WHEREAS by section four hundred and fifty-four of the Native Land Act, 1931, it is provided, *inter alia*, that on being satisfied that the purchase of any Native land has been duly completed by or on behalf of the Crown under the authority of the Native Land Act, 1931, the Governor-General may issue a Proclamation that such land has become Crown land:

And whereas the purchase of the Native land set out in the Schedule hereto has been duly completed by or on behalf of the Crown under the authority of the said Act:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority so conferred upon me by section four hundred and fifty-four of the Native Land Act, 1931, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim that the Native land set out in the Schedule hereto has become Crown land.

Now, therefore, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto shall be a scenic reserve under the said Act, and subject to the provisions thereof.

WHEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto is a reserve duly set apart for a site for a public hall : And whereas it is expedient that the control of the said reserve should be vested in a special Board, as hereinafter provided :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section seventeen of the Public Reserves, Domains, and National Parks Act, 1928, doth hereby revoke an Order in Council dated the fourth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, and published in the *Gazette* of the tenth day of that month, vesting the control of the reserve described in the Schedule hereto in the Bell Hill Public Hall Board, and doth hereby vest the control of the reserve described in the Schedule hereto for the period of five years from the date hereof (unless previously amended or revoked under the said Act) in the undermentioned persons, namely :—

Alfred Edwin Barton,
Percy Henry Ney Pope,
Claude Arthur Campbell,
Colin Alfred Campbell, and
Earnest Coleman,

who are hereby constituted for that purpose a special Board by the name of the Bell Hill Public Hall Board (hereinafter referred to as "the Board"), with the powers and subject to the conditions hereinafter contained, that is to say :—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Monday in each quarter at eight o'clock p.m. at the Bell Hill Public Hall, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Monday, the eighth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-four.

2. The members of the Board shall at their first meeting, and thereafter at the annual meeting hereinafter mentioned, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

3. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, provided that two days' notice of any such meeting is given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

4. Any three members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

6. If by resignation, death, incapacity, or otherwise the seat of any member shall be or become vacant, or if any member absents himself without reasonable cause from three consecutive meetings of the Board, the Governor-General shall have power to appoint any other person to be a member of the Board in his stead.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at the meeting.

8. The Board shall have prepared and submitted at an annual meeting to be held in the month of April in each year a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of March, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister of Lands as soon as possible after each annual meeting.

9. The Board shall control the said reserve and the building erected thereon for the purposes of a public hall, and shall also afford settlers and residents of Bell Hill and the surrounding district such facilities for meeting within the said hall as may from time to time be determined by the Board: Provided that the Board shall have power to fix reasonable charges for the use of the said hall.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 12th day of December, 1933.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is provided by section nine of the Local Authorities Interest Reduction and Loans Conversion Act, 1932-33, that, with the precedent consent of the Governor-General, given by Order in Council under section thirteen of the said Act after compliance with the provisions of Part II of the Act, and subject to and in accordance with the provisions of such Order in Council, any local authority may issue new securities in conversion of any existing securities to which the said Act applies :

And whereas by the said section thirteen it is further provided that the Governor-General, by the Order in Council giving his consent to the conversion of existing securities by a local authority, may make such provisions as he thinks fit with respect to all or any of the matters specified in the said section, and that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, every Order in Council under the said section shall have the force of law as if enacted in the said Act, anything to the contrary in any other Act or in any regulations made under the said Act or any other Act notwithstanding :

And whereas the Auckland Metropolitan Fire Board (being a local authority within the meaning of the said Act) has issued securities in respect of the loans specified in the First Schedule hereto, and such securities are existing securities to which the said Act applies :

And whereas the said local authority, being desirous of issuing new securities in conversion of such existing securities, has complied with the provisions of Part II of the said Act, and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General to such conversion should be given as required by the said Act, and that by this Order the provisions hereinafter set forth should be made with respect to the matters specified in the said section thirteen :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the issue by the said local authority of new securities in conversion of any existing securities to which this Order applies, and with respect to such conversion doth hereby make the following provisions.

PRELIMINARY.

1. This Order may be cited as the Auckland Metropolitan Fire Board Loans Conversion Order, 1933.

2. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires,—

“The Act” means the Local Authorities Interest Reduction and Loans Conversion Act, 1932-33 :

“The date of conversion” means the date specified in clause five of this Order :

“Existing securities” means debentures or other securities issued by the local authority before the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three ; and includes any securities issued on or after that date, but before the date of conversion, in replacement (as that term is defined in the Act) of any such securities :

“The local authority” means the Auckland Metropolitan Fire Board :

“Local fund” has the same meaning as in Part V of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926 :

“New securities” or “new debentures” means securities or debentures issued in accordance with this Order in conversion of existing securities to which this Order applies :

“Unconverted securities” means existing securities to which this Order applies and in respect of which dissent from conversion is signified in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

APPLICATION OF ORDER.

3. This order shall apply to all existing securities issued in respect of the loans specified in the First Schedule hereto.

