And whereas it is now expedient that the said road should be proclaimed as a public road:

Now, therefore, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by section four hundred and eighty-seven of the Native Land Act, 1931, do hereby proclaim as a public road the road described in the Schedule hereto.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Small Farms (Relief of Unemployment) Act, 1932-33 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby amend the regulations made on the nineteenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, and published in the *Gazette* of the twenty-second day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, by adding thereto the following regulation for the purposes of the said Act, and doth hereby declare that such regulation shall come into force on the day of publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

REGULATION.

11. No registration or other fee shall be payable in respect of any memorandum or deed of mortgage or any bill of sale given as security for an advance made under the authority of these regulations; or in respect of the discharge or variation of the terms of any such memorandum or deed of mortgage or bill of sale; or in respect of any caveat lodged to protect any interest acquired by His Majesty the King or by the Minister of Employment pursuant to these regulations or to the said Act or to the Unemployment Amendment Act, 1932; or in respect of any memorandum or deed of lease issued pursuant to the said Act or to the Unemployment Amendment Act, 1932; or of any surrender or re-entry or any notice of forfeiture or any other dealing with such lease or memorandum of lease as is provided for by the said Act or the regulations thereunder.

And whereas it is desirable to amend the said regulations in the manner hereinafter described:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby amend the said regulations of the twenty-sixth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, by making the regulations set out in the Schedule hereto; and doth hereby order and declare that these regulations shall come into force on the date of publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

SCHEDULE.

REGULATION 5 of the hereinbefore-recited regulations is hereby amended by adding the following proviso thereto:—

"Provided further that in the Oreti River it shall be lawful during the 1933 fishing season to use a hand-net, the area of the mouth of which shall not exceed 9 sq. ft. If such hand-net is oval in shape the height in feet multiplied by the width in feet must not exceed 11; if circular, the diameter must not exceed 3 ft. 4 in., or the circumference 10 ft. 7 in."

The hereinbefore-recited regulations are further amended by the addition of the following regulation:—

"23B. Any person fishing for whitebait in the Mataura River may use a fishing stand or jetty, provided that such stand or jetty does not extend into the river more than 9 ft. from the landward end, and that the understructure of such stand or jetty shall not consist of stakes other than those required to support a plank or platform on which such person may stand. No person shall construct a stand or jetty which shall obstruct the flow of the water or divert the movements of the whitebait.

"(a) No person shall use any boat when fishing for whitebait on the Mataura River unless such boat is moored at a distance of not less than two chains from any set-net already in use as provided in Regulation 18 hereof.

"The person using such boat as aforesaid shall not use such boat in any manner which shall obstruct the flow of the water or divert the movements of the whitebait: Provided, however, that no person shall use any boat as aforesaid for whitebait-fishing unless such boat is registered and licensed in accordance with the provisions of the said Act.

"(b) Any person fishing for whitebait in the Taieri River may use a fishing stand or jetty, provided that such stand or jetty does not extend into the river more than 9 ft. from the landward end, and that the understructure of such stand or jetty shall not consist of stakes other than those required to support a plank or platform on which such person may stand. No person shall construct a stand or jetty which shall obstruct the flow of the water or divert the movements of the whitebait."

"5. No person shall fish for trout, perch, or other acclimatized fish in the upper reaches of the Waikanae River and its tributaries from its junction with the Ngatiawa River.

No person shall fish for trout, perch, or other acclimatized fish in the lakes, rivers, and streams of the said district with any lure or bait other than artificial ones: Provided, however, that artificial and live baits may be used in the Otaki, below the railway bridge; the Waikanae, below Buchanan's house; the Mangahao, below the two dams; the Ohau, below the railway bridge; the Horowhenua Lake; the Manawatu, from the mouth to the Ngawapurua Bridge; the Oroua, from the Awahuri Bridge to its junction with the Manawatu River; the Rangitikei; the Turakina; the Wangaehu; the Hutt, from the mouth to the Belmont Stream, and from the Moonshine Bridge to its source; the Whakataki; the Pahaoa; the Wairarapa Lake; the Tauherenikau; the Haungaroa; the Waiohine; the Taueru; the Waingawa; the Ruamahunga, below the Te Ore Ore Road Bridge; the Tiraumea; the Makakahi, within the Pahiatua County: Provided, further, that in the Hutt River between Belmont Creek and Moonshine Bridge artificial baits and bully only may be used.

