A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section thirty-five of the Public Works Act, 1928, it is provided that in the case of any land taken, purchased, or acquired for a Government work, and not required for that purpose, the Governor-General may, on recommendation by the Minister, by Proclamation, declare such land to be Crown land subject to the Land Act, 1924, and thereupon the land may be administered and disposed of under that Act accordingly:

Now, therefore, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by section thirty-five of the Public Works Act, 1928, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare the land described in the Schedule hereto to be Crown land subject to the Land Act, 1924.

*Amending Warrant declaring Open Seasons for Imported and/or Native Game in certain Acclimatization Districts in so far as it affects the East Coast Acclimatization District, and declaring an Open Season for Imported Game and Native Game in the East Coast Acclimatization District.*

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, I, James Alexander Young, Minister of Internal Affairs of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby amend the Warrant dated 9th March, 1934, made under the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, and published in *New Zealand Gazette* No. 14, of the 12th idem, at page 520, by deleting all that portion of such Warrant included under the heading "East Coast Acclimatization District," and do hereby declare the period from the 1st day of May to the 31st day of July, 1934 (both days inclusive), to be an open season in the East Coast Acclimatization District, as described in *New Zealand Gazette* No. 17, of 12th March, 1925, at page 749, for the taking or killing of the following imported game (viz., cock pheasants, Californian quail, Australian quail, and Virginian quail), and the period from the 1st day of May to the 30th day of June, 1934 (both days inclusive), to be an open season in the said district for the taking or killing of the following native game (viz., grey duck, shoveller duck, and black swan), subject to the following conditions.

LICENSES to take or kill such imported game and native game in the said district will be issued to any person on payment of the sum of twenty shillings (20s.) each; and the Chief Postmaster at Gisborne and the postmasters at Motu, Te Karaka, and Patutahi are hereby authorized to sign and issue the said licenses.

2. No person shall in any one day take or kill native game exceeding in number twenty-five head in all of grey duck, shoveller duck, and black swan, or take or kill more than fifteen head in all of grey duck and shoveller duck.

3. No person shall commence shooting earlier than one hour before sunrise or continue shooting later than one hour after sunset on any day during the open season.

4. No person shall use live birds of any species as decoys, nor shall use artificial decoys so that more than fifteen artificial decoys are used at any one time (whether by one or several persons) on any particular water within an area of less than one hundred yards square.

5. No person shall use or cause to be used any motor-vehicle in connection with the taking or killing of native game: Provided that this condition shall not be so construed as to prohibit the use of any motor-vehicle for the purpose of travelling either generally or to or from a rendezvous.

6. No person shall use or cause to be used for the purpose of taking or killing any imported or native game any unmoored floating stand, pontoon, hide, mai-mai, or lou, or any boat artificially dressed or covered in any way.

7. No person engaged in shooting from any shelter, mai-mai, mud-hole, boat, louvre, or other contrivance shall have or use more than one gun.

8. Excepted areas wherein imported game and/or native game shall not be taken or killed during the open season:—  
Hauomatuku Block 4c 63AB and Mangaoe Block 113 and C 1A and 1D, being the property of William Morris. Gisborne Borough Council's Waterworks Reserve.—All that area comprising parts 3, 4, and 6 of Maraetaha No. 2, Nuhaka Survey District, containing 2,561 acres.

9. Any person committing a breach of any of these conditions is liable on conviction to a fine of £20.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR FEBRUARY, 1934.

General.—Very dry conditions continued during February in Nelson and Marlborough. The spring and summer in those provinces have been the driest on record, and come as the culminating point of four dry years. There is a very serious lack of moisture in the subsoil, and the question of winter feed for stock is causing great anxiety. The west coast of the South Island also experienced a very dry month. In Canterbury, though the rainfall was below average, the humid conditions delayed harvesting. Towards the end of the month, however, the situation improved and good progress was being made. Heavy rains were experienced in the North Island, and were of enormous benefit to pastures. Over much the greater part of the Dominion herbage is in the tender and succulent conditions usually associated with spring, and an abundance of winter feed is assured. Stock are generally in good condition and dairy yields have recovered to beyond the average for the time of year. Tobacco crops have been adversely affected in Nelson by drought and in other parts by excessive moisture. There has also been some damage to small crops and fruits.

Rainfall.—The only parts of the North Island which had less than the average rainfall were in central and northern Taranaki, the southern Waikato, and portions of the Auckland Peninsula. Much of the remainder had twice the average and many places considerably more than twice. The week from the 7th to the 13th was a particularly wet one, especially in the South Auckland, Bay of Plenty, Poverty Bay, Hawke's Bay, and central districts. In Hawke's Bay the Tutaekuri River burst its banks and severe flooding occurred in the vicinity of Meeanee, Taradale, and Pakowhai. There was some flooding, also, in north Auckland and the Bay of Plenty, where Whakatane had a record rainfall for February.

