W HEREAS by section three hundred and two of the Land Act, 1924, as amended by section ten of the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1926, it is enacted that on the disposal of any national-endowment land by way of sale, or on the acquisition of the fee-simple of any such land, the Covernor Covernor may be Proplemention, declared that the Governor-General may by Proclamation declare that such land shall, as from a date to be specified in the Proclamation, cease to be national-endowment land:

IS Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, and in pursuance of the authority to make regulations for the peace, order, and good government of Samoa conferred upon him by the Samoa Act, 1921, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby make the following regulations.

### REGULATIONS.

- 1. Short Title.—This Order may be cited as the Samoa Publications Order, 1933, and shall come into force on the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-four.
- 2. Interpretation.—In this Order, where not inconsistent with the context,—
  "Administrator" means the Administrator of Western Samoa:

  - "Gazette" means the Western Samoa Gazette;
  - "Newspaper" includes any newspaper, journal, magazine, circular, pamphlet, book, hand-bill, document, or any other illustrated or printed matter, whether published periodically or irregularly, or on only one occasion, which is intended or is likely to be read or seen by or read or communicated to the general public or any part or section thereof:

"Postal packet" includes a letter, post-card, letter-card, newspaper, book, packet, pattern, or sample packet, parcel, and every other packet or article transmissible by post:

"Printed" includes any form of writing, drawing, typing, printing,

cyclostyling, or any reproduction of any of such methods and any picture or photographic reproduction, whether produced by hand or mechanical device.

## PART I.

# NEWSPAPERS IN SAMOAN LANGUAGE.

3. Official, Religious, and Trade Publications exempted.—The provisions of this Part of this Order shall not apply to any newspaper published by or under the authority of the Executive Government of Samoa or to any newspaper of any missionary or Church organization operating in Samoa which relates to matters connected with work of such organization or to any advertisement or announcement published in any newspaper in the ordinary manner and form of commercial

advertising and containing only matter wholly of a commercial nature.

4. Importation and Publication prohibited.—Save in accordance with the provisions hereinafter appearing, it shall be unlawful to import into Samoa or to print, publish, sell, or distribute therein any newspaper printed in the Samoan language or partly in that language and partly in any other language.

5. Possession for Sale or Distribution.—It shall be unlawful for any person to have in his possession for the purpose of sale or distribution in Samoa any newspaper the importation or publication whereof is prohibited under the preceding clause.

6. Presumptions as to Purpose.—Any person who has in his possession one or more copies of any such newspaper (or any seditious newspaper as defined by Part II of this Order) or is the owner, lessee, or occupier of any premises in or about which such newspaper is found, or in the case of premises owned, leased, or occupied by a body corporate or a partnership, is a director, officer, or servant of such body corporate or is a member or servant of such partnership shall be deemed to have such newspaper in his possession for the purpose of the sale and distribution thereof in Samoa, unless he shall satisfy the High Court that the said newspaper was in his possession, or in and about such premises as the case may be, without his knowledge or consent.

7. Administrator may authorize Importation and Publication.—The Administrator may by permit under his hand authorize the importation into Samoa, or the printing, publication, sale, or distribution therein, of any newspaper printed in the Samoan language, or partly in that language and partly in any other language, but subject to and in

accordance with the provisions hereinafter appearing.

8. Application for Permit.—Every application for a permit under the last preceding clause shall be in the form set out and contain the information indicated in the First Schedule hereto, and shall be supported

by a statutory declaration as therein provided.

9. Grant of Permit.—If the Administrator is satisfied that the importation, printing, publication, sale, or distribution of the said newspaper is not likely to cause disaffection or disloyalty or to hinder the administration of the executive government of the Territory or to prejudicially affect the peace, order, and good government of Samoa, he may grant the said application.

10. Extent of Permit.—A permit granted under the last preceding

10. Extent of Permit.—A permit granted under the last preceding clause hereof shall extend only to the issue of the newspaper specified in the application for the permit, and not to any subsequent issues

thereof.

# PART II.

## SEDITIOUS NEWSPAPERS.

11. Seditious Newspaper defined.—A seditious newspaper means any newspaper which incites, encourages, advises, or advocates violence, lawlessness, and disorder, or expresses any seditious intention, or misrepresents or tends to bring into hatred or contempt the Parliament or Executive Government of New Zealand or the Administration or Public Service of the Territory by intemperate language, malicious or reckless criticism, or otherwise tends to interfere with the peace, order, or good government of the Territory, and includes every issue of any newspaper which the Administrator shall by notice published in the Gazette declare to be a seditious newspaper, whether printed before or after such notice and whether within or without the Territory.

12. Importation and Publication prohibited.—It shall be unlawful for any person to import into Samoa or to print, publish, sell, or

distribute therein any seditious newspaper.

13. Possession for Sale or Distribution.—It shall be unlawful for any person to have in his possession for sale or distribution in Samoa any seditious newspaper.

# PART III.

# GENERAL.

- 14. Postal Packets may be detained.—Where the Postmaster at Apia has reason to suspect that any postal packet contains any newspaper, the importation, printing, publication, sale, or distribution of which is prohibited by Part I or Part II of this Order, he may detain such postal packet with its contents, and the same shall be opened, examined, and dealt with in manner hereinafter mentioned.
- 15. Mode of opening Postal Packets.—Every postal packet detained as aforesaid shall be opened and examined by the said Postmaster in the presence of two members of the Samoan Public Service specially nominated for that purpose by the Administrator. Such persons shall not disclose any matters discovered by them in the course of such examination, except for the purpose of enforcing this Order.

16. Disposal of Postal Packet.—If on any such examination the said postal packet is found to contain any newspaper as aforesaid the said packet shall be forfeited to His Majesty, and shall be disposed of in such manner as the Administrator shall direct; but such forfeiture and disposal shall not affect any liability to penalty or punishment to which the sender or addressee, or any other person, may be subject under the provisions of this Order.

.17. Penalties.—Every person is liable to one year's imprisonment or to a fine of £200 or, in the case of a body corporate, to a fine of £500 who disobeys any of the provisions of this Order by wilfully doing any act which it forbids or omitting to do any act which it requires to be done.

18. Application of Customs Acts.—This Order shall be deemed to be included in the term "the Customs Acts" as used in the Customs Act, 1913, but the penalty prescribed by subsection five of section forty-six of the said Act shall be increased to the extent specified in the last preceding clause hereof in respect of newspapers imported into Samoa in breach of the provisions of this Order.

Every goods-service conducted between any two points or areas or between any point and any area or within any area for the conduct of which there is an available route that includes at least five miles of a rural main highway (as hereinafter defined) and that is not more than two miles longer than some other available route not including at least five miles of a rural main highway:

Save and except 1. A goods-service conducted only by means of a vehicle used under the terms of a passenger-service liceuse granted

under the said Act:

2. A goods-service in which the only goods carried are goods of one of the kinds following, namely:—

(i) Milk and cream while being carried from farms to

dairy factories.

(ii) Goods carried in a vehicle used solely in connection

with funerals. (iii) Newspapers if carried on vehicles used principally for the carriage of milk or cream from farms to dairy

factories. (iv) Goods towed or carried on vehicles used solely in connection with repair or wreckage on vehicles which have met with mishap.

3. A goods-service conducted only within a radius of

3. A goods-service conducted only within a radius of ten miles from the chief post-office at Hamilton.

(b) For the purposes of this Schedule "Rural main highway" means a main highway or any part of a main highway within the meaning of the Main Highways Act, 1922, lying outside the boundaries of a borough or town district and outside the areas following, namely:—

### No. 1.-Anckland Area.

All that portion of the North Island, bounded to the north by the Waitakere – West Coast Road from the sea to the junction of the said road with the No. 13 Main Highway at Waitakere, thence by the No. 13 Main Highway to its junction with the No. 14 Main Highway at Kumeu, thence by the No. 14 Main Highway to its junction with the No. 1 Main Highway at Pukeatua, thence by the No. 1 Main Highway to

the Orewa River, and thence by the Orewa River to the sea; and to the south by the southern boundary of the Manukau County and the southern boundary of the Papakura Town District: including all beroughs and town districts therein or contiguous thereto.

### No. 2.-Wellington Area.

The area of the Wellington City, Johnsonville Town District, The area of the Wellington City, Johnsonville Town District, the County of Makara, and all that portion of the Hutt County bounded to the north by the No. 1 Main Highway from the county boundary at Paremata to its junction with the Pahautanni-Upper Hutt Road, thence by the Pahautanui-Upper Hutt Road, via Judgeford and Moonshine, to the boundary of the Upper Hutt Borough; thence by the northern boundary of the Upper Hutt Borough to its intersection with the Wellington-Napier Railway line; and thence by the Wollington-Napier Railway line to the eastern boundary of the Hutt County: including all boroughs and town districts therein or contiguous thereto. therein or contiguous thereto.

### No. 3.-Christchurch Area.

The area of the City of Christchurch and the boroughs of Lyttelton, Sumner, New Brighton, and Riccarton, together with the counties of Waimairi, Heathcore, Mount Herbert, Halswell, and the Paparua County, excluding the West Melton Riding: including all boroughs and town districts therein or contiguous thereto.

## No. 4.—Dunedin Area.

All that area bounded on the east and south by the sea from Blueskin Bay to Brighton; thence by the Outram-Brighton Road, via Allanton, to the Taieri River; thence by the Taieri River and Christmas Creek to the western boundary of the Waikouaiti County; thence by the county boundary, and the northern boundary of the Blueskin Riding of the aforesaid county, to the sea at Blueskin Bay: including all boroughs and town districts therein or contiguous thereto.

### SECOND SCHEDULE.

Provisions of Part II of the Transport Licensing Agt, 1931, and of the Transport Law Amendment Act, 1933, applied, with Modifications, in accordance with Section 47 of the said Act to Goods-Services carried on within Controlled Areas.

