. The Waimakariri River was in flood, and the west coast rivers were high.

There was an interruption to the westerly weather from the 19th to the 22nd while a depression of cyclonic form developed in the Tasman Sea and crossed the South Island. But on the 23rd the westerlies again took charge and continued until the 26th. Rivers once more became high on the west coast, and on the night of the 24th to the 25th severe thunderstorms were again experienced.

From the 18th onward conditions were disturbed in the Pacific Islands, and by the 25th a cyclone was moving southward through the Tonga Group. This cyclone led to an interruption of the westerly type of weather, and on the 28th a secondary cyclone developed just north of the Auckland Peninsula. Heavy rain fell on this day in the east coast districts of the North Island and in the far North.

Thunderstorms have already been mentioned several times, and numbers occurred on the last two days of the month. On the 27th one did considerable damage in North Auckland. There were few days, indeed, that were entirely free from thunderstorms. Small tornadoes occurred, also, at several places.
