## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by section twenty-six of the Board of Trade Act, 1919, and of every other power and authority enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby, on the recommendation of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, make the following Board of Trade Regulations fixing the maximum prices of superphosphate.

## REGULATIONS.

1. THESE regulations may be cited as the Board of Trade (Superphosphate) Regulations, 1934.

2. These regulations shall come into force on the day after the publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

3. No person shall sell superphosphate of the grade commercially known as 44/46 per cent. superphosphate for delivery on trucks ex works at a price which if it be sold ex works in the North Island of New Zealand exceeds £4 per ton, or if it be sold ex works in the South Island of New Zealand exceeds £4 5s. per ton.

4. No person shall sell superphosphate manufactured in New Zealand on terms relating to rates of commission, discounts, railage allowances, and credit that are in any particular less favourable to the buyer than the terms relating to the said matters generally in force in the trade in the locality where such sale is effected on the 31st day of March, 1934.

5. Any person selling superphosphate of the grade commercially known as 44/46 per cent. superphosphate for delivery on trucks ex works shall, if so required by the buyer, sell the same on the same terms relating to rates of commission, discounts, railage allowances, and credit as were generally in force in the trade in the locality where such sale is effected on the 31st day of March, 1934.

WHEREAS by Order in Council made on the ninth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, and subject to the determinations as to borrowing and repayment therein set out, consent was given to the raising by the Waikato Hospital Board (hereinafter called "the said local authority") of the sum of two thousand one hundred pounds (£2,100) by a special loan to be known as "Boiler Loan, 1934" (hereinafter called "the said loan"):

And whereas the said local authority, pending the raising of the said loan in accordance with the said determinations, is desirous of borrowing the said sum or part thereof by the hypothecation or mortgage, pursuant to section thirty-four of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, of the debentures authorized to be issued in respect of the said loan:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and by section seven of the Local Authorities Interest Reduction and Loans Conversion Act, 1932-33, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the said local authority, pending the raising of the said loan in accordance with the said determinations (by which, *inter alia*, the rate of interest to be inserted in the said debentures is limited to four pounds (£4) per centum), borrowing the said sum of two thousand one hundred pounds (£2,100) or part thereof by the hypothecation or mortgage of the said debentures at a rate of interest not exceeding five pounds (£5) per centum per annum.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the Waikato Hospital Board (hereinafter called "the said local authority") is desirous of raising the sum of two thousand one hundred pounds (£2,100) by a loan to be known as "Boiler Loan, 1934" (hereinafter called "the said loan"), for the purpose of purchasing and erecting a 62 H.P. underfired multitubular boiler for the Waikato Hospital, including foundation and brickwork, feed pump, automatic stoker, water and steam connections, flue, and new building to house the boiler; also for strengthening and supporting the present boilers, and incidental expenses:

And whereas the said local authority has complied with the provisions of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council, as required by the said Act, should be given to the raising of the said loan:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the said Act, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising by the said local authority of the said loan up to the amount of two thousand one hundred pounds (£2,100), and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

(1) The term for which the said loan or any part thereof may be raised shall be five (5) years.

(2) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said loan or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate exceeding four pounds (£4) per centum per annum.

(3) The said loan shall be repaid by annual instalments of principal of not less than four hundred and twenty pounds (£420) during the first four years of the currency of the loan and the balance in the last year.

(4) No interest on the loan and no instalment of principal shall be paid out of loan-money.

(5) The rate payable for brokerage, underwriting, and procuration fees in respect of the raising of the said loan or any part thereof shall not in the aggregate exceed one-half per centum of any amount raised.

(6) The payment of interest and repayment of principal in respect of the said loan shall be made in New Zealand.

WHEREAS the Ohakune Borough Council (hereinafter called "the said local authority") proposes, pursuant to the provisions of section three of the Main Highways Amendment Act, 1928, to borrow the sum of one thousand four hundred and fifty pounds (£1,450) by a loan to be known as "Main Highways Loan, 1934" (hereinafter called "the said loan"), for the purpose of paying its proportion of the cost of tar-sealing work on the Ohakune Borough sections of the Raetihi-Ohakune and Bulls-Taumarunui Main Highways and the reconstruction of Mangateitei and Mangawhio Bridges:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and

authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising by the said local authority of the said loan up to the amount of one thousand four hundred and fifty pounds (£1,450), and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

(1) The term for which the said loan or any part thereof may be raised shall be five (5) years.

(2) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said loan or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate exceeding four pounds (£4) per centum per annum.

(3) The said loan together with interest thereon shall be repaid by equal annual or half-yearly instalments extending over the term as determined in (1) above.

WHEREAS by the Napier Borough Loans Conversion Order, 1934, made on the twelfth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, and published in the *Gazette* on the fifteenth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, and subject to and in accordance with the provisions of such Order, consent was given by the Governor-General in Council, acting in pursuance of the authority conferred by the Local Authorities Interest Reduction and Loans Conversion Act, 1932-33, to the issue of new securities in conversion of existing securities issued in respect of the loans referred to in the First Schedule of such Order :

And whereas it is expedient to vary certain of the provisions aforesaid relating to the conversion of such existing securities :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred on him by subsection two of section thirteen of the said Local Authorities Interest Reduction and Loans Conversion Act, 1932-33, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth order as follows:—

1. This order may be cited as the Napier Borough Loans Conversion Amendment Order, 1934, and shall be read together with and form part of the Napier Borough Loans Conversion Order, 1934 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order).