(a) Numbers of sections of the said Act so applied (subject to modification): Sections 20, 24, 25, 26, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33, 34, 35, 36, 37, 42, and 43.
(b) Numbers of sections of the Transport Law Amendment Act, 1933, so applied (subject to modification): Sections 15, 19, 20, 28, 29, and 30.

(c) Provisions of sections enumerated above of the said Act (as amended), as modified in their application to goodsservices :-Section 20.

(1) It shall not be lawful for any person to carry on any goods-service with respect to which these provisions are applied, otherwise than pursuant to the authority and in conformity with the terms of a goods-service license granted

under these provisions.

(2) Every person who, contrary to the provisions of this section, carries on any goods-service commits an offence, and is liable to a fine of one hundred pounds, and to a further fine of ten pounds for every day on which such offence is

committed.

(3) If any company earries on any goods-service contrary to these provisions every director or other person acting in the management of the business shall, in addition to any penalty to which the company may be liable, be liable to a fine of ten pounds for every day on which such service is so carried on carried on.

### Section 24.

(1) Every application for a goods-service license shall be in the prescribed form, and, save as provided in subsection four hereof, shall, unless the Minister otherwise directs, be addressed and forwarded to the Commissioner accompanied by the

prescribed fee.

(2) The Commissioner shall, on being satisfied that the application is duly made, transmit the same to the proper Licensing Authority, but may in any case before so doing require the applicant to furnish such further information or particulars as may, in the opinion of the Commissioner, be necessary to enable the Licensing Authority to come to a proper decision.

(3) The Commissioner shall in every case place before the

Licensing Authority all such information at his disposal (whether obtained from the applicant or not) as will assist the Licensing Authority in dealing with the application.

(4) Notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing provisions of this section, an application for a temporary license may be made direct to the appropriate Licensing Authority.

### Section 25.

Section 25.

(1) On receiving an application for a goods-service license, other than an application for a temporary license, the Licensing Authority shall, in the prescribed form, give not less than three clear days' public notice of the receipt of such application, fixing in such notice a time and place at which it will hold a public sitting for the purpose of receiving evidence and representations in favour of or against the granting of the application by persons who in the opinion of the Licensing Authority are directly interested, and shall also give not less than three clear days' notice of such time and place to the applicant.

(2) The Licensing Authority shall hold such public sitting in such place as it deems most convenient, having regard to

the nature of the business.

(3) At such public sitting the Licensing Authority shall hear all evidence tendered and representations made which it deems revelant to the subject-matter of the application, save that at any time during such sitting it may decide not to receive further evidence or representations.

(4) Any such sitting may, in the discretion of the Licensing Authority, be adjourned from time to time and from place to

### Section 26.

(1) In considering any application for a goods-service license the Licensing Authority shall generally have regard to—
(a) The extent to which the proposed service is necessary or desirable in the public interest; and
(b) The needs of the district or districts as a whole in relation to goods-transport.

If, having regard to the foregoing considerations the Licensing Authority is of opinion that the proposed service is unnecessary or undesirable, it shall refuse to grant a license.

- (2) If, after having had regard to the matters mentioned in the last preceding subsection, the Licensing Authority proposes to give further consideration to the application, it shall take into account-
- (c) The financial ability of the applicant to carry on the proposed service, the likelihood of his carrying it on satisfactorily, and, in the case of an existing service, the period during which the service has been carried on satisfactorily:
- (d) Time-tables or frequency of the proposed service, if the service is intended to be of a regular nature:(e) The charges proposed to be made for the carriage of

- goods:

  (f) The goods transport of any kind, whether by land or water, already provided in respect of the localities to be served:
- (g) The requirements of such localities in respect of goods
- (h) The vehicles proposed to be used in connection with the

service:

(i) The conditions of roads and streets to be traversed on the route or routes, and any restrictions of load or speed, or other lawful restrictions affecting vehicles of the type or class proposed to be used, including restrictions arising out of the classification of roads and streets under section one hundred and sixty-six of the Public Works Act, 1928:

of the Public Works Act, 1928:

(j) Any evidence and representations received by it at the public sitting, and any representations otherwise made by the Government Railways Board, local authorities, or other public bodies, or any persons carrying on goods transport of any kind (whether by land or water) likely to be affected, and any representations contained in any petition presented to it signed by not fewer than twenty-five adult residents of any locality proposed to be served:

Provided that before taking into consideration any adverse representations made otherwise than at the public sitting the Licensing Authority shall give the

public sitting the Licensing Authority shall give the applicant and all other persons likely to be affected a reasonable opportunity to reply to such representa-

tions.

(3) The Licensing Authority in considering any application shall also take into account any representations made to it by the Licensing Authority of any district through any part of which the goods-service is proposed to be carried on.

(1) Save as otherwise provided in this section and subject to appeal as hereinafter provided, the Licensing Authority may, after duly considering an application therefor, grant or refuse a goods-service license.

(2) A goods-service license shall not be refused in any case where the applicant (having made his application before the 21st day of May, 1933) proves to the satisfaction of the

licensing authority-

(a) That on the passing of the Transport Licensing Act, 1931, and continuously thereafter until the date of the application, the service in respect of which the application is made has been lawfully carried on by the applicant or by preceding owners of the vehicles or other plant used by the applicant in respect of the

(b) In the case of an application for a goods-service license in respect of a seasonal service, that substantially the same service has been lawfully and continuously carried on by the applicant or by preceding owners of the vehicles or other plant used by the applicant in respect of the service during the two seasons immediately preceding the 1st day of April, 1933, or, where that day falls in such a season, that such service is then being uninterruptedly carried on as aforesaid and was being substantially so carried on during the whole

was being substantially so carried on during the whole of the immediately preceding season:

Provided that no such service shall be deemed to have ceased to be continuously carried on by reason of any interruption by flood, closing of roads or streets, or any other cause whatever beyond the control of the applicant.

(3) Notwithstanding anything contained in the last preceding subsection, the Licensing Authority, in granting a license to any person in respect of a service mentioned therein, shall have the same powers of imposing terms and conditions as are hereby conferred with respect to any other goodsservice license, and in particular but without limiting such general powers the Licensing Authority may, after taking into account the matters mentioned in paragraphs (f) and (g) of subsection two of section twenty-six hereof, grant such (g) of subsection two of section twenty-six hereof, grant such license for an area smaller than that within which the service had theretofore been carried on.

### Section 29.

Section 29.

Every goods-service license shall be—

(a) A continuous license — meaning thereby a license in respect of a service to be carried on throughout the year, whether daily or on specified days of every week, or otherwise at intervals not exceeding one month, or a license in respect of special events recurring at intervals during the year; or

(b) A seasonal license—meaning thereby a license in respect of a service to be carried on only during a period or periods of the year specified in the license; or

(c) A temporary license—meaning thereby a license for a service to be carried on for a specified period of not more than fourteen days or a license for any specified special occasion or occasions.

## Section 30.

(1) In granting any goods service license the Licensing Authority shall prescribe—

(a) The class of license (whether continuous, seasonal, or

temporary) and the period or occasion of the license:
(b) A date on which the service may or shall be commenced:
(c) The localities to be served or the route or routes to be

traversed or both: (d) Such other matters and conditions as may be prescribed

by regulations:
and may, if in its discretion it thinks fit, prescribe—

(e) The charges to be made for the carriage of goods either definitely or by reference to a maximum charge or minimum charge or both:

(f) The time tables or forester to a carrier to be charged.

(f) The time-tables or frequency of service to be observed, either definitely or sufficiently to show the nature of

the service permitted:

(g) Maximum weight of goods to be carried during any (g) Maximum weight of goods to be carried during any specified period or periods or on any specified occasion or occasions, or, in lieu thereof, or in addition thereto, the number and capacity of the vehicles to be used during any specified period or periods or on any specified occasion or occasions:
(h) Any other matters and conditions that the Licensing Authority thinks proper.

## Section 31.

(1) Every license shall be in the prescribed form, and be signed on behalf of the Licensing Authority by the Chairman or two other members thereof, or by an officer of the Licensing Authority acting by direction thereof, and shall take effect according to its tenor to authorize the licensee, but no other person, to carry on a goods-service in accordance with the terms and conditions of the license during the duration thereof.

(2) No license granted by any Licensing Authority shall have any force or effect to authorize the carrying-on of a goods-service outside the area in respect of which it may issue

licenses or to authorize the use on any road or street of any goods-service vehicle prohibited by virtue of any classifi-cation of roads or streets made pursuant to regulations under section 166 of the Public Works Act, 1928, from using such road or street: Provided that the alteration of the boundaries of any district shall not operate to deprive of force and effect in respect of any area thereby excluded from such district any goods-service license theretofore granted by the Licensing Authority thereof.

(3) It shall be a condition of every goods-service license that every vehicle to be used in connection with the license shall be maintained in a fit and proper condition, to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Transport.

(4) It shall be a condition of any license that the licensee will not abandon or curtail the authorized service without the consent of the proper Licensing Authority, in which case he shall give such notice as the Licensing Authority directs of his intention to abandon or curtail the service.

(5) If any licensee abandons or curtails any service in breach of a condition authorized by the last preceding subsection hereof, the Licensing Authority may revoke his license, and may either in lieu of or in addition to any such penalty impose a monetary penalty not exceeding twenty-five pounds, which may be recovered in any Court of competent jurisdiction as a debt due to the Crown.

### Section 32.

(1) The Commissioner shall keep a register of goods-service licenses, and such other register or registers as he deems

(2) The contents of any such register may be evidenced in my proceedings by a certificate under the hand of the Commissioner, and every such certificate shall be prima facie evidence of the matters stated therein.

(3) A certificate under the hand of the Commissioner that on a date specified in such certificate the name of any person did not appear in any register as the holder of a license under these provisions shall, until the contrary is proved, be sufficient evidence that such person was not the holder of such a license on that date

### Section 33.

Except in the case of a temporary license, every goods-service license when issued on a quarter-day (as defined in the said Act) shall take effect on that day, and in every other case shall be deemed to have taken effect on the quarter-day immediately preceding the date on which the license is issued, and in each such case shall, unless sooner revoked, or unless expressed to expire at any earlier date, expire on the completion of twelve months after the quarter-day on which it took effect, save that a license granted in accordance with subsection two of section twenty-eight hereof shall, unless sooner revoked, expire on the 31st day of May, 1934.