SPECIAL RESOLUTION OF LOCAL AUTHORITY.

4. (1) If the local authority so resolves by a resolution passed and confirmed as provided by subsection two of section nine of the Act, it may, subject to and in accordance with the provisions of this Order, issue new securities in conversion of existing securities to which this Order applies.

(2) The following provisions of this Order shall come into force if such a resolution is passed and confirmed as aforesaid, but not otherwise :

Provided that a certificate signed by the Chairman of the local authority and published in the *Gazette*, to the effect that such a resolution has been duly passed and confirmed shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein certified.

DATE OF CONVERSION.

5. The date from which the conversion of existing securities into new securities shall take effect shall be the first day of February, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-four.

NOTICE TO HOLDERS OF EXISTING SECURITIES.

6. (1) The local authority shall cause a notice in the form numbered (1) in the Second Schedule hereto to be published, not later than fourteen days before the date of conversion, at least once in each of the following publications :—

(a) The *Gazette* :

(b) A newspaper circulating in the City of Auckland :

(c) A newspaper circulating in the City of Wellington :

(d) A newspaper circulating in the City of Christchurch :

(e) A newspaper circulating in the City of Dunedin.

(2) The local authority shall also forward a copy of such notice, together with a copy of this Order, or of the prospectus,⁵ to every holder whose address is known to the local authority.

(3) In addition to the notice required by the last preceding subclauses the local authority may give such further notice in relation to the conversion (whether by way of advertisement or otherwise) as it thinks fit.

RIGHT TO APPLY FOR OR DISSENT FROM CONVERSION.

7. The holder of any existing securities to which this Order applies may make application to the local authority in writing for the conversion of such securities into new securities in accordance with this Order. Every application under this clause shall be accompanied by the securities to which it relates.

8. If the holder of any existing securities to which this Order applies does not, within the time and in the manner provided by this Order, signify his dissent from the conversion of such securities into new securities, the existing securities shall be converted into new securities in the same manner as if application had been made under the last preceding clause.

9. Dissent from the conversion of any existing securities may be signified—

(a) At any time before the expiration of fourteen days from the date of conversion ;

or

(b) If the holder of the securities (or, where the holder is a trustee, any person whose consent would, but for this Order, be required for conversion) is during the whole of the time between the date of the publication of this Order in the *Gazette* and the expiration of the period referred to in the last preceding paragraph absent from New Zealand—at any time before the expiration of three months from the date of conversion ; or

(c) In the case of any particular holder—within such further time as the local authority may, on account of special circumstances, in its discretion allow.

10. The dissent of the holder of any existing securities from the conversion of those securities into new securities shall be signified in writing, and shall be deemed to be signified when such writing is received by the local authority or by any person authorized by the local authority to receive it.

SURRENDER OF CONVERTED SECURITIES, AND PAYMENT OF INTEREST THEREON.

11. The holder of any existing securities converted into new securities (whether the conversion is on application or after failure to dissent) shall not be entitled to demand payment of any interest payable on the existing securities, or to receive the new securities or any interest thereon, until he has surrendered the existing securities to the local authority.

12. Subject to the provisions of the last preceding clause, the interest on any such existing securities for the period ending on the date of conversion shall be payable not later than one month from the date of conversion.

NEW SECURITIES.

13. (1) New securities shall be issued in the form of debentures in the form numbered (2) in the Second Schedule hereto.

(2) Every new debenture shall be for a sum of five pounds, fifty pounds, one hundred pounds, five hundred pounds, one thousand pounds, or a multiple of one thousand pounds.

(3) All new debentures shall be numbered consecutively, and as between the holders thereof shall rank equally.

(4) Every new debenture shall state on its face the fact that the holder has no claim in respect thereof upon the Government or public revenues of New Zealand.

(5) Every new debenture shall be signed by the Chairman, countersigned by the Treasurer or some other officer appointed by the local authority for the purpose, and sealed with the common seal of the local authority.

INTEREST AND COUPONS.

14. (1) The rate of interest payable on new securities shall be four and one-quarter per centum per annum.

(2) The interest on new securities shall be payable half-yearly on days corresponding to the maturity dates of the securities.

15. (1) Any new debenture for one thousand pounds or a multiple of one thousand pounds may, if the holder so desires, be issued without coupons, and in any such case the interest thereon shall be payable by cheque.

(2) Except as provided in the last preceding subclause, separate coupons for each amount of interest payable on any debenture, in the form numbered (3) in the Second Schedule hereto, and numbered consecutively for each debenture, shall be attached thereto.

(3) The signatures to coupons may be made by facsimiles thereof in lithograph or otherwise.

MATURITY DATES.

16. (1) Every new security shall be redeemable at par on such one of the maturity dates set out in the Third Schedule hereto as is specified in that behalf in the security.

(2) The local authority shall so fix the respective maturity dates of the new securities that the aggregate amount of principal secured by the new securities maturing on each of such dates shall, if practicable, be a multiple of one hundred pounds, and, subject thereto, shall, as nearly as may be, bear the same proportion to the aggregate amount of principal secured by all the new securities as the sum set opposite that date in the Third Schedule hereto bears to the total amount specified in that Schedule.

