Lands set apart as Provisional State Forests declared to be subject to the Land Act, 1924.

[L.S.] BLEDISLOE, Governor-General. A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by section twenty of the Forests Act, 1921–22, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting on the recommendation of the Minister of Lands, do hereby proclaim and declare that the lands described in the Schedule hereto, being portions of Provisional State Forests Nos. 1678 and 1621, set apart by Proclamations dated the twenty-ninth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and gazetted on the eighth day of May of that year, and the eleventh day of October, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, and gazetted on the fourteenth day of that month, respectively, are required for settlement purposes; and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act such lands shall, from and after the day of the gazetting hereof, cease to be provisional State forests, and shall become subject to the provisions of the Land Act, 1924.

W HEREAS it is provided by section nine of the Local Authorities Interest Reduction and Loans Conversion Act, 1932-33, that, with the precedent consent of the Governor-General, given by Order in Council under section thirteen of the said Act, after compliance with the provisions of Part II of the Act, and subject to and in accordance with the provisions of such Order in Council, any local authority may issue new securities in conversion of any existing securities to which the said Act applies:

And whereas by the said section thirteen it is further provided that the Governor-General, by the Order in Council giving his consent to the conversion of existing securities by a local authority, may make such provisions as he thinks fit with respect to all or any of the matters specified in the said section, and that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, every Order in Council under the said section shall have the force of law as if enacted in the said Act, anything to the contrary in any other Act or in any regulations made under the said Act or any other Act notwithstanding:

And whereas the Dunedin City Council (being a local authority within the meaning of the said Act) has issued securities in respect of the loans specified in the First Schedule hereto, and certain of such securities are existing securities to which the said Act applies:

And whereas the said local authority, being desirous of issuing new securities in conversion of such existing securities, has complied with the provisions of Part II of the said Act, and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General to such conversion should be given as required by the said Act, and that by this Order the provisions hereinafter set forth should be made with respect to the matters specified in the said section thirteen:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the issue by the said local authority of new securities in conversion of any existing securities to which this Order applies, and with respect to such conversion doth hereby make the following provisions.

PRELIMINARY.

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Dunedin City Loans Conversion Order, 1934.
- 2. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires,—
 "The Act" means the Local Authorities Interest Reduction and Loans Conversion Act, 1932-33:
- "The date of conversion" means the date specified in clause five of this Order:
- "Existing securities" means debentures or other securities issued by the local authority before the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three; and includes any securities issued on or after that date, but before the date of conversion, in replacement (as that term is defined in the Act) of any such securities:
- "The local authority" means the Dunedin City Council:
- "Local fund" has the same meaning as in Part V of the Local Bodies' Loans
- Act, 1926:
 "New securities" or "new debentures" means securities or debentures issued in accordance with this Order in conversion of existing securities to which this Order applies:
- "Unconverted securities" means existing securities to which this Order applies and in respect of which dissent from conversion is signified in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

APPLICATION OF ORDER.

3. This Order shall apply to all existing securities to which this Act applies issued in respect of the loans or parts of loans described in the First Schedule hereto.

SPECIAL RESOLUTION OF LOCAL AUTHORITY.

- 4. (1) If the local authority so resolves by a resolution passed and confirmed as provided by subsection two of section nine of the Act, it may, subject to and in accordance with the provisions of this Order, issue new securities in conversion of existing securities to which this Order applies.
- (2) The following provisions of this Order shall come into force if such a resolution is passed and confirmed as aforesaid, but not otherwise:

 Provided that a certificate signed by the Mayor and published in the Gazette to the effect that such a resolution has been duly passed and confirmed shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein certified.

DATE OF CONVERSION.

5. The date from which the conversion of existing securities into new securities shall take effect shall be the first day of October, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-four.

NOTICE TO HOLDERS OF EXISTING SECURITIES.

- 6. (1) The local authority shall cause a notice in the form numbered (1) in the Second Schedule hereto to be published, not later than the first day of September, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, at least once in each of the following publications:—

 - (a) A newspaper circulating in the City of Auckland:
 (b) A newspaper circulating in the City of Wellington:
 (c) A newspaper circulating in the City of Christehurch:

 - (d) A newspaper circulating in the City of Dunedin.

