In pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred on me by the Taupiri Drainage and River District Act, 1929, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby after the boundaries of the Tauhei Drainage District the very different parts of the Tauhei Drainage District. by excluding from such district the area of land described in the First Schedule hereto; and doth hereby declare that the boundaries of the said drainage district, with such alteration as herein provided for, shall be those described in the Second Schedule hereto.

In the case of wholesale supply the charge shall not exceed £16 per kilovoltampere per annum, plus ½d. per unit. "Wholesale supply" for this purpose shall be held to be a supply in respect of which the consumer shall guarantee to pay not less than £180 per annum. Nothing in this license shall be held to impose any liability Nothing in this license shall be held to impose any lability upon His Majesty the King or upon the Government of New Zealand to pay compensation to any person, corporate body, or local authority by reason of the exercise by the licensee of the authority hereby granted; but the licensee shall be liable for any loss or damage which any person, corporate body, or local authority may sustain as the result of the exercise by the licensee of any of the powers granted by this license.

(2) This regulation shall also apply in the case of registration-plates issued under section 18 of the said Act.

4. For the licensing year commencing on the 1st day of

4. For the licensing year commencing on the 1st day of June, 1934, and for subsequent years, all registration-plates shall be metal plates, which for vehicles other than motor-cycles shall be approximately 13\(\frac{7}{8}\) in. long and 4\(\frac{7}{8}\) in. high, and for motor-cycles shall be approximately 7\(\frac{1}{8}\) in. long and 44\(\frac{1}{8}\) in high 4¼ in. high.

5. The distinguishing marks to be exhibited on the said registration-plates shall be as follows:----

(a) (i) For private motor-cars, as defined by the said Act, other than caravans (as defined in Regulation 6 hereof), and excluding private-hire and rental cars, as defined in the Motor-vehicles Insurance (Third-party Risks) Regulations, 1934, a series of numerals from 301 to 99,999 inclusive, without initial letter, and also a series of numerals from 1 onwards preceded by the letter X.

(ii) For motor-cycles a series of numerals from 1

onwards without initial letter.

(iii) For private-hire or rental cars a series of numerals from 1 to 300, inclusive, without initial letter.

(b) In the case of registration-plates issued to manufacturers and dealers in motor-vehicles in terms of section 18 of the said Act, a series of numerals preceded by the letter D.

(c) For motor-vehicles exempt from license fees in terms of section 11 of the said Act (other than motor-vehicles the property of the Crown and motor-cycles), a scries of numerals preceded by the letter E.

(d) For motor-vehicles (other than motor-cycles) the property of the Crown as series of numerals preceded.

(2) The members of the Board shall at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held at a time fixed by the Board, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. "(2) For the purposes of this section the term 'recognized certificate' means a certificate, diploma, degree, or license granted by some university, college, or other public institution (whether in New Zealand or elsewhere), and which is recognized by the Board as furnishing sufficient evidence of the possession of the requisite knowledge and skill for the efficient practice of the profession of engineering."