"7. No person shall use any sinker or weight exceeding the weight of half an ounce when fishing with live bait in waters where such bait may be used: Provided that there shall be no restriction on the weight of sinkers used for perch-fishing in the Tauherenikau River up to the bridge crossing the river on the Featherston-Martinborough Road, and in the Ruamahunga River up to the bridge crossing the river on the Kahutara Road, and also in the Wairarapa Lake and lagoons.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the second section of the Okarito Harbour Act, 1932-33, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby vest the control and management of the harbour of Okarito in the Okarito Harbour Company, Limited, being a company duly incorporated under the Companies Act, 1908, and having its registered office at Auckland, and having as its principal object the development, control, and management of the harbour of Okarito (hereinafter called "the company"), for a period of twenty-five years computed from the first day of September, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, upon and subject to the terms

and conditions set forth in the First Schedule hereto: And His Excellency doth hereby further direct that those provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, specified in the Second Schedule hereto shall, on and from the date last hereinbefore-mentioned, apply as if the company were a Harbour Board within the meaning of that Act.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

1. In this Order in Council, if not inconsistent with the context,—

"Minister" means the Minister of Marine:

"Harbour" means the harbour of Okarito:

"Harbour-works" means such harbour-works as the company may, pursuant to the provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, be authorized to construct within the limits of the harbour, and includes any harbour-works as defined in section 5 of the Harbours Act, 1923, that have been duly authorized.

2. His Majesty, or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service, acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, over, and out of the said harbour and harbour-works.

3. All persons shall, at all reasonable times, and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use any wharf in the said harbour constructed or controlled by the company, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

4. The company shall appoint all officers and servants required for the control and management of the harbour and harbour-works.

5. The company shall, within twelve months from the date hereof, prosecute to the satisfaction of the Minister the construction of such harbour-works as he may deem essential for the working of the harbour, and shall from time to time make such alterations or additions thereto as the Minister may deem necessary for the safe and convenient working of the harbour having regard to the volume of shipping using the harbour.

6. The company shall carry out in respect of the harbour all the duties herein imposed or implied by the provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, set forth in the Second Schedule hereto.

7. The company shall maintain and keep the harbour-works and all erections thereon in good order and repair, and shall erect, exhibit, and maintain at the company's own cost any lights, beacons, buoys, or sea-marks required for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light, beacon, buoy, or sea-mark shall be exhibited or placed in position for use until it has been approved of by the Minister.

8. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said harbour-works and any buildings erected thereon and view the state of repair thereof; and upon his leaving at the registered office of the company a notice, in writing, of any defect or want of repair in such harbour-works or buildings, or any of them, requiring the company, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the company shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

9. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the company to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder.

10. The company shall cause its accounts to be balanced in each financial year of the company, and shall forward to the Minister three copies of the same, duly audited, within three months from the date up to which they are balanced.

11. The Minister may from time to time by notice in writing served on the company require the company, within such time as may be specified in such notice, to alter or reduce all or any of the dues and charges prescribed by the company by rules made under section 3 of the Okarito Harbour Act, 1932-33. Forthwith upon the receipt of the said notice the company shall make the requisite amendments to its rules.

12. If the company shall at any time during the term hereof abandon the harbour or fail or neglect to carry on the control and management thereof for a period of three months, then this license may be revoked and all harbour-works then existing shall immediately revert to the Crown freed and discharged from all claims and obligations by or on behalf of the company.