And where the address of any holder of existing securities to which this Order and where the address of any holder of existing securities to which this Order applies is known, shall forward by registered letter to such holder a copy of such notice accompanied by a copy of the prospectus (if any) issued by the local authority, or, if no prospectus is issued, by a copy of this Order. If the local authority reserves the right conferred by clause 16 (1) of this Order to repay any new security at a date prior to that specified therein, particulars of such right shall be inserted in the notice and in the prospectus referred to in this clause.

(2) In addition to the notices required by the last preceding subclause, the local authority may give such further notice in relation to the conversion (whether by way of advertisement or otherwise) as it thinks fit.

RIGHT TO APPLY FOR OR DISSENT FROM CONVERSION.

- 7. The holder of any existing securities to which this Order applies may make application to the local authority in writing for the conversion of such securities into new securities in accordance with this Order. Every application under this clause shall be accompanied by the securities to which it relates.

 8. If the holder of any existing securities to which this Order applies does not, within the time and in the manner provided by this Order, signify his dissent from the conversion of such securities into new securities, the existing securities shall be converted into new securities in the same manner as if application had been made under the last preceding clause.

 - (a) At any time up to and including the date of conversion; or
 (b) If the holder of the securities (or, where the holder is a trustee, any person whose consent would, but for this Order, be required for conversion) is during the whole of the time between the date of the publication of this Order in
- the whole of the time between the date of the publication of this Order in the Gazette and the date of conversion absent from New Zealand, at any time before the expiration of three months from the date of conversion; or

 (c) In the case of any particular holder, within such further time as the local authority may, on account of special circumstances, in its discretion allow.

 10. The dissent of the holder of any existing securities from the conversion of those securities into new securities shall be signified in writing, and shall be deemed to be signified when such writing is received by the local authority or by any person authorized by the local authority to receive it.

SURRENDER OF CONVERTED SECURITIES, AND PAYMENT OF INTEREST THEREON.

- 11. The holder of any existing securities converted into new securities (whether the conversion is on application or after failure to dissent) shall not be entitled to demand payment of any interest payable on the existing securities, or to receive the new securities or any interest thereon, until he has surrendered the existing securities to the local authority
- 12. Subject to the provisions of the last preceding clause, the interest on any such existing securities for the period ending on the date of conversion shall be payable not later than two months from the date of conversion.

NEW SECURITIES.

- 13. (1) New securities shall be issued in the form of debentures in the form numbered (2) in the Second Schedule hereto.
- (2) Every new debenture shall be for a sum of five pounds, twenty-five pounds, fifty pounds, one hundred pounds, or any sum in excess of one hundred pounds.

 (3) All new debentures shall be numbered consecutively, and as between the holders
- (3) An new dependings shall be numbered consecutively, and as between the holders thereof shall rank equally.

 (4) Every new debenture shall state on its face the fact that the holder has no claim in respect thereof upon the Government or public revenues of New Zealand.

 (5) Every new debenture shall be signed by the Mayor or Deputy Mayor, countersigned by the Treasurer or some other officer appointed by the local authority for the purpose, and sealed with the common seal of the local authority.

INTEREST AND COUPONS.

- 14. (1) The rate of interest payable on new securities shall be four and onequarter per centum per annum.

 (2) The interest on new securities shall be payable half-yearly on days corresponding
- to the maturity dates of the securities snan be payable nan-yearly on days corresponding to the maturity dates of the sequrities.

 15. (1) Separate coupons for each amount of interest payable on any debenture, in the form numbered (3) in the Second Schedule hereto, and numbered consecutively for each debenture, shall be attached thereto.

 (2) The signatures to coupons may be made by facsimiles thereof in lithograph or

MATURITY DATES.

- 16. (1) Every new security shall be redeemable at par on such one of the maturity dates set out in the Third Schedule hereto as is specified in that behalf in the security: Provided that in respect of any new security the specified maturity date of which is a date later than the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and forty, the local authority may stipulate in such new security for the redemption thereof at the option of the local authority on such date prior to the date so specified (but not earlier than the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and forty) as the local authority may fix by notice in that behalf to be published in the Gazette at least three months before such date.

