**W**HEREAS by section four hundred and fifty of the Native Land Act, 1931 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), it is provided, *inter alia*, that the Crown may purchase any Native land in pursuance of a resolution of the assembled owners passed and confirmed in accordance with Part XVIII of the said Act; and on the resolution being adopted by the Native Land Settlement Board it shall become a contract of purchase as between the Crown and all persons who are the owners of the land; and the Governor-General may, by Proclamation, at any time after the contract of purchase has been so made, declare that the land so purchased is vested in His Majesty the King, and it shall vest accordingly and shall become Crown land:

And whereas a resolution was passed by a meeting of assembled owners and duly confirmed by the Waikato-Maniapoto District Maori Land Board, that the land set out in the Schedule hereto be sold to the Crown:

And whereas the Native Land Settlement Board has adopted such resolution:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by section four hundred and fifty of the said Act, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land set out in the Schedule hereto is vested in His Majesty the King.

WHEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto, hereinafter designated "the said land," is part of an area of 5,866 acres 3 roods 20 perches taken for the purpose of a State forest under the Public Works Act, 1928, by Proclamation dated the sixth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and thirty, and published in the *Gazette* of the eleventh day of September, one thousand nine hundred and thirty:

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the Marriage Act, 1908, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage districts known as the Reefton and Lyell districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into one marriage district, the name and boundaries whereof shall be as follow:—

REEFTON DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Nelson Land District, bounded by a line commencing at the confluence of the Orikaka River with the Buller River; thence along the eastern watershed of the Orikaka River to the Lyell Range; thence along the summit of the Lyell Range to the watershed between the Newton Stream and the Matiri River; thence along the summit of the range over Mount Newton to the Buller River; thence by a right line across the Buller River and along the summit of the range between the Matakaitaki and Maruia Rivers over Mount Mantell and Mount Cann to the summit of the main range near the source of the Maruia River; thence south-westerly along the summit of the watershed between the Maruia River and the Waiiau River to the watershed between the Maruia River and the Grey River; thence along the summit of that watershed to Mount Haast; thence along the watershed between the Grey River and the Inangahua River to the saddle between the Mawhera-iti River and the Inangahua River; thence along a right line in the direction of the mouth of the Totara River to the summit of the Paparoa Range; thence along a right line to the confluence of the Orikaka River with the Buller River, the place of commencement.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the first day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five.

The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair and shall at all times exhibit from the wharf and maintain at the licensee's own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels : Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof, and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf requiring the licensee within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the licensee shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The master of all vessels discharging ballast at the said wharf shall have all such ballast taken away and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.



10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the 29th day of November, 1934, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand.

12. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the licensee's part.

13. In case the licensee shall—

- (1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty consecutive days;
- (3) Become bankrupt, or be brought under the operation of any law for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy; or
- (4) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions;

then, and in any of the said cases, this Order in Council and every right, power, or privilege may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the *Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee and to all persons concerned or interested that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

14. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the licensee shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said wharf entirely from the site and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of the revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and if the licensee fails so to do, the Minister may cause the said wharf to be removed and the site so restored and may recover from the licensee the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Post and Telegraph Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

## REGULATIONS.

1. THESE regulations may be cited as the Post Office Savings-bank Amending Regulations, 1934.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and be deemed to form part of the Post Office Savings-bank Regulations, 1913, made under the Post and Telegraph Act, 1908, and enuring under the Post and Telegraph Act, 1928 (hereinafter called "the principal regulations").

3. These regulations shall come into force on the date of the publication hereof in the *Gazette*.

4. Regulation 11 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding thereto the following words:—

"Or by trustees constituted under any formal instrument creating a trust. In cases where a trustee acts for more than one trust, separate accounts may be opened for each trust."

5. Regulations 15 and 16 of the principal regulations are hereby revoked, and the following regulations substituted:—

"15. (1) Moneys belonging to any person shall not be deposited in the Post Office Savings-bank to the credit of more than one account therein otherwise than as provided in clause (2) of this regulation.

