IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by subsection nine of section twelve of the Land Act, 1924, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that from and after the date hereof the land comprised in the pieces of closed road described in the First Schedule hereto, being land which is adjacent to the national-endowment land described in the Second Schedule hereto, shall be deemed to be added to the said endowment.

*Amendments to the Regulations under the Post and Telegraph
Department Act, 1918.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 3rd day of December,

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by section two hundred and thirty of the Post and Telegraph Act, 1928 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), and of all other powers and authorities in that behalf enabling him, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby amend in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereto the regulations made on the fourteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the twenty-third day of the same month, at page 3460, under the authority of the Post and Telegraph Department Act, 1918, and enuring under the said Act, and the amendments thereof made from time to time under the provisions of the said Act, and doth order and declare that such amendments shall have effect on and from the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-four.

SCHEDULE.

1. REGULATIONS 3 to 9 inclusive are hereby revoked, and the following substituted :—

"3. The First Division shall include such officers as the Director-General from time to time directs to be included in that Division.

"The First Division shall be subdivided into the classes shown in the First Schedule attached hereto, and the officers of that Division shall, subject to passing any prescribed efficiency test or examination, and subject to any provisions in these regulations relating to good conduct and the diligent and efficient performance of their duties, be paid the salaries set forth in that Schedule with annual increments as provided therein and in Regulation 11 hereof.

"4. The Second Division shall include all officers of the Department, other than those appointed by the Governor-General, not included in the First Division.

"The Second Division shall be subdivided as may from time to time be directed by the Director-General, and officers included in that Division shall, subject to passing any prescribed efficiency test or examination, and subject to any provisions in these regulations relating to good and diligent conduct and the efficient performance of their duties, be paid salaries, with annual increments, as set forth in the scale of rates fixed from time to time by the Director-General for officers of the Second Division and as provided in Regulation 11 hereof.

"5. The grading of the officers of the First Division shall be fixed by the Director-General according to the character and importance of the duties performed by or assigned to each officer. The Director-General shall regrade such officers at such times as may be fixed by the Governor-General in Council.

"6. Notwithstanding anything heretofore contained, the Director-General may at any time create any position he deems advisable for the proper working of the Department, and fix the grading of any officer appointed thereto or abolish any position which he considers unnecessary or alter the grading of any officer whose duties he considers to have increased in importance as to require such action."

2. Regulation 13 is hereby amended by deleting the words "Clerical Division or to the Engineering Division," and substituting therefor the words "First Division."

3. Regulation 24 (as heretofore amended) is hereby amended by deleting the words "Clerical, Engineering, and General Divisions," and substituting therefor the words "First and Second Divisions."

4. Regulation 28 is hereby revoked, and the following substituted :—

"Every person who enters the service of the Department shall be appointed on probation and shall continue in such probationary position for such period as the Director-General directs. At any time during the period of probation any such appointment may be annulled or confirmed by the Director-General.

“Controlling officers are to report to the Director-General on the suitability of probationers at the end of three months’ service and thereafter as directed, provided always that, in the event of the services rendered by a probationer being other than fully satisfactory, a special report shall forthwith be submitted.”

5. Regulation 29 (2) is hereby amended by deleting the words “the salary provided in the sixth subdivision of the scale in the Second Schedule,” and substituting therefor the words “a salary from time to time determined by the Director-General.”

6. Regulation 30 (as heretofore amended) is hereby amended by deleting the words “Before an officer graded in Class VI of the General Division shall be deemed eligible for advancement beyond the fifth subdivision,” and substituting therefor the words “Before a male officer graded in the Second Division shall be deemed eligible for advancement beyond a salary from time to time determined by the Director-General.”

7. Regulation 31 is hereby amended by deleting the words “senior mechanic, or other position graded above Class V of the General Division,” and substituting therefor the words “foreman-mechanic or other position in the Second Division of the same grade of classification.”

8. Regulations 32 and 33 (as heretofore amended) and 34 (1) and 34 (2) are hereby amended by deleting the words “Clerical Division,” and substituting therefor the words “First Division.”

9. Regulation 36 is hereby amended by deleting the words “to the Engineering Division.”

10. Regulation 37 (as heretofore amended) is amended by deleting the phrase “Class G. VI,” and substituting therefor the words “the Second Division.”

11. Regulation 38 is hereby revoked, and the following substituted:—

“Vacancies in the First Division for cadetships or junior clerkships shall be filled by (a) officers of the Second Division and message-boys, on probation, in the employ of the Department, who have passed the departmental Entrance Examination or its equivalent; and (b) outside eligible applicants: Provided that if any such officer, message-boy, or applicant is available who has passed the University Entrance Examination he may be given precedence over any such officer, message-boy, or applicant who has passed only the departmental Entrance Examination or its equivalent.”