Provided that where application for a renewal of a license

is duly made in accordance with section thirty-five of these provisions, such license shall, where the application for renewal is not disposed of before the date of expiry of the license, continue in force until the application is disposed of,

unless the Licensing Authority otherwise directs.

# Section 34.

(1) The Licensing Authority during the currency of a goods-service license may, of its own motion or on the application of the licensee, amend or revoke any of the terms or conditions of such license or add any new terms and conditions which in its opinion are necessary in the public interest.

(2) The Licensing Authority shall give to the licensee, and

(2) The Licensing Authority shall give to the licensee, and to every other person who in its opinion is likely to be affected, seven days' notice of its intention to exercise any power conferred by this section.

(3) Every such amendment or revocation or addition of

(3) Every such amendment or revocation or addition of new terms and conditions made pursuant to this section shall be noted in the appropriate register.

(4) Where for any reason it is not practicable to hold a meeting of the Licensing Authority for the purpose of passing a resolution in exercise of any of the powers conferred by the foregoing provisions of this section, the assent of all the members signified in writing or by telegram to the amendment or revocation of any term or condition of a license, or the or revocation of any term or condition of a license, or the addition of any new term or condition, as the case may be, shall be effective as and be deemed to be a resolution of the

Licensing Authority duly passed at a meeting thereof:
Provided that a record of such action as aforesaid as of the date on which the last assent was signified shall be entered into the minutes of the next meeting of the Licensing

Authority.

Section 35.

Section 35.

(1) Every application for the renewal of a goods-service license shall be made in the prescribed form to the proper Licensing Authority not less than twenty-eight days nor more than fifty-six days before the day on which such license expires. Every such application shall be forwarded through the Commissioner unless the Minister otherwise directs.

(2) Every application for the renewal of a goods-service license shall be made to the Licensing Authority within whose jurisdiction the service is being carried on at the date of the application, but if the occasion so requires, shall be trans-

application, but if the occasion so requires, shall be trans-

mitted to and dealt with by the Licensing Authority within whose jurisdiction the service will be carried on if the license is renewed.

(3) Section twenty-five of these provisions shall apply to every application for the renewal of a goods-service license

as if it were an application for a new license.

(4) No person shall be entitled as of right to a renewal of (4) No person snall be entitled as of right to a renewal of a goods-service license, and, in considering any application for renewal, the Licensing Authority shall take into account all that a Licensing Authority is directed by section twenty-six of these provisions to take into account in considering an original application for a license.

(5) In granting any renewal of a goods-service license the Licensing Authority may either endorse the existing license or may issue a new license in lieu thereof, but any such new license shall show on the face thereof that it is in renewal of

(6) The renewal of any license shall take effect for a period of not more than twelve months from the expiry of the license in renewal of which it is granted, but any such renewal may be granted in advance to take effect as aforesaid.

### Section 36.

Section 36.

(1) Any Licensing Authority may at any time, and, if so directed by the Minister shall, hold a public inquiry as to whether or not any goods-service carried on under the authority of a license under this Part, granted by such Licensing Authority, is being carried on in confermity with the terms and conditions of the license.

Not less than fourteen clear days' public notice of the (2) Not less than fourteen clear days public notice of the day, time, and place fixed for such inquiry shall be given in one or more newspapers having a regular circulation in the localities served by such goods-service, and particulars of the matters proposed to be inquired into shall be given in writing to the licensee not later than ten days before the day on which the inquire is to be hold.

to the licensee not later than ten days before the day on which the inquiry is to be held.

(3) For the purposes of such inquiry the provisions of the Commissions of Inquiry Act, 1908, shall, so far as they are applicable, apply as if the Licensing Authority were a Commission of Inquiry appointed under that Act.

(4) If as a result of such inquiry the Licensing Authority is satisfied that the licensee is not carrying on the service in all respects in conformity with the license, or that he has disposed of such service to any other person, then the Licensing disposed of such service to any other person, then the Licensing Authority may-

(a) Revoke such license; or (b) Suspend such license for such period as it thinks fit; or (c) Either in lieu of or in addition to suspending or revoking the license as aforesaid impose a penalty not exceeding £25 which may be recovered in any Court of competent

jurisdiction as a debt due to the Crown.

(5) The Licensing Authority may, in any case, without holding such inquiry as aforesaid, so suspend any license if it is satisfied that the licensee has wilfully committed a breach of any of the conditions of the license.

(6) Every revocation or suspension of a goods-service license shall be noted in the appropriate register.

### Section 37.

(1) The Governor-General may make regulations prescribing a accounts and records in relation to a goods-service that the Minister may require to be kept by persons carrying on a goods-service pursuant to a license under this Act, and prescribing the financial and statistical returns that the Minister

may require to be made to him by such persons.

(2) Every person carrying on any goods-service pursuant to a license under this Act shall keep such of the prescribed accounts and records in relation thereto as the Minister may accounts and records in relation thereto as the minister may from time to time, by notice published in the *Gazette*, require, and shall make to the Minister in such manner and at such times as the Minister may from time to time notify by writing under his hand, addressed to such person, such of the prescribed financial and statistical returns as the Minister may in such notice require him to make notice require him to make.

(3) Every person who fails to comply with any of the requirements of the Minister pursuant to this section commits an offence, and is liable to a fine of twenty pounds, and, in the case of a continuing offence, to a further fine of five rounds for every day during which the offence continues.

(1) Every Inspector may at any time-

(a) Stop, enter, and inspect while the same is being used any vehicle appearing to him to be used in the conduct of a goods-service:
(b) Enter any place where such vehicle is kept and inspect

such vehicle:

(c) Make any reasonable running-test of such vehicle at the cost in all things of the owner thereof:

cost in all things of the owner thereor:

(d) Require the owner of such vehicle or any other person for the time being in charge thereof to furnish all such assistance as may be necessary for the purpose of any such inspection or running-test:

(e) Require the production of any current license or any document or instrument in avidence thereof issued in

document or instrument in evidence thereof issued in respect of such vehicle.

(2) Every person who obstructs or hinders or incites any person to obstruct or hinder any Inspector in the exercise of powers conferred by this section, or refuses or fails to furnish any such assistance as aforesaid, or who, having the custody or possession of any license as aforesaid, refuses or fails to produce the same to an Inspector on demand, commits an offence, and is liable for each such offence to a fine of ten rounds

- (1) There shall be a right of appeal in the prescribed manner and in the prescribed form and within the prescribed time to the Transport Co-ordination Board from any decision of any Licensing Authority with respect to-
  - (a) The grant, renewal, or revocation of any goods-service
  - license; and

    (b) The terms or conditions of any license, except so far as such terms or conditions have been imposed in conformity with express requirements of these provisions or any regulations thereunder; and
  - (c) The amendment or revocation of any terms or conditions of a license, or any new terms or conditions, or any application for any amendment or revocation of terms or conditions or for new terms or conditions.

- (2) The following persons and bodies, and no others, may appeal as provided in the last preceding subsection, namely:—
  (d) A person whose application for a goods-service license or renewal thereof has been refused:
  (e) A person to whom a goods-service license or renewal thereof has been granted, or is proposed to be granted, and who desires to appeal against the terms and conditions contained or proposed to be inserted in the license: license:
  - (f) The holder of a goods-service license who is dissatisfied with the decision of the Licensing Authority with respect to the amendment or revocation of any term or condition of such license, or the insertion of a new

term or condition in the license:

(g) A person whose goods-service license is suspended or revoked, or on whom any penalty has been imposed pursuant to section thirty-one or section thirty-six of these provisions:

(h) Any person (being the owner of a licensed goods-service), or the Minister, or the Government Railways Board, or any local authority or public body affected by any decision of a Licensing Authority:

- (i) Any one or more of the signatories to a petition presented to the Licensing Authority pursuant to paragraph (j) of section twenty-six of these provisions:
  (j) Any twenty-five or more adult residents of any locality affected by any decision of a Licensing Authority.
- (3) An appeal by the persons mentioned in paragraph (j) of the last preceding subsection shall be by petition in the prescribed form.
- (4) Pending the determination of any appeal duly lodged by a person carrying on a goods-service against any decision of a Licensing Authority in relation to that service, the appellant may carry on such service to the full extent to which he was lawfully carrying it on at the time the decision of the Licensing Authority was given.
- (5) Upon any appeal the Commissions of Inquiry Act, 1908, shall, so far as they are applicable, apply as if the Transport Co-ordination Board were a Commission of Inquiry appointed under that Act.
- (6) The Transport Co-ordination Board in its determination may confirm, modify, or reverse the decision appealed from
- (7) The determination of the Transport Co-ordination Board in any appeal as aforesaid shall be final, and in cases where the decision appealed from is modified or reversed, it shall be the duty of the Licensing Authority forthwith to give effect to the determination of the Transport Co-ordination
- determination of the Transport Co-ordination Board shall in every case be communicated by that Board to the Commissioner, who shall thereupon notify the same to the appellant, and every other person who in the opinion of the Commissioner is directly concerned.
- (9) The Transport Co-ordination Board in determining any appeal shall not be bound to hear any person or to take any evidence or to receive any representations from any person.

(3) The Licensing Authority appointed by the Commissioner for the purposes of the last preceding subsection shall, in considering any application for a license, take into account in addition to the matters mentioned in section 26 of these provisions any representations made to it by the Licensing Authority of any other controlled area through any part of which the service is to be carried on.

(4) This section shall come into force on the first day of February, nineteen hundred and thirty-four.

### Section 19 (from 1933 Act).

No application for a goods-service license or for the amendment of a goods-service license, the granting or making of which would be to affect in any way any determination by the Transport Co-ordination Board of an appeal under section 43 of these provisions, shall be dealt with by any Licensing Authority until after the expiration of six months from the date of such determination, unless the Board consents thereto on the ground that there has been a material change in the conditions of the service affected since the giving of such determination.

