HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section two, subsection one, of the Public Service Amendment Act, 1927, it is enacted that the Governor-General in Council may at any time, on the recommendation of and for special reasons assigned by the Commissioner, revoke wholly or in part any declaration heretofore made, pursuant to section four of the Public Service Act, 1912, excluding any office from the operation of that Act:

And whereas the Commissioner has recommended that the declaration made on the eighth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, excluding the office of Audit Officer, London, should be wholly revoked for the special reasons assigned by him:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke wholly the declaration made on the eighth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen.

Land permanently reserved in the Otago Land District for Recreation Purposes.

WHEREAS by the three-hundred-and-fifty-ninth section of the Land Act, 1924, it is enacted that the Governor-General may from time to time set apart temporarily as reserves, notwithstanding that the same may be then held under pastoral license, any Crown lands which in his opinion are required for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned:

And whereas by the three-hundred-and-sixtieth section of the said Act it is provided that land temporarily reserved under the said three-hundred-and-fifty-ninth section may, at the expiration of one month, but not later than six months, after the publication in the *Gazette* of notice of such temporary reservation, be permanently reserved, and that notice of such permanent reservation shall be published in the *Gazette*:

And whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto was by Warrant dated the tenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, and published in the *Gazette* of the sixteenth day of that month, temporarily reserved under the authority of the said Act for recreation purposes:

Now, therefore, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the said Act, do hereby permanently reserve the land described in the Schedule hereto for recreation purposes, for which the said land was so temporarily reserved as aforesaid.

Notice of Intention to issue an Order in Council revoking the Reservation over the Buffalo Domain, Auckland Land District.

WHEREAS by section forty-one of the Public Reserves, Domains, and National Parks Act, 1928 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), it is provided that the Governor-General may from time to time by Order in Council, but subject to compliance with the requirements of subsection two of section seven of the said Act, declare that the land comprised in a public domain or part thereof shall cease to be subject to Part II of the said Act; and, further, may declare either that such land shall be a public reserve for the purposes of Part I of the said Act, or Crown land available for disposal by way of sale for cash under the Land Act, 1924:

And whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto is known as the Buffalo Domain, but is not required for domain purposes, and it is expedient to revoke the reservation over the said land:

WHEREAS by the three-hundred-and-fifty-ninth section of the Land Act, 1924, it is enacted that the Governor-General may from time to time set apart temporarily as reserves, notwithstanding that the same may be then held under pastoral license, any Crown lands which in his opinion are required for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned:

And whereas by the three-hundred-and-sixtieth section of the said Act it is provided that land temporarily reserved under the said three-hundred-and-fifty-ninth section may, at the expiration of one month, but not later than six months, after the publication in the *Gazette* of notice of such temporary reservation, be permanently reserved, and that notice of such permanent reservation shall be published in the *Gazette*.

And whereas the lands described in the Schedule hereto were, by Warrants dated the twenty-eighth day of July, and the third day of August respectively, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, and published in *Gazette* of the fourth and the eleventh days of August of that year, temporarily reserved under the authority of the said Act for river-protection purposes:

Estimated Areas under Wheat, Oats, Barley, and Potatoes (Season 1932-33).

Census and Statistics Office,

AS in previous years, cards were sent out by post to grain-growers and to potato-growers throughout the Dominion asking them to state what areas they had sown or planted, or intended to sow or plant, in wheat, oats, barley, and potatoes this season.
