ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 25th day of January, 1934.

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. J. G. COATES PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the lands and licenses or interests in land described in the second column of the Schedule hereto are lands and licenses or interests in land in Western Samoa belonging to the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints: And whereas such lands and licenses or interests in land have been granted or acquired and are now registered

in the Land Register of Western Samoa in the respective volumes and folios thereof set out in the third column of the said Schedule in the several names respectively appearing in the first column of the said Schedule opposite to the descriptions of the said several lands contained in the second column of the said Schedule: And whereas none of such names represents any existing person or body corporate: And whereas it is expedient that all such lands should be vested in the Corporation of the Presiding Bishop of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints, a corporation sole created and existing under the laws of the State of Utah, United States of America, and carrying on business there and in Pesega in Western Samoa and elsewhere: And whereas legislation is necessary to enable such lands to be so vested:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, and in pursuance of the authority to make regulations for the peace, order, and good government of Samoa conferred upon him by the Samoa Act, 1921, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Samoa Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints Order, 1934, and shall come into force on the first day of February, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-four.

2. The several freehold lands and licenses or interests in land described in the second column of the Schedule which belong to the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints and which are registered in the Land Register of Western Samoa in the respective names appearing in the first column of the Schedule under the respective references appearing in the third column of the Schedule shall vest in and be held by the Corporation of the Presiding Bishop of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints, a corporation sole created and existing under the laws of the State of Utah, United States of America, and the successors and assigns for ever of the said corporation sole, subject, nevertheless, to all such encumbrances and other interests, if any, as the same are now subject to, and subject to the trusts and purposes for which such lands may have been granted or acquired.

3. The provisions of the Companies Ordinance, 1920, relating to foreign companies shall apply to the said corporation sole.

Land permanently reserved in the Auckland Land District for the Preservation of Native Fauna and Flora.

BLEDISLOE, Governor-General.

WHEREAS by the three-hundred-and-fifty-ninth section of the Land Act, 1921, it is enacted that the Governor-General may from time to time set apart temporarily as reserves, notwithstanding that the same may be then held under pastoral license, any Crown lands which in his opinion are required for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned:

And whereas by the three-hundred-and-sixtieth section of the said Act it is provided that land temporarily reserved under the said three-hundred-and-fifty-ninth section may, at the expiration of one month, but not later than six months, after the publication in the *Gazette* of notice of such temporary reservation, be permanently reserved, and that notice of such permanent reservation shall be published in the *Gazette*:

And whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto was, by Warrant dated the second day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, and published in the *Gazette* of the seventh day of that month, temporarily reserved under the authority of the said Act for the preservation of native fauna and flora:

Now, therefore, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the said Act, do hereby permanently reserve the land described in the Schedule hereto for the preservation of native fauna and flora for which the said land was so temporarily reserved as aforesaid.

Authorizing the Laying-off of Roads of less Width than 66 ft.

Notice under the Shops and Offices Act, 1921-22, prohibiting the Sale within the Borough of Northcote and the Town Districts of Glen Eden and Papatoetoe of certain Goods comprised in the Trade of a Butcher.

WHEREAS petitions in writing, signed by a majority of the occupiers of all the butchers' shops within each of the following districts—namely, the Borough of Northcote and the Town Districts of Glen Eden and Papatoetoe—have been forwarded to me, desiring that the sale of certain goods comprised in the trade of a butcher—namely, fresh meat, other than pork—be prohibited during such time as the said shops are required to be closed in pursuance of the Shops and Offices Act, 1921-22:

And whereas I, Adam Hamilton, Minister of Labour, am satisfied that the sale of the said goods is comprised in the trade of a butcher within each of the said districts, and that the signatures to such petitions represent a majority of the occupiers of all the said shops within each of the said districts:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of section 33 of the said Act, I do hereby direct that on and after the 26th day of February, 1934, the sale of the said goods within each of the following districts—namely, the Borough of Northcote and the Town Districts of Glen Eden and Papatoetoe—shall be and is hereby prohibited as follows: On Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, Fridays, and Saturdays, after the hour of 4.30 p.m.

THE following estimated average yields per acre of wheat, oats, and barley for the season 1933-34 have been compiled from reports furnished by Stock Inspectors of the Department of Agriculture throughout the Dominion, and are now published for general information.

The above estimates may be compared with last season's actual average yields, which were: Wheat, 36-54 bushels; oats, 44-16 bushels; and barley, 34-34 bushels.

In accordance with the above estimates, the total yield of wheat for the season 1933-34 should be approximately 8,500,000 bushels, as against an actual yield of 11,054,972 bushels for the season 1932-33.

The area from which oats were threshed for the five seasons ending with 1932-33 averaged 24 per cent. of the total area under that crop. Assuming that a similar proportion is threshed this year, the total yield of grain should be approximately 3,200,000 bushels, as against an actual yield of 5,132,183 bushels for the season 1932-33.

On a similar assumption in regard to barley, the total yield of grain should be approximately 650,000 bushels, as against an actual yield of 561,017 bushels for the season 1932-33.

THE WAIMAKARIRI RIVER IMPROVEMENT AMENDMENT ACT, 1933 (LOCAL).

PUBLIC notice is hereby given that the above Act was passed on the 20th day of December, 1933.

By the Act the Waimakariri River Trust is directed within two calendar months of the passing of the Act to publish in the *Gazette* and also publicly notify the general purport of sections 12 to 24 thereof, and to send a copy of such notice by ordinary post to all persons who it is reasonable to suppose are or may be interested in the lands affected. The following is the general purport of the above sections: The Waimakariri River Trust, on lodging a memorial with the District Land Registrar at Christchurch within twelve calendar months after the passing of the Act, and complying with any requisitions by him, is entitled to apply to be registered proprietor of an estate in fee-simple in respect of any of the lands generally described in the First Schedule to the Act.

Any such claim must be served upon the Trust within six months after the posting of the notice above referred to by the District Land Registrar, otherwise it ceases.

The procedure on any such claims is as nearly as may be the same as on claims under Part III of the Public Works Act, 1928.

The Trust is empowered by memorial to the District Land Registrar to abandon any of its rights under the Act, and on such abandonment any claim for compensation abates, except as to costs awarded by the Court, and the land shall then revert in the previous owners.