(3) Subject to the foregoing provisions of this clause and to the express wish of any holder who desires to have the maturity date of his securities postponed, the maturity dates of the new securities shall as nearly as practicable be in the same chronological order as the maturity dates of the existing securities in conversion of which they are respectively issued.

PREMIUMS.

17. (1) The holder of any existing securities bearing interest at a rate which, as reduced in accordance with Part I of the Act, does not exceed the rate of interest payable on the new securities shall on the conversion of such securities be entitled to receive new securities for the same aggregate amount of principal as is secured by the existing securities.

(2) The holder of any existing securities bearing interest at a rate which, as reduced in accordance with Part I of the Act, exceeds the rate of interest payable on the new securities shall on the conversion of such securities be entitled to receive new securities for the same aggregate amount of principal as is secured by the existing securities, and, in addition thereto, shall be entitled to receive a premium on such principal computed in accordance with the Fourth Schedule hereto.

18. (1) Subject to the provisions of this clause as to payment in cash, every premium to which any person is entitled under the last preceding clause shall be satisfied by issuing to him additional new securities for the amount of such premium, or so much thereof as is not paid in cash, as the case may be.

(2) The local authority shall pay in cash the amount (if any) required to reduce to the nearest multiple of five pounds the aggregate amount of all such premiums to which any person is entitled, and may, if it thinks fit, pay in cash the whole or any part of the balance of any such aggregate amount.

(3) All payments of cash in accordance with the last preceding subclause that are not made out of the appropriate sinking fund pursuant to the provisions of this Order (if any) in that behalf shall be made by the local authority out of the local fund, and charged to the appropriate account.

(4) The power of the local authority to issue new securities in accordance with this Order shall be deemed to include the power to issue any additional new securities required for the purposes of this clause.

PLACE FOR PAYMENT OF PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST.

19. The principal and interest in respect of new securities shall be payable in New Zealand.

CONSOLIDATED SINKING FUND FOR NEW SECURITIES.

20. (1) In order to provide funds for the repayment of the new securities the local authority shall forthwith make provision for the creation, pursuant to a resolution of the local authority, of a consolidated sinking fund, of which the Public Trustee shall be the Commissioner.

(2) For such purpose the local authority shall permanently appropriate for payment on or before the first day of February in every year after the date of conversion a contribution of £923, together with a further sum equal to 3 per centum of the amount of new securities redeemed up to and including the first day of February immediately preceding the date in respect of which such contribution is appropriated for payment, and shall pay each such contribution to the Public Trustee.

Every such contribution may be reduced by any annual sums payable to any sinking fund for unconverted securities pursuant to the next succeeding clause hereof.

(3) The provisions of subsections four, five, and six of section ninety-five of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, shall apply with respect to such sinking fund.

SINKING FUND FOR UNCONVERTED SECURITIES.

21. (1) If dissent is signified in accordance with the provisions of this Order from the conversion of any existing securities to which this Order applies issued in respect of any loan referred to in the First Schedule hereto, the local authority, in order to provide funds for the repayment of the unconverted securities issued in respect of such loan, shall forthwith make provision for the creation, pursuant to a resolution of the local authority, of a sinking fund, of which the persons who at the date of conversion were Sinking Fund Commissioners in respect of such loan shall be the first Commissioners.

(2) For such purpose the local authority shall permanently appropriate a sum which bears the same proportion to the annual contribution payable, before the date of conversion, to the existing sinking fund of such loan as the aggregate amount of principal secured by such unconverted securities bears to the aggregate amount of principal secured by all the existing securities issued in respect of such loan, and shall pay such sum to the Commissioners yearly and every year until the maturity date of such unconverted securities, or until the Commissioners are satisfied that the accumulations of sinking fund will suffice to redeem such securities at maturity.

(3) The first of such yearly payments shall be made not later than one year after the date on which the last annual contribution payable before the date of conversion to the existing sinking fund of such loan was payable.

(4) Subject to the provisions of this Order, the provisions of sections forty to forty-four of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, shall, so far as applicable and with all necessary modifications, apply with respect to such sinking fund:

Provided that nothing in the said sections or in this Order shall authorize the removal or suspension of the Public Trustee as Commissioner of any sinking fund.

APPLICATION OF EXISTING SINKING FUNDS.