12. Regulation 39 is hereby amended by the addition of the following:—

“An officer who for any reason is reduced in grade may retain such relative seniority as the Director-General decides.”

13. Regulation 59 (8) (as heretofore amended) is hereby amended by deleting the words “Clerical and Engineering Divisions,” and substituting therefor the words “First Division.”

14. Regulation 61 is hereby revoked, and the following substituted:—

“The Director-General may authorize the payment of one or more risk allowances, not exceeding £10 per annum each, for the performance of tellers’ duties at such money-order and savings-bank offices as he may decide.”

15. Regulation 108 is hereby amended by deleting the words “by telegram.”

16. Regulation 132 is hereby amended by deleting the words “Officers below Class II of the Clerical and Engineering Divisions,” and substituting therefor the words “Officers of the First Division graded below Class II.”

17. The First Schedule is hereby amended by deleting the words “Clerical and Engineering Divisions,” and substituting therefor the words “First Division”; by deleting from the first subdivision the amounts “790½” and “837”; and by adding the following words:—

“NOTE.—The salaries shown in the above scale are to be read as subject to—

“(a) Reduction pursuant to the provisions of the Finance Act, 1931, and the National Expenditure Adjustment Act, 1932; and

“(b) Increase pursuant to the provisions of the Finance Act (No. 2), 1934.”

18. The Second, Third, and Fourth Schedules are hereby revoked.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 3rd day of December, 1934.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is provided by section nine of the Local Authorities Interest Reduction and Loans Conversion Act, 1932-33, that, with the precedent consent of the Governor-General, given by Order in Council under section thirteen of the said Act, after compliance with the provisions of Part II of the Act, and subject to and in accordance with the provisions of such Order in Council, any local authority may issue new securities in conversion of any existing securities to which the said Act applies:

And whereas by the said section thirteen it is further provided that the Governor-General, by the Order in Council giving his consent to the conversion of existing securities by a local authority, may make such provisions as he thinks fit with respect to all or any of the matters specified in the said section, and that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, every Order in Council under the said section shall have the force of law as if enacted in the said Act, anything to the contrary in any other Act or in any regulations made under the said Act or any other Act notwithstanding:

And whereas the Whangaroa County Council (being a local authority within the meaning of the said Act) has issued securities in respect of the loans specified in the First Schedule hereto, and such securities are existing securities to which the said Act, applies:

And whereas the said local authority, being desirous of issuing new securities in conversion of such existing securities, has complied with the provisions of Part II of the said Act, and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General to such conversion should be given as required by the said Act, and that by this Order the provisions hereinafter set forth should be made with respect to the matters specified in the said section thirteen:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the issue by the said local authority of new securities in conversion of any existing securities to which this Order applies, and with respect to such conversion doth hereby make the following provisions.

PRELIMINARY.

1. This Order may be cited as the Whangaroa County Loans Conversion Order, 1934 (No. 1).

2. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires,—

“The Act” means the Local Authorities Interest Reduction and Loans Conversion Act, 1932-33:

“The date of conversion” means the date specified in clause five of this Order:

“Existing securities” means debentures or other securities issued before the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three; and includes any securities issued on or after that date, but before the date of conversion, in replacement (as that term is defined in the Act) of any such securities:

“The local authority” means the Whangaroa County Council:

“Local fund” has the same meaning as in Part V of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926:

“New securities” or “new debentures” means securities or debentures issued in accordance with this Order in conversion of existing securities to which this Order applies:

“Unconverted securities” means existing securities to which this Order applies and in respect of which dissent from conversion is signified in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

APPLICATION OF ORDER.

3. This Order shall apply to all existing securities issued in respect of the loans specified in the First Schedule hereto.

SPECIAL RESOLUTION OF LOCAL AUTHORITY.

4. (1) If the local authority so resolves by a resolution passed and confirmed as provided by subsection two of section nine of the Act, it may, subject to and in accordance with the provisions of this Order, issue new securities in conversion of existing securities to which this Order applies.

(2) The following provisions of this Order shall come into force if such a resolution is passed and confirmed as aforesaid, but not otherwise:

Provided that a certificate signed by the Chairman of the local authority and published in the *Gazette* to the effect that such a resolution has been duly passed and confirmed shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein certified.

DATE OF CONVERSION.

5. The date from which the conversion of existing securities into new securities shall take effect shall be the first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five.

NOTICE TO HOLDERS OF EXISTING SECURITIES.

6. The local authority shall cause a notice in the form numbered (1) in the Second Schedule hereto, together with a copy of this Order, to be forwarded by registered letter not later than fourteen days before the date of conversion to every holder of existing securities to which this Order applies.

