"2. (1) There is hereby constituted a Board which shall be known as the Government Railways Board (hereinafter in this Act called 'the Board').

"(2) The Board shall consist of five persons to be from time to time appropriated by the Government Green in Government and the state of the constant of the state of the state

"(2) The Board shall consist of five persons to be from time to time appointed by the Governor-General in Council. One such member shall be so appointed as Chairman of the Board. "(3) The first person appointed as Chairman of the Board shall hold office as a member of the Board and as Chairman thereof for a period of four years from the date of his appointment. Every subsequent such appointment shall be for a period of three years period of three years.

"(4) Of the first members of the Board other than the Chairman, two shall be appointed for a period of two years and two shall be appointed for a period of three years from the date of their respective appointments, and thereafter every such member of the Board shall be appointed for a period of two years from the date of his appointment.

"(5) On the termination of the period for which he was appointed every person appointed as aforesaid shall cease to be a member of the Board, but shall, unless otherwise disqualified, be eligible for reappointment."

In pursuance of all powers and authorities enabling it under the Government Railways Act, 1926, and its amendments, the Government Railways Board hereby resolves to fix the following Local Rates and Scale of Charges for Goods, and to impose the following conditions and regulations in respect to the New Zealand Government Railways open for traffic; and the said Board hereby further resolves that such local rates and scale of charges and such conditions and regulations shall come into force on the 22nd day of October, 1933, on which date all local rates, scales, conditions, and regulations previously made, fixed, or imposed in this behalf in respect to the said railways shall be revoked.
