Declaring Portions of Railway Land between Windsor Junction and Tapui to be Crown Land.

[L.S.] BLEDISLOE, Governor-General.
A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section thirty-five of the Public Works Act, 1928, it is provided that in the case of any land taken, purchased, or acquired for a Government work and not required for that purpose, the Governor-General may, on recommendation by the Minister, by Proclamation declare such land to be Crown land subject to the Land Act, 1924, and thereupon the land may be administered and disposed of under that Act accordingly:

Now, therefore, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by section thirty-five of the Public Works Act, 1928, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare the land described in the Schedule hereto to be Crown land subject to the Land Act, 1924.

ALTERATION AND RECONSTITUTION OF LOCAL DISTRICTS.

WHEREAS by section 2 of the Public Trust Office Amendment Act, 1921-22, it is enacted that the Public Trustee may, by notice in the *Gazette*, from time to time establish and define, abolish, alter, and reconstitute local districts for the purposes of the said Act:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and in exercise of the before-mentioned powers, I, John William Macdonald, the Public Trustee for the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby alter and reconstitute the local districts controlled by the District Public Trustees at Hamilton and New Plymouth as set out hereunder:—

Local Districts of Hamilton and New Plymouth.

The following area has been removed from the control of the District Public Trustee at Hamilton and placed under the control of the District Public Trustee at New Plymouth. All that area in the Auckland Land District, the boundaries of which are more particularly described as follows: Commencing at the mouth of the Waikaukau River in Block IX, Whareorino Survey District, and proceeding generally easterly along the said river to the northern boundary of Kinohaku West E 1D 2A; thence north-easterly along the northern boundaries of the said 1D 2A, 1D 2B 2, 1D 2B 1, and Part 1E to the western boundary of Section 5, all in Block X, Whareorino Survey District; thence southerly along the western boundaries of Sections 5 and 7, and easterly along the southern boundary of the said Section 7 (both being in Block X, Whareorino Survey District) to the western boundary of Section 3, Block XI, of the said survey district; thence southerly along the western boundary of the said Section 3 to its south-western corner; thence easterly generally along the southern boundary of the Whareorino Survey District to the middle of the Awakino River; thence south-easterly generally along the middle of the said river to the Awakino-Te Kuiti Road; thence north-easterly along the south-east side of the said road to the westernmost corner of Maboenui 2 No. 5B 2; thence south-easterly along the south-west boundaries of the said Sections 2 No. 5B 2 and 2 No. 5B 1 to the south-eastern boundary of the last-mentioned lot; thence north-easterly along the said boundary to the Waipotipoti Stream; thence generally easterly along the said stream to its confluence with the Mokau River; thence generally southerly and westerly along the middle of the said river to the Tasman Sea; thence northerly along the sea-coast to the mouth of the Waikaukau River, the point of commencement.

NOTE.—With the exception of a cold and stormy spell which followed Christmas, December was a month of pleasant summer weather, very dry, with abundant sunshine, and with temperatures somewhat above the average. Total bright sunshine, 252.3 hours, 54 per cent. of the possible, and two sunless days. Precipitation was 69 per cent. below the normal. Hail fell on the 28th and 29th, lightning was seen on the 24th, and thunder was heard on the 24th and 29th. Mean dew-point at 9 a.m., 51.4°; and mean vapour pressure, 0.379 in.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR DECEMBER, 1933.

General.—The first half of December was very dry and warm, many parts of the country having no rain at all. In Marlborough, especially, and to only a slightly less extent in Nelson, the situation prior to the 17th was very serious, and although some good rains fell thereafter, they were too late to save large areas of crops. Pastures are generally in the dry condition usual about a month later in the summer. Canterbury had better rains than most districts, and though the wheat yield will be lighter than last year, an ample growth of pasture seems assured. Generally speaking, milk yields have fallen off somewhat owing to the absence of green growth, but otherwise there is no lack of feed at present and stock are in good condition. Lambs are going early to the freezers, but in some parts of the South Island, especially, are small. Haymaking and shearing have been carried out under favourable circumstances. The hot and dry weather was accompanied by some strong winds, while the cold, stormy conditions occurring during the rains did an amount of damage which is difficult to determine. The season, therefore, has been by no means ideal for crops.

Rainfall.—There were some heavy falls in eastern districts of the North Island on the 1st, but otherwise it was extremely dry until the 16th. From then onwards stormy and wet weather prevailed, and the situation was considerably improved. Over most of the North Island, however, the total rain for the month was much below average. There were some exceptions in South Taranaki, Hawke's Bay, and the East Cape districts. In the South Island there was still a deficit at the end of the month in northern Nelson and Marlborough and in southern coastal districts. In Canterbury, Westland, and much of the interior of Otago, on the other hand, the normal was exceeded, and the soil is in a satisfactory condition.

Temperatures.—Owing to the high temperatures of the first half of the month the cold weather of the last seven or eight days was not sufficient to lower the average below the normal for December. Though the mean temperature was everywhere above normal, it was in the interior and in Westland that the warmth was especially marked. Some frosts occurred during the last week, especially in the interior of the South Island.

Sunshine.—Except at scattered places in eastern districts, sunshine was generally considerably above the average. Nelson had 320.3 hours, Blenheim 304.7, and Lake Tekapo 296.0 hours.

Storm Systems.—The month opened with high pressure over New Zealand, but a series of small cyclones passing to the east of the Dominion on a south-easterly course was responsible for the prevalence of southerly winds and cool temperatures during the first day or two. Between the 5th and the 7th a shallow westerly depression passed but produced very little rain. Following another spell of high pressure, there was a second shallow depression on the 10th, but again scarcely any rain resulted.

The third depression, however, which dominated the weather between the 15th and 18th, was much more vigorous. It produced practically general rains with many heavy falls, and marked the end of the drought. In Westland the rain was very heavy and some flooding occurred. There were several washouts on roads and railways.

The next storm was experienced between the 21st and 24th. It became very deep after crossing New Zealand, and was followed by strong southerlies which were responsible for a cold Christmas, conditions in the South Island being almost wintry. Rain was widespread and hailstorms did some damage, especially in the South Island. Heavy snowfalls occurred on the mountains. Banks Peninsula received a white coating, and even in Christchurch there were some snow showers.

The fifth and last storm raged from the 27th to the 30th. It, again, became very deep after passing to the eastward, and the southerlies which resulted far surpassed those of its predecessor in severity. The gale commenced in the south on the 28th and did not die out over the North Island until the night of the 30th. In many places it rose to a whole gale, being one of the worst southerlies experienced for many years. Once more there were heavy snowfalls down to low levels on the mountains and numerous hailstorms. Heavy rain fell at many places. Much damage was done to fruit and crops and vegetation generally by the cold, the hailstones, and the persistent gales.

Thunderstorms accompanied each of the last three storms, but were most violent and widespread on the 24th and 28th.

On the 4th December a small tornado, arising as a waterspout over the sea, struck a portion of New Plymouth and partially wrecked one or two buildings. Two other waterspouts were seen near Patea on the 28th.