RIGHT TO APPLY FOR OR DISSENT FROM CONVERSION.

7. The holder of any existing securities to which this Order applies may make application to the local authority in writing for the conversion of such securities into new securities in accordance with this Order. Every application under this clause shall be accompanied by the securities to which it relates.

8. If the holder of any existing securities to which this Order applies does not, within the time and in the manner provided by this Order, signify his dissent from the conversion of such securities into new securities, the existing securities shall be converted into new securities in the same manner as if application had been made under the last preceding clause.

9. Dissent from the conversion of any existing securities may be signified—

- (a) At any time before the expiration of fourteen days from the date of conversion; or
- (b) In the case of any particular holder, within such further time as the local authority may, on account of special circumstances, in its discretion allow.

10. The dissent of the holder of any existing securities from the conversion of those securities into new securities shall be signified in writing, and shall be deemed to be signified when such writing is received by the local authority or by any person authorized by the local authority to receive it.

SURRENDER OF CONVERTED SECURITIES, AND PAYMENT OF INTEREST THEREON.

11. The holder of any existing securities converted into new securities (whether the conversion is on application or after failure to dissent) shall not be entitled to demand payment of any principal or interest payable in respect of the existing securities, or to receive the new securities or any instalment of principal and interest payable in respect thereof, until he has surrendered the existing securities to the local authority.

12. Subject to the provisions of the last preceding clause, the interest on the outstanding principal represented by any such existing securities for the period ending on the date of conversion shall be payable not later than one month from the date of conversion.

NEW SECURITIES.

13. The aggregate amount of principal secured by the new securities to be issued in conversion of existing securities to which this Order applies (including new securities to be issued by way of premium), together with interest thereon computed at the rate of four and one-quarter per centum per annum, shall be repaid by equal half-yearly instalments over a period of twenty-three years, the first half-yearly instalment to fall due and be paid on the first day of September, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five, and subsequent half-yearly instalments to fall due and be paid on every first day of March and first day of September thereafter, the last half-yearly instalment to fall due and be paid on the first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and fifty-eight.

14. (1) New securities for the amount of each half-yearly instalment referred to in the preceding clause shall be issued in the form of debentures in the form numbered (2) in the Second Schedule hereto.

(2) All new debentures shall be numbered consecutively, and as between the holders thereof shall rank equally.

(3) Every new debenture shall state on its face the fact that the holder has no claim in respect thereof upon the Government or public revenues of New Zealand.

(4) Every new debenture shall be signed by the Chairman, countersigned by the Treasurer or some other officer appointed by the local authority for the purpose, and sealed with the common seal of the local authority.

PREMIUMS.

15. The holder of any existing securities to which this Order applies shall on the conversion of such securities be entitled to receive new securities for the same aggregate amount of principal as is secured by the existing securities, and, in addition thereto, shall be entitled to receive a premium on such principal computed in accordance with the Third Schedule hereto.

16. (1) Subject to the provisions of this clause as to payment in cash, every premium to which any person is entitled under the last preceding clause shall be satisfied by issuing to him additional new securities for the amount of such premium, or so much thereof as is not paid in cash, as the case may be.

(2) The local authority may, if it thinks fit, pay in cash the whole or any part of the aggregate amount of all such premiums to which any person is entitled.

(3) All payments of cash in accordance with the last preceding subclause shall be made by the local authority out of the local fund, and charged to the appropriate account.

(4) The power of the local authority to issue new securities in accordance with this Order shall be deemed to include the power to issue any additional new securities required for the purposes of this clause.

PLACE FOR PAYMENT OF PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST.

17. The principal and interest in respect of new securities shall be payable in New Zealand.

SINKING FUND FOR UNCONVERTED SECURITIES.

18. (1) If dissent is signified in accordance with the provisions of this Order from the conversion of any existing securities issued in respect of any loan in the First Schedule hereto for which a sinking fund was provided, the local authority, in order to provide funds for the repayment of the unconverted securities issued in respect of such loan, shall forthwith make provision for the creation, pursuant to a resolution of the local authority, of a sinking fund, of which the Public Trustee shall be the Commissioner.

(2) For such purpose the local authority shall permanently appropriate a sum which bears the same proportion to the annual contribution payable, before the date of conversion, to the existing sinking fund of such loan as the aggregate

amount of principal secured by such unconverted securities bears to the aggregate amount of principal secured by all the existing securities in respect of which such existing sinking fund is held, and shall pay such sum to the Commissioner yearly and every year until the maturity date of such unconverted securities, or until the Commissioner is satisfied that the accumulations of sinking fund will suffice to redeem such securities at maturity.

