B Y virtue and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by section eighteen of the Forests Act, 1921-22, I, Sir Michael Myers, Administrator of the Government of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby set apart the national-endowment land described in the Schedule hereto as a provisional State forest.

SCHEDULE.

WESTLAND LAND DISTRICT.---WESTLAND FOREST-CONSERVA-TION REGION.

ALL those areas of national-endowment land in the Westland Land District, containing by admeasurement 1,446 acres, more or less, and described as follows :— All that area containing by admeasurement 1,380 acres, more or less, situated in Blocks VII and XI, Ahaura Survey District, and bounded as follows: Commencing at the inter-section of the eastern boundary of the said Block XI with the porth-eastern boundary of Section 31. HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL.

N pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by section thirty-four of the Cook Islands Act, 1915, and of every other authority enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby amend the Cook Islands Treasury Regulations, 1916, in the manner herein set forth.

### REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Cook Islands Treasury Regulations Amendment, 1935, and shall be read together with and form part of the Cook Islands Treasury Regulations, 1916 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal regulations").

2. Clause 7 (3) of the principal regulations, as amended by the Cook Islands Treasury Regulations Amendment, 1932, is hereby further amended by adding after the words "Treasurer of Rarotonga" the words " or other officer appointed by the Resident Commissioner of Rarotonga

to act in his stead," and by adding after the words "Resident Commissioner of Rarotonga" the words " or other officer appointed by him to act in his stead."

3. Clause 7 (4) of the principal regulations, as amended by the Cook Islands Treasury Regulations Amendment, 1932, is hereby further amended by adding after the words "Accountant, Cook Islands Department," the words "or other officer appointed by the Secretary for the Cook Islands to act in that capacity for the purposes of these regulations," and by adding after the words "Secretary for the Cook Islands" the words "or other officer authorized by him to act in his stead."

4. Clause 7 (5) of the principal regulations, as amended by the Cook Islands Treasury Regulations Amendment, 1932, is hereby further amended by adding after the words "Treasurer of Niue" the words "or other officer appointed by the Resident Commissioner of Niue to act in his stead," and by adding after the words "Resident Commissioner of Niue" the words "or other officer authorized by him to act in his stead."

5. Clause 7 (6) of the principal regulations, as amended by the Cook Islands Treasury Regulations Amendment, 1932, is hereby further amended by adding after the words "Accountant of the External Affairs Department" the words "or other officer appointed by the Secretary for External Affairs to act in that capacity for the purposes of these regulations."

### Wellington City Conversion Loan No. 1, 1935.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by Part II of the Local Authorities Interest Reduction and Loans Conversion Act, 1932-33, and the Wellington City Loans Conversion Order, 1935 (No. 1), the Wellington City Council hereby resolves as follows :---

"That, for the purpose of providing the interest, sinking fund, and other charges on the new securities authorized to be issued by the Wellington City Council under the above-mentioned Act and Order in conversion of existing securities issued in respect of the loans set out in the First Schedule to issued in respect of the loans set out in the First Schedule to that Order, and also the interest, sinking fund, and other charges in respect of the unconverted securities issued in respect of such loans, the said Wellington City Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of eleven one-hundredths of a penny (11/100d.) in the pound on the rateable value (on the basis of the unimproved value) of all rateable property of the district being the City of Wellington, and that such special rate shall be an annually recurring rate during the currency of such securities and be payable yearly on the 2nd day of June in each and every year until the last maturity date of such securities are fully paid off."
