- "(3) The fee for a monthly license issued to any person being under the age of sixteen years shall be £1 10s., and to any other person £3."

 3. Regulation 3 of the principal regulations is hereby further amended by revoking clause (5) thereof.

 4. Regulation 14 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking clause (4) thereof and substituting the following clause in lieu thereof:—

- "(4) The fee for a permit issued for a week or less shall be 3s., and for a permit issued for more than a week shall be at the rate of 3s. for every week or part of a week of the period for which the permit is issued."

 - "At Auckland on the third Monday in January, March, May, July, September, and November.
 - "At Hamilton on the first Monday in January, May, and September.
 - " At Napier on the first Monday in February, June, and October.
 - "At Wanganui on the first Monday in February, June, and October.
 - "At New Plymouth on the first Monday in February, May, August, and November.
 - "At Palmerston North on the first Monday in February, June, and October.
 - "At Wellington on the first Monday in February, April, June, August, October, and December.
 - "At Nelson on the first Monday in February, June, and October.
 - "At Greymouth on the first Monday in February, June, and October.
 - "At Christchurch on the first Monday in January, March, May, July, September, and November.
 - "At Dunedin on the first Monday in February, April, June, August, October, and December.
 - "At Invercargill on the first Monday in April, August, and December.
- - "At Gisborne after the 14th February and the 14th August.
 - "At Timaru after the 14th May and the 14th October.
 - "At Whangarei after the 4th January and the 4th June.

FUGITIVE CRIMINAL.

The Portugal (Extradition) Order in Council, 1933. At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 26th day of June, 1933.

Whereas by the Extradition Acts, 1870 (33 and 34 Vict., c. 52) to 1906 (6 Edw. VII, c. 15) it was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 (33 and 34 Vict., subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as

subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a Treaty was signed on the 17th day of October, 1892, and was subsequently ratified, between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and His late Majesty the King of Portugal for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals:

And whereas a further Convention was signed on the 20th January, 1932, between His Majesty and the President of the Portuguese Republic, which Convention is in the terms following:—

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland, and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, and the President of the Portuguese Republic,

Being desirous of amending Article 3 of the Treaty for the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals which was signed at Lisbon on the 17th October, 1892,