22. The existing sinking fund of each of the loans referred to in the First Schedule hereto other than the loan for which the Public Trustee is sinking fund Commissioner shall be applied by the Commissioners thereof in or towards making the following payments, in the following order of priority, namely:—

- (a) First, in transferring to the Commissioners of the sinking fund hereinbefore required to be created for the unconverted securities issued in respect of such loan a sum which bears the same proportion to the amount of such existing sinking fund at the date of conversion as the aggregate amount of principal secured by such unconverted securities bears to the aggregate amount of principal secured by all the existing securities issued in respect of such loan;
- (b) Secondly, in payment in accordance with the directions of the local authority of any cash payments required by this Order to be made in respect of premiums;
- (c) Thirdly, in payment to the Commissioner of the aforesaid consolidated sinking fund on the first day of February in each year following the date of conversion of all interest accrued up to such date of payment, to be held as part of such consolidated sinking fund; and

(d) Fourthly, in transferring on the first day of February in each year for a period of ten years following the date of conversion to the aforesaid Commissioner of the consolidated sinking fund to be held as part of such sinking fund a sum equal to one-tenth of the amount of such sinking fund.

23. The existing sinking fund of every loan referred to in the First Schedule of which the Public Trustee is Sinking Fund Commissioner shall be applied by the Commissioner thereof as follows:—

- (a) In transferring to the Commissioner of the sinking fund hereinbefore required to be created for the unconverted securities issued in respect of such loan a sum which bears the same proportion to the amount of such existing sinking fund at the date of conversion as the aggregate amount of principal secured by such unconverted securities bears to the aggregate amount of principal secured by all the existing securities issued in respect of such loan;
- (b) In payment in accordance with the directions of the local authority of any cash payments required by this Order to be made in respect of premiums; and
- (c) In transferring the balance to the Commissioner of the consolidated sinking fund hereinbefore required to be created for the new securities, to be held as part of that sinking fund.

ADDITIONAL SECURITY.

24. (1) In any case where there has heretofore been executed in favour of the holder of any existing securities issued in respect of any loan referred to in the First Schedule hereto any deed of mortgage or charge over any land or other property now vested in or belonging to the local authority, the local authority shall, on the conversion of such loan, if so required by such holder, execute in his favour by way of additional security for the new securities and unconverted securities in respect of such loan a new deed of mortgage or charge corresponding as nearly as circumstances will permit to the terms of the existing deed.

(2) On the execution of any new deed pursuant to the last preceding subclause the existing deed shall be deemed to be cancelled, and the persons in whose favour such existing deed was executed shall do all such acts and execute all such instruments as may be necessary effectually to discharge such property from the existing mortgage or charge.

SECURITIES HELD BY TRUSTEES.

25. The provisions of sections twenty-two, twenty-three, and twenty-four of the New Zealand Debt Conversion Act, 1932-33 (relating to the adjustment of premiums as between capital and income and to the powers of trustees and other persons in relation thereto), shall apply with respect to existing securities converted into new securities in accordance with this Order in the same way as they apply with respect to securities converted under that Act, save that the references in the said section twenty-two to the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, shall be construed as references to the day following the date of conversion.

BROKERAGE.

26. The local authority shall not, in respect of the conversion into new securities of any existing securities to which this Order applies, enter into any contract for the payment of brokerage at a rate exceeding one-quarter per centum of the amount of such existing securities.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Sale of Food and Drugs Act, 1908, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby amend the regulations made under the said Act on the twenty-third day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, and gazetted on the twenty-sixth day of the same month (hereinafter referred to as "the principal regulations"), as follows:—

1. Regulation 10 of the principal regulations relating to preservatives is hereby amended by adding thereto the following sub-clause:—

"(8) (a) No preservative substance shall be sold as suitable for use in any food unless the addition of such substance to such food is specifically permitted by these regulations.

"Prohibition.

"(b) No label shall bear any statement which directly or by implication suggests the addition of any substances to any food as a preservative if the sale of such food containing, or after the addition of, the preservative would be an offence against these regulations."

2. Regulation 11 of the principal regulations relating to flavourings and colourings is hereby amended as follows: By deleting all the words after the words "coal-tar dyes, namely" in subclause (3) thereof, and substituting therefor the following:—

“(3A) The numbers in the margin opposite the names of the coal-tar dyes in subclause (3) hereof refer to the numbers allotted in Rowe's Colour Index.

“(3B) Rowe's Colour Index means the colour index edited by F. M. Rowe, and published by the Society of Dyers and Colourists, England, in 1924.

“ Labelling.

“(3c) Every package containing any colouring or colourings sold or intended for food colouring shall bear a label in which shall be written legibly and prominently—

- “(i) The name or names of the colouring or colourings; and
- “(ii) Where any coal-tar dye is present the number under which the dye is indexed in Rowe's Colour Index.”

3. Subclause (5) of Regulation 35 of the principal regulations relating to malt-extract and cod-liver oil is hereby amended by deleting the words “ fifteen parts,” and substituting therefor the words “ ten parts.”

4. Regulation 45 of the principal regulations in so far as it relates to reconstituted cream is hereby amended by adding thereto the following subclause :—

“(6) Where any reconstituted cream is sold in an unlabelled container provided by the customer there shall be conspicuously posted on the walls of that part of the premises in which the sale takes place a notice, or such number of notices as an officer may direct, adequately to notify the purchaser that reconstituted cream is so sold or offered for sale, and if both cream and reconstituted cream are so sold at the same premises the fact shall be stated in such notice or notices.”

