IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by section twenty of the Forests Act, 1921-22, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting on the recommendation of the Minister of Lands, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto, being portion of a provisional State forest set apart by Proclamation dated the thirteenth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, and gazetted on the sixteenth day of that month, is required for settlement purposes; and, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, such land shall from and after the day of the gazetting hereof cease to be provisional State forest, and shall become subject to the provisions of the Land Act, 1924.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by the Town Boards Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the Town District of Otorohanga shall be altered by including therein the area described in the First Schedule hereto, such area now being part of the County of Otorohanga; and that the boundaries of the said town district, with such alteration as herein provided for, shall be those described in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

AREA INCLUDED IN THE TOWN DISTRICT OF OTOROHANGA.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Harbours Act, 1923, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby license and permit James McVeagh, William McHardy, Michael James Jones, and George Justin Browne, all of Auckland (hereinafter called "the licensees," which term shall include their executors, administrators, and assigns unless the context requires a different construction), to use and occupy all that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark at Brown's Bay, Waiheke Island, shown on plan marked M.D. 5200, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, for the purpose of the use of the wharf as shown on the said plan for a term of fourteen years computed from the thirtieth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensees upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the First Schedule hereto, and doth hereby prescribe that the dues and rates set forth in the Second Schedule hereto shall be charged and taken for the use of the said wharf.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the terms—
 - "Foreshore" means such parts of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides;
 - "Low-water mark" means low-water mark at ordinary spring tides;
 - "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.
2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto necessary for the maintenance of the said wharf at the site shown on plan marked M.D. 5200.
3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensees shall pay to the Minister the sum of £1, and thereafter an annual sum of £2 in advance, payable on the first day of April in each year, the proportionate part of such rental in respect of the period from the 30th day of August, 1934, until the 31st March following to be paid on the licensees being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.
4. All persons shall at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharf and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.
5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said wharf without payment.
6. The licensees shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair and shall at all times exhibit from the wharf and maintain at the licensees' own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.
7. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof, and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensees in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf requiring the licensees within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the licensees shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.
8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensees to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.
9. The master of all vessels discharging ballast at the said wharf shall have all such ballast taken away and deposited above high-water mark or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.
10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the 30th day of August, 1934, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensees shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.
11. The said rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensees three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensees in New Zealand.
12. The licensees shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the licensees' part.
13. In case the licensees shall—
 - (1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
 - (2) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty consecutive days;
 - (3) Become bankrupt, or be brought under the operation of any law for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy; or
 - (4) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions;

then, and in any of the said cases, this Order in Council and every right, power, or privilege may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensees or other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the *Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensees and to all persons concerned or interested that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred have been revoked and determined.

14. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the licensees shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said wharf entirely from the site and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of the revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and if the licensees fail so to do, the Minister may cause the said wharf to be removed and the site so restored and may recover from the licensees the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

SHIPPING WHARFAGE.

Every person who shall use the said wharf with any vessel shall pay for the use thereof as follows, that is to say:—

- For every vessel a sum of 1d. per ton on the gross tonnage of such vessel per day for each day or part of a day a vessel shall occupy a berth alongside any vessel lying at the said wharf, or shall lie at the said wharf undergoing repairs or fitting-out only, or shall lie off the said wharf with a line attached thereto.

GOODS WHARFAGE.

Every person who shall use the said wharf for landing or shipping any goods shall, before using same, pay dues as follows, that is to say:—

1. For all goods landed on the said wharf, a rate of 2s. 6d. per ton weight or measurement, at the option of the licensees.
2. For every head of great cattle or horses landed upon or shipped from the said wharf, 2s. 6d. per head.
3. For every yearling or calf so landed upon or shipped from the said wharf, the sum of 1s. per head.
4. For every head of sheep or small cattle so landed upon or shipped from the said wharf, the sum of 6d. per head.
5. If any ship shall use the said wharf for the discharge of any goods or cargo after the usual working hours or on wharf holidays, such ship shall pay to the licensees for the use of the said wharf a charge at the rate of 1s. per ton in addition to the above on all goods or cargo so discharged from such ship.

This charge will only be made when, in the opinion of the wharfinger, it is necessary to employ labour to stack or remove cargo in sheds in consequence of the discharge of such goods or cargo as aforesaid.