(3) The first of such yearly payments shall be made not later than one year after the date on which the last annual contribution payable before the date of conversion to the existing sinking fund of such loan was payable.

(4) Subject to the provisions of this Order, the provisions of sections forty to forty-four of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, shall, so far as applicable and with all necessary modifications, apply with respect to such sinking fund.

APPLICATION OF EXISTING SINKING FUND.

19. (1) The existing sinking fund of every loan in the First Schedule hereto shall be applied by the Public Trustee as Commissioner thereof in or towards making the following payments, in the following order of priority, namely:—

(a) First, in transferring to the Commissioner of the sinking fund hereinbefore required to be created for the unconverted securities issued in respect of such loan a sum which bears the same proportion to the amount of such existing sinking fund at the date of conversion as the aggregate amount of principal secured by such unconverted securities bears to the aggregate amount of principal secured by all the existing securities in respect of which such sinking fund is held; and

(b) Secondly, as far as it will extend, in repayment as at the date of conversion of the principal secured by the existing securities issued in respect of such loan and held by the Public Trustee.

(2) Interest up to the date of conversion on any existing securities so repaid in accordance with paragraph (b) of the last preceding subclause shall be paid by the local authority out of the local fund.

CONSOLIDATED SPECIAL RATE.

20. (1) As a security for the new securities and the unconverted securities the local authority shall forthwith, by resolution gazetted (in the form numbered (3) in the Second Schedule hereto), make and levy a special rate over the whole of the district of the local authority to provide for the payment of the half-yearly instalments of principal and interest in respect of the new securities and of interest sinking fund, and other charges in respect of the unconverted securities.

(2) Subject to the provisions of this Order, the provisions of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, and of any other Act shall, so far as applicable and with all necessary modifications, apply with respect to such special rate, and with respect to the principal, interest, and other charges in respect of such securities, as if such special rate were made and levied in respect of a special loan raised under Part I of the said Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926.

(3) Upon the making of such special rate every special rate theretofore made in respect of any existing securities to which this Order applies shall cease to be a security for such existing securities.

SECURITIES HELD BY TRUSTEES.

21. The provisions of sections twenty-two, twenty-three, and twenty-four of the New Zealand Debt Conversion Act, 1932-33 (relating to the adjustment of premiums as between capital and income and to the powers of trustees and other persons in relation thereto), shall apply with respect to existing securities converted into new securities in accordance with this Order in the same way as they apply with respect to securities converted under that Act, save that the references in the said section twenty-two to the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, shall be construed as references to the day following the date of conversion.

BROKERAGE.

22. The local authority shall not, in respect of the conversion into new securities of any existing securities to which this Order applies, enter into any contract for the payment of brokerage at a rate exceeding one-quarter per centum of the amount of such existing securities.

£0.55 multiplied by 9.761556 is £5.3688558, or £5 7s. 4d., which is the premium for £100 of the existing securities.

The premiums on other amounts of existing securities of the same class can be computed in the same way, or, alternatively, by ascertaining 5.3688558 per cent. of the amount of the principal in each case.

And whereas the said local authority, being desirous of issuing new securities in conversion of such existing securities, has complied with the provisions of Part II of the said Act, and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General to such conversion should be given as required by the said Act, and that by this Order the provisions hereinafter set forth should be made with respect to the matters specified in the said section thirteen :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the issue by the said local authority of new securities in conversion of any existing securities to which this Order applies, and with respect to such conversion doth hereby make the following provisions.

PRELIMINARY.

1. This Order may be cited as the Whangaroa County Loans Conversion Order, 1934 (No. 2).

2. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires,—

“The Act” means the Local Authorities Interest Reduction and Loans Conversion Act, 1932-33 :

“The date of conversion” means the date specified in clause five of this Order :

“Existing securities” means debentures or other securities issued before the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three ; and includes any securities issued on or after that date, but before the date of conversion in replacement (as that term is defined in the Act) of any such securities :

“The local authority” means the Whangaroa County Council :

“New securities” or “new debentures” means securities or debentures issued in accordance with this Order in conversion of existing securities to which this Order applies :

“Unconverted securities” means existing securities to which this Order applies and in respect of which dissent from conversion is signified in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

APPLICATION OF ORDER.

3. This Order shall apply to all existing securities issued in respect of the loans specified in the First Schedule hereto.

SPECIAL RESOLUTION OF LOCAL AUTHORITY.

4. (1) If the local authority so resolves by a resolution passed and confirmed as provided by subsection two of section nine of the Act, it may, subject to and in accordance with the provisions of this Order, issue new securities in conversion of existing securities to which this Order applies.