5. Regulation 63 of the principal regulations relating to preserved fruit is hereby amended by adding to subclause (2) thereof after the word “ sugar ” the following words : “ Except in the case of pulped uncooked fruits prepared specially for use as dessert flavourings or dressing, the preservative substance sodium benzoate in proportion not exceeding eight grains to the pint, or sulphur dioxide in proportion not exceeding three grains to the pint, may be added.”

6. Regulation 65 relating to essences is hereby amended as follows :—

(i) Subclause (1) is revoked and the following substituted therefor :—

“(i) Essences shall be solutions of wholesome flavouring-substances in water or in ethyl alcohol or in ethylene glycol or in isopropyl alcohol, with or without water, and with or without harmless colouring-matter. They shall not contain any mineral oil nor any added foreign substance.

“(ii) Subclause (8) is hereby amended by inserting between the word “ an ” and the word “ alcoholic ” the word “ (ethyl) ”; and by adding after the word “ glycerine ” the words “ but no isopropyl alcohol or ethylene glycol.”

“(iii) Subclause (9) is amended by inserting before the words “ as the case may be ” the words “ or imitation vanilla flavour.”

7. Regulation 86 of the principal regulations as amended by Order in Council gazetted on 26th May, 1932, is hereby further amended by revoking subclause (7) thereof relating to lysol and substituting therefor the following :—

“ Lysol.

“(7) Lysol shall conform to the description, characters, and tests respectively prescribed in the 1932 edition of the British Pharmacopœia for ‘ *Liquor Cresolis Saponatus.* ’”

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the thirteenth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, and published in the *Gazette* of the following day, at page 961, by-laws relating to Westport Harbour were made :

And whereas it is expedient to make the following additional by-laws :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by sections nine and two hundred and twenty-six of the Harbours Act, 1923, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following by-laws relating to the Harbour of Westport, and doth hereby order that they shall come into force on the fifteenth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three.

BY-LAWS.

1. THE master of any vessel which touches on the bar when outward bound from the harbour shall immediately advise the signal station by sounding a clear blast of about three seconds' duration on the ship's whistle. If the vessel touches more than once an additional short blast shall be sounded on each occasion on which the bar is touched.
2. The officer in charge of the signal station at the time when any such signal is given shall forthwith acknowledge it by exhibiting from the northern yardarm a black ball by day, and a red light, which shall be visible all round, by night, and shall keep such signal exhibited until the vessel is well clear of the bar.
3. If the master of the vessel does not receive such acknowledgment he shall, when clear of the bar, advise the signal station by means of the International or the Morse Code of Signals.
4. Every person who fails or neglects to comply with any of the above by-laws shall be liable to a fine of twenty pounds (£20).

License authorizing H. J. Wardell, of Bog Roy, to use Water for the Purpose of generating Electricity.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 12th day of December, 1933.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Public Works Act, 1928, and of all other powers in any-wise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby grant to H. J. Wardell, of Bog Roy (hereinafter with his successors and assigns referred to as "the licensee"), a license subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth to take and use from a stream situated on Run 322D, Gala Survey District, Waitaki County, in the Otago Land District (hereinafter referred to as "the said stream") for the purposes hereinafter set forth a stream of water (hereinafter referred to as "the said water") not exceeding nine cubic feet per second at any one time : Provided that nothing herein shall be held to guarantee that the said stream contains sufficient water to supply the volume of water hereinbefore referred to ; and all rights hereby granted shall be subject to all existing rights heretofore granted under the Mining Acts or otherwise.

CONDITIONS.

1. REGULATIONS.

THIS license is subject to the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1927, the Electrical Wiring Regulations, 1927, and any regulations made or to be made in amplification or amendment thereof or in substitution therefor.

2. PLANS.

The licensee shall forward for the approval of the Minister of Public Works (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister")—

- (a) Full detailed drawings and specifications of the diverting weirs.
- (b) Drawings showing how and in what manner the water is diverted.
- (c) Contour-plans showing difference in level of water due to the construction of the headworks.
- (d) Drawings giving full particulars of any tunnels, aqueducts, and pipe-lines used in conveying the water from the headworks to the power-station.
- (e) Drawings showing the arrangement of the generating, switching, and transforming plant in the power station.

3. UTILIZATION OF THE WATER AND LOCATION OF HEADWORKS.

The said water shall be used under this license solely for the purpose of generating electricity up to a maximum capacity of 10 kw. for lighting or heating or power purposes. The said water shall be taken from the said stream situated in Run 322D, Gala Survey District, Waitaki County, as indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 85802 (hereinafter referred to as "the said plan"), deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington.

4. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF WORKS.

The licensee is hereby authorized, subject to the conditions herein contained, to construct, maintain, and use the following works for the purposes of this license, the position of the said works being indicated on the said plan :—

- (a) Headworks consisting of dam and necessary intakes.
- (b) Pipe-lines leading from headrace to the power-house hereinafter referred to ; also tailrace from the power-house to the said stream.
- (c) Powerhouse with all necessary equipment, including water-turbines, generators, transformers, lightning arresters, switchboards, switches, exciters, and other appliances for generating electricity.