Order in Council consenting to the Raising of Part (£16,500) of the Sewerage Portion (£45,000) of the Blenheim Borough Council's 1919 Waterworks and Sewerage Poll Loan Authority of £110,000, and prescribing the Conditions thereof.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Orders in Council made on the twentieth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, the fifth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, and the nineteenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, consent was given under section twenty of the Finance Act, 1919, to the raising by the Blenheim Borough Council (hereinafter called "the said local authority")

of the sum of one hundred and ten thousand pounds (£110,000), by a loan to be known as "Waterworks and Sewerage Loan, 1920" (hereinafter called "the said loan"):

And whereas by Order in Council made on the seventh day of September, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, consent was given to the raising on certain conditions of the sum of forty-five thousand pounds (£45,000), being the sewerage portion of the said loan, and the sum of sixteen thousand five hundred pounds (£16,500) (hereinafter called "the said sum"), being portion thereof, has not yet been raised:

And whereas by section nine of the Local Authorities Interest Reduction and Loans Conversion Amendment Act, 1934, the consent given by the said Orders in Council was revoked, in so far as the authority conferred thereby had not been exercised, and it is not now lawful or competent for the said local authority to borrow any moneys to which such consent relates, except in accordance with the provisions of an Order in Council under section eleven of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926:

And whereas it is expedient to authorize the said local authority to borrow on the conditions hereinafter mentioned the said sum of sixteen thousand five hundred pounds (£16,500), being the whole of the moneys to which the said consent relates:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926, and by section 9 of the Local Authorities Interest Reduction and Loans Conversion Amendment Act, 1934, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the borrowing by the said local authority of the said sum of sixteen thousand five hundred pounds (£16,500) for the purpose for which the aforesaid sewerage portion (£45,000) of the said loan was authorized, and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

- (1) The term for which the said sum or any part thereof may be borrowed shall not exceed twenty-three years.
- (2) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said sum or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate exceeding three pounds ten shillings (£3 10s.) per centum per annum.
- (3) The said sum together with interest thereon shall be repaid by instalments of principal in the amounts and on the dates set out in the Schedule hereunder:—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Radio (Cook Islands Amendment) Regulations, 1934.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and be deemed to form part of the Radio Regulations, 1932 (hereinafter called "the principal regulations").

3. These regulations shall come into force on the date of their publication in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

4. The Cook Islands Amateur Radio Regulations, 1925, published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 11th day of June, 1925, are hereby revoked, but all licenses issued and in force thereunder shall remain in force and shall be deemed to be licenses issued under the corresponding provisions of the principal regulations as hereby amended.

5. The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking clause (b) of Regulation 1 thereof, and substituting the following clauses :—

"(b) These regulations shall not apply to the Territory of Western Samoa.

"(c) The following provisions of these regulations shall not apply to the Cook Islands :—

"Parts III, IV, and V, Section B of Part VI, and Part VII relating respectively to mobile stations, broadcasting stations, private commercial stations, private experimental (research) stations, and radio dealers, and comprising Regulations Nos. 74 to 154 (inclusive) and 176 to 213 (inclusive).

"(d) The provisions of clause 73 of Part II of the principal regulations shall not apply to the Island of Niue, for which territory the fees, if any, shall be as prescribed from time to time by the Minister of External Affairs."

6. Regulation 6 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding thereto the following words : "For the purposes of these regulations the Cook Islands shall be a Radio District classified as follows :—

"(5) Cook Islands."

7. The principal regulations are further amended by adding thereto the following provisions :—

"PART IX.—COOK ISLANDS.

"214. In the application of these regulations to the Cook Islands and also (so far as applicable) in the application to the Cook Islands of sections 199 to 201 (inclusive) of the Post and Telegraph Act, 1928—

"(i) All references to the Minister of Telegraphs shall, save as provided by Regulation No. 216 hereof, be construed as references to the Resident Commissioner of Rarotonga, or the Resident Commissioner of Niue, as the case may require, and all powers, discretions, and duties conferred or imposed on the Minister of Telegraphs shall be exercised and discharged by such Resident Commissioner.

“(ii) All references to a District Radio Inspector, to a Radio Inspector, and to the Secretary of the Post and Telegraph Department, respectively, shall be construed as references to the Superintendent of the Radio Station at Rarotonga, or the Superintendent of the Radio Station at Niue, as the case may require.

“(iii) All references to the Post and Telegraph Department and the officers thereof shall be construed as references to the Cook Islands Public Service and the officers thereof.

“(iv) All references to New Zealand as a territorial designation shall be construed as references to the Cook Islands.

“215. Under Regulation No. 10 a Resident Commissioner shall have power only to grant licences for—

“(i) An ordinary receiving station (Part II); and

“(ii) A private experimental (amateur) station (Part VI, Section A).

“216. Under Regulation No. 23 a Resident Commissioner shall have power only to grant an Amateur Operator's Certificate, and all other certificates mentioned in the said regulations shall be granted by the Minister of Telegraphs.

“217. The forms set out in the Schedule hereto when used in the Cook Islands shall be intituled with the words ‘Cook Islands,’ or ‘Niue,’ as the case may require, in lieu of the words ‘Dominion of New Zealand—Post and Telegraph Department.’”

8. The forms set out in the Schedule to the said regulations shall be intituled with the words “Cook Islands,” or “Niue,” as the case may require, in lieu of the words “Dominion of New Zealand—Post and Telegraph Department.”
