

HEREAS by the Public Works Act, 1928, it is enacted W that if at any time after the issue or making of any Proclamation taking land under this Act, and before the payment or award of any compensation in respect to the taking thereof, it is found that the land or any part thereof is not required for the purpose for which it was taken, the Governor-General may, by a subsequent Proclamation gazetted, revoke the former Proclamation, either wholly or

gazetted, revoke the former Proclamation, either wholly or so far as he thinks necessary:

And whereas it is found that part of the land taken for the purposes of the Waikato-Thames Railway, by a Proclamation made under the Public Works Act, 1882, dated the eighteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two (hereinafter termed "the said Proclamation"), and published in the New Zealand Gazette No. 8 of the twenty-sixth day of the same month, at page 1525, is not required for the purposes for which it was taken:

Now, therefore, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in me by the Public Works Act, 1928, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as affects the land described in the Schedule hereto.

Extension to New Zealand of Convention between the United | Kingdom and Austria respecting Legal Proceedings in Civil | and Commercial Matters.

IT is hereby notified for general information that the Convention between the United Kingdom and Austria regarding Legal Proceedings in Civil and Commercial Matters, signed at London on the 31st day of March, 1931, and in respect of which ratifications were exchanged at Vienna on the 12th day of January, 1932, has been extended to the Dominion of New Zealand pursuant to the provisions of Article 15 of the said Convention, as from the 25th day of July, 1932.

The Right Honourable Arthur Henderson, M.P., His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs; and

Who, having communicated their full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed as follows:—

I.—Preliminary.

(b) In this Convention the words—

(1) "Territory of one (or of the other) High Contracting Party" shall be interpreted as meaning at any time any of the territories of such High Contracting Party to which the Convention at that time applies;

II.—Service of Judicial and Extra-Judicial Documents. Article 2.

When judicial or extra-judicial documents drawn up in the territory of one of the High Contracting Parties are required by a judicial authority situated therein to be served on persons, partnerships, companies, societies, or other corporations in the territory of the other High Contracting Party, such documents may be served on the recipient whatever his nationality, in any of the ways provided in Articles 3 and 4.

(a) A request for service shall be addressed by a Diplomatic (a) A request for service shall be addressed by a Diplomatic or Consular Officer of the High Contracting Party from whose territory the documents to be served emanate, to the competent authority of the country where the documents are to be served, requesting such authority to cause the documents to be served. The request shall be sent by such Diplomatic or Consular Officer to such authority.

(b) The request for service shall be drawn up in the language of the country where service is to be effected.

The request for service shall state the names and descriptions of the parties, the name, description, and address of the recipient, and the nature of the document to be served, and shall enclose the documents to be served in duplicate.

(c) The document to be served shall either be drawn up in

the language of the country in which it is to be served, or be accompanied by a translation in such language. Such translation shall be certified as correct by a Diplomatic or Consular Officer of the High Contracting Party from whose territory the document emanates.

(d) Requests for service shall be addressed and sont—

(d) Requests for service shall be addressed and sent— In England, to the Senior Master of the Supreme Court of Judicature.

In Austria, to the Federal Ministry of Justice.

If the authority to whom a request for service has been sent is not competent to execute it, such authority shall of his own motion transmit the document to the competent

authority of his own country.

(e) Service shall be effected by the competent authority of (e) Service shall be elected by the competent authority of the country where the document is to be served, who shall serve the document in the manner prescribed by the municipal law of such country for the service of similar documents, except that, if a wish for some special manner of service is expressed in the request for service, such manner of service shall be followed in so far as it is not incompatible with the shall be followed in so far as it is not incompatible with the

law of that country.

law of that country.

(f) The execution of the request for service duly made in accordance with the preceding provisions of this Article shall not be refused unless (1) the authenticity of the request for service is not established, or (2) the High Contracting Party in whose territory it is to be effected considers that his sovereignty or safety would be compromised thereby.

(g) The authority by whom the request for service is executed shall furnish a certificate proving the service or explaining the reason which has prevented such service, and setting forth the fact, the manner, and the date of such service or attempted service, and shall send the said certificate to the Diplomatic

service, and shall send the said certificate to the Diplomatic or Consular Officer by whom the request for service was made. The certificate of service or of attempted service shall be placed on one of the duplicates or attached thereto.