5. MAINTENANCE OF WORKS.

The licensee shall maintain the said works used under the license in proper working order during the continuance of this license.

6. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of twenty-one years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination

of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine, but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

7. RENTAL.

The licensee shall in respect of this permit pay to the Public Works Engineer for the district, or otherwise, as the Minister may from time to time require, a rental at the rate of £2 per annum, payment to be made yearly on the 31st day of March. The existing generating plant is rated at 250 volts 40 amps.

8. GRANTING OF OTHER WATER-RIGHTS.

Nothing herein shall prevent the Governor-General in Council or the Minister from granting to any person or body corporate other than the licensee a license or permit to take water from any portion of the said stream, except at the place where the licensee is by this license empowered to take it: Provided that no such license or permit shall so operate as to enable such person or body corporate to reduce the natural fall between the headworks and tailwater, or the volume of the water which the licensee is by this license authorized to take from the said stream.

9. VARIATION IN CONDITIONS OF LICENSE.

The terms and conditions of this license may from time to time, at the request or with the consent in writing of the licensee, be altered by the Governor-General by Order in Council.

10. SURRENDER OF LICENSE.

The licensee may at any time, with the consent of the Minister, surrender this license, and shall thereupon remove from the ground (if so required by the Minister) all removable equipment, machinery, buildings, and other plant herein authorized to be installed or provided. If the licensee fails or neglects so to remove the said plant within twelve months after being required so to do, such equipment, machinery, buildings, and other plant shall, without payment of compensation, vest in and become the property of the Crown.

11. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraph (c) of clause 5 of the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1927.

12. CROWN NOT LIABLE TO PAY COMPENSATION.

Nothing in this license shall be held to impose any liability upon His Majesty the King or upon the Government of New Zealand to pay compensation to any person, corporate body, or local authority by reason of the exercise by the licensee of the authority hereby granted; but the licensee shall be liable for any loss or damage which any person, corporate body, or local authority may sustain as the result of the exercise by the licensee of any of the powers granted by this license.

13. BED OF STREAM NOT LEASED.

Nothing herein shall be held to constitute a lease from the Crown of the bed of the stream shown on the said plan, nor shall the provisions of Part IX of the Property Law Act, 1908, apply to this license.

14. DEFAULT.

If the licensee fails or neglects to observe any of the conditions or obligations imposed by this license, then and in any such case the provisions of clauses 229 and 230 of the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1927, shall apply to the breach of any such condition or obligation.

15. ALTERATIONS TO WORKS.

In the event of the licensee at any time desiring to make alterations to the works involving a departure from the location or type of construction shown on the approved plans, he shall first submit for the Minister's approval plans showing such new location and/or type of construction as it is proposed to adopt, and, with such approval, the alterations may be carried out.

16. INSPECTION OF WORKS.

The Inspecting Engineer of the Public Works Department, or any other person empowered in that behalf by the Minister, shall at all times, both during and after the construction of the works, have free access to and liberty to inspect such works in order to ensure that the provisions of this license are given due effect.

17. CONTRACT BETWEEN LICENSEE AND CROWN.

This license shall be deemed to constitute a contract as between the licensee and His Majesty the King, and may be enforced by and against either party accordingly.

18. REQUIREMENTS OF THE WAITAKI COUNTY COUNCIL.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the licensee shall not by virtue of these presents be entitled to generate electricity, except subject to such conditions (not inconsistent with the provisions of this license) as may from time to time be imposed by the Waitaki County Council.

19. RAILWAYS AND TELEGRAPH LINES.

The licensee shall rectify to the satisfaction of the Government Railways Board or the Minister of Telegraphs, as the case may be, any interference or disturbance caused by the erection or operation of the licensee's system that affects the satisfactory working of telegraph lines which are the property of the Railways Department or the Telegraph Department, and which were erected prior to the licensee's lines.

20. TIME FOR SUBSTANTIAL COMPLETION OF WORKS.

NOTE.—Although the month, on the whole, was cold and windy, there was an abundance of bright sunshine. The total of 232.5 hours was 57 per cent. of the possible, and there were two sunless days. Rainfall was 36 per cent. below the mean of previous years. Hail fell on the 22nd and 23rd. Mean dew-point at 9 a.m., 45.3°; and mean vapour pressure, 0.302 in.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR OCTOBER, 1933.

General.—October was a very dry month. Though the first twenty days were mild, some very cold weather for the time of year followed. The snowfalls between the night of the 20th and the morning of the 23rd, in addition to being heavy, were most unusually widespread for October. The frosts following the snow caused serious damage. In Central Otago the season's fruit crop was almost totally destroyed. The cold and rather windy weather combined with the lack of rain checked the growth of pastures, and at the end of the month, owing to the general lack of moisture in the subsoil, the situation was distinctly dangerous. The Nelson District and Marlborough were especially unfortunate in missing the rains when other areas had moderate amounts, and pastures and crops have suffered correspondingly. Nevertheless, the country as a whole was standing up remarkably well under the dry conditions. Feed was actually becoming scarce in a comparatively few districts only. The lambing season has been an excellent one. Milk yields are still very high and stock are in good condition. The season is a particularly early one, most places being a fortnight or more ahead of the usual stage of development.