(2) The following provisions of this Order shall come into force if such a resolution is passed and confirmed as aforesaid, but not otherwise :

Provided that a certificate signed by the Chairman of the local authority and published in the *Gazette* to the effect that such a resolution has been duly passed and confirmed shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein certified.

DATE OF CONVERSION.

5. The date from which the conversion of existing securities into new securities shall take effect shall be the ninth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five.

NOTICE TO HOLDERS OF EXISTING SECURITIES.

6. The local authority shall cause a notice in the form numbered (1) in the Second Schedule hereto, together with a copy of this Order, to be forwarded by registered letter not later than fourteen days before the date of conversion to every holder of existing securities to which this Order applies.

RIGHT TO APPLY FOR OR DISSENT FROM CONVERSION.

7. The holder of any existing securities to which this Order applies may make application to the local authority in writing for the conversion of such securities into new securities in accordance with this Order. Every application under this clause shall be accompanied by the securities to which it relates.

8. If the holder of any existing securities to which this Order applies does not, within the time and in the manner provided by this Order, signify his dissent from the conversion of such securities into new securities, the existing securities shall be converted into new securities in the same manner as if application had been made under the last preceding clause.

9. Dissent from the conversion of any existing securities may be signified—

(a) At any time before the expiration of fourteen days from the date of conversion ;

or

(b) In the case of any particular holder, within such further time as the local authority may, on account of special circumstances, in its discretion allow.

10. The dissent of the holder of any existing securities from the conversion of those securities into new securities shall be signified in writing, and shall be deemed to be signified when such writing is received by the local authority or by any person authorized by the local authority to receive it.

SURRENDER OF CONVERTED SECURITIES, AND PAYMENT OF INTEREST THEREON.

12. Subject to the provisions of the last preceding clause, the interest on the outstanding principal represented by any such existing securities for the period ending on the date of conversion shall be payable not later than one month from the date of conversion.

NEW SECURITIES.

13. The aggregate amount of principal secured by the new securities to be issued in conversion of existing securities to which this Order applies, together with interest thereon computed at the rate of four and one-quarter per centum per annum, shall be repaid by equal half-yearly instalments over a period of twenty-five years, the first half-yearly instalment to fall due and be paid on the ninth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five, and subsequent half-yearly instalments to fall due and be paid on every ninth day of May and ninth day of November thereafter, the last half-yearly instalment to fall due and be paid on the ninth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and sixty.

14. (1) New securities for the amount of each half-yearly instalment referred to in the preceding clause shall be issued in the form of debentures in the form numbered (2) in the Second Schedule hereto.

(2) All new debentures shall be numbered consecutively, and as between the holders thereof shall rank equally.

(3) Every new debenture shall state on its face the fact that the holder has no claim in respect thereof upon the Government or public revenues of New Zealand.

(4) Every new debenture shall be signed by the Chairman, countersigned by the Treasurer or some other officer appointed by the local authority for the purpose, and sealed with the common seal of the local authority.

15. As the existing securities to which this Order applies bear interest at a rate which, as reduced in accordance with Part I of the Act, does not exceed the rate of interest payable on the new securities, the holders of such existing securities shall on the conversion thereof be entitled to receive new securities for the same aggregate amount of principal as is secured by the existing securities, without premium.

PLACE FOR PAYMENT OF PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST.

16. The principal and interest in respect of new securities shall be payable in New Zealand.

CONSOLIDATED SPECIAL RATE.

17. (1) As a security for the new securities and the unconverted securities the local authority shall forthwith, by resolution gazetted (in the form numbered (3) in the Second Schedule hereto), make and levy a special rate over the whole of the district of the local authority to provide for the payment of the half-yearly instalments of principal and interest in respect of such securities.

(2) Subject to the provisions of this Order, the provisions of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, and of any other Act shall, so far as applicable and with all necessary modifications, apply with respect to such special rate, and with respect to the principal, interest, and other charges in respect of such securities, as if such special rate were made and levied in respect of a special loan raised under Part I of the said Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926.

(3) Upon the making of such special rate every special rate theretofore made in respect of any existing securities to which this Order applies shall cease to be a security for such existing securities.

Re-enacting Provisions as to Exemption of certain Types of Passenger-service Vehicles from Requirements as to Certificate of Fitness.

Regulations under the Rabbit Nuisance Act, 1928, relating to the Destruction of Rabbits in the Peria Rabbit District.— (Notice No. Ag. 3230.)