### Section 20 (from 1933 Act).

(1) Notwithstanding anything contained in these provisions, any goods-service license may, subject to the provisions of this section, be transferred to any person.

(2) Application for the transfer of any license shall be made in the prescribed form, and the provisions of section

- 24 of these provisions shall apply to every such application.
  (3) The Licensing Authority shall give to every person who in its opinion is likely to be affected seven days' notice of its intention to consider any application for a transfer as aforesaid.
- (4) The Licensing Authority, after duly considering the application and any objections thereto, may grant or refuse the transfer of the license, but shall not in any case grant a transfer unless it is satisfied that the proposed transferee is financially able to carry on the service, and is likely to carry it on satisfactorily.

## Section 28 (from 1933 Act).

(1) In any case where, from a comparison of the goods traffic and passenger traffic respectively, and the revenue derived from each by a service for the carriage of both goods and passengers, the Licensing Authority is of opinion that such service is principally a goods-service, and if such service is carried on by vehicles designed chiefly for the carriage of goods, and is a goods-service with respect to which these provisions are applied, the Licensing Authority may issue a goods-service license in respect thereof, endorsed to the effect that the vehicles authorized to be used may, in the ordinary course of the goods-service operations, but subject to such conditions (if any) as are specified, carry passengers for hire or reward without a passenger-service license.

(2) For the purpose of enabling it to exercise the power conferred by the last preceding subsection the Licensing Authority may treat an application for a passenger-service license as an application for a goods-service license and deal with the same accordingly.

Section 29 (from 1933 Act).

### Section 29 (from 1933 Act).

Every person commits an offence and is liable to a fine of fifty pounds for each such offence who does any act in any capacity as agent for any goods-service which may be lawfully carried on only pursuant to a license these under provisions if at the time of his doing such act such a license is not in force in respect of such service.

### Section 30 (from 1933 Act).

If at any time the Governor-General in Council is satisfied that goods are being carried by motor-vehicle in such a manner as in effect to constitute a regular public service, he may, whether or not goods are being so transported for hire or reward of any kind, declare such manner of transport to be the carrying on of a goods-service within the meaning to be the carrying-on of a goods-service within the meaning of the said Act as modified by this Order, and thereupon it shall be unlawful for any goods in any part of New Zealand to be so carried, save pursuant to the authority and in conformity with the terms of a goods-service license granted under the said Act as modified by this Order.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL AS N pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by section fifty-nine of the Transport Licensing Act, 1931 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), and of all other powers and authorities him thereunto enabling, His Transport the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations, and doth hereby declare that this Order in Council shall come into operation on the date of publication thereof in the New Zealand Gazette.

#### REGULATIONS.

# GENERAL PROVISIONS

These regulations may be cited as the Passenger-service Vehicle (Constructional) Regulations, 1933.
 (1) In these regulations, unless the context otherwise

requires,—
"Authorized Officer" includes the Commissioner of Transport and the officer authorized by him to issue a certificate of fitness in respect of a passengerservice vehicle:

"Body" includes all that portion of a passenger-service vehicle designed to accommodate and to protect the driver, passengers, conductor, or attendant (if any),

- driver, passengers, conductor, or attendant (if any), or otherwise provided for their use in general: lassis," save as otherwise provided in clause (5) of Regulation 38 hereof, includes all that portion of a passenger-service vehicle (exclusive of the body and the separate fittings, equipment, or attachments for
- the body, and exclusive of the consumable supplies, such as fuel, oil, and water:
  "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Transport:
  "Omnibus" means a passenger-service vehicle the body of which is designed for the carriage of both seated and standing passengers:
  "Passenger-service vehicle" means a passenger-service vehicle as defined by the said Act:

"Passenger-truck" means (1) a passenger-service vehicle the body of which, although designed principally for the carriage of goods, has by adaption or by alteration been made suitable for the carriage of passengers, or (2) any passenger-service vehicle so designated by the Commissioner of Transport:

rivice-car" means a passenger-service vehicle which has the majority of its seats placed uninterruptedly across the body, which is not designed to carry "Service-car"

standing passengers: "Service-coach" means

rvice-coach" means a passenger-service vehicle the body of which has a longitudinal aisle and is not

- designed to carry standing passengers: heel-track" means the distance between the centres  $\hbox{``Wheel-track}$ of the off side and near side wheels of a pair of wheels, and when a pair of wheels consists of twin wheels on the off side and twin wheels on the near side, means the distance from the centre of the off side twin wheels to the centre of the near side twin wheels.
- (2) The Commissioner shall have power to determine whether any passenger-service vehicle is an omnibus, a passenger-truck, a service-car, or a service-coach, and his determination thereof shall for the purposes of these reguassenger-truck lations be final and conclusive.
- 3. (1) Every passenger-service vehicle (not being a passenger-truck) first used in a passenger-service (as defined by the said Act) before the 1st day of June, 1932, shall comply with the conditions and requirements appropriate to its class contained in Part I of these regulations.
- (2) Every passenger-service vehicle (not being a passengertruck) first used in a passenger-service (as defined by the said Act) after the 1st day of June, 1932, and every passenger-service vehicle which has been licensed under the Motoromnibus Traffic Act, 1926, and to which the provisions of both Parts I and II of the Motor-omnibus (Constructional) Regulations, 1929, applied, shall comply with all the conditions and requirements appropriate to its class contained in Parts I and II of these regulations.

(3) Every passenger-truck shall comply with the conditions and requirements contained in Part III of these regulations, but need not comply with the conditions and requirements contained in Parts I and II hereof other than as provided in Part III.

(4) Every passenger-service vehicle, in addition to complying with such of the conditions and requirements of these regulations as is hereinbefore provided, shall comply with such other of the conditions and requirements of Parts I, II, and III hereof as the Commissioner, after taking into account the nature and reasonable needs and requirements of the service in which such vehicle is being or is intended to be used, may direct.

(5) The Commissioner shall have power to determine from any records in his possession the date on which any passenger-service vehicle was first used, and for the purpose of these

regulations his determination shall be final.

4. (1) The Commissioner may, in special circumstances, and subject to such conditions as he thinks fit to impose, grant exemption in respect of any passenger-service vehicle from the provisions of any of these regulations, and may extend such exemption so that it may be granted at the discretion of the Authorized Officer to all passenger-service vehicles of the same make, type, and model plying under similar con-

(2) Application for such exemption shall in every case be (2) Application for such exemption shall in every case be made by the owner (or intending owner) of the passenger-service vehicle, or of the chassis to the Authorized Officer, and shall state fully the grounds on which exemption is sought. The application shall state the name of the maker of the chassis, shall properly identify the vehicle, and any other information required by the Authorized Officer shall be also surplied. also supplied.

5. (1) For the purpose of the said Act, the Authorized Officer may, at his discretion, issue a certificate of fitness or permit in respect of the passenger-service vehicle, subject to the condition that certain requirements of these regulations

be fulfilled within a specified time limit or limits.

(2) From every decision of an Authorized Officer (not being the Commissioner) made in terms of these regulations, there shall be a right of appeal by the owner of the vehicle to the Commissioner.

6. Every person who does or omits or causes or knowingly permits or suffers to be done or omitted, any act, matter, or thing contrary to the provisions of these regulations, or contrary to the provisions or restrictions in the permit, or the certificate of fitness, or who, for the purpose of these regulations, makes any statement or supplies any information that is false or misleading in any material particular, or who otherwise than in accordance with an order of exemption requirements of these regulations shall be liable to a fine of £10.

#### PART I.

REGULATIONS APPLICABLE TO ALL LICENSED PASSENGER-SERVICE VEHICLES OTHER THAN PASSENGER-TRUCKS.

# Doorways.

- 7. (1) Every passenger-service vehicle with a body designed or the vehicle and another which if not at the extreme rear end of the body shall be on the off side. When only two doorways are provided no part of one doorway shall be transversely opposite any portion of the opening of the other door-
- (2) One of the doorways need not be available for use save in cases of emergency, and if intended for use only in such cases, shall be fitted with a door (hereinafter referred to as the "emergency door") kept securely latched until it is required to be used. The device for opening the emergency door shall to be used. The device for opening the emergency door shall be quick acting and of ample strength and shall at all times be capable of ready operation, and if such device includes a removable key, the latter shall be permanently fixed by a chain fastened within 1 ft. 6 in. of the keyhole. The keyhole shall be situated not higher than 4 ft. from the floor. On every emergency door fitted with a closing or locking device there shall be painted an "arrow" sign or some suitable word or phrase (e.g., "turn," "lift, then push") as a guide to the method of opening the door. In an omnibus fitted with an emergency door a conspicuous notice directing attention to emergency door a conspicuous notice directing attention to the emergency door shall be displayed inside the omnibus near the front thereof. Every emergency door shall be kept of all obstruction on the outside of the passenger-service vehicle.
- (3) The outside of and any passageway to the doorway or doorways in general use shall at all times be kept free and

unobstructed, and if a passenger-seat obstructs an emergency door that portion of the seat which would be likely to delay egress in emergency shall be readily removable. Nothing egress in emergency shall be readily removable. Nothing shall be carried likely to cause obstruction to the latter door from either inside or outside.
(4) Every doorway shall be provided with a suitable non-

slip tread-plate.

(5) More than one emergency door may be provided in any assenger-service vehicle, in which case the foregoing prosions shall apply to all such emergency doors.

(6) A ready means of exit from the passenger-vehicle shall be at all times available for the driver, and shall not be obstructed by passengers or otherwise.