13. At the end of the term hereby granted the harbour and all harbour-works shall revert in His Majesty, and the company shall have no claim for compensation in respect thereof.

14. Nothing herein contained shall be deemed to limit the powers and authorities conferred upon the Governor-General in Council by the Harbours Act, 1923, in respect of the issue

of licenses to occupy foreshore and land below low-water mark within the limits of the harbour and of the grant of authority to construct harbour-works thereon.

15. If the company fails or neglects, within twelve months from the date hereof, to proceed with the construction of the harbour-works deemed by the Minister to be necessary for the improvement of the harbour, this Order in Council shall immediately determine.

NOTE.—A cloudy dismal month, with rainfall 27 per cent. above the mean of previous years. Total bright sunshine, 77 hours, 26 per cent. of the possible, and eleven sunless days. Frost was recorded on the grass on three mornings, and fog was in evidence on the morning of the 11th. Mean dew-point at 9 a.m., 41.7°; and mean vapour pressure, 0.263 in.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR JULY, 1933.

General.—Though there was again a persistence of southerly winds, and eastern districts particularly experienced a lack of sunshine, July was a mild winter month, and conditions were very favourable for stock and pastures. The growth of grass has been unusually good for the time of year, all districts reporting a certain amount. This has been particularly fortunate in Canterbury and Marlborough, since the shortage of winter feed has thereby been compensated for. Stock are everywhere reported to be in good condition.

Rainfall.—The distribution of rainfall during the month was rather patchy. On the whole the average was slightly exceeded, and there were some isolated very high totals. On the other hand, large areas received less than usual. North Auckland, North Taranaki, South Wellington, and the Bay of Plenty and central districts of the North Island registered an excess, while most of the remainder experienced a shortage. In the South Island, western districts and the interior had much more than normal, but eastern and far southern districts much less. The rain on the West Coast was made up largely of a very few but very heavy falls.

Temperatures did not, generally, differ greatly from the average for July. In eastern districts, from Canterbury northwards, the persistent southerly winds and lack of sunshine were responsible for low day temperatures, and the mean, also, was consequently somewhat below normal. The remainder of the country enjoyed more genial conditions. There were no severe cold snaps, and frosts were rather less frequent than usual.

Sunshine.—Though sunshine was below normal everywhere except in western and far southern districts of the South Island, it was only in eastern districts that the deficits were large. Nelson recorded 143.4 hours, while Hokitika, on the wet West Coast, in spite of 21.73 in. of rain, came a close second with 142.9 hours. The Capital City, with 77.0 hours, occupied an unenviable position at the bottom of the list.

Pressure Systems.—The weather in July was generally similar to that in June so far as the type of storm system was concerned. Most of the storms were of cyclonic form, and there was a persistent tendency for high pressures over the southern portion of the Dominion. Several very intense anticyclones were experienced, barometers rising on the 27th to over 30.6 in. at a number of places. There were only three depressions of the westerly type, and of these the only one that affected the weather greatly was that which passed on the 9th. A low-pressure trough extended a long way northwards from this depression and general rains resulted, especially in the North Island. Snow fell on the ranges of the South Island.

The first of the cyclones passed the northern extremity of the North Island on the 3rd. There were heavy rains in the far North as it passed and south-easterly gales followed it.

Between the 14th and the 17th a complex depression crossed the South Island. Practically all districts recorded heavy rain, many of the falls being of exceptional severity. Floods occurred in Taranaki, Westland, and the Mackenzie Country in western South Canterbury. The fall of the 14th, which in many places exceeded 2 in., was quite an unusual one for the district last mentioned. Snow fell in the same area on several days and was widespread on the ranges generally.

A third cyclone, which crossed the tip of the Auckland Peninsula on the 22nd, also caused general rains. Southerly gales blew after the centre had passed, and there was further snow on the ranges.

Stormy weather with north-east or northerly gales prevailed during the last two days of the month, while a cyclone, which had caused heavy floods in New South Wales, was advancing across the Tasman Sea.