In the South Island some parts of southern Marlborough, most of Otago, and the interior of south Canterbury recorded more than the average fall, the excesses being large in places in Central Otago. The rest of the Island had considerably less than normal. On the west coast it was a particularly dry month. Westport had 1.05 in. and Karamea 1.47 in. only.

Temperatures.—Except in Otago and Southland temperatures were below normal, the departures being largest in eastern districts of the North Island. A number of fairly severe frosts were recorded at some of the higher stations in Canterbury, but elsewhere there were practically none.

Sunshine.—The amount of bright sunshine recorded did not differ greatly from normal. In the North Island it was rather less, but in most of the South Island rather more. Blenheim had 240.4 hours and Lake Tekapo 236.9 hours.

Pressure Systems.—There were two principal storm systems which affected New Zealand during the month, each of which commenced as a vigorous cyclone in the coastal area of Queensland and caused extensive flood-rains in the eastern Australian States. In each the eastward movement was very slow. The first appeared near Mackay on the 1st February, and, travelling slowly in a south-south-easterly direction, became a very deep and violent storm by the 4th, when it was situated west of the centre of the Tasman Sea. During this period there were easterly winds in northern New Zealand, and the unsettled

weather which had prevailed there during the latter part of January was very slow in dissipating. After the 4th the cyclone commenced to fill up. The remains of it passed over New Zealand as a complex trough of low pressure, which, though shallow, was responsible between the 6th and 8th for a general rain, which was the best experienced during the month. The southerly wind which followed the depression on the 8th and 9th was very cold and boisterous. Conditions remained unsettled to the east and north until the 13th.

The second cyclone appeared on the central Queensland coast on the 20th and moved southward until, on the 24th, it had reached Tasmania. It there, like its predecessor, commenced to pass slowly eastward, at the same time filling up. A low-pressure trough lying in a north and south direction was left, however, over the Tasman Sea, and while it crossed the Dominion, between the 26th and 28th, fairly widespread rains fell. Each of these cyclones was preceded in the New Zealand area by a rather intense anticyclone.

In addition to the above-mentioned storms, moderate depressions passed between the 16th and the 18th and the 20th and 21st respectively, but neither produced a great deal of rain.

The purpose of the proposed amalgamation is the spreading of risks incidental to such investments over as large a body of investments as possible, and so preventing any losses occurring from crippling or very seriously injuring any one specific trust which losses the whole fund might bear without serious inconvenience or injury.

The terms and conditions intended to be provided in the Bill deal with the following matters:—

- (a) Definition of what investments may be amalgamated.

- (f) The crediting or payment to each trust having a capital share in the amalgamated fund out of such Income Account of a uniform rate of interest which may be lower up to but not exceeding one-half per centum below the average rate of interest earned by the whole of the investments comprised in the amalgamated fund.
- (g) The setting up of a reserve fund into which after payment in each year to each trust of such uniform rate of interest the balance left in such Income Account is to be paid.
- (h) How the reserve fund should be invested, and how and to what objects income derived from its investment or the capital of the reserve fund may be applied and under what conditions such income and capital may be applied.

## RESOLUTION.

THE following regulations were laid before the members of the Committee of the Northland Trotting Club at a meeting held on the 16th day of April, 1934, at Whangarei, with a recommendation by the Chairman of such Club, Mr. H. W. Crawford, that the same be passed at once with a view to their approval by His Excellency the Governor-General in pursuance of the Gaming Act, 1908, section 33.

Mr. H. W. Crawford, the Chairman of such Club and the meeting moved, and Mr. L. R. Nelson seconded, and it was resolved that such regulations should be adopted and that the Chairman and Secretary be authorized to sign the same in authentication thereof.

The following are the regulations referred to:—

## NORTHLAND TROTTING CLUB.

REGULATIONS.

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

In pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Northland Trotting Club, a racing club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said Club"), doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the racecourse situated in the district of Auckland and known as the Epsom Racecourse while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

1. These regulations shall come into force on the date of the same being published in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

2. In these regulations the words "bookmaker," "racing club," and "race meeting" shall have the meanings ascribed to those terms respectively by section 2 of the Gaming Act, 1908.

3. The following persons shall be and are hereby excluded from the racecourse above described while the same is used or occupied by the said club for a race meeting, namely:—

- (a) Bookmakers.
- (b) Bookmakers' clerks, bookmakers' assistants, and bookmakers' agents.

- (c) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Association.
- (d) Common prostitutes and persons who habitually consort with thieves or persons who have no lawful visible means of support.
- (e) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering, or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues, and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908: Provided always that the executive committee appointed by the New Zealand Racing Conference, upon being satisfied by evidence as to character and otherwise that any person who, by reason of any conviction, comes within the scope of this regulation, should have relief from the effect thereof, may grant exemption to any such person, and may at any time revoke any such exemption without notice to such person and without assigning any reason for such revocation.

The foregoing regulations of the Northland Trotting Club were made and passed by such Club on the 16th day of April, 1934, and signed by the Chairman and Secretary.