Article 4.

(a) Any of the following methods of service may be used in the territory of either High Contracting Party, without any request to or intervention of the authorities of the country where service is to be effected in connection with judicial or extra-judicial documents drawn up in the territory of the other High Contracting Party:—

(1) Service by a Diplomatic or Consular Officer of the High Contracting Party from whose territory the document

emanates;
(2) Service by an agent appointed for the purpose either by the judicial authority by whom service of the document is required, or by the party on whose application the document was issued;

(3) Service through the postal channel;

(4) Any other mode of service recognized by the law existing at the time of service in the country from which the documents

at the time of service in the country from which the documents emanate.

(b) It is understood—

(1) That in none of the methods of service provided for in this article shall any measures of compulsion be employed;

(2) That the validity and effect of any such service will remain a matter for the determination of the respective Courts of the High Contracting Parties in accordance with their law.

(c) The High Contracting Parties agree that in principle it is desirable that documents served by any of these methods should, unless the recipient is a subject of the High Contracting should, unless the recipient is a subject of the High Contracting Party from whose territory the document to be served emanates, either be drawn up in the language of the country in which service is to be effected or accompanied by a translation into such language. Nevertheless, in the absence of any legislation in their respective territories making translations obligatory in such cases, the High Contracting Parties do not accept any obligation in this respect.

(a) In any case where documents have been served in accordance with the provisions of Article 3, the High Contracting Party, by whose Diplomatic or Consular Officer the request for service is addressed, shall pay to the other High Contracting Party any charges and expenses which are payable under the law of the country where the service is effected to the persons employed to effect service, and any charges and expenses incurred in effecting service in a special manner. These charges and expenses shall not exceed such as are usually allowed in the Courts of that country.

(b) Repayment of these charges and expenses shall be claimed by the competent authority by whom the service has been effected from the Diplomatic or Consular Officer by whom the request was addressed when sending to him the certificate provided for in Article 3 (g).

(c) Except as provided above, no fees of any description shall be payable by one High Contracting Party to the other in respect of the service of any documents. (a) In any case where documents have been served in

III .- TAKING OF EVIDENCE.

Article 6.

When a judicial authority in the territory of one of the High Contracting Parties requires that evidence should be taken in the territory of the other High Contracting Party, such evidence may be taken, whatever the nationality of the parties, in any one of the ways prescribed in Articles 7 and 8.

Article 7.

(a) The judicial authority by whom the evidence is required may, in accordance with the provisions of its law, address itself by means of "Letters of Request" to the competent

itself by means of "Letters of Request" to the competent authority of the country where the evidence is to be taken, requesting such authority to take the evidence.

(b) The "Letter of Request" shall be drawn up in the language of the country where the evidence is to be taken, or be accompanied by a translation in such language. Such translation shall be certified as correct by a Diplomatic or Consular Officer of the High Contracting Party from whose judicial authority the request emanates. The "Letters of Request" shall state the nature of the proceedings for which the evidence is required, the names and descriptions of the Request" shall state the nature of the proceedings for which the evidence is required, the names and descriptions of the parties thereto, and the names, descriptions, and addresses of the witnesses. They shall also either be accompanied by a list of interrogatories to be put to the witness or witnesses, or, as the case may be, by a description of the documents, samples, or other objects to be produced and identified, and a translation thereof certified as correct in the manner heretofore provided, or shall request the competent authority to

totore provided, or snall request the competent authority to allow such questions to be asked viva voce as the parties or their representatives shall desire to ask.

(c) The "Letters of Request" shall be transmitted—
In England by an Austrian Diplomatic or Consular Officer to the Senior Master of the Supreme Court of Judicature.

In Austria by a British Consular Officer to the Federal

In Austria by a British Consular Officer to the Federal Ministry of Justice.

In case the authority to whom "Letters of Request" are transmitted is not competent to execute them, he shall forward them without any further request to the competent authority

them without any further request to the competent authority of his own country.

