Regulations under the Rabbit Nuisance Act, 1928, relating to the Destruction of Rabbits in the Kiwitahi Rabbit District.— (Notice No. Ag. 3160.)

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 10th day of January, 1934.

THE RIGHT HON. G. W. FORBES PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the Rabbit Nuisance Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations relating to the destruction of rabbits in the district under the jurisdiction of the Kiwitahi Rabbit Board, and doth hereby declare that the regulations hereby made shall come into force on the date of the publication of this Order in Council in the *Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations, unless inconsistent with the context,—
 “Board” means the Kiwitahi Rabbit Board established under the Rabbit Nuisance Act, 1928 :
 “Inspector” means the person for the time being authorized to act as Rabbit Inspector to the Board :
 “Owner” shall have the meaning ascribed to the word “owner” in section 2 of the said Act :
 “Notice” means a notice to destroy rabbits on private land issued by the Inspector pursuant to section 6 of the said Act.
2. Every owner on whom a notice is served shall carry out or cause to be carried out to the satisfaction of the Inspector an effective poisoning over all infested portions of the land to which such notice refers, and shall, immediately after such poisoning, take or cause to be taken all reasonable steps to fill in all burrows on such land, and forthwith after the filling in of such burrows shall, to the satisfaction of the Inspector, fumigate or cause to be fumigated all fresh burrows and reopened burrows.
3. Notwithstanding the provisions of Regulation 5 hereof all trapping, shooting, hunting, or dogging of rabbits shall, not later than seven days after the service of any notice served after the gazettement of these regulations, cease on all land in respect of which notice has been served ; and thereafter for a period of three months no owner of any such land nor any other person shall trap, shoot, hunt, or dog, or permit or suffer to be trapped, shot, hunted, or dogged, any rabbits on such land except with the written permission of the Board and subject to the conditions specified therein.
4. Notwithstanding the provisions of Regulation 2 hereof the Inspector may, in respect of any land to which any of the said provisions are not conveniently applicable, authorize in writing signed by him the employment of any other method or methods of rabbit-destruction ; and compliance with the method or methods specified in any such authority shall be deemed a compliance with these regulations.
5. The Board may in the months of January or February in any year publicly notify, by notice published twice in some one or more newspapers circulating in the Kiwitahi Rabbit District, that all trapping, shooting, hunting, or dogging of rabbits within the said district is prohibited for a period of three months from a date to be specified in such notice (being a date not earlier than seven days after the first publication of such notice), and, except with the written permission of the Board and subject to the conditions specified therein, no owner nor any other person shall during the period so specified trap, shoot, hunt, or dog, or permit to be trapped, shot, hunted, or dogged, any rabbits within the said district.
6. Every person committing a breach of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

to be a Commission to inquire into and report upon tendencies and developments apparent in the Dominion in relation to the promotion, financial methods, control, and

operations of companies and other corporations which seek to raise capital and loan funds in the Dominion and particularly—

- (1) (a) The methods of promotion and administration of such companies including their subsidiary companies and syndicates :
- (b) The scheme of control of such companies and the relative powers and right of promoters, subscribers of shares, and subscribers of debenture, bond, or security certificate issues :
- (c) The financial schemes of such companies with particular reference to the relative application of the companies' and bondholders' property and funds to (1) remuneration and profits to promoters and subsidiary companies, (2) formation, working and administration expenses, and (3) protection and furtherance of the interests of holders of long-term debentures, bonds, security certificates, and like instruments or securities :
- (d) Whether the benefits which may be found at present to accrue to promoters or shareholders in bond-issuing companies through the surrender or forfeiture of bonds should be applied and credited to bondholders' funds in the particular group or series of any such bonds surrendered or forfeited, or otherwise :
- (e) Whether the provisions of the Companies Act, 1933, relating to prospectuses and otherwise requiring disclosure of material contracts and transactions and prospective contracts and transactions are reasonably adequate to protect intending investors in shares, debentures, bonds, security certificates, and other like instruments :
- (2) (a) The financial structure of financial investment and trust companies, and as to whether any additional legislative provision should be made to afford investors a greater measure of protection for their capital moneys and other interests in such companies :
- (b) The desirability of regulating in the public interest the formation and operation of trust companies and investment companies dealing in company shares, Government, local body, and other forms of security.
- (3) The operation of the present statute governing the constitution and registration of stock exchanges in New Zealand ;

and generally what steps, if any, should be taken by way of modifying existing statute law and regulations thereunder having regard to the present and prospective welfare of the investing public and the community generally :