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Rabbit Nuisance Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations relating to the destruction of rabbits in the Peria Rabbit District, and doth hereby declare that the regulations hereby made shall come into force on the date of the publication of this Order in Council in the *Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations, unless inconsistent with the context,—
“Board” means the Peria Rabbit Board established under the Rabbit Nuisance Act, 1928 ;
“Inspector” means the person for the time being authorized to act as Rabbit Inspector to the Board ;
“Owner” shall have the meaning ascribed to the word “owner” in section 2 of the said Act ;
“Notice” means a notice to destroy rabbits on private land issued by the Inspector pursuant to section 6 of the said Act.
2. Every owner on whom a notice is served shall carry out or cause to be carried out to the satisfaction of the Inspector an effective poisoning over all infested portions of the land to which such notice refers, and shall, immediately after such poisoning, take or cause to be taken all reasonable steps to fill in all burrows on such land, and forthwith after the filling in of such burrows shall, to the satisfaction of the Inspector, fumigate or cause to be fumigated all fresh burrows and reopened burrows.
3. Notwithstanding the provisions of Regulation 5 hereof, all trapping, shooting, hunting, or dogging of rabbits shall, not later than seven days after the service of any notice served after the gazetting of these regulations, cease on all land in respect of which notice has been served ; and thereafter for a period of three months no owner of any such land nor any other person shall trap, shoot, hunt, or dog, or permit or suffer to be trapped, shot, hunted, or dogged, any rabbits on such land except with the written permission of the Board and subject to the conditions specified therein.
4. Notwithstanding the provisions of Regulation 2 hereof, the Inspector may, in respect of any land to which any of the said provisions are not conveniently applicable, authorize in writing signed by him the employment of any other method or methods of rabbit-destruction ; and compliance with the method or methods specified in any such authority shall be deemed a compliance with these regulations.
5. The Board may in the months of January or February in any year publicly notify, by notice published twice in some one or more newspapers circulating in the Peria Rabbit District, that all trapping, shooting, hunting, or dogging of rabbits within the said district is prohibited for a period of three months from a date to be specified in such notice (being a date not earlier than seven days after the first publication of such notice), and, except with the written permission of the Board and subject to the conditions specified therein, no owner nor any other person shall during the period so specified, trap, shoot, hunt, or dog, or permit to be trapped, shot, hunted, or dogged, any rabbits within the said district.
6. Every person committing a breach of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

who are hereby constituted for that purpose a special Board by the name of the Urenui Public Reserve Board (hereinafter referred to as “ the Board ”), with the powers and subject to the conditions hereinafter contained, that is to say :—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the second Monday in each month, at one o'clock p.m., at the Urenui Hall, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Monday, the tenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-four.

2. The members of the Board shall at their first meeting, and thereafter at the annual meeting hereinafter mentioned, elect one of themselves to be chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

3. Special meetings may be convened by the chairman, provided that two days' notice of any such meeting is given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

4. Any four members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

5. If at any meeting the chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose one of their number to be chairman of such meeting.

6. If by resignation, death, incapacity, or otherwise the seat of any member shall be or become vacant, or if any member absents himself without reasonable cause from three consecutive meetings of the Board, the Governor-General shall have power to appoint any other person to be a member of the Board in his stead.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

8. The Board shall have prepared and submitted at an annual meeting to be held in the month of April in each year a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of March, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister of Lands as soon as possible after each annual meeting.

9. The Board shall control the said reserve and any buildings erected thereon for the purposes of a ladies' rest-room and a dental clinic, and may, subject to such conditions as it thinks fit, permit such buildings to be used by any public or social organization in Urenui and the surrounding district: Provided that the Board shall have power to fix reasonable charges for the use of any building under its control.

As the said area is more particularly shown and delineated on plan marked M.D. 7311, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington.

Determinations by Minister of Customs under Section 16 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act, 1934.

Customs Department, Wellington, 4th December, 1934.

PART I.

IN pursuance of section 16 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act, 1934, the Minister of Customs doth hereby determine that, with respect to each of the following classes of motor-vehicles the undermentioned goods may be entered under Tariff item 389 (a) as unassembled or completely knocked down motor-vehicles:—

Column No. 1.

Column No. 2.

Classes of Motor-vehicles.

Goods which may be entered under Tariff Item 389 (a).

Class I:—

Motor-vehicles, being passenger motor-vehicles other than omnibuses

(I) Chassis, consisting of—

(a) Side members, end members, cross members, subframe, dumb irons, tank saddles, brackets for fixing engine, spring brackets, engine and gear box; and

These goods (except the engine and gear box) may be built up into a frame, by means of rivets, gussets, bolts or welding, and the engine and gear box may be fully assembled and secured to the frame. The frame must not be further assembled but such other parts of the chassis as are ordinarily riveted to the frame may be so affixed thereto.

(b) Scuttle (or cowl), wind-shield assembly, mud-guards, valances, running boards, and other parts of chassis

May not be attached to the frame or to parts riveted thereto (as referred to in (a) above) but may, subject to the foregoing restriction, be imported in such condition as the importer elects.