(d) The competent authority to whom the "Letters of Request" are transmitted or forwarded shall give effect thereto and obtain the evidence required by the use of the same compulsory measures and the same procedure as are employed in the execution of a commission or order emanating from the authorities of his own country except that, if a wish that some special procedure should be followed is expressed in the "Letters of Request," such special procedure shall be followed in so far as it is not incompatible with the law of the country where the evidence is to be taken.

country where the evidence is to be taken.

(e) The Diplomatic or Consular Officer, by whom the "Letters of Request" are transmitted, shall, if he so desires. "Letters of Request " are transmitted, shall, if he so desires, be informed of the date and place where the proceedings will take place, in order that he may inform the interested party or parties, who shall be permitted to be present in person or to be represented if they so desire by any persons competent to appear before the Courts of either of the countries concerned."

(f) The execution of the "Letters of Request" can only be refused—

(1) If the authenticity of the "Letters of Request" is not (2) If in the country where the evidence is to be taken the

(2) If in the country where the evidence is to be taken the execution of the "Letters of Request" in question does not fall within the functions of the judiciary;
(3) If the High Contracting Party in whose territory the evidence is to be taken considers that his sovereignty or safety would be compromised thereby.
(g) In every instance where the "Letters of Request" are not executed by the authority to whom they are addressed, the latter will at once inform the Diplomatic or Consular Officer by whom they were transmitted, stating the grounds on which the execution of the "Letters of Request" has been refused, or the judicial authority to whom they have been forwarded. been forwarded.

Article 8.

(a) The evidence may also be taken, without any request to or intervention of the authorities of the country in which it is to be taken, by a person in that country directly appointed for the purpose by the Court by whom the evidence is required. A Diplomatic or Consular Officer of the High Contracting Party whose Court requires the evidence or any other suitable person may be so appointed.

(b) A person so appointed to take evidence may request the

(b) A person so appointed.

(b) A person so appointed to take evidence may request the individuals named by the Court appointing him to appear before him and give evidence, or to produce any document, sample, or other object. He may take all kinds of evidence which are not contrary to the law of the country where the which are not contrary to the law of the country where the evidence is being taken and shall have power to administer an oath, but he shall have no compulsory powers. False testimony given before a person appointed to take evidence in accordance with this article shall be punishable in the Courts of the country for which the evidence is required in the same manner as if such testimony had been given before a Court of such country.

(c) Requests to appear issued by such person shall, unless the recipient is a subject of the High Contracting Party for whose judicial authority the evidence is required, be drawn up

in the language of the country where the evidence is to be

in the language of the country where the evidence is to be taken, or be accompanied by a translation into such language.

(d) The evidence may be taken in accordance with the procedure recognized by the law of the country for whose judicial authority the evidence is required, and the parties will have the right to be present or to be represented by any persons competent to appear before the Courts of either of the countries concerned.

Article 9.

The fact that an attempt to take evidence by the method aid down in Article 8 has failed, owing to the refusal of any witness to appear, to give evidence, or to produce documents, samples, or other objects, does not preclude a request being subsequently made in accordance with Article 7.

Article 10.

(a) Where evidence is taken in the manner provided in Article 7, the High Contracting Party by whose judicial authority the "Letters of Request" are addressed shall repay to the other High Contracting Party any expenses incurred by the competent authority of the latter in the execution of the request in respect of any charges and expenses payable to witnesses, experts, interpreters, or translators, the costs of obtaining the attendance of witnesses who have not costs of obtaining the attendance of witnesses who have not appeared voluntarily, and the charges and expenses payable to any person whom such authority may have deputed to act in cases where the law of his own country permits this to be done, and any charges and expenses incurred by reason of a special procedure being requested and followed. These expenses shall be such as are usually allowed in similar cases in the Courts of the country where the evidence has been

taken.

(b) The repayment of these expenses shall be claimed by the competent authority by whom the "Letters of Request" have been executed from the Diplomatic or Consular Officer by whom they were transmitted when sending to him the documents establishing their execution.

(c) Except as above provided, no fees of any description shall be payable by one High Contracting Party to the other in respect of the taking of evidence.

IV .- JUDICIAL ASSISTANCE FOR POOR PERSONS: IMPRISON-MENT FOR DEBT AND SECURITY FOR COSTS.

Article 11.