And with the like advice and consent I do further appoint you

John Saxon Barton

to be Chairman of the said Commission :

And for the better enabling you, the said Commission, to carry these presents into effect, you are hereby authorized and empowered to make and conduct any inquiry under these presents at such places as you may deem advisable and at such times as you may deem expedient, with power to adjourn from time to time and from place to place as you think fit, and to call before you and examine on oath or otherwise, as may be allowed by law, such person or persons as you think capable of affording information in the premises ; and you are also empowered to call for and examine all such books or records as you deem likely to afford you the fullest information on the subject-matter of the inquiry hereby directed to be made, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all lawful means whatsoever :

And, using all diligence, you are required to submit a report to me under your hands and seals not later than the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, of your opinion as to the aforesaid matters :

And you are hereby strictly charged and directed that you shall not at any time publish or otherwise disclose, save to me in pursuance of these presents or by my direction, the contents or purport of any report so made or to be made by you :

And it is hereby declared that these presents shall continue in full force and virtue although the inquiry is not regularly continued from time to time or from place to place by adjournment.

WHEREAS the Hawke's Bay Rivers Board (hereinafter referred to as "the Board") has from time to time executed works for the control of flood-waters of the Tutaekuri River and now proposes to execute the Tutaekuri flood-control works described in the Hawke's Bay Rivers Amendment Act, 1930, as amended by the Hawke's Bay Rivers Amendment Act, 1932-33 (which works already executed and to be executed are hereinafter referred to as "the works"):

And whereas the cost to the Board of the portions of the works already executed amounts to the sum of £33,000: And whereas the cost of the portions of the works to be executed has been estimated at the sum of £112,000, comprised of the sum of £16,000 for the Washout Traffic Bridge and £96,000 for the remainder of the works to be executed: And whereas arrangements have been made for the Unemployment Board to contribute a sum estimated at £24,000 towards the cost of labour, the Minister of Public Works to contribute approximately £36,000, and the Main Highways Board to contribute one-half of the cost of the Washout Traffic Bridge: And whereas the balance of the cost to be provided in accordance with the provisions of the Hawke's Bay Rivers Act, 1919, and amendments, is estimated to be £8,000 for the Washout Traffic Bridge and £36,000 for the remainder of the works to be executed: And whereas it appears that the works are safeguarding or will safeguard from damage public highways and other public works under the control and management of the Hawke's Bay County Council (hereinafter called "the County Council") and property of the County Council: And whereas it appears that the works are safeguarding or will safeguard from damage harbour works and other works made or maintained or proposed to be made or maintained by the Napier Harbour Board (hereinafter called "the Harbour Board") and property of the Harbour Board, and are reclaiming or otherwise improving or will reclaim or otherwise improve lands belonging to the Harbour Board: And whereas it appears that certain areas within the Borough of Napier but outside the Hawke's Bay Rivers District are deriving or will certainly derive benefit from the works: And whereas no preliminary agreement for apportioning the cost of the works has been made between the Board and the County Council, or between the Board and the Harbour Board, or between the Board and the Napier Borough Council: And whereas the Board could not agree with the said County Council, Harbour Board, and Napier Borough Council, respectively, as to what proportion of the said cost was fairly chargeable to each of them or upon the said areas: And whereas the Board applied under sections 16 and 17 of the Hawke's Bay Rivers Act, 1919, for the cost of the works to be apportioned between the Board and the said County Council, Harbour Board, and Napier Borough Council: And whereas by Warrant dated the 29th day of November, 1933, John Saxon Barton, Esquire, Stipendiary Magistrate, of Wellington, was appointed a Commissioner to hold an inquiry into the matters in dispute between the Board and the County Council, the Harbour Board, and the Napier Borough Council, respectively, and to report to me what is a fair and reasonable proportion of the cost of the works to be paid by each of them: And whereas such inquiry was held at Napier on the 4th day of December, 1933: And whereas the said John Saxon Barton did report to me concerning the said matters on the 7th day of December, 1933:

Now, therefore, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in me by the Hawke's Bay Rivers Act, 1919, and of every other power in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby determine the said matters as follows:—

1. The sum of £33,000, being the cost of works already executed, shall be borne wholly by the Board.

2. The cost of the Washout Traffic Bridge, after deducting the contributions from the Main Highways Board, shall be apportioned equally between the Board and the County Council.

3. The cost of the works to be executed, excluding the Washout Traffic Bridge, shall, after deducting all contributions, grants-in-aid, and subsidies from other sources, be paid by the bodies listed hereunder in the same proportions as the sums respectively set opposite their names bear to the sum of £36,000.