(II) Bodies, viz.:—

(i) "Composite" bodies, being bodies the shell of which is composed of metal panels and a wooden framework,—

(a) Metal panels

Shall be plain or machined metal stampings, with or without a priming coat of paint or similar material but must not be built up in any way by welding or any other process which has the like effect.

(b) Framework

Must be completely dismantled into its component parts.

(c) Other parts of body (excluding upholstery or other interior trimmings, seat springs, and cushions, in any form whatever)

May, subject to the foregoing restriction, be imported in such condition as the importer elects.

(ii) "All steel" bodies, being bodies consisting of metal panels which when welded together form the shell,—

(a) Side panels (right and left)
Rear panel

Shall be plain or machined metal stampings with or without a priming coat of paint or similar material but must not be built up in any way by welding or any other process which has the like effect, except that reinforcing plates or parts and such other parts as are ordinarily welded to individual panels may be attached thereto.

(b) Underbody (or floor)

May be built up but no other panels (e.g., side or rear panels) may be attached thereto.

(c) Other parts of body (excluding upholstery or other interior trimmings, seat springs, and cushions, in any form whatever)

May, subject to the foregoing restrictions, be imported in such condition as the importer elects.

Class II:—

Motor-vehicles, being omnibuses, commercial trucks, or delivery vans

Chassis

Shall be imported in the condition set out with respect to the chassis of motor-vehicles in Class I.

PART II.

I hereby make the following further determinations under the aforesaid section:—

(1) If any motor-vehicles of any of the classes mentioned in Part I of this notice are imported in a condition less assembled or more completely knocked down than that respectively set out in Column No. 2 of that Part, they may be entered under Tariff item 389 (a).

(2) If motor-vehicles or parts of motor-vehicles of any of the classes mentioned in Part I of this notice are imported in a condition more assembled or less completely knocked down than that respectively set out in Column No. 2 of that Part, they shall not be entered under Tariff item 389 (a).

(3) Except with the special permission of the Minister, but subject to paragraph (1) of this Part, no goods enumerated in Column No. 2 of Part I of this notice shall be entered under Tariff item 389 (a) if any other goods comprising the chassis or body or any part thereof respectively that have formed or are intended to form part of the same motor-vehicle shall be or shall have been imported in a form otherwise than as set out in the said Column No. 2. Notwithstanding anything in this paragraph, if the Minister is satisfied that the body for any such vehicle is to be wholly manufactured in New Zealand, the chassis for any motor-vehicle of the kind mentioned in Class I of Part I of this notice may be entered under Tariff item 389 (a) if it is imported in the condition set out in Column No. 2 of that Part, or in accordance with paragraph (1) of this Part.

(4) Except with the special permission of the Minister, and under conditions set out by him, all the imported unassembled or completely knocked down (c.k.d.) parts enumerated in Column No. 2 of Part I of this notice for any one vehicle shall be imported in the same ship.

(5) Except with the special permission of the Minister, all the goods enumerated in Column No. 2 of Part I of this notice and forming or intended to form parts of any one vehicle shall, if entered under Tariff item 389 (a), be used only in the assembly, completion, or manufacture of that vehicle and shall not be used in the manufacture or repair of other motor-vehicles.

(6) Except with the special permission of the Minister, no upholstery or other interior trimmings, being goods of leather, textile, rubber or similar materials, seat springs, or cushions, in any form whatever for motor-vehicles, or bodies for omnibuses, or bodies or cabs for commercial trucks or delivery vans, or parts of the same, shall be entered under Tariff item 389 (a).

(7) Except with the special permission of the Minister but subject to paragraph (1) of this Part no goods which are enumerated in Column No. 2 of Part I of this notice and which have been entered under Tariff item 389 (a) shall be used in the completion or manufacture of a motor-vehicle of the kind mentioned in Class I of that Part if the chassis or body or any part thereof is imported in a form otherwise than as set out in the said Column No. 2.

(8) Except with the special permission of the Minister, no goods enumerated in Column No. 2 of Part I of this notice which have been entered under Tariff item 389 (a) shall be used in the completion or manufacture of a motor-vehicle if any upholstery or other interior trimmings, being goods of leather, textile, rubber, or similar materials, seat springs, or cushions, imported in a form wholly or partly made up or manufactured from leather in hides, piece-goods, metal wire or similar articles are also used in such completion or manufacture.

