A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, by a Proclamation dated the sixteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, and published in the *Gazette* of the twenty-fifth day of that month, at page 923 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Proclamation"), an area of Crown land containing 1,525 acres, more or less (hereinafter referred to as "the said area"), situated in Block II, Coromandel Survey District, Auckland Land District, and certain other lands were set apart as provisional State forests in terms of section thirty-four of the War Legislation and Statute Law Amendment Act, 1918:

And whereas errors were made in the description of the said area included in the Schedule attached to the said Proclamation and it is desirable that the errors be rectified:

Now, therefore, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by section three of the Forests Amendment Act, 1925, do hereby amend the said Proclamation by substituting the description of the area set forth in the Schedule hereto for the description of the said area set forth in the said Proclamation; and do declare that this Proclamation shall take effect as from the date of the said Proclamation.

*Grading of Pigs slaughtered for Export or Local Consumption in Meat-export Slaughterhouses and Bacon-curing Works.—(Notice No. Ag. 3115.)*

AS from 1st July, 1933, all pigs slaughtered in meat-export slaughterhouses and bacon-curing works in the North Island and passed as fit for human consumption will be graded by grading officers approved by the Department of Agriculture in co-operation with the New Zealand Meat-producers Board. In carrying out this duty graders will give consideration to the specifications stated hereunder as constituting the types of carcass most exactly suited for both the export and the local trade, but will carry out their duties on such lines as may be from time to time determined by instructions issued by the Department in co-operation with the Board.

**PORKERS.**

*First Grade.*—Prime barrows and maiden sows, well finished, satisfactory length, light shoulders, well finished leg to hock. Fat flare must be white and firm.

*Second Grade.*—Any pigs of sufficiently good quality not passing as first.

*Other Pigs.*—Pigs passed as fit for human consumption to be classified by the grader and approved by the Inspector as suitable for the export trade or otherwise.

Freedom from taint imperative in all grades.

Porkers to be classed on weight in three divisions as follows: 60 lb. to 80 lb.; 81 lb. to 100 lb.; 101 lb. to 120 lb.

**BACONERS.**

*First Grade.*—Prime barrows or maiden sows. Length: The minimum length from aitch-bone to first rib—26 in. for pigs weighing from 121 lb.—130 lb., 27 in. for pigs 131 lb.—140 lb., 28 in. for pigs 141 lb.—160 lb., 30 in. for pigs 161 lb.—180 lb. (dead-weight). Fatness: The maximum thickness of back fat at shoulder not to exceed 1½ in. in pigs weighing 121 lb.—130 lb., 1½ in. in pigs weighing 131 lb.—140 lb., 1¾ in. in pigs weighing 141 lb.—160 lb., and 2 in. in pigs weighing 161 lb.—180 lb. (dead-weight). Finish and conformity: Neck and shoulders not too heavy; well finished from leg to hock; satisfactory thickness of flank. Fat to be white and firm, free from any oil, fish, or meat taint.

*Second Grade.*—Lacking in above good points, e.g., overfat, heavy neck and shoulders, short loin, bad conformity, thickness of bone.

*Other Pigs.*—Pigs passed as fit for human consumption to be classified by the grader and approved by the Inspector as suitable for the export trade or otherwise.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR APRIL, 1933.

General.—During the first part of April there was a predominance of fine and mild weather, but in the latter half there were frequent boisterous winds from a westerly or south-westerly quarter. An unusually cold spell for the time of year occurred on the 23rd and 24th. Heavy snow fell down to low levels on the ranges, and frosts were numerous and rather severe. It was not until the 28th that mild conditions returned. Though rainfall was below average over most of the North Island, the falls were well distributed, and stock and pastures have maintained unusually good condition. Milk yields were very well maintained until the cold weather set in, when there was a rapid falling off. On the east coast and in parts of the Wairarapa, however, the continued shortage of rain is being felt, and the cold, dry, westerly winds had a very exhausting effect on pastures. Winter feed is likely to be scarce. In the South Island Canterbury unfortunately missed most of the heavy rains. On the Plains there is an acute shortage of feed, and most turnip crops have been ruined by the effects of the drought and the ravages of the diamond-backed moth. In Marlborough conditions have improved somewhat, satisfactory rains having fallen and temperatures having remained sufficiently mild to permit some growth of vegetation. The remainder of the South Island experienced wet conditions, and the state of stock and pastures is generally satisfactory.

Rainfall.—Rainfall was very much below average over the greater part of the North Island. The Hawke's Bay and Poverty Bay districts had less than half. A small area around Hamilton and the country surrounding the South Taranaki Bight, however, recorded more than the normal totals. In the South Island Canterbury was again unfortunate, dry conditions still persisting. Some stations once more experienced a shortage of more than 50 per cent. Over the remainder of the South Island the rainfall was above the average. A particularly wet month was experienced in Otago and Southland, the normal for April being more than doubled at many places.

Temperature.—Temperatures were slightly above normal over most of the North Island, but the reverse was the case in Taranaki. In the South Island coastal portions of Marlborough and Canterbury recorded temperatures slightly above normal, but over the remainder they were considerably below. From the 23rd onward there were many frosts, especially in the South Island.

Sunshine.—At most places more than the average amount of bright sunshine was experienced, but in parts of the South Island, especially the west coast and the south, there was a deficit. Napier, with 223.4 hours, had the best record.

Pressure Systems.—During the first part of the month the disturbed conditions experienced in March in the New Caledonia and New Hebrides region persisted with unabated intensity. On the 2nd a deep cyclone, which had developed in the area mentioned and moved southwards, was centred west of Cook Strait. There seemed a prospect of heavy general rains and very stormy conditions, but at this critical stage the cyclone began to fill up and move rapidly south-eastwards. Though strong winds and fairly general rain occurred, the heavy precipitation was confined principally to the mountain ranges and the western and southern portions of the South Island. By the 4th the weather was fine again.

A second deep cyclone developed in the New Hebrides on the 6th, and by the 12th was centred east of Norfolk Island. H.M.S. "Diomedé" experienced severe weather while passing through it on the way to the Tonga Islands. On the following day, again at the critical stage for New Zealand, it commenced to fill up rapidly, and by the 14th had petered out. It therefore affected only the northern and north-eastern portions of the North Island.

During the 8th and 9th widespread rain was caused by a double westerly depression. The falls were very heavy in the North Island, and many thunderstorms were reported.

The outstanding feature of the month, however, was a very intense anticyclone which covered the whole of Australia, practically continuously, from the 12th to the 26th. Anticyclones of this type are not unusual in the autumn, but seldom occur so early as this. The consequence of this high pressure to the westward was that New Zealand experienced a severe spell of westerly weather. From the 14th to the 27th there was scarcely a day without strong and squally winds from a westerly quarter. They were especially boisterous in the ranges, the night of the 18th to 19th and the 23rd being the roughest periods. On the 23rd a very deep depression crossed the Dominion, and the strong southerly winds which followed it brought a severe cold snap. On this day and the next there was heavy snow in the ranges, and many places experienced hail showers. The whole period was a very wet one for districts with a westerly aspect.

Thunderstorms occurred in some part of the country on the 18th, 19th, and 21st to 23rd. A small tornado was reported from near Opotiki on the 22nd.

From the 28th to the 30th finer weather was experienced.