The subjects of one High Contracting Party shall enjoy in the territory of the other High Contracting Party a perfect equality of treatment with subjects of that High Contracting Party as regards free judicial assistance for poor persons and imprisonment for debt; and, provided that they are resident in any such territory, shall not be compelled to give security for costs in any case where a subject of such other High Contracting Party would not be so compelled.

V.—GENERAL PROVISIONS.

Article 12.

Any difficulties which may arise in connection with the operation of this Convention shall be settled through the diplomatic channel.

Article 13.

The present Convention of which the English and German texts are equally authentic, shall be subject to ratification. Ratifications shall be exchanged in Vienna. The Convention shall come into force one month after the date on which ratifications are exchanged and shall remain in force for three years after the date of its coming into force. If neither of the High Contracting Parties shall have given notice through the diplomatic channel to the other not less than six months before the expiration of the said period of three years of his intention to terminate the Convention, it shall remain in force until the expiration of six months from the day on which either of the High Contracting Parties shall have given notice to terminate it. The present Convention of which the English and German to terminate it.

Article 14.

Article 14.

(a) This Convention shall not apply ipso facto to Scotland or Northern Ireland, nor to any of the Colonies or Protectorates of His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland, and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, nor to any territories under His suzerainty, nor to any mandated territories administered by His Government in the United Kingdom, but His Majesty may at any time, while the Convention is in force under Article 13, by a notification given through His Minister at Vienna, extend the operation of this Convention to any of the above-mentioned territories.

(b) Such notification shall state the authorities in the territory concerned to whom requests for service or for the taking of evidence are to be transmitted, and the language in which communications and translations are to be made.

The date of the coming into force of any such extension shall be one month from the date of such notification.

(c) Either of the High Contracting Parties may, at any time after the expiry of three years from the coming into force of an extension of this Convention to any of the territories referred to in paragraph (a) of this Article, terminate such extension on giving six months' notice of termination through the diplomatic channel. the diplomatic channel.

(d) The termination of the Convention under Article 13 shall, unless otherwise expressly agreed to by both High Contracting Parties, *ipso facto* terminate it in respect of any territories to which it has been extended under paragraph (a)

of this Article.

Article 15.

(a) The High Contracting Parties agree that His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland, and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, may at any time, while the present Convention is in force, either under Article 13 or by virtue of any accession under this Article, by a notification by virtue of any accession under this Article, by a notification given through the diplomatic channel, accede to the present Convention in respect of any Member of the British Commonwealth of Nations, whose Government may desire that such accession should be effected, provided that no notification of accession may be given at any time when the Federal President of the Republic of Austria has given notice of termination in respect of all the territories of His Majesty to which the Convention applies. The provisions of Article 14 (b) shall be applicable to any such notification. Any such accession shall take effect one month from the date of its notification.

(b) After the expiry of three years from the date of the

shall take effect one month from the date of its notification.

(b) After the expiry of three years from the date of the coming into force of any accession under paragraph (a) of this Article either of the High Contracting Parties may, by giving a six months' notice of termination through the diplomatic channel, terminate the application of the Convention to any country in respect of which a notification of accession has been given. The termination of the Convention under Article 13 shall not affect its application to any such country.

(c) Any notification of accession under paragraph (a) of this Article may include any dependency or mandated territory administered by the Government of the country in respect of which such notification of accession is given; and any notice of termination in respect of any such country under paragraph (b) shall apply to any dependency or mandated territory which was included in the notification of accession in respect of that country.

Character: The occulting light with white and red sectors will be replaced by a group flashing light, with white and red sectors, showing four flashes every twenty seconds, thus: Flash, 0.23 sec.; eclipse, 2.43 sec.; flash, 0.23 sec.; eclipse, 2.43 sec.; flash, 0.23 sec.;

Power: The power of the white light will be increased from 35,000 candles to 608,000 candles, and that of the red

light from 14,000 candles to 243,200 candles.

Visibility: The range of the white light will remain unaltered at 22 miles, but that of the red light will be increased from 12 miles to 22 miles.

NOTE.—In other respects the light will remain unaltered.