### Driver's Protection.

8. (1) In an omnibus there shall be no passenger-seat alongside the driver's seat or with its centre nearer than 3 ft. alongside the driver's seat or with its centre nearer than 3 ft. to the steering-wheel rim or to any change-gear or brake-lever grip, unless the passenger-seat is divided from the driver's seat by a permanent partition from the floor to a height of not less than 1 ft. 6 in. above the upper side of the driver's seat (including padding) and when practicable not less than 1 ft. 6 in. of space on each side of the centre of the steering-wheel from the level of the driver's shoulders to the floor shall be kept clear and unobstructed for the limbs of the driver, but portion of such space may be included in the passageway provided for by clause (3) of the last preceding regulation.

(2) In an omnibus at the front end thereof a conspicuous notice "Do not converse with driver or stand alongside or forward of his seat" shall at all times be displayed.

(3) In service-cars or service-coaches, the front seat shall, if two passengers are to be carried beside the driver, have not less than 4 ft. length when measured 6 in. above the level of the seat and 6 in. forward of the back squab.

(4) There shall not be any seat on the right-hand s te of the driver's seat in a right-hand control vehicle, or on his

left-hand side if the vehicle has left-hand control.

(5) There shall be no avoidable obstruction of any nature (6) There shall be no avoidable obstruction of any nature whatsoever on the passenger-service vehicle which may interfere with the driver's near or distant vision, whether in front or to the right or left. No passenger or person shall at any time be allowed to be in such a position on the passenger-service vehicle that he interferes with the driver's vision as aforesaid. An efficient approved windscreen-wiper must be fitted to prevent interference with the driver's vision through the front windscreen by rain or snow, and efficient approved means must be adopted to prevent interference with the driver's vision through the driver's vision through the front windscreen by the rays of the sun or otherwise howsoever.

(6) A mirror or mirrors shall be provided so that the driver may have a view of the interior of the passenger-service vehicle, and to enable him to be aware without turning his head of the existence or approach of any other vehicle on the

nead of the existence or approach of any other vehicle on the rear right-hand side.

(7) To every omnibus when used for city suburban service also when manual signals cannot be readily and effectively given from the driver's seat of any other passenger-service vehicle approved mechanical devices efficient by day and by night shall be fitted, to the Authorized Officer's satisfaction, one near the front of the vehicle to indicate to road-users and controllers of traffic when it is about to turn towards the right or left and the other at the rear to warn any vehicle following when the passenger-service vehicle is about to stop, reduce speed, or change direction. They must be so fitted that when the former is operated, the latter is automatically illuminated to give its cautionary signal which may be in the form of an amber light. Notwithstanding anything to the may, if necessary, project outwards for a distance not exceeding 4 ft. 9 in. from the longitudinal centre-line of the passenger-service vehicle and measured at right angles to that

centre-line.

If the device fitted near the front of the vehicle would, when indicating a full turn to the right, project more than 4 ft. from the longitudinal centre-line of the vehicle, it shall be fitted in such a position that it will be not less than 6 ft. 6 in. nor more than 7 ft. 6 in. above the roadway when the vehicle is fully laden. If a direction-indicator is also fitted to the rear of a passenger-service vehicle, it must be fitted towards the off side, not less than 3 ft. nor more than 4 ft. above the roadway when the vehicle is fully laden, and when in position to show a right angle turn, it shall not project beyond the to show a right angle turn, it shall not project beyond the outermost part of the entire body of the vehicle.

# Liquid Fuel.

9. (1) The driver of a passenger-service vehicle shall not allow motor-spirits or other liquid fuel to be carried thereon otherwise than in the permanent fuel-supply tanks or in a specially fitted emergency fuel-supply tank.

(2) The said tanks shall be properly constructed of durable material, and shall be of ample strength for the purpose which they serve. They shall be so placed that any overflow shall not fall upon woodwork or be allowed to accumulate on the passenger-service vehicle, and the filling inlet for the fuel shall be brought without a detachable joint to the outside of the body of the passenger-service vehicle, and shall not be placed below, or laterally within 1 ft. of any doorway in general use, or within 2 ft. of the exhaust-pipe outlet.

(3) An aperture for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of liquid fuel may be provided in that portion of the tank which is within the body of the passenger-service vehicle. Such aperture shall, if so provided, be fitted with a securely screwed-in bushing, with a hole not exceeding 1 in. in diameter in the middle thereof, through which a metal depth-rod shall pass. Such rod shall be permanently and rigidly attached at

Such rod shall be permanently and rigidly attached at pass. Such for shall be permanently and rightly attached at its upper end to a metal screw-on cap which itself shall properly and securely close the said aperture, except for any necessary air-vent, while at the lower end of the rod there shall be provided a permanent stopper which will not pass through the said hole in the bushing, but will pass the tankaperture when the bushing is removed therefrom. No person shall remove the hushing save with the express approval of shall remove the bushing, save with the express approval of the Authorized Officer. The said aperture shall be so situated that it will at all times, when the passenger-service vehicle is in use, be at a higher level than the filling-inlet.

(4) The filling-inlet must be provided with a secure cap,

and any person removing the cap must fit it tightly in position immediately after the purpose for which it was removed is

(5) A cock shall be provided in the main fuel-pipe line, and the control handle shall be visible and readily accessible at all times from outside the passenger-service vehicle, and it shall be periodically operated to avoid any delay in operating it in an emergency.

10. (1) Every passenger-service vehicle shall be fitted with brakes which comply with the requirements of the Motorvehicle Regulations, 1933, and they shall be of a type approved by the Commissioner of Transport or shall themselves be subject to his approval in design, construction, performance, and dependability in service. The stopping-ability of the foot-brake of every passenger-service vehicle, measured as provided in Regulation 4 of the Motor-vehicle Regulations, 1933, when under official test by the Authorized Officer shall 1933, when under official test by the Authorized Officer, shall 1933, when under official test by the Authorized Officer, shall be equivalent to or shall be considered by the Authorized Officer to be capable of being equivalent to 25 ft. for a four-wheel-braking system, or to 35 ft. for a two-wheel-braking system. The stopping-ability of the hand-brake of every passenger-service vehicle measured as provided in Regulation 4 of the Motor-vehicle Regulations, 1933, shall be equivalent to such distance as the Authorized Officer may consider satisfactory, having regard to the type, design, or condition of such brake, but in no case shall the stopping-ability be considered satisfactory if when under official test by the Authorized Officer it exceeds a distance of 60 ft.

(2) Any passenger-service vehicle-brake which simultaneously applies the braking-pressure on two wheels or drums

(2) Any passenger service vehicle brake which simultaneously applies the braking-pressure on two wheels or drums with a common axis shall be so adjusted or fitted that the braking effect is approximately the same on each road wheel.

(3) For the purpose of testing the brakes, the passenger-service vehicle shall, if the Authorized Officer in special circumstances so desires, be presented with a load that is distributed as would be the case when passengers, their belongings, and freight (if any) were aboard.

# Alterations in Passenger-service Vehicle or Route.

Alterations in Passenger-service Vehicle or Route.

11. (1) If the owner of a passenger-service vehicle which is restricted by the certificate of fitness or permit to specific routes desires to carry passengers in that passenger-service vehicle over any route different in whole or in part from the said routes, the written approval of the Authorized Officer shall first be obtained.

(2) Save for minor necessary maintenance requirements, no alteration shall be made in the design or construction of a passenger-service vehicle without the prior written approval of the Authorized Officer, nor shall any bulky equipment or fittings be added without such approval being obtained. Any such alterations or any substantial replacements shall comply so far as is considered reasonable by the Authorized Officer with any relative requirements of these regulations, whether contained in Part I or in Part II hereof.

#### Fire-extinguishers.

12. (1) Every passenger-service vehicle shall be provided with at least one fire-extinguisher. Such appliance shall be of a type approved by the Fire Underwriters' Association as suitable for motor-vehicle service, and must at all times be effectively maintained by the owner of the passenger-service

vehicle, who shall also see that it is at all times carried close to a near side doorway so placed as to be readily accessible from both inside and outside of the vehicle.

(2) The driver of a passenger-service vehicle shall not allow any fire-extinguisher to inconvenience passengers, either by reason of its condition or position.

# $Signals\ from\ and\ Hand-supports\ for\ Passengers.$

13. (1) Every passenger-service vehicle for use in a licensed service having more than twelve passenger seats, and any other passenger-service vehicle if so required by the Authorized Officer, shall be provided with suitable equipment to enable Officer, snail be provided with stitudie equipment to enable any passenger thereon to signal to the driver and conductor (or attendant) if any. The equipment shall be conveniently placed to serve each group of not more than five seated passengers, or less if the Authorized Officer considers the general arrangement of the seats throughout the body so

(2) Sufficient hand-rails, hand-straps, or hand-grips shall be provided for the convenience and safety of passengers when standing in or moving along passageways.

#### Fume, &c., Protection.

14. The passenger-service vehicle must be so constructed and maintained that smells or fumes from the exhaust-pipe or other sources, or the heat from the motor exhaust-pipe, or any other parts, shall not injuriously affect any part of the passenger-service vehicle, or injuriously affect or interfere with the comfort of the passengers or driver.

# Destination Signs and Marker Lights.

15. Unless the Authorized Officer approves otherwise,

(1) On the front of every passenger-service vehicle there shall be placed, not lower than 3 ft. above the ground, words to indicate for every single journey the destination, and also, to indicate for every single journey the destination, and also, in the case only of every omnibus at a reasonable height on at least the near side thereof words to indicate the general route of the vehicle (if more than one route is available) so that the words in each case will in daylight be clearly visible to persons of normal sight at a distance of 44 yd. At all times while the omnibus is by law required to be lighted, the front indicator containing the information aforesaid shall be clearly illuminated. It shall be the duty of the driver of the vehicle to see that the destination and route signs (or any words indicating route exhibited on the vehicle) are correct for each single journey, and that the front indicator of his for each single journey, and that the front indicator of his omnibus is illuminated when required as aforesaid.

