THE RIGHT HON. G. W. FORBES PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Education Act, 1914, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations in amendment of existing regulations; and, with the like advice and consent, doth prescribe that this Order shall come into force on the date of publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

AMENDED REGULATIONS.

REGISTRATION OF PUBLIC, PRIVATE, AND SECONDARY SCHOOLS' COLOURS, BADGES, OR MONOGRAMS.

1. THE regulations relating to the registration of public, private, and secondary schools' colours, badges, or monograms made by Order in Council as shown in the attached Schedule are hereby amended by—

(1) Deleting from clause 1 the word "and," and further by inserting after the word "secondary" the words "technical, technical high, and combined."

(2) Deleting clause 2 and substituting therefor the following clause:—

"2. Every application for registration or amendment thereto shall be made by the controlling authority of the school and shall contain an exact description of the subject of the application, and the registration officer may require the description to be exemplified by a specimen or a drawing, and may refuse to accept any description that is in his opinion not sufficiently exact. No steps other than merely formal ones shall be taken to alter the colours, badges, or monograms till notice of approval has been obtained from the registration officer."

ATTENDANCE REGISTERS, RETURNS, AND AVERAGE ATTENDANCE.

2. The regulations relating to attendance registers, returns, and average attendance made by Orders in Council as shown in the attached Schedule are hereby amended by—

(1) Deleting clause 13 and substituting therefor the following clause:—

"13. When during any year—

"(1) A main and a side school are separated and established as mixed or separate schools;

 - “(5) A public school is established as a district high school, or a district high school is disestablished ;
 - “(6) A special class is established or disestablished in connection with a public school ;
 - “(7) An intermediate department is attached to, or ceases to be attached to, a public school ;
 - “(8) A public school becomes, or ceases to be, a contributing school ;
 - “(9) The attendance of one or more schools is affected by the consolidation of two or more schools or by the opening of a school in a new building on a new site, or by any other cause approved by the Minister for the purpose of this clause ;
- “then, in any of these cases, the school or group of schools so established shall be deemed to be a new school.”

And whereas it has been mutually agreed by His Majesty's Government in the Dominion of Canada and His Majesty's Government in the Dominion of New Zealand that the said agreement should be further extended as hereinafter appears :

And whereas by the said Act it is further provided that any agreement modifying the said agreement may be given effect to by Order in Council under the Customs Amendment Act, 1921 :

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the Customs Amendment Act, 1921, and subsection two of section two of the Trade Agreement (New Zealand and Canada) Ratification Act, 1932, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby order and direct that the operation of the said agreement shall be extended for a period of twelve months from the twenty-fourth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-four.

Vesting the Control of Lake Rotoiti Scenic Reserves in a Scenic Board.

BLEDISLOE, Governor-General.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by sections eighteen, nineteen, and twenty of the Native Purposes Act, 1931, and section thirteen of the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand doth hereby vest the control of the reserves described in the Schedule hereto (being land subject to the last-mentioned Act) for the period of five years from the date hereof (unless previously altered or revoked under that Act) in the under-mentioned persons, namely :—

- Wirihana Tamati,
- Heemi Te Uara,
- Rangikauariro Taiatini Te Tikao,
- Te Mapu te Kirikau,
- Wharerangi Ratema, and
- The Government Tourist Agent at Rotorua, *ex officio*,

who are hereby constituted for that purpose a special Board by the name of the Lake Rotoiti Scenic Board (herein referred to as "the Board"), in trust, for the preservation of scenery, and with the powers and subject to the conditions hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The first meeting of the Board shall be held on Tuesday, the fifth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, at Otaremarae, Rotoiti, and thereafter the Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Monday in each month at the place aforesaid, or at such time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board.

2. The Chairman shall have an original as well as a casting vote, and shall hold office until the election of his successor.

3. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

4. Any three members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

5. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at the meeting.

6. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose one of their number to be chairman of such meeting.

7. If by resignation, death, incapacity, or otherwise the seat of any member shall be or become vacant, or if any member absents himself, without reasonable cause, from three consecutive meetings of the Board, the Governor-General shall have power to appoint any other person to be a member of the Board in his stead.

