IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the Customs Act, 1913 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act"), and by the Customs Amendment Act, 1921, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby amend the Customs (Tariff Preference and General) Regulations, 1925, made by Order in Council on the twenty-first day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, and published in the *Gazette* on the twenty-sixth day of the same month, at page 3265, as amended by the Order in Council made on the eighth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and thirty, and published in the *Gazette* on the eleventh day of the same month, at page 2750, to the extent set forth below, namely :—

By deleting from clause 4 (b) (i) of Form 3 and clause 7 (b) (i) of Form 4 in the Second Schedule thereto and from the Third Schedule thereto the words "Fibres, natural, animal, or vegetable, even though sorted, dressed, scoured, or similarly treated, including raw silk, organzine, tram silk, grege, poil, crepe, and grenadine, but not including schappe," and by substituting therefor the following words :—

Cellulose acetate film base.

Cork strip for tipping cigarettes.

Fibres, natural, animal, or vegetable, even though sorted, dressed, scoured, or similarly treated, including raw silk, organzine, tram silk, grege, poil, crepe, grenadine, and single spun schappe yarn.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the sixth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, and gazetted on the ninth day of that month, an area of sixteen acres two roods thirty perches, in the Town of Titirangi, North Auckland Land District, was brought under the provisions of Part II of the Public Reserves, Domains, and National Parks Act, 1928, as the Laingholm Domain :

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the eleventh day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, and gazetted on the twenty-third day of that month, a Domain Board was appointed to have control of the said Laingholm Domain :

And whereas an error was made in the description of the said domain in the Schedules to the Orders in Council hereinbefore referred to, and it is expedient that the error should be rectified :

16. CROWN NOT LIABLE TO PAY COMPENSATION.

Nothing in this license shall be held to impose any liability upon His Majesty or upon the Government of New Zealand to pay compensation to any person, corporate body, or local authority by reason of the exercise by the licensee of the authority hereby granted; but the licensee shall be liable for any loss or damage which any person, corporate body, or local authority may sustain as the result of the exercise by the licensee of any of the powers granted by this license.

17. BED OF STREAM NOT LEASED.

18. DEFAULT.

19. ALTERATIONS TO WORKS.

Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensees shall thereupon cease and determine, but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensees of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

7. RENTAL.

The licensees shall in respect of this license pay to the District Electrical Engineer, Public Works Department, Christchurch, a yearly rental of 4s. per kilowatt of maximum output generated during each and every year from 1st April, 1933, with a minimum of 9s. 3d. per annum. The output either shall be recorded by means of a watt-hour meter installed by the licensees, or, failing such installation, it shall be determined on the maximum capacity of the generating plant installed. The present plant is rated at 230 volts 10 amperes.

8. GRANTING OF OTHER WATER-RIGHTS.

Nothing herein shall prevent the Governor-General in Council from granting to any person or body corporate other than the licensees a license to take water from any portion of the said stream, except at the place where the licensees are by this license empowered to take it: Provided that no such license shall so operate as to enable such person or body corporate to reduce the natural fall between the headworks and tail-water, or the volume of the water which the licensees are by this license authorized to take from the said stream.

9. VARIATION IN CONDITIONS OF LICENSE.

The terms and conditions of this license may from time to time, at the request or with the consent in writing of the licensees, be altered by the Governor-General by Order in Council.

10. SURRENDER OF LICENSE.

The licensees may at any time, with the consent of the Minister, surrender this license, and shall thereupon remove from the ground (if so required by the Minister) all removable equipment, machinery, buildings, poles, transmission-lines, and other plant herein authorized to be installed or provided. If the licensees fail or neglect so to remove the said plant within twelve months after being required so to do, such equipment, machinery, buildings, poles, lines, and other plant shall, without payment of compensation, vest in and become the property of the Crown.

11. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraph (c) of clause 5 of the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1927.

The generating and transmission voltage shall be approximately 230 volts between the terminals.

12. CROWN NOT LIABLE TO PAY COMPENSATION.

Nothing in this license shall be held to impose any liability upon His Majesty the King or upon the Government of New Zealand to pay compensation to any person, corporate body, or local authority by reason of the exercise by the licensees of the authority hereby granted; but the licensees shall be liable for any loss or damage which any person, corporate body, or local authority may sustain as the result of the exercise by the licensees of any of the powers granted by this license.

13. BED OF STREAM NOT LEASED.

Nothing herein shall be held to constitute a lease from the Crown of the bed of the stream shown on the said plan, nor shall the provisions of Part IX of the Property Law Act, 1908, apply to this license.