Temporary Light: The existing occulting light with white and red sectors will be extinguished on 13th March, 1934, and from 13th March to 17th March, inclusive, while alterations are in progress a temporary light with white and red sectors of low power visible 17 miles and having the same character as the new light will be exhibited from the balcony of the lighthouse tower. lighthouse tower.

Note.—A cold, dry, and sunny month, with precipitation 46 per cent. below the mean of previous years. Total bright sunshine, 211 hours, 49 per cent. of the possible, and one sunless day. Frost was recorded on the grass on the morning of the 23rd. Mean dew-point at 9 a.m., 47.8°; and mean vapour pressure, 0.332 in.

Notes on the Weather for November, 1933.

General.—From the meteorological point of view November was a quiet month. Southerly or south-easterly winds were unusually prevalent and were responsible for temperatures being rather on the cold side. There was a better distribution of rainfall than in October, but Nelson and Marlborough again experienced a serious shortage, and are suffering drought conditions. Elsewhere, though supplies are not so abundant in the Waikato and Taranaki districts as last year, there is generally an abundance of pasture. Stock are in good condition, milk-yields are above normal, and in most districts lambs are fattening well. The heavy rains in Canterbury in the early part of the month saved the situation, particularly as regards wheat crops. On the whole, however, crops do not seem to be doing quite so well as last year. The late frosts of the 22nd and 23rd caused serious losses of potatoes, tomatoes, spring vegetables, and small fruits.

Rainfall.—Rainfall was above average north of Auckland, in the Bay of Plenty, and eastern districts of the North Island, and in most of Canterbury and Otago. In the Waikato, Taranaki, the Manawatu, the Wairarapa, Westland, Southland, and particularly Nelson and Marlborough, it was considerably below average. There was an absence of warm north-westerly rains.

Temperatures.—Temperatures were above normal from Auckland northwards and west of the ranges in the North Island, but east of the main range they were below. The Hawke's Bay and Poverty Bay areas had very cold weather for the time of year. In the South Island, Central Otago had a warm month but the remainder a cold one. The frosts of the 22nd and 23rd were unusually severe for so late in the season. In South Canterbury and Otago that of the 22nd was the more severe, but thence northwards, in North Canterbury, Marlborough, Wellington, and Hawke's Bay, it was on the 23rd that the damage was done.

Sunshine.—There was less sunshine than usual over the greater part of the North Island, and especially the east coast, owing to the dull weather brought by the persistent southerly and south-easterly winds. From Wellington southwards, however, the normal was exceeded at most places by large amounts. Lake Tekapo recorded 285.5, Nelson 271.0, and Blenheim 254.0 hours.

Pressure Systems.—During the first three days pressure was high and the weather fine. On the afternoon of the 2nd, however, during a heat thunderstorm at Omata, near New Plymouth, a Maori was struck by lightning and killed, a rare occurrence in New Zaland.

Between the 3rd and the 6th a cyclone moved down from the north on to New Zealand, becoming more extensive in the process. This storm produced general rains which were of very great value to the country. The heaviest fell on the 5th when the storm was in the form of an irregular cyclone covering the central portion of the Dominion. The principal wheat-growing areas of Canterbury received between $2\frac{1}{2}$ and 5 in. Large amounts were recorded also in eastern Otago and in Hawke's Bay. In the latter district there were heavy thunderstorms. Though cold weather followed it, and there was snow on the high levels, especially in Canterbury, the rain was a fairly mild one. North Auckland had heavy rain in the early part of this

About a week later, on the 11th to 12th, another depression caused widespread rain, Canterbury again having heavy falls. This depression was of the westerly type, but a cyclone developed in its northern portion.

The third storm system occurred between the 20th and 24th. Following the passage of a westerly depression on the night of the 20th, a series of cyclones developed over the northern part of the Tasman Sea and passed to the north of the Dominion. Rains were again fairly general, but the parts principally affected were the northern and eastern portions of the North Island. From the morning of the 22nd cold southerly or south-easterly winds prevailed over the greater part of the country. A somewhat similar type of weather was experienced from the 27th to the 30th, but on this occasion there was very little rain in the South Island and the cold was, much less severe.

(d) Common prostitutes and persons who habitually consort with thieves or persons who have no lawful visible means of support.

(e) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house breaking or pocket picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues, and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908: Provided