(2) Every service-car or service-coach intended for or used

in a licensed service after sunset shall be fitted with two "marker lights" (one each side of the longitudinal centre-line of the vehicle) coloured blue and with a lens not less than 3 sq. in. effective area, directed horizontally forward and fitted as high up as is conveniently possible near the front of the body and as far apart transversely as is structurally convenient, but in no case closer than 40 in. from centre to

## Tires.

16. (1) Each tire of a passenger-service vehicle shall be made of soft or elastic materials, such as rubber, and shall be of good quality and construction throughout, and shall be maintained in a safe and satisfactory condition.

(2) Every passenger-service vehicle shall be equipped with tires of sufficient load capacity to meet reasonable requirements of service, and in determining the sizes of the tires required the load tables and data as published from time to time by the Society of Motor Manufacturers and Traders, Ltd. (England), and by the Tire and Rim Association, Inc. (U.S.A.), may be utilized by the Commissioner with any variation thereof may be utilized by the Commissioner with any variation thereof that he may deem reasonable. In the case of a pneumatic tire its appropriate inflation pressure shall be that recommended by the standard tables as aforesaid, and so far as practicable the tire shall be kept inflated at that pressure. If the tire is of such make, type, or construction that recommendations concerning it are not published in either of the said tables, then the load limits and inflation pressures of the tire as aforesaid shall be such as are fixed by the Commissioner.

#### Electric Wires.

17. Wires conducting electric current shall be properly insulated, and be protected from injury, and shall be so placed as to minimize the risk of danger from short-circuits or other causes.

#### Oil Protection.

18. The exhaust-pipe shall not be placed where oil or any inflammable or vaporizable material is likely to be dropped

# Accumulation of Benzine, &c.

19. When a guard, tray, or undershield is fixed beneath the engine, carburettor, or fuel-tank it shall be so constructed that any overflow of liquid fuel is not retained thereon.

#### Steering.

20. (1) Steering-gear and all connections thereof shall be of ample strength, and their design and leverage shall be such

as to give convenient and sensitive control.

(2) When ball-and-socket joints of steering-connections are (2) When ball-and-socket joints of seering-connections are used the longitudinal or transverse rods, as the case may be, shall be supported upon the ball, or the respective parts of the ball-and-socket joint shall be prevented from separating through wear or neglect of maintenance by the provision of a special keeper, or by fitting some other suitable and positive retaining-device approved for the purpose by the Authorized Officer.

Officer.

# Protection from Vibration.

21. Unless approved otherwise by the Authorized Officer, all brake and steering connections and all parts connected by bolts or by studs and nuts which in the opinion of the Authorized Officer are subject to severe vibration, shall be fastened by lock-nuts, castellated nuts with pins, or by nuts with approved spring washers or lock-nut washers.

#### Protection from Breakages.

22. Whenever the Authorized Officer so requires on a passenger-service vehicle there shall be provided, to his satisfaction, effective and sufficient means of control to restrict the field of swing of the driving-shaft in the event of breakage of either the driving-shaft or the gear-box.

#### Parcels, &c.

23. (1) In every omnibus approved for the carriage of standing passengers reasonable provision conveniently placed throughout the body shall be made for the carriage of passenger's parcels, coats, and other articles, and when it is desired by the owner of the passenger-service vehicle that baggage (or goods) be allowed on the passenger-service vehicle, safe and reasonable provision as may be required by the Authorized Officer shall be made for its carriage and

(2) When baggage or goods are to be carried within a passenger-service vehicle body the passengers shall be protected from possible injury or discomfort by a partition, guard rails, grill, screen, or by other means approved by the Authorized Officer.

#### Spare Wheel, Tools, &c.

24. The owner of every passenger-service vehicle shall cause to be carried thereon at all times when in service a properly equipped spare wheel, or a spare rim and tire, ready for service in respect of each size of tire being used, and also sufficient and suitable tools and renewable parts to meet all reasonable road needs:

Provided that any passenger-service vehicle may, at the discretion of the Authorized Officer by writing under his hand, be exempted for the duration of the current certificate of fitness or permit or for such shorter period as may therein be stated, either in whole or in part, from the requirements

of this regulation.

#### Trailers.

25. A trailer shall not be used in conjunction with a passenger-service vehicle unless the certificate of fitness or the permit, as the case may be, so provides.

# Jacks, &c.

26. One suitable complete and efficient lifting-jack of an ordinary rated capacity of at least three-quarters of the total laden weight of the vehicle shall at all times while a passenger-service vehicle is in service be carried under the passenger-service vehicle is in service be carried under the driver's seat, or in some near-by conspicuous position, and shall be readily available without the use of a key, and, in addition, any other appliances or equipment that may, in the opinion of the Authorized Officer, be necessary in cases of accident or emergency for any particular route or vehicle shall also be carried thereon. The owner of any vehicle equipped as aforesaid shall provide for the efficient tuition of the driver and conductor or attendant (if any) in the use of such jack and appliances of such jack and appliances.

# Loading.

27. (1) The fact that in the opinion of the Authorized Officer the chassis of any passenger-service vehicle is carrying, or in service is likely to carry, a greater load, or to be subjected in the frame or other vital part to a greater unit stress than it was designed by the makers regularly and continuously

to carry, may be a ground for his refusal to issue a certificate s or permit in respect of the vehicle, or may be a ground for the issuing of such certificate or permit only subject to certain conditions being complied with in respect of the

passenger-service vehicle.

(2) Unless the Commissioner gives written permission to the contrary, the maximum number of passengers permitted to be carried by any omnibus shall be not greater than fourthirds of the number of passengers for which seating accommodation is provided, or the maximum number of seated and standing passengers which the Authorized Officer declares the omnibus to be fit to carry, whichever is the less, nor shall more passengers be carried on any other type of passenger-service vehicle than the number of passengers for which seating accommodation is provided.

which seating-accommodation is provided.

(3) It shall not be lawful for any person to operate a passenger-service vehicle or for the owner of any passenger-service vehicle to permit the same to be operated unless (a) its service vehicle to permit the same to be operated unless (a) its current certificate of fitness or permit is displayed in a conspicuous part of the interior of the vehicle, and approved by the Authorized Officer; (b) the certificate of fitness is displayed in a suitable frame or other holder; and (c) the seated passengers and standing passengers (if any) or other load on the passenger-service vehicle do not exceed the limitations of passengers and load fixed in the certificate or permit. For the purpose of computation of the number of passengers under this regulation (a) a child means any person under sixteen years of age, (b) each child shall have not less than I ft. of seat-width (provided that in the case of an omnibus an undivided seat measuring not less than 2 ft. 8 in. in width may accommodate three children), and (c) when standing passengers are permitted on an omnibus two children standing may be considered the equivalent of one adult standing.

#### Motor-vehicles Act Requirements.

28. No passenger-service vehicle shall be considered to be in a suitable condition for the carriage of passengers unless all the requirements of the Motor-vehicles Act, 1924, and its amendments, and any regulations for the time being in force thereunder in so far as they affect the passenger-service vehicle have been fulfilled.

#### Inspection.

29. For whatever purpose the passenger-service vehicle is presented for inspection, it shall on each such occasion be presented in a thoroughly clean condition in all parts.

The owner shall give without charge every facility for expediting the inspection of the vehicle or its separate parts or for any testing or weighing thereof, and, if requested so to do, shall supply all tools or workshop equipment that it is possible for him to provide for the power investigation of the control of the c possible for him to provide for the prompt inspection of the vehicle. The owner shall also provide without charge any skilled or unskilled labour that may reasonably be required during the inspection.

### PART II.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS APPLICABLE ONLY TO PASSENGER. SERVICE VEHICLES (OTHER THAN PASSENGER-TRUCKS) FIRST USED IN A PASSENGER-SERVICE AFTER THE 1ST DAY OF JUNE, 1932, or as otherwise provided in Regulation 3.

# Doorways.

30. Every doorway to a passenger-service vehicle for entrance or egress shall accord with the following requirements as may be appropriate according to the type of vehicle and doorway. The doorway shall give overall adjacent to the frame

(a) In the case of an omnibus at least 1 ft. 10 in. clear width for a height of at least 5 ft. from the floor if an emergency doorway, and at least the same width

an emergency doorway, and at least the same width for a height of at least 6 ft. from the floor or step, as the case may be, if not an emergency doorway:

(b) In the case of a service-coach at least 1 ft. 6 in. clear width for a height of at least 4 ft. 6 in. from the floor if an emergency door, and at least 1 ft. 10 in. clear width for a height of at least 5 ft. from the floor or step, as the case may be, if not an emergency doorway: doorway:

(c) In the case of a service-car carrying eight persons or less (inclusive of the driver), at least 1 ft. 6 in. clear width for a height of at least 3 ft. 9 in. from the

floor or step, as the case may be, for all doorways:
(d) In the case of other service-cars at least 1 ft. 6 in. clear width for a height of at least 4 ft. from the floor if an emergency doorway, and at least 1 ft. 8 in. clear width for a height of at least 4 ft. from the floor or step, as the case may be, if not an emergency doorway.

Seats and Passenger Accommodation.

31. (1) In every scat there shall be provided for each seated passenger at least 1 ft. 4 in. in width, measured in a straight line along the front edge of the seat in the case of an omnibus, and at least 1 ft. 6 in. in width so measured in the case of a service-car or service-coach, and there shall similarly be provided widths of the same respective dimensions for the body and shoulders of each passenger. There shall also be provided for each seated passenger from the front edge of the seat horizontally to the back of the seat depth not less than 1 ft. 2 in. in the case of an omnibus and 1 ft. 4 in. in the case of a service-car or service-coach. The distance from the floor-covering to the top of the seat shall, in the case of an omnibus, be not less than I ft. 5 in., and in other cases shall be sufficient to provide reasonable comfort to the satisfaction of the Authorized Officer. For the purposes of this clause, any cushion or other covering shall be deemed part of the seat, and for computing the width, depth, and height of a seat, the cushion or other coverings shall be uncompressed.

(2) No seat may be so situated that when occupied it will be likely to cause unreasonable obstruction in the

(2) No seat may be so situated that when occupied it will be likely to cause unreasonable obstruction in the entrance and exit for passengers.