14. CHARGES FOR ELECTRICAL ENERGY.

The charges for electrical energy shall not exceed 1s. per unit for lighting purposes, and 6d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes: Provided that "lighting purposes" shall include the operation of motor generators for lighting purposes.

15. DEFAULT.

If the licensees fail or neglect to observe any of the conditions or obligations imposed by this license, then and in any such case the provisions of clauses 229 and 230 of the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1927, shall apply to the breach of any such condition or obligation.

16. ALTERATIONS TO WORKS.

In the event of the licensees at any time desiring to make alterations to the works involving a departure from the location or type of construction shown on the approved plans, they shall first submit for the Minister's approval plans showing such new location and [or] type of construction as it is proposed to adopt, and, with such approval, the alterations may be carried out.

17. INSPECTION OF WORKS.

The Inspecting Engineer of the Public Works Department or any other person empowered in that behalf by the Minister shall at all times, both during and after the construction of the works, have free access to and liberty to inspect such works in order to ensure that the provisions of this license are given due effect to.

18. CONTRACT BETWEEN LICENSEE AND CROWN.

This license shall be deemed to constitute a contract as between the licensees and His Majesty the King, and may be enforced by and against either party accordingly.

19. REQUIREMENTS OF HURUNUI ELECTRIC-POWER BOARD AND THE AMURI COUNTY COUNCIL.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the licensees shall not by virtue of these presents be entitled to lay, construct, put up, place, or use the electric lines hereby authorized, except subject to such conditions (not inconsistent with the provisions of this license or of the regulations) as may from time to time be imposed by the Hurunui Electric-power Board and the Amuri County Council.

20. RAILWAYS AND TELEGRAPH DEPARTMENTS' LINES.

The licensees shall rectify to the satisfaction of the Government Railways Board or the Minister of Telegraphs, as the case may be, any interference or disturbance caused by the erection or operation of the licensees' system that affects the satisfactory working of telegraph-lines which are the property of the Railways Department or the Telegraph Department, and which were erected prior to the licensees' lines.

21. TIME FOR SUBSTANTIAL COMPLETION OF WORKS.

The licensees shall substantially complete the works hereby authorized within a period of one year from the date of this license, or within such further time as the Minister may allow in the event of the work being delayed by strikes, lockouts, breakdowns, or other unavoidable causes not due to any neglect by the licensees.

22. PURCHASE OF INSTALLATION BY ELECTRIC-POWER BOARD OR CROWN.

Subject to the provisions of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, or any Act passed in amendment thereof or in substitution thereof, any Electric-power Board whose district or outer area shall include the area within which are erected the lines described in clause 4 hereof, or the Crown, shall have the right, at any time during the currency of this license, to purchase and take over the licensees' installation at a valuation to be agreed upon between the said Board or the Crown, as the case may be, and the licensees; and, failing such agreement, at a valuation to be fixed by a single arbitrator to be appointed pursuant to the provisions of the Arbitration Act, 1908, and thereupon the Governor-General may by Order in Council revoke this license.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section one hundred and fifty-eight of the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), that where the foreshore outside the limits of a harbour is not vested in any Harbour Board or other local authority the Governor-General may, by Order in Council, grant, for a period not exceeding twenty-one years, the control of such part or parts thereof as he thinks fit to any local authority, Domain Board, or persons acting as trustees for the inhabitants of the locality, upon such conditions as may be prescribed in the Order:

And whereas the foreshore hereinafter described is not vested in any Harbour Board or other local authority, and the Hutt County Council (hereinafter called "the Council") has applied to the Governor-General in Council for the control thereof:

And whereas it is desirable that the control should be granted to the Council:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby grant to the Council the control of the foreshore as described in the first Schedule hereto, and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

THAT portion of the foreshore in Hutt County, commencing one mile south of the Paekakariki Railway-station, and extending generally southward and westward to Te Rewarewa Point.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

1. IN these conditions the term—

"Foreshore" means all land between high-water mark of ordinary spring tides and low-water mark of ordinary spring tides.

"Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to that part of the foreshore as is defined in the First Schedule hereto.

3. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress out and over the said foreshore without payment.

4. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or with any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provision of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are or may hereafter be in force.

5. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall not apply to those portions of the foreshore required for securing the shore-ends of any telegraph cables that are at present or may be at any time laid down within the said area of foreshore.

