Sir Michael ▲ vested in me by the Marriage Act, 1908, I, Sir Michael Myers, the Administrator of the Government of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage districts known as the Morrinsville, Te Aroha, and Ohinemuri districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory here-tofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into three marriage districts, the names and boundaries where of shell be as follows: whereof shall be as follows :-

#### MORRINSVILLE DISTRICT.