(3) Every seat in a passenger-service vehicle shall be of good-quality leather or other suitable, durable, and sanitary material, and in the case of every service-car or service-coach other than an omnibus shall be fitted with a sprung, stuffed, or otherwise comfortable cushion.

(4) Every seat of a passenger-service vehicle shall be provided with a back, and so far as is reasonable both the back and the bottom of the seat shall be so tilted or shaped; also the seat shall be so constructed and placed that there would be ample leg-room and reasonable comfort in the seat for an

be ample leg-room and reasonable comfort in the seat for an adult passenger of average proportions.

When seats face each other, or in any other way are so arranged that the respective passengers would be likely to interfere with each others comfort, the seats shall be so constructed and placed that each passenger shall have as legroom from 6 in. above the highest portion of the front edge of the seat to the floor at least 9 in. clear space forward for the full length of the front-edge of the seat. The distance in full length of the front-edge of the seat. The distance in every seat between the support for the passenger's back and the rear of the nearest seat that is facing the same way, or any other obstruction directly in front of a passenger when measured parallel with and 6 in. above the seat proper, or alternatively, when measured horizontally with and 2 ft. from the floor directly below, shall, in the case of an omnibus, be not less than 2 ft. 3 in. and in the case of a service-car or service coach he not less than 1 ft. 6 in a service coach be not less than 2 ft.

of not less than 2 it. 3 in. and in the case of a service-car or service-coach be not less than 2 ft. 6 in.

(5) If the seat used by the driver of a service-car or a service-coach is intended also to accommodate passengers on his left it shall have a length when measured 6 in. above the level of the seat and 6 in. forward of the back squab, of not less than for one passenger 3 ft., or not less than for two

passengers 4 ft. 6 in.

Passage ways.

32. From each doorway of an omnibus or service-coach (other than an emergency door or special doorway for the driver) to each row of seats adjoining one another, or to within 5 ft. of any individual seat, there shall be a passageway or aisle not less than 1 ft. 3 in. in width in the case of an omnibus and 1 ft. in width in the case of a sorwing cases. and I ft. in width in the case of a service-coach, exclusive in both cases of the space reserved as leg-room for seated passengers under clause (4) of Regulation 31 and free throughout from structural projections or obstructions.

#### Dimensions.

33. (1) In every omnibus, for a distance of at least 8 in. on each side of the longitudinal centre-line of the aisle or passageway the height throughout measured from the top of passageway the height throughout measured from the top of the floor-covering to the roof (or extension thereof) clear of obstruction and exclusive of projections of any kind, including lighting fittings or ventilators, shall be not less than 6 ft. In every service-coach for a distance of at least 5 in. on each side of the longitudinal centre-line of the aisle or passageway the height throughout measured from the top of the floor-covering to the roof (or extension thereof) clear of obstruction covering to the roof (or extension thereof) clear of obstruction and exclusive of projections of any kind as aforesaid shall be not less than 5 ft.

In the case of every passenger-service vehicle, the height measured throughout from the central portion of the top of the seat (and, if fitted with a cushion, measured while the cushion is normally depressed) to the roof (or extension there-of) clear of obstruction and exclusive of projections of any kind as aforesaid shall be not less than 3 ft. 2 in.

(2) The maximum length of a passenger-service vehicle, including fittings, attachments, and load, shall not exceed

30 ft.

(3) The body of any passenger-service vehicle shall not overhang its rear wheel-track by more than 1 ft. 3 in. on either side.

(4) The length by which the body overhangs the axis of the rear wheels of a passenger-service vehicle shall not exceed two-fifths of the wheel-base, provided that the Authorized Officer may at his discretion allow an extra length up to 8 in. when he considers such allowance necessary or desirable. In this clause "body" does not include a compartment or fitting specially provided for the carriage of baggage or other goods, or a platform or staircase external to the seating accommodation, provided these are not used to accommodate

passengers.
(5) The length by which any part of a passenger-service vehicle, including its fittings, equipment, or its load, extends farther forward than the forward limits of the wheel-base shall in no circumstances exceed 7 ft., nor shall it extend more than 3 ft. in front of the radiator, or 1 ft. 6 in. in front of the forward end of the chassis-frame member (or the equivalent such frame member), whichever of the latter two alter-

of such frame memoer), whichever of the latter two alternatives is the greater distance.

(6) The length by which any part of a passenger-service vehicle, including its fittings, equipment, or its load, extends farther rearward than the rearward limits of the wheel-base, shall be not greater than 9 ft. 6 in., nor greater than 3 ft. 6 in. behind the body, whichever is the lesser distance, and the said 3 ft. 6 in. shall be reduced to the extent of any extra allowance granted under along (4) of this regulation. granted under clause (4) of this regulation:
Provided that the Authorized Officer may allow the said

3 ft. 6 in. to be increased by an amount equal to that by which the body overhang falls short of the limit of two-fifths of the wheel-base, but in no such case shall the total overhang then

exceed 7 ft

(7) For the purpose of this regulation "wheel-base" in the

- (a) A passenger-service vehicle with only two axles means the distance measured horizontally and parallel to the longitudinal centre-line of the vehicle from the axis or centre of the rear wheel to the centre of the front wheel when in its normal position; and in the case of
- (b) A passenger-service vehicle fitted with a more or less rigid frame which is carried towards the front end, or towards the rear end, or towards both ends by two axles placed closely one behind the other, means the distance measured as in the last preceding paragraph from the point (or points) midway between the closely-placed axles.

# Body.

34. (1) Every passenger-service vehicle shall be fitted with 34. (1) Every passenger-service venicle shall be fitted with a permanent body, the frame of which shall be made of wood, steel, or other durable material approved by the Authorized Officer. The body shall be of good and robust design, shall be made of first-class materials, with first-class workmanship and finish, shall be designed to give, to the satisfaction of the Authorized Officer, full protection to passengers, and shall be permanently attached to the chassis.

(2) Highly inflammable materials shall not be used in the

construction of the body or fittings and equipment.

(3) Fittings shall not have sharp corners or edges, or extend in such a way as to render them likely to be a cause of injury

to passengers or to their clothing.

(4) Effective means shall be taken to prevent any unnecessary rattle of windows or doors or other noises caused by movements of the body-frame or other part when the vehicle is in use.

passenger-service vehicle shall be fitted with windows along each side and at the rear of the body: Provided that a service-car or service-coach may have movable side panels or curtains which shall, when in the closed position, be transparent to such degree that there is good visibility for the passengers. In the case of an omnibus any windows that open and alongside which a passenger may be seated shall be guarded to a distance of at least 3 ft. above the level of the top of the seat by slats on the inside or by other approved means, so that a spherical body 5 in. in diameter cannot within the said distance be passed through the opening.

(6) Every passenger-service vehicle body shall be effectively and automatically ventilated, either by means of special design and construction of the walls and ceilings or by the provision of approved ventilators therein or by a combination of such methods, and special attention shall be given to the need for minimizing described.

minimizing draughts.

## Lighting.

35. (1) While carrying passengers at any time when by law the passenger-service vehicle is required to be lighted, the interior shall, subject to the provisions hereinafter set out, be illuminated with electric light on the basis of a minimum of six candle-power to every two seats in the case of vehicles chiefly candle-power to every two seats in the case of veincles chiefly used on an urban or suburban service, and in other cases on the basis of a minimum of six candle-power to every five seats. In any case when there is a doubt as to which of the two intensities of lighting as above described should be adopted, the decision of the Authorized Officer shall be final for the purposes of this regulation.

(2) The lights shall be so placed within the body of the passenger-service vehicle or shall be so controlled by switches, or so guarded by shields or non-reflectors that the driver shall not be hampered by light direct or reflected from the internal lights. Independent circuits shall be provided so that, during lighting hours and while the passenger-service vehicle is on service, at least one of the interior lights may remain alight.

service, at least one of the interior lights may remain angue.

(3) When owing to paucity of passengers or the requirements of safety or other proper circumstances, it would temporarily not be reasonable wholly to meet the requirements of clause (1) hereof, all or any of the internal lights save that referred to in subclause (2) hereof may be switched off by the driver.

(4) The lights shall be so distributed that the doorways and

steps shall be illuminated while in use, and so that light is distributed throughout the interior of the passenger-service

(5) No single light shall be less than six candle-power.
(6) Lamp-fittings, globes, and wiring shall be of a substantial nature, so that passengers will be protected from their failure or breakage.

(7) Every passenger-service vehicle shall be fitted with a cautionary signal light (preferably amber in colour) which is automatically lit upon application of the service brake and is extinguished when such brake is again released. Such cautionary light shall be located near to the tail-light fitting

cautionary light shall be located near to the tan-light noting or may form part thereof, and shall show to the rearward.

(8) Unless the Authorized Officer in special circumstances approves otherwise, every service-car or service-coach shall—

(a) If intended to be used in a licensed passenger-service longer than half an hour after sunset, have provision for its front destination sign to be clearly illuminated.

(b) If actually used for half an hour after sunset have its front destination sign clearly illuminated.

## Steps.

36. (1) Steps for the assistance of passengers in entering and alighting from the passenger-service vehicle shall be placed to all outside doorways (except emergency doors) which do not reach within 1 ft. 4 in. of the surface of a level roadway. Steps must be safe and convenient, and sufficient means shall be provided by grip-handles to assist passengers using them.

(2) Unless the Authorized Officer approves otherwise, the distance of the lowest step above the surface of a level roadway must be not more than 1 ft. 4 in. with the passenger-service vehicle unloaded, or less than 10 in. with the passenger-service vehicle loaded, and the tire worn to its maximum degree. The rise between one step and the next shall not be greater than I ft. The treading-surface of any step shall not be less than I in. from front to back. Every step shall be provided and maintained with a suitable covering or tread-plate to prevent slipping, and shall be of the one continuous level for its full width at each doorway.