"(2) Nothing in clause (1) of this regulation shall prevent a person being a depositor in the Post Office Savings-bank from making a deposit to the credit of one account only in addition to any account or accounts opened or kept by such person—

"(a) As trustee for another person also named in the title to the account; or

"(b) As trustee of a legally constituted friendly, charitable, or provident society; or

"(c) As trustee of a society registered under the Trade-unions Act, 1908, or the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, or the Coal-mines Act, 1925, or any amendment thereof, respectively; or

"(d) As trustee of such other non-mercantile society as the Governor-General in Council from time to time specifies; or

"(e) As an executor, administrator, or other personal representative of a deceased person; or

"(f) As a trustee under any formal instrument creating a trust; or

"(g) On behalf of a present or past inmate of any institution deposits for the inmates of which have been approved under Regulation 12 (2) hereof; or

"(h) As trustee or on behalf of an inmate or former inmate of an institution established or deemed to be established under the Child Welfare Act, 1925, on whose behalf deposits have been made under the provisions of section 37 of the last-mentioned Act.

"16. (1) No person shall receive the benefit of deposits made in the Post Office Savings-bank to the credit of more than one account therein otherwise than as provided in clause (2) of this regulation.

"(2) Nothing in clause (1) of this regulation shall prevent any person from receiving the benefit of a deposit made to the credit of one account only in addition to any account or accounts under which such person receives benefit solely—

"(a) As a member of a legally constituted friendly, charitable, or provident society; or

"(b) As a member of a society registered under the Trade-unions Act, 1908, or the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, or the Coal-mines Act, 1925, or any amendment thereof respectively; or

"(c) As a member of a corporate body not carried on for the purposes of trade or profit; or

"(d) As a member of such other non-mercantile society as the Governor-General in Council from time to time specifies; or

"(e) As a beneficiary in the estate of a deceased person; or

"(f) As a beneficiary under any formal instrument creating a trust; or

"(g) As a present or past inmate of any institution deposits for the inmates of which have been approved under Regulation 12 (2) hereof; or

"(h) As a former inmate of an institution established or deemed to be established under the Child Welfare Act, 1925, on whose behalf deposits have been made under the provisions of section 37 of the last-mentioned Act.

"16A. If by reason of any contravention of Regulations 15 and 16 hereof any person receives or any account is credited with interest in excess of the amount which such person may properly receive or with which such account may properly be credited, such excess may be recovered as a debt due to the Crown from any person by whom it has been received or may be forfeited and debited to the account to which it was credited, and in the latter case may at any time be entered as a debit in the appropriate depositor's book without the consent of the depositor being first obtained.

6. Clause (5) of Regulation 22 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding thereto the following words:—

"Provided that when a deposit is made by means of a cheque or other negotiable instrument the entry in the depositor's book shall be conclusive evidence of the fact and amount of the deposit only after the value of the cheque or negotiable instrument has been collected from the bank or institution by which it is payable:

"Provided also that if a cheque or other negotiable instrument is dishonoured, the amount thereof shall forthwith be debited to the savings-bank account of the person to whose account the amount was previously credited:

"Provided also that the Postmaster-General may forthwith or at any time thereafter cause to be debited in the depositor's book the amount of the dishonoured cheque or other negotiable instrument, and such entry whenever made shall be as effective as if made at the time when the instrument was dishonoured."

7. Regulation 28 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting in clause (1) thereof, following the words "another person," the following words:—

"Pursuant to Regulation 9 hereof."

8. Regulation 28 of the principal regulations is hereby further amended by adding thereto the following additional clause:—

"(4) Where an account has been opened by one or more persons pursuant to Regulation 11 hereof as trustees, executors, or administrators in the estate of any deceased person or under any formal instrument creating a trust, and letters of administration in the estate concerned or probate or other formal instrument creating the trust has been produced to and noted by the Postmaster-General, it shall not be necessary for any person whose name is entered in the title of the account, but not as a trustee, to be joined in the application, but the application may be made pursuant to Regulation 28A hereof."

9. The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting following Regulation 28 thereof the following additional regulation:—

"28A. (1) An application to withdraw moneys deposited under Regulation 11 hereof shall be made jointly by the trustees, executors, or administrators entitled thereto.

"(2) Nevertheless, where the number of such persons exceeds two, such persons may by notice in writing given to the Postmaster-General authorize any two or more of their number either generally or for any particular transaction to make such application on their behalf.

"(3) Any such notice shall be deemed to continue in force until notice of revocation thereof is received by the Postmaster at the Post Office where the account is kept.