(2) The local authority shall so fix the respective maturity dates of the new securities that the aggregate amount of principal secured by the new securities maturing on each of such dates shall, if practicable, be a multiple of one hundred pounds, and, subject thereto, shall, as nearly as may be, bear the same proportion to the aggregate amount of principal secured by all the new securities as the sum set opposite that date in the Third Schedule hereto bears to the total amount specified in that Schedule.

(3) Subject to the foregoing provisions of this clause and to the express wish of any holder who desires to have the maturity date of his securities postponed, the maturity date of the new securities shall as nearly as practicable be in the same chronological order as the maturity dates of the existing securities in conversion of which they are respectively insued. which they are respectively issued.

19. The principal and interest in respect of new securities shall be payable in New Zealand.

20. (1) In order to provide funds for the repayment of the new securities the local

20. (1) In order to provide funds for the repayment of the new securities the local authority shall forthwith make provision for the creation, pursuant to a resolution of the local authority, of a consolidated sinking fund, of which such persons as the local authority appoints shall be the Commissioners.

(2) For such purpose the local authority shall permanently appropriate and shall pay to the Commissioners of the consolidated sinking fund on each first day of April following the date of conversion up to and including the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and fifty-eight, a contribution of forty-one thousand two hundred and eighty-four pounds, increased in respect of each contribution by a sum equal to four per centum of the aggregate amount of new securities redeemable up to and including the first day of April preceding the date on which such contribution is payable, and reduced by the aggregate of the sums which during the twelve months preceding the date of payment of such contribution have, pursuant to the provisions of the next succeeding clause, been paid to any sinking funds for unconverted securities.

SINKING FUND FOR UNCONVERTED SECURITIES.

21. (1) If dissent is signified in accordance with the provisions of this Order from the conversion of any existing securities issued in respect of any loan referred to in the First Schedule hereto, and to which this Order applies, the local authority, in order to provide funds for the repayment of the unconverted securities issued in respect of such loan, shall forthwith make provision for the creation, pursuant to a resolution of the local authority, of a sinking fund, of which the persons who at the date of conversion were Sinking Fund Commissioners in respect of such loan shall be the first Commissioners

missioners.

(2) For such purpose the local authority shall permanently appropriate a sum which bears the same proportion to the annual contribution payable, before the date of conversion, to the existing sinking fund of such loan as the aggregate amount of principal secured by such unconverted securities bears to the aggregate amount of principal secured by all the existing securities in respect of which such existing sinking fund is held, and shall pay such sum to the Commissioners yearly and every year until the maturity date of such unconverted securities, or until the Commissioners are satisfied that the accumulations of sinking fund will suffice to redeem such securities at maturity.

(3) The first of such yearly payments shall be made not later than one year after the date on which the last annual contribution payable before the date of conversion to the existing sinking fund of such loan was payable.

(4) Subject to the provisions of this Order, the provisions of sections forty to forty-four of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, shall, so far as applicable and with all necessary modifications, apply with respect to such sinking fund.

APPLICATION OF EXISTING SINKING FUNDS.

APPLICATION OF EXISTING SINKING FUNDS.

22. Where in respect of any loan specified in the first column of the First Schedule hereto the whole of the securities issued in respect thereof and outstanding at the date of conversion are not existing securities to which the Act applies, the existing sinking fund of such loan shall be divided into two parts, the first of which shall bear to the second the same proportion which the amount of the outstanding existing securities to which the Act applies bears to the amount of the outstanding existing securities to which the Act does not apply. The first part of such sinking fund shall be applied by the Commissioners thereof in accordance with the provisions of clause twenty-three hereof as if those existing securities issued in respect of the loan to which the Act applies were a separate loan to which that clause applies, and such first part of the sinking fund were the sinking fund of such separate loan, and the second part of such sinking fund shall be retained by the Commissioners as a sinking fund for those existing securities issued in respect of the loan to which the Act does not apply.