(9) Except with the special permission of the Minister, no goods enumerated in Column No. 2 of Part I of this notice which have been entered under Tariff item 389 (a) shall be used in the completion or manufacture of motor-vehicles being omnibuses, commercial trucks, or delivery vans (mentioned in Class II of that Part), if the bodies or cabs therefor or any manufactured or partly manufactured parts thereof (other than those admitted under Tariff items 387, 448, or such other Tariff item as may be specified by the Minister), have been imported.

PART III.

For the purpose of this notice an "omnibus" means a motor-vehicle designed solely or principally for the carriage of persons exceeding nine in number, and a "commercial truck" or "delivery van" means a motor-vehicle designed solely or principally for the carriage of goods.

PART IV.

(1) These determinations shall come into force on the 1st day of September, 1935.

(2) The determinations made on the 18th day of October, 1934, and published in the *Gazette* on the same day, at page 3357, shall be revoked on the coming into force of these determinations.

(3) Notwithstanding such revocation the provisions of the paragraphs numbered respectively (5), (7), (8), and (9) of Part II of the said determinations of the 18th day of October, 1934, relating to the use of certain goods entered under Tariff item 389 (a) shall at all times after such revocation continue to apply to goods so entered during the currency of the said determinations.

(4) It should be understood that the determinations comprised herein may be varied from time to time by a notice published in the *Gazette*. In the case of major variations at least three months' notice of any such variation will, if practicable, be given.

NOTE.—A remarkably good spring month. Temperatures were very slightly below normal, and there were no frosts. Total bright sunshine, 194.8 hours, 48 per cent. of the possible; three sunless days. Precipitation was 101 per cent. above normal, more than half of which fell in the first two days. There was a strong north-west gale on the 1st accompanied by very heavy rain, and on the 2nd a strong southerly blow. The remainder of the month was mild with very little wind. Mean dew-point at 9 a.m., 47.3°; mean vapour pressure, 0.325 in.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR OCTOBER, 1934.

General.—With the exception of the first two days October was very mild and equable. There was much less westerly wind than usual at this time of year. Conditions are rather dry in the eastern portions of the North Island, but in Nelson, Marlborough, and Canterbury the subsoil is thoroughly soaked for the first time during the last four to five years. Over the rest of the country, though rainfall has been on the light side so far this year, there is no acute shortage. On the whole, October was one of the best spring months we have had. There has been a wonderful flush of growth in grass and vegetation generally, and the countryside has never looked greener. Stock are in good condition, although in some districts lambs have not thriven as well as might be expected. The prospects for fruit and other crops are very good. Some trouble has been experienced in parts of Canterbury and Marlborough from excessive moisture.

Rainfall.—In Taranaki, western Wellington, Nelson, Marlborough, and Canterbury, rains were, in general, much above the average, though there were a few exceptions. Wellington City and much of Marlborough had double the normal total. In Westland the falls were for the most part about average. The remainder of the country received much less than is usual in October.

Temperatures.—After the 2nd the month was a very mild one with no prolonged or severe spell of cold southerly wind. Nevertheless, mean temperatures were almost everywhere below normal. The departures were fairly large on the east coast but very small on the west.

Sunshine.—As regards sunshine, conditions were very irregular. Considerable departures from the average were recorded at numbers of places, but excesses and deficits appear to be about equally mixed. Lake Tekapo had 246.5, Napier 226.1, Tauranga 215.5, and Blenheim 211.7 hours.

Storm Systems.—The only storm of note occurred at the beginning of the month. At this time a depression was crossing the Dominion, and on the morning of the 2nd a deep cyclone centre developed over the Cook Strait area. Rain was practically general, and in the western and central districts there were many heavy falls. Flooding occurred in Taranaki, southern Wellington, Marlborough, and North Canterbury. On the 1st northerly gales raged at many places from Nelson and Marlborough northwards, and the Wairarapa experienced the most destructive gale in its history. The reason why this wind was so damaging is not very clear since, in the higher levels and at Wellington, for instance, stronger blows have been recorded. It must, however, have descended with unusual force to the low levels after crossing the Tararua Ranges. Such a descent is favoured if the ground is unusually warm, and the fact that the night of the 30th September to 1st October was unusually warm at Wellington while a very high maximum temperature was recorded at Masterton is in accordance with this. A strong southerly wind and a sharp cold snap followed on the 2nd October, and snow fell to low levels on the ranges.

A moderate westerly depression which passed on the 9th was also responsible for a fresh fall of snow on the ranges, but the precipitation caused by it was far from general.

On the 12th another depression moved on to the country, and, its further movement being checked by an intense anti-cyclone to the eastward, did not disappear until the 16th. During this time rain fell in all parts but was particularly heavy on the mountains and in western districts.

Several other depressions passed during the month but none were very boisterous or productive of general rain. Associated with one of these there were some severe thunder and hail storms in western districts of the North Island on the 31st.
