THE RIGHT HON. J. G. COATES PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section four hundred and fourteen, subsection one, of the Mining Act, 1926, it is provided that the Governor-General, by Order in Council, may from time to time declare that any of the provisions of the Mining Act, 1926, shall apply to prospecting and mining for and the storage of petroleum and other mineral oils and of natural gas, and also define the districts within which any such Order in Council shall take effect:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the said section four hundred and fourteen, subsection one, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby declare that the provisions of the Mining Act, 1926, set out in the First Schedule hereto shall apply to prospecting and mining for and the storage of petroleum and other mineral oils and of natural gas within the districts described in the Second Schedule hereto.

## SECOND SCHEDULE.

### DESCRIPTION OF DISTRICTS.

ALL that area in the North Auckland Land District contained in Blocks 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, and 16, Purua Survey District, Blocks 2, 5, and 6, Tangihua Survey District, and Block 4, Maungaru Survey District, exclusive of the Kioreroa Block, an endowment of the Whangarei High School, situated within that area.

All that area in the Taranaki Land District : Bounded towards the north generally by the Mokau River from the sea to the Tahumataroa Stream ; thence by that stream to the eastern boundary of Mokau-Mohakatino No. 1H Block ; thence towards the east by the said eastern boundary to the south-eastern boundary of the said Mokau-Mohakatino No. 1H Block ; thence towards the south-east by a right line to the easternmost corner of the Town of Midhirst ; thence towards the south-west by the said Town of Midhirst to its northernmost corner ; thence by a right line to the mouth of the Pitone Stream ; and thence towards the north-west by the sea to the mouth of the Mokau River, the place of commencement.

All that area in the Hawke's Bay Land District contained in the Survey Districts of Mahanga and Nuhaka.

All that area in the Hawke's Bay Land District contained in the Survey Districts of Mangatoro and Weber.

All that area in the Wellington Land District contained in the Survey District of Mount Cerberus.

All that area in the Wellington Land District, containing by admeasurement 18,071 acres, more or less, being Mataikona Nos. 1, 2, and 3 Blocks : Bounded towards the north and north-east generally by the Aohanga River, from the confluence of the Waingongoro Stream with that river to the sea ; thence towards the south-east by the sea to the mouth of the Mataikona River ; thence towards the south-west by the Mataikona River to the Makatote Stream ; thence towards the west generally by the Makatote Stream to Section 5, Block XI, Aohanga Survey District ; thence by that section to the Waingongoro Stream ; and thence by the Waingongoro Stream to the Aohanga River, the place of commencement ; excluding Section 145 in Block III, Castlepoint Survey District.

## THE 1931 INTERNATIONAL CODE OF SIGNALS.

*Former Notices.*—Nos. 24 and 48 of 1932.

It has now been agreed that the new International Code of Signals will come into use on the 1st January, 1934.

As previously announced, the new code consists of two volumes: Volume I for visual and sound signalling, and Volume II, radio signalling.

Special attention is drawn to the fact that the existing pilot signal S ("I want a pilot") is replaced by the letter G ("I require a pilot"). No alteration is, however, made in the case of the two-letter signals, PT, NC, and JD, which retain their old and well established meanings.

In the quarantine signals, the flag signal Q will indicate a clean bill of health, while the two-flag signals, QQ and QL, will indicate an infected ship. The new night signal (to be used only when within the precincts of a port) will consist of a red light over a white light, the lights being not more than 6 ft. apart. *It should be carefully noted that the new pilot and quarantine signals are not to be used until the new code comes into force on the 1st January, 1934.*

Masters and officers should, during the remainder of the year, take all possible opportunities to familiarize themselves with the new code and its procedure, and to practise its use with other ships. A suitable procedure, when it is desired to exchange communications by the new code, would be to hoist the code pendant with the fly tied to the halyards, to which signal the answering ship, if able to communicate in the new

code, would reply by a similar hoist. Should the answering ship only be able to communicate in the old code, she would hoist the code pendant as at present. The radio-signalling volume might also be used experimentally for radio communication until it comes into general use on the 1st January.