#### Miscellaneous Fittings.

37. (1) Buffers of a cushioning non-rigid type and fitted in a manner approved by the Authorized Officer shall be provided along the front of every passenger-service vehicle to reduce likelihood of injury to the vehicle or the passengers in the event of a collision, and likewise shall be provided along the rear end or at and about the two rear corners of every passenger-service vehicle, which is not provided with a begree real secretice. vehicle which is not provided with a baggage-rack accepted by the Authorized Officer as likely to serve the same purpose.

(2) An omnibus shall be so constructed, or side guards or other approved appliances shall be so fitted, that, save for any necessary steering-clearance, or essential clearance due to the nature of the road surface, persons are protected from falling under the vehicle from the sides.

### General Chassis Requirements.

38. (1) The springs shall be of ample strength and shall be so designed, constructed, and secured that when the passenger-service vehicle is travelling either fully or partially loaded it shall afford reasonable comfort to the passengers under average conditions of its service and route.

(2) The wheels shall not be so heavy or so equipped that

(2) The wheels shall not be so heavy or so equipped that more than reasonable strain is placed upon the steering-gear.

(3) The sum of the weight of the passenger-service vehicle body with its fittings and equipment and spare wheel or wheels, tools and other gear, fuel, oil, and water, the driver, passengers, and any other load that the chassis is, in the opinion of the Authorized Officer likely to carry in service, shall not exceed the maximum gross load that the chassis was classified by its maker to carry setaly in regular daily designed by its maker to carry safely in regular daily passenger-service.

passenger-service.

(4) The wheel-base, tires, steering-gear, overhang, and the loading of every passenger-service vehicle shall be such that skidding, pitching, or other improper movements shall be avoided so far as possible.

(5) In this and the next succeeding regulation "chassis" means the actual chassis that is proposed to be used as supplied by the manufacturer, with its original equipment and with its road-wheels fitted with tires complete (and of the

type, sizes, and construction intended for service on the finished ssenger-service vehicle), but does not include any of the

(a) The spare rim and tire or the spare wheel, as the case may be; or
(b) The tools, jacks, and such-like gear; or
(c) The special equipment such as external rack for baggage or the extra equipment such as collision-buffers; or

or the extra equipment such as collision-buffers; or (d) The fuel, oil, and water.

39. The Authorized Officer shall be supplied before inspection of the passenger-service vehicle (and before construction of the body) with a schedule in detail, describing the several parts included in each of the items (a), (b), (c), and (d) set out in clause (5) of the last preceding regulation, and the respective weights of each of such items shall be then supplied to the Authorized Officer or shall be specially obtained without delay if he so requires. In addition, the Authorized Officer shall be supplied, before inspection of the passenger-service vehicle (and before construction of the body), with the following information:—

(i) A copy of the maker's specifications, plans (to scale) and

(i) A copy of the maker's specifications, plans (to scale) and data covering the design, the strength or capacity, the dimensions and the weight of the chassis, and including the manufacturer's certified ordinary allowance for body-weight, his ordinary rating of the passenger-service vehicle in passengernis ordinary rating of the passenger-service vehicle in passenger-seating capacity, and the unit-weight allowance per passenger, the ordinary rating of the safe load on the chassis in pounds avoirdupois for regular daily passenger-service, and the maximum safe gross-load limit in pounds on the chassis when in daily service.

(ii) Complete information concerning the braking systems, steering-mechanism, gear ratios, and relative road speeds, engine revolutions at normal speed, battery capacity, nature or type of head-lamps, and the mechanical signalling device or devices (if any).

(iii) Plans (dimensional and drawn to scale) and specifications are recognized to design the design the nature and quality of metasical

(in) Plans (dimensional and drawn to scale) and specifications covering the design, the nature and quality of materials in the body, its fittings and equipment, together with the actual weight of the complete body with its fittings and equipment: Provided that if the body weight cannot be declared at the time an estimate of its weight shall be given. (iv) Any other information which the Authorized Officer may deem necessary.

#### PART III.

REGULATIONS APPLICABLE ONLY TO PASSENGER-TRUCKS.

# Drivers' Protection.

40. (1) Clause (6) of Regulation 7 hereof shall apply to

passenger-trucks.

(2) In a passenger-truck there shall be no avoidable obstruction of any nature whatsoever which may interfere with the driver's near or distant vision, whether in front or to the right or left.

Liquid Fuel.

41. Clauses (1) and (4) of Regulation 9 hereof shall apply to passenger-trucks.

Brakes.

42. Clauses (1), (2), and (3) of Regulation 10 hereof shall apply to passenger-trucks: Provided that in the case of a vehicle to be used only under a temporary license or for only a short period the Authorized Officer may, at his discretion, dispense with any of the requirements of the said clause 10 (1) if he is satisfied that the brakes are sufficiently safe and efficient in the circumstances.

# Tires.

43. Clauses (1) and (2) of Regulation 16 hereof shall apply to passenger-trucks.

Steering.

44. The steering-mechanism of a passenger-truck shall give reasonably sensitive control, and any ball-and-socket connection which in the opinion of the Authorized Officer requires the fitting of a keeper or retainer shall be so equipped.

#### Jacks.

45. One complete and efficient lifting-jack of an ordinary rated capacity equal at least to the tare weight of the vehicle shall be carried under the driver's seat in every passenger-truck or otherwise as approved by the Authorized Officer, and the jack shall be readily available without the use of a key.

46. Clauses (1) and (3) of Regulation 27 and clause (3) of Regulation 38 shall apply to passenger-trucks.

# General Body Requirements.

47. (1) Clause (2) of Regulation 33 shall apply to passenger-

trucks.

(2) Every passenger-truck shall be fitted with a body and cab securely and firmly fixed to the chassis. The floor of the body shall be of wood or other suitable approved material, and shall be unbroken and closely jointed through-

(3) The cab of every passenger-truck shall be fitted with a transparent front windshield, and shall be designed to give to the satisfaction of the Authorized Officer reasonable protection to the driver and the passengers (if any) from the

(4) The body of every passenger-truck (exclusive of the driver's cab) shall be constructed throughout—

(a) As a fixed "all-weather" unit, or as a self-contained walled and roofed structure attached to and readily detachable from the truck proper, as may be required by the owner; or

by the owner; or

(b) As a rigid framework with or without a sheet covering for weather protection enclosing the space to be occupied by the passengers; or

(c) With rigid guards, battens, or railings surrounding the space to be occupied by the passengers securely held to the floor, cab, or other fixed part of the vehicle, placed within 9 in. of the floor and reaching to a height of not less than 11½ in. above the floor as a protection for the passengers who may be seated on the floor, and when seats or forms are provided, the height to the top of the guard, battens, or railings shall be not less than 11½ in. above the level of the seat-board, while if passengers are to be carried on the floor between or among the seats intermediate railings or battens shall be provided so that the opening between adjacent railings or battens shall be not more than 9 in. from edge to edge; or

edge; or
(d) As any combination of the above types (a), (b), or (c)
approved of by the Authorized Officer.

(5) In every passenger-truck ready means for entry to and exit from the vehicle shall at all times be available to and exit from the vehicle shall at all times be available to the passengers, and if so required by the Authorized Officer, the place or places of entry and exit access shall be fitted with steps or other suitable means to give a convenient approach. When the body is as described in paragraph (a) or paragraph (b) of the last preceding clause at least two entry and exit ways shall be provided, one on the near side and the other either at the back or on the off side.

(6) If the passenger space is completely surrounded by material not readily able to be folded or opened for ventilation purposes, then provision for effective ventilation must be made in or near the roof.

#### Seating Accommodation.

Seating Accommodation.

48. (1) All passengers in a passenger-truck shall be carried in a seated position for which the necessary space or facilities must be available as hereinafter provided.

(2) Each adult passenger over sixteen years of age shall have at least 3½ sq. ft. of floor space if a seat is not provided, and at least 3 sq. ft. of floor space if a seat is provided. Each passenger under sixteen years of age, however seated, shall have not less than 2 sq. ft. of floor space.

(3) In every passenger-truck the seat in the front cab or driver's compartment shall provide for its full width not less than 1 ft. 4 in. in length for the driver and for each seated passenger.

passenger.

(4) Passenger-seating accommodation shall be provided only on one side of the driver of a passenger-truck.

(5) Any seats provided for passengers, exclusive of seats in the front cab or driver's compartment, shall fulfill the

following requirements:—

(a) Unless the Authorized Officer approves otherwise, the distance from the floor or floor-covering to the level of the top of the seat, with cushion (if any) uncompressed, shall be approximately 1 ft. 6 in., and the distance from the front to the back of the seat or the seat-board shall be not less than 9 in.

(b) For each passenger over sixteen years of age there shall be provided not less than 1 ft. 4 in. iv length of seat measured along the front edge of the seat or seat-board.
(c) All seats shall be of ample strength and shall be securely and rigidly fastened to the floor or the body of the vehicle.

# Maximum Passenger Accommodation.

49. The maximum passenger accommodation of a passenger-truck shall be determined by the Authorized Officer by computation of the seating and floor space available as provided in the last preceding regulation, and also by application of Regulation 46 hereof, so far as it applies.

## Miscellaneous.

50. (1) The following regulations shall apply to passenger-trucks: Regulations 17 (electric wires), 21 (protection from vibration), 22 (protection from breakages), 24 (spare wheel, tools, &c.), 28 (Motor-vehicles Act requirements), and 29 (inspection) hereof.

(2) To assist the Authorized Officer in identifying the vehicle, and in the inspection thereof, the owner thereof shall supply any information available or obtainable concerning the vehicle or its history which may be required by the Authorized Officer.

Stocks of Flour, Wheat, and Oats.

A CENSUS of stocks of flour, wheat, and oats in the Dominion was taken as at the 30th November, 1933, when the following quantities were returned: Flour, 13,841 tons; wheat, 3,891,706 bushels (including 3,341,940 bushels of milling wheat), and 1,448,603 bushels of oats. Returns were received covering all stocks owned or stored by millers, merchants, and farmers throughout the Dominion, with a few unimportant exceptions which would not appreciably affect the totals given.