Rainfall.—The only places where the total rainfall exceeded the average were in western districts of the South Island and on the coast from Dunedin southward. Even in these areas excesses were not general. Over practically the whole of the North Island the deficit was considerable. In the South Island, in addition to Nelson and Marlborough, western Canterbury and Otago had, in many places, less than half the average.

Temperatures.—The mean temperatures were almost everywhere below the normal for October, and in most places considerably so. Christchurch proved an exception, the mean there being 0.8° above normal. Until the 20th conditions were generally mild, and Christchurch's high figure was due to some very warm days experienced during this period. The cold spell from the 21st to the 24th was, however, amongst the worst known for October. Severe frosts occurred between the 22nd and 24th, the time of maximum severity being latest in the more northern areas. The most disastrous effects were in Central Otago, where the fruit crop was practically wiped out. At Stoke, near Nelson, also, much damage was done to orchards, but, on the whole, fruitgrowers in Canterbury, Nelson, and Hawke's Bay were fortunate and suffered comparatively little. Losses of potatoes, tomatoes, and small fruits were heavy in many districts. There were frosts again at many places a week later. Though not severe, they checked growth, and in the Nelson and Marlborough districts intensified the effect of the rain scarcity on pastures and vegetation generally.

Sunshine was generally much above normal. Nelson recorded 283.3, Blenheim 264.8, and Lake Tekapo 246.6 hours. *Pressure Systems.*—At the beginning of the month the weather was controlled by a strongly developed high-pressure system, and fine conditions ruled throughout the first week. During the 7th and 8th a westerly depression passed causing scattered rains. After a second spell of high pressure, a series of westerly depressions followed one another closely across the Dominion between the 11th and 17th. During this period rain was fairly general, but heavy falls were not numerous except in western districts. The deepest of the depressions, passing on the 14th, was accompanied in places by thunderstorms. Snow fell on the high levels of Canterbury.

The most important of the month's storms were the two which occurred between the 20th and 23rd. Both developed on the coast of New South Wales where each was of cyclonic form though connected with a westerly depression passing in the South. While the first was crossing New Zealand on the 20th, it deepened rapidly, and in its rear the southerly winds proved to be unusually cold for the time of year. Snow fell on much of the high country, particularly on the eastern side of the South Island and in the Wellington Province. A temporary clearance followed at most places on Saturday, but the second depression passed rapidly eastward over the Dominion, deepening in the process as its predecessor had done. Again the southerly were severe. Snow was widespread on all the high levels, even to the Gisborne district. There were falls, also, on the Canterbury plains and coastal areas of Otago and Southland. During the 22nd and 23rd hailstorms were very numerous in districts east of the ranges. Rain was practically general during this period.

The last series of depressions was experienced between the 28th and 30th. Comparatively little rain accompanied them, but they were followed on the 30th and 31st by cold southerlies.

Alterations to the Scales of Charges upon the New Zealand Government Railways.

IN pursuance of all powers and authorities enabling it under the Government Railways Act, 1926, and its amendments, the Government Railways Board hereby resolves to make the following alterations in the General Scale of Charges made on the 4th day of November, 1931, and published in the *Gazette* of the 13th day of November, 1931, and to the Goods—Local Rates Scale of Charges made on the 19th day of October, 1933, and published in the *Gazette* of the 26th day of October, 1933, in force on the New Zealand Government Railways open for traffic.

PASSENGERS.

21. Free School Season Tickets.

By omitting from paragraph 1 the following :—

Free second-class season tickets, available for each standard term of fourteen weeks as notified by the Education Department, may be issued to school pupils as hereinafter set forth, between the ages of 5 years and 10 years residing at a distance of not less than 2 miles from the school, and to school pupils of 10 years of age and over, but not exceeding 19 years of age, residing at a distance of not less than 3 miles from the school. The tickets will be available for distances not exceeding 60 miles, and are issuable as follows :—

And substituting the following :—

Free second-class season tickets, available for each standard term of fourteen weeks as notified by the Education Department may be issued to school pupils as hereinafter set forth, between the ages of 6 years and 10 years, residing at a distance of not less than 2 miles from the school and to school pupils of 10 years of age and over, but not exceeding 19 years of age, residing at a distance of not less than 3 miles from the school: Provided that a pupil who attains the age of 6 years in any term or in the holidays immediately following it may under like conditions receive a free school season ticket at any time during the first four weeks of that term. The tickets will be available for distances not exceeding 60 miles, and are issuable as follows :—

30. Judges proceeding to Shows, Exhibitors, Attendants, Owners or Trainers travelling in Charge of Live-stock or Racehorses.