8. The Board shall prepare and submit at an annual meeting to be held in the month of April in each year a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of March, together with a statement of

the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister charged with the administration of the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, as soon as possible after each annual meeting.

9. The Board shall control the said reserves in accordance with the provisions of the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, and of the regulations made thereunder.

NOTE.—A cool and windy month, with temperatures about 1.5° below normal. Total bright sunshine, 179.1 hours, 47 per cent. of the possible; four sunless days. Rainfall was 22 per cent. below normal. Gales occurred on many occasions, chiefly at night; there was a fog on the morning of the 20th; and lightning was seen on the night of the 7th. Mean dew-point at 9 a.m., 51.0°; mean vapour pressure, 0.373 in.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR MARCH, 1934.

General.—In much the greater part of the North Island March was very dry. In the South Island conditions were more varied, and a most important feature was the breaking of the drought in Nelson and Marlborough by the heavy rains of the 27th. Temperatures were considerably below normal, but this was not altogether an unfavourable circumstance since, in combination with a general absence of strong winds, it tended to mitigate the effects of the lack of rainfall, especially in the middle of the month. In most districts there is abundant pasture of good quality, but in the Waikato and parts of Taranaki rain is needed to produce a good growth before winter. In Nelson and Marlborough, also, there has not yet been much recovery following the drought. Stock are almost everywhere reported to be in good condition, the milk yield has been well maintained, and crops generally are good. The apple crop in Nelson is, however, rather light owing to the absence of soil moisture.

Rainfall.—The only considerable area of the North Island which had more than the average rainfall included most of western Wellington south of Wanganui and extended to the northern Wairarapa. Over the rest of the Island the totals averaged only about half the normal, and the central and north-eastern districts recorded a particularly dry month. In the South Island, an area in North Canterbury and South Marlborough had double the usual fall for March. Westport, also, had a heavy fall. Elsewhere, conditions varied considerably, but excesses were rather less numerous than deficits.

Temperatures.—The month was a distinctly cold one. At most places the mean temperature was between 1° and 2° below normal. The west coast of the South Island had relatively milder conditions than the remainder of the Dominion. A few frosts were recorded but, on the whole, the cold spells, though lengthy, were not severe.

Sunshine.—In eastern districts of the South Island from Canterbury southwards cloudy and humid conditions prevailed, and sunshine was much below normal. Elsewhere, totals were generally either equal or better than average. Nelson had 248.6, Napier 221.5, Taupo 221.2, New Plymouth 219.7, and Blenheim 219.1 hours.

Pressure Systems.—The storm systems experienced during the month were rather too complicated to describe in detail. A marked characteristic of the general situation was the disturbed conditions which prevailed in the tropics. Damage was done by cyclones in Australia on both the north-west and the Queensland coasts, while several less violent storms occurred in the area to the east of Australia. Associated with these conditions were a number of intense and widespread anti-cyclones which occurred in New Zealand latitudes. In several the pressure at the centre exceeded 30.5 in., and the mean pressure for the month was considerably above normal.

On the 1st a shallow cyclone was located west of the Auckland Peninsula. This crossed the peninsula during the night and was followed closely by a depression which had a cyclonic centre in its southern portion where it passed over Otago. Almost general rains resulted, with thunderstorms in places.

A westerly depression passing quickly between the 5th and the 7th was responsible for some very stormy weather. Thunderstorms were widespread on the night of the 7th, and in Canterbury there were some severe hailstorms. Snow fell on the ranges, the falls on Mount Egmont and at the National Park being unusually heavy.

Another rapidly moving westerly depression was responsible for some heavy rains in western districts of the South Island on the 12th. There was some hail, also, in the far South.

The most important storm was cyclonic in form and moved slowly through Cook Strait between the 26th and 28th. General rains were recorded with many heavy falls, especially in the central portions of the Dominion. Between 1 in. and 2 in. were recorded in the areas of Nelson and Marlborough, where drought had previously prevailed. Particularly heavy falls occurred in parts of North Canterbury and the Kaikoura districts, where rivers and creeks were in high flood. This and that of the 2nd were the only general rains.