"(4) The receipt of the persons named in any such notice shall be a good discharge to the Postmaster-General for all moneys paid in pursuance thereof."

10. The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting after Regulation 32 the following additional regulation:—

"32A. (1) In lieu of giving an authority by order as provided by Regulation 32, a depositor may by order authorize a person to operate upon his account generally. Such order shall be in a form approved by the Postmaster-General and be witnessed in the same manner as an order under Regulation 32.

"(2) The Postmaster-General may, under such circumstances as he deems expedient, accept a general order given by a minor of the age of seven years or upwards.

"(3) A general order given in favour of a corporate body may be exercised by an officer or servant of such body if authorized by the corporate body in that behalf under Regulation 32 or under this regulation in like manner as if the corporate body were a depositor.

"(4) A general order may at any time be revoked by the depositor by notice in writing under his hand, but such revocation shall not be effective until it is received by the Postmaster at the Post Office where the depositor's account is kept.

"(5) In the absence of effective written notice of revocation, the presentation of the depositor's book by the authorized agent may be accepted by the Postmaster-General as evidence of non-revocation of the general order.

"(6) This regulation shall not apply to accounts opened under Regulation 11 hereof."

11. The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting following Regulation 40 thereof the following additional regulation:—

"40A. (1) On the death of any trustee, executor, or administrator who is entitled to a deposit made under Regulation 11 hereof, or on the addition or substitution of any other trustee, executor, or administrator, then on evidence of such death or on production of any vesting order, vesting declaration, or other instrument vesting the legal ownership of such deposit, and on such verification thereof or evidence of identity as the Postmaster-General may require, the names of the surviving, added, or substituted trustees, executors, or administrators shall be entered in the title of the account as being the persons entitled thereto.

"(2) Any new trustees, executors, or administrators shall before their names are so entered make the declaration required upon the making of a first deposit.

"(3) In any case provided for by this regulation the receipt of the persons named in the title of the account as altered in manner provided by this regulation (or the receipt of two or more of such persons as provided by Regulation 28A) shall be a good discharge to the Postmaster-General for any sums standing to the credit of the account."

*Classification of Assistant Teachers in Technical Schools and of Manual-training Teachers.*

THE following lists of assistant teachers employed in technical schools, combined schools, recognized technical classes and recognized manual-training classes, or classified for employment in such schools or classes, are issued under the authority of the Minister of Education in accordance with the regulations relating to technical schools, recognized technical classes recognized manual-training classes, and combined secondary and technical schools, made by Orders in Council dated the 10th November, 1925, and 25th September, 1931.

Under the heading "Division" is shown the division and class in which the teacher is classified.

The class of salary corresponding with the class and division in which the teacher is placed is given in the Schedule to the aforementioned regulations.

Attention is drawn to the regulations relating to appeals of teachers against their classification and grading, under which any teacher who considers he has good grounds for objection to his classification may lodge an appeal to reach the Director of Education not later than forty clear days after the publication of this list in the *New Zealand Gazette*—i.e., such appeals must reach the Director not later than 22nd January, 1935, and must contain an explicit statement of the grounds on which the appeal is based.

NOTE.—In the last column of the classification list T.S. stands for "Technical School," E.B. for "Education Board," S. of A. for "School of Art," Int. for "Intermediate School (or Department)," and C.S. for "Combined School."

## RESOLUTION MAKING SPECIAL RATE.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by Part II of the Local Authorities Interest Reduction and Loans Conversion Act, 1932-33, and the Inangahua County Loans Conversion Order, 1934, the Inangahua County Council hereby resolves as follows:—

“That, for the purpose of providing interest, sinking fund, and other charges on the new securities authorized to be issued by the Inangahua County Council under the above-mentioned Act and Order whether in conversion of existing securities issued in respect of the loan set out in the First Schedule to the said Order, or for the purpose of providing for cash premium payments, and also interest, sinking fund, and other charges, or, as the case may be, instalments of principal and interest, on the unconverted securities issued in respect of such loan, the said Inangahua County Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of 0.427d. in the pound upon the rateable value (on the basis of the unimproved value) of all rateable property in the County of Inangahua, and that such special rate shall be an annually-recurring rate during the currency of such securities and be payable yearly on the 30th day of June in each and every year until the last maturity date of such securities, being the 1st day of December, 1964, or until all such securities are fully paid off.”