1. JUDGES OF EXHIBITS PROCEEDING TO SHOWS.

Paragraph (1) :—

After the words "first-class tickets at the" *delete* the words "holiday excursion fares specified in Regulation 5," and *insert in lieu thereof* "special excursion fares specified in Regulation 6."

In the *pro forma* certificate *delete* the words "holiday excursion fare," and *insert in lieu thereof* "special excursion fare."

2. EXHIBITORS OR ATTENDANTS TRAVELLING IN CHARGE OF LIVE-STOCK.

Paragraph (1) :—

In the first line *delete* "Holiday excursion tickets (Regulation 5)," and *insert in lieu thereof* "Special excursion tickets (Regulation 6)."

In the *pro forma* certificate *delete* the words "holiday excursion fare" and *insert in lieu thereof* "special excursion fare."

3. OWNERS OR TRAINERS TRAVELLING IN CHARGE OF RACEHORSES.

Paragraph (1) :—

In the first line *delete* "Holiday excursion tickets (Regulation 5)," and *insert in lieu thereof* "Special excursion tickets (Regulation 6)."

In the *pro forma* certificate *delete* the words "holiday excursion fares," and *insert in lieu thereof* "special excursion fares."

31. Meetings of Religious Bodies, Friendly Societies, and Conferences.

Paragraph (1) :—

After the words "of the currency of the ticket in each case," *delete* the words "at holiday excursion fares specified in Regulation 5," and *insert in lieu thereof* "at special excursion fares specified in Regulation 6."

In the *pro forma* certificate *delete* the words "holiday excursion fare" and "holiday excursion fares," and *insert in lieu thereof* "special excursion fare" and "special excursion fares."

Paragraph 5 : Delete the word "six," and *insert in lieu thereof* the word "twenty."

By adding new Regulation 31a :—

31a. Summer Schools for Instructional and Recreational Purposes and Camps organized by Religious Organizations.

Persons travelling to attend summer schools for instructional and recreational purposes and camps organized by religious bodies as may be approved by the General Manager may be granted tickets, available for return for one month from date of commencement of the currency of the ticket in each case, at special

2. Tickets granted under this regulation will be available for use on the outward journey within seven days previous to and at any time during the meeting, provided the person to whom the ticket is issued tenders the necessary certificate and can reach the place of meeting in time to take part in its business.

3. Written application, specifying dates over which the gatherings will extend, the stations between which the journeys will be made, and the name of person who will sign certificates on behalf of the controlling body, should first be made to the General Manager of the New Zealand Government Railways, Wellington, not less than two months before the date of commencement of the meeting. Certificates signed by any other than the person named in such application will not be recognized.

4. The provisions of this regulation shall not apply in any case where the number of persons travelling by the railway for the purposes of the meeting is less than fifty.

5. The Department reserves to itself the right to decline any application.

41. North Island Main Line and Branches.

By adding the following:—

2A. TICKETS BETWEEN AUCKLAND AND REMUERA AVAILABLE BETWEEN AUCKLAND AND ORAKEI.

Tickets issued under the provisions of Regulations 9, 12, 14, 16, 19, 20, 21, 22, 28, 30, and 41, available for travel between Auckland and Remuera, will be available for travel between Auckland and Orakei.

LUGGAGE, PARCELS, ETC.

45. Checked Luggage.

By adding to paragraph 1 the following:—

(dd) From Dargaville to any station on the North or South Island Main Line and Branches or the Picton Section, and from any officered station on the North or South Island Main Line and Branches or the Picton Section to Dargaville.

By adding the following paragraph:—

(12A) For each check issued for luggage to be conveyed between Dargaville and stations on the North Island Main Line and Branches the charge will be 1s. Classification of Assistant Teachers in Technical Schools and of Manual-training Teachers.

THE following list of assistant teachers employed in technical schools, combined schools, and recognized technical classes, and recognized manual-training classes, or classified for employment in such schools or classes, are issued under the authority of the Minister of Education, in accordance with the regulations relating to technical schools, recognized technical classes, recognized manual-training classes, and combined secondary and technical schools, made by Orders in Council dated the 10th November, 1925, and 25th September, 1931.

Under the heading "Division" is shown the division and class in which the teacher is classified.

The class of salary corresponding with the class and division in which the teacher is placed is given in the Schedule to the aforementioned regulations.

Attention is drawn to the regulations relating to appeals of teachers against their classification and grading, under which any teacher who considers he has good grounds for objection to his classification may lodge an appeal to reach the Director of Education not later than forty clear days after the publication of this list in the *New Zealand Gazette*—i.e., such appeals must reach the Director not later than the 24th January, 1934, and must contain an explicit statement of the grounds on which the appeal is based.

NOTE.—In the last column of the classification list T.S. stands for "Technical School," E.B. for "Education Board," S. of A. for "School of Art," Int. for "Intermediate School (or Department)," and C.S. for "Combined School."