2. The principal order is hereby amended by adding after clause twenty-three thereof the following new clause:—

“23A. For the purposes of the last two preceding clauses the sinking fund of every loan set out in the First Schedule hereto, of which the Public Trustee is holder of some only of the existing securities issued in respect thereof, shall be divided into two parts, the first of which shall bear to the second the same proportion which the amount of the existing securities so held by the Public Trustee bears to the amount of the existing securities held by persons other than the Public Trustee. The said parts shall be applied as follows:—

“(a) The first part of such sinking fund shall be applied by the Commissioner thereof in accordance with the provisions of clause twenty-two hereof as if the existing securities issued in respect of the loan and held by the Public Trustee were a separate loan within the meaning of that clause, and such first part of the sinking fund were the sinking fund of such separate loan.

“(b) The second part of such sinking fund shall be applied by the Commissioner thereof in accordance with the provisions of clause twenty-three hereof as if the existing securities issued in respect of the loan and held by persons other than the Public Trustee were a separate loan within the meaning of that clause and such second part of the sinking fund were the sinking fund of such separate loan.”

*Regulations as to Appeals under Section 3 of the Agricultural and Pastoral Societies Amendment Act, 1933.—(Notice No. Ag. 3199.)*

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by section three of the Agricultural and Pastoral Societies Amendment Act, 1933, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations for the purposes of that section.

REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations, unless inconsistent with the context,—

“Licensing authority” means the society, or person, or body of persons authorized to issue licenses under any by-laws made pursuant to the said Act or by which or by whom was forfeited a deposit paid by a licensee by way of security for due compliance with the terms and conditions of his license :

“The said Act” means the Agricultural and Pastoral Societies Amendment Act, 1933.

2. Every appeal pursuant to subsection (3) of section 3 of the said Act shall be in the form in the Schedule hereto or to the like effect, and shall be lodged at the office of the Clerk of the Magistrate’s Court nearest by the most convenient route to the address of the licensing authority within fourteen days of the receipt by the appellant of notice of the decision in respect of which the appeal is made. 4. At the hearing of the appeal the appellant may appear in person or by his agent authorized by him in writing or by a barrister or solicitor of the Supreme Court, but not otherwise. The licensing authority may appear by any person authorized by it in writing in that behalf or by a barrister or solicitor of the Supreme Court.

5. The Magistrate or Justices hearing the appeal may—

(a) In his or their discretion receive any evidence he or they may think fit (whether on oath or otherwise), and may act upon any statement, document, information, or matter which in his or their opinion may assist in the determination of the appeal whether or not the same would be legally admissible in a Court of law :

(b) In matters not expressly provided for in these regulations conduct the hearing in such manner as he or they think fit :

(c) From time to time adjourn the hearing or consideration or determination of the appeal as he or they think fit :

*New Zealand Coinage Act, 1933.—Trial of the Pyx of Silver Coins made for the Government of New Zealand by the Royal Mint in London.*

VERDICT.

WE whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the thirteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, before the King's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of New Zealand coins of silver which, according to accounts produced by the officers of the Royal Mint in London were coined in the said Mint in accordance with the New Zealand Coinage Act, 1933, from the 3rd day of October, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, to the 15th day of February, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, both days inclusive, and were set aside and placed in the Pyx of the said Mint as prescribed by Order in Council made under the said Act. We ascertained the number of coins in each packet produced to us, and that such number corresponded with the number which the officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took two coins from each of such packets of silver coins, making altogether twenty-two half-crowns, sixteen florins, eighteen shillings, sixteen sixpences, and thirty-four threepences. We then weighed each one pound troy weight (at its standard weight) of the coins so taken out and ascertained that the said coins so bulked were within the remedy as to weight prescribed by the New Zealand Coinage Act, 1933. We then took for assay one pound troy (at its standard weight) of the coins so weighed comprising thirteen half-crowns, eight florins, nine shillings, eight sixpences, and eighteen threepences, and we ascertained that the amount of variation from the standard weight allowed under the New Zealand Coinage Act, 1933, was, for such pound so taken for assay, nil on the whole, and that, therefore, such pound troy of silver coins weighed and assayed as aforesaid was on the whole within the variation from standard weight so allowed. We then assayed separately the coins in the pound troy so taken for assay, comparing them with the standard Trial Plate made of pure silver (as prescribed by the Imperial Coinage Act, 1920) produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal of the said coins was on the whole within the remedy as to fineness prescribed by the New Zealand Coinage Act, 1933, and we found that the amount of variation from the standard fineness so prescribed was minus eight ten-thousandths (—0008) on the whole of the coins in such pound, and that, therefore, the said pound troy of silver coins weighed and assayed as aforesaid was, on the whole, within the variation from fineness allowed under the New Zealand Coinage Act, 1933. We weighed in bulk the residue of the coins remaining in the said packets of silver coins and we ascertained that they were on the whole within the remedy as to weight allowed under the New Zealand Coinage Act, 1933, being sixty thousandths of an ounce (—0060) below the standard weight prescribed by the said Act.