6. The Council may enclose any part or parts of the foreshore described in the First Schedule hereto for the purpose of holding athletic sports or games, and may by by-law fix a charge for admission to such enclosed part or parts: Provided that the total number of days on which such enclosures are made shall not exceed six in any one year.

7. The Council may, subject to the provisions of section 171 of the Harbours Act, 1923, erect, or license, or permit the erection of bathing-sheds or boat-sheds on the foreshore described in the First Schedule hereto, and may make by-laws regulating the use thereof, and may fix charges for such use: Provided that the funds so received shall be expended in improving the foreshore for the benefit of the public.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Council to remove, or cause to be removed, any stone, sand, shingle, or shells without the consent of the Minister being first obtained.

9. By-laws made by the Council under the said Act in respect of the foreshore shall not have effect unless and until approved in writing by the Minister.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for twenty-one years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Council six calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the Council in New Zealand.

Amending Regulations under the Orchard and Garden Diseases Act, 1928, in regard to the Importation of Fruit or Plants into New Zealand.—(Notice No. Ag. 3131.)

THE RIGHT HON. J. G. COATES PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the Orchard and Garden Diseases Act, 1928 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, being of the opinion that the fruit, the introduction of which into New Zealand is hereby prohibited, is likely to introduce into New Zealand Mediterranean or West Australian fruit-fly (*Halterophora capitata*, described also as *Ceratitidis capitata*), doth hereby make the following regulations in further amendment of the regulations under the Orchard and Garden Diseases Act, 1908, enuring under the said Act, governing the importation of fruit or plants into New Zealand made by Order in Council on the twenty-third day of August, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and published in the *Gazette* on the second day of September, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, at page 3100 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal regulations"), and doth hereby declare that the regulations hereby made shall come into force on the date of the publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

1. NOTWITHSTANDING anything to the contrary in the principal regulations in so far as they relate to the admission of fruit, the introduction into New Zealand of any fruit from any country in which Mediterranean or West Australian fruit-fly (*Halterophora capitata*, described also as *Ceratitidis capitata*) is known to exist is absolutely prohibited.

2. Every shipment of fruit which by the principal regulations and these regulations may be introduced into New Zealand shall, in addition to the certificates required by the principal regulations to accompany such fruit to New Zealand, be accompanied by a certificate signed by an officer of the Department of Agriculture or other Department performing the functions or duties relating to horticulture in the country where such fruit was grown, and certifying that Mediterranean or West Australian fruit-fly (*Halterophora capitata*, described also as *Ceratitidis capitata*) does not exist in the country where such fruit was grown:

Provided that the aforesaid certificate may be combined with the appropriate certificate required by the principal regulations to accompany fruit the introduction of which is permitted under the principal regulations and these regulations and if so combined may be in or to the effect of the form set out in the Schedule hereto.

Post Office Savings-bank.—Amending Rates of Interest payable on Deposits.

IN exercise of the powers conferred on me by subsection (1) of section 82 of the Post and Telegraph Act, 1928, I, Joseph Gordon Coates, Minister of Finance, do hereby give notice as follows:—

(1) On and after the 1st day of August, 1933, the Post Office Savings-bank rate of interest shall, subject to the following clauses hereof, be in the case of each depositor—

(a) On so much of his deposit as does not exceed £1,000, a rate of 3 per centum per annum:

(b) On so much thereof as exceeds £1,000 and does not exceed £2,000, a rate of 2½ per centum per annum.

(2) In the case of each depositor the amount of whose deposit on the 31st day of July, 1933, exceeds £2,000, and who on that date is receiving under any lawful authority then in force interest on any amount of such deposit in excess of £2,000 (but not exceeding £5,000) at the rate of 3 per centum per annum, such depositor shall be entitled on and after the 1st day of August, 1933, to receive interest at the rate of 2½ per centum per annum on the amount in excess of £2,000 on which on the 31st day of July, 1933, he was so entitled to receive interest at the rate of 3 per centum, but so that no interest shall be allowed on any moneys lodged to the account on or after the 1st day of April, 1928, unless and until the balance at credit does not exceed £2,000, and thereafter interest shall be allowed only on so much thereof as does not exceed £2,000.

(3) In the case of savings-banks established under the Savings-bank Act, 1908, registered friendly societies, societies incorporated under the Industrial and Provident Societies Act, 1908, and such other non-mercantile societies as the Governor-General in Council or the Minister of Finance has heretofore approved in that behalf, or as the said Minister shall from time to time hereafter so approve, the aforesaid limit of £2,000 shall not apply.