23. Subject to the provisions of the last preceding clause the existing sinking fund of every loan referred to in the First Schedule hereto shall be applied by the Commissioners thereof in or towards making the following payments, in the following order of priority,

(a) First, in transferring to the Commissioners of the Sinking fund hereinbefore required to be created for the unconverted securities issued in respect of such loan a sum which bears the same proportion to the amount of such existing sinking fund at the date of conversion as the aggregate amount of principal secured by such unconverted securities bears to the aggregate amount of principal secured by all the existing securities in respect of which such sinking fund is held; and
(b) Secondly, in payment, in accordance with the directions of the local authority, of any cash payments required by this Order to be made in respect of pre-

(b) Secondly, in payment, in accordance with the directions of the local authority, of any cash payments required by this Order to be made in respect of premiums to which any person is entitled on the conversion of any existing securities to which this Order applies (whether issued in respect of such loan or of any other loan referred to in the First Schedule hereto);
(c) Thirdly, in transferring the balance to the Commissioners of the consolidated sinking fund hereinbefore required to be created for the new securities, to be held as part of that sinking fund.

CONSOLIDATED SPECIAL RATE.

24. (1) As a security for the new securities and the unconverted securities the local authority shall forthwith, by resolution gazetted (in the form numbered (4) in the Second Schedule hereto), make and levy a special rate over the whole of the district

Second Schedule hereto), make and levy a special rate over the whole of the district of the local authority to provide for the payment of interest, sinking fund, and other charges in respect of such securities.

(2) Subject to the provisions of this Order, the provisions of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, and of any other Act shall, so far as applicable and with all necessary modifications, apply with respect to such special rate, and with respect to the interest and other charges in respect of such securities, as if such special rate were made and levied in respect of a special loan raised under Part I of the said Local Bodies' Loans Act. 1926

(3) Upon the making of such special rate every special rate theretofore made in respect of any existing securities to which this Order applies shall cease to be a security for such existing securities.

SECURITIES HELD BY TRUSTEES.

25. The provisions of sections twenty-two, twenty-three, and twenty-four of the New Zealand Debt Conversion Act, 1932-33 (relating to the adjustment of premiums as between capital and income and to the powers of trustees and other persons in relation thereto), shall apply with respect to existing securities converted into new securities in accordance with this Order in the same way as they apply with respect to securities converted under that Act, save that the references in the said section twenty-two to the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, shall be construed as references to the day following the date of conversion.

BROKERAGE.

26. The local authority shall not, in respect of the conversion into new securities of any existing securities to which this Order applies, enter into any contract for the payment of brokerage at a rate exceeding one-quarter per centum of the amount of such existing securities.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by section ten of the Magistrates' Courts Act, 1928, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations made on the thirteenth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, and published in the Gazette of the sixteenth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, prescribing the travelling allowances of Stipendiary Magistrates, and doth hereby make the following regulations in lieu thereof; and doth direct that such regulations shall come into force on and from the ninth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-four.

REGULATIONS.

TRAVELLING-ALLOWANCES.

1. Stipendiary Magistrates shall receive travelling-allowance for personal expenses at the rate of 18s. per diem for each day on which they are necessarily absent from their headquarters at night; provided that while at sea the allowance shall be at the rate of 9s. for the first day and 5s. for each subsequent

day.

2. The allowance shall be for each day of twenty-four hours. The day shall be deemed to commence at the hour of departure

from headquarters.

3. For any portion of a day the rate shall be one twenty-fourth of the full daily rate for each hour's absence.

4. In computing the time of absence, a fraction of an hour, if less than half an hour, shall not be taken into account,

but half an hour or more shall be reckoned as one hour.
5. When a Magistrate leaves and returns to headquarters

the same day actual and reasonable expenses only shall be paid.

6. Nothing in these regulations shall preclude the Minister from authorizing temporary special rates or amounts for travelling to meet special cases.

7. The cost of transport by land or sea will be paid by the Government, or when paid by the Magistrate travelling the same will be refunded to him on production of vouchers, but no vouchers for such expenses will be required for sums of 5s. and under, and vouchers for railway fares will not be required if the railway travelled upon and the extent of the journey is stated.

8. Public conveyances must be used where available, and the cost of motor-cars or special conveyances will not be allowed unless specially authorized.

9. All vouchers for travelling allowances or expenses must be made out in detail on the proper Treasury form, must state definitely the duty on which the Magistrate is travelling, and must be signed and certified by the claimant, and certified as correct by the Permanent Head of the Department or other authorized authority.

10. No Magistrate shall leave his district without the authority of the Minister of Justice or some officer authorized

by him.

A cool, late autumn month, with temperature about 1.7° below normal. Total bright sunshine, 37 per cent. of the possible; five sunless days. Precipitation was 14 per cent. above normal. Gales occurred on the 8th, 15th, and 17th; hail was recorded on four occasions; there was a heavy thunderstorm on the afternoon of the 4th, accompanied by torrential rain, and lightning was seen on the evening of the 2nd. Frosts were recorded on the 19th, 27th, and 30th. Mean dew-point at 9 a.m., 43.9°; mean vapour pressure, 0.286 in.

Notes on the Weather for May, 1934.

General.—Though there were two rather severe storms during May, the weather for the greater part of the month was relatively quiet. Temperatures were, in the mean, considerably below normal, but there was only one really severe cold snap, that accompanying a southerly gale on the 17th to 18th. In the South Island, especially on the east coast, there was much cloudy and misty weather. A certain amount of growth took place in pastures in most districts, and stock generally are reported as being in good condition. The soil is generally well provided with moisture, the effects of previous dry spells having practically disappeared even in Nelson and Marlborough.

Rainfall.—In much the greater part of the North Island the total rainfall was considerably below average, but small excesses were recorded in some areas around Auckland, in southern Taranaki, and in southern Wellington. In the South Island the Nelson Province and Stewart Island had rather less than the average, but in the remainder it was a very wet month. Parts of Canterbury had almost three times the normal for May.

Temperatures were below average everywhere except in parts of Otago and Southland. The departures were rather large in the North Island, averaging from one and a half to two degrees, but were generally smaller in the South. Owing to the large proportion of calan nights frosts were rather numerous.

Sunshine.—In the North Island the month was a fairly sunny one, but most of the South Island recorded much less than the average. Tauranga had 183-0, Nelson 177-1, New Plymouth 162-5, and Napier 162-2 hours.

Pressure and Weather Systems.—The first event of meteorological importance in the month was the development of a remarkable cyclonic storm which reached its maximum intensity on the night of the 3rd. On the 2nd there was a trough of low pressure located west of New Zealand. It was not very deep, but it extended in almost a due north and south direction from north of Norfolk Island southward to beyond the region covered by our reports. It marked the boundary between warm air coming from the tropics and a colder mass lying to the west of it which had a far southern origin. On the 2nd there was a small centre of low pressure in the above-mentioned trough situated in the neighbourhood of Norfolk Island, the lowest pressure being about 29-8 in. Under the circumstances then existing it was proper to expect that the centre would move towards North Auckland and cause north-easterly gales and heavy rains there, but it would have been difficult to foresee the striking changes that did take place. On the morning of the 3rd the storm centre had developed into a deep and full-fledged cyclone, the lowest pressure being near Cape Maria van Diemen and amounting to about 29-2 in. The southward movement was continued, and on the

rain. And since the division-line between the two winds moved extremely slowly, the rain continued for a long time. This was the explanation of the extremely heavy rain which occurred on Banks Peninsula and the floods of record height which did so much damage at Little River and the surrounding district. The north-easterly gales caused widespread damage over the North Island. There was flooding also in the far North and the Thames and Waikato districts, and, with the exception of the west coast of the South Island, almost the whole country received a deluge of rain.

On the 5th the cyclone was filling up and the weather moderating. The general line of disturbance, however, moved only very slowly eastward, and from the 5th to the 10th there was a spell of cold and boisterous southerly weather with dull skies and frequent showers, especially along the east coast.

Another notable spell of stormy weather commenced on the 14th. This was in marked contrast to the one described above, being of the westerly type. From the 15th to the 17th most of the country, but especially the South Island, was afflicted with north-westerly or westerly gales for periods of varying duration. Much damage was done, especially to power lines, but also in some cases to buildings. The spell concluded on the 17th to 18th with a southerly gale and a severe cold snap. Snow fell on the ranges in all parts of the country, and in Southland even the low levels were coated for a few hours. Stratford and Te Pohue also reported falls. Hailstorms were recorded from one end of the country to the other. The high southerly winds caused further damage to trees, fences, &c. On the evening of the 17th a tornado, which was unusually severe for New Zealand, struck New Plymouth, partially wrecking a number of houses.

From the 19th onward the weather was quiet, high pressure ruling most of the time. Though temperatures were rather low, especially in the South, there were no extremes.
