HEREAS by section three hundred and two of the Land Act, 1924, as amended by section ten of the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1926, it is enacted that on the disposal of any national-endowment land by way of sale, or on the acquisition of the fee-simple of any such land, the Governor-General may by Proclamation declare that such land shall, as from a date to be specified in the Proclamation, cease to be national-endowment land:

In pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by section fourteen of the British Nationality and Status of Aliens (in New Zealand) Act, 1928, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following additional regulations for the purposes of the said Act and of Part II of the Imperial Act in its application to New Zealand, and doth hereby declare that the regulations hereby made and doth hereby declare that the regulations hereby made shall come into force on the date of their publication in the

REGULATIONS.

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Naturalization Amendment Regulations, 1935.

(2) In these regulations—

"The said Act." means the British Nationality and

"The said Act" means the British Nationality and Status of Aliens (in New Zealand) Act, 1928:

"The principal regulations" means the Naturalization Regulations, 1929 (being regulations made under the said Act by Order in Council dated the 2nd day of September, 1929, and published in the Gazette of the 5th day of the same month).

2. (1) A declaration by the wife of a naturalized British subject that she desires to acquire British nationality under section 10 of the Imperial Act (as set out in the Schedule to the British Nationality and Status of Aliens (in New Zealand) Amendment Act, 1934-35) in the application of the said section to New Zealand, shall be in the Form No. 1 in the First Schedule hereto.

(2) Clause 9 of the principal regulations is hereby amended y inserting the words "or acquisition" after the word resumption" wherever that word occurs in the said clause.

3. (1) A declaration by a British woman who has been married to an alien that she desires to retain while in New Zealand the rights of a British subject in accordance with the provisions of section 3 of the British Nationality and Status of Aliens (in New Zealand) Amendment Act, 1934-35, shall be in the Form No. 2 in the First Schedule hereto.

(2) A declaration made for the purposes of this clause may be made before a Stipendiary Magistrate but not otherwise. Every such declaration shall be registered in the Department of Internal Affairs at Wellington.

(3) With respect to declarations made for the purposes of this clause, the following provisions shall apply:—

(a) Every such declaration shall be subscribed in duplicate;
(b) The Stipendiary Magistrate taking any such declaration shall transmit to the Department of Internal Affairs at Wellington the two copies thereof; and
(c) On payment by the declarant of the prescribed fee for registration, one copy shall be officially noted as having been registered and shall be returned to the declarant, and one copy shall be filed in the Department. Department.

4. Clause 7 of the principal regulations is hereby revoked, and the following clause substituted therefor:—

and the following clause substituted therefor:—

"7. (1) Except in the case of persons resident in the Cook Islands or in Western Samoa, the oath of allegiance shall be taken within one calendar month after the date of the certificate of naturalization to which it relates; in the case of persons resident in the Cook Islands or in Western Samoa, the oath of allegiance shall be taken within three months after the date of the certificate of naturalization.

"/2) Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding

"(2) Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding subclause, the Minister of Internal Affairs may, if he thinks fit, extend the time within which the oath of allegiance may be taken.

"(3) If the oath of allegiance is not duly taken the certificate

(3) If the oath of allegiance is not duly taken the certificate of naturalization shall not take effect."

5. The Form No. 5 in the First Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting from the list of "Particulars relating to Applicant" the word "Nationality" after the words "Place and Date of Birth."

6. (1) Fees in accordance with the Second Schedule hereto shall be payable into the Consolidated Fund in respect of the several matters therein mentioned.

(2) Subclause (1) of clause 11 of the principal regulations and the Second Schedule to those regulations are hereby revoked.

Note.—A good autumn month, with mean temperature nearly 2° F. above normal. The extreme maximum was 80°. Total bright sunshine, 193 hours, 50 per cent. of the possible. Precipitation was 22 per cent. above normal. Except for a thunderstorm on the early morning of the 19th, the month was without incident. Mean dew-point at 9 a.m., 53.7°; mean vapour pressure, 0.413 in.

Notes on the Weather for March, 1935.

Notes on the Weather for March, 1935.

General.—March was a very satisfactory autumn month. The warmth and lack of wind led to rapid growth of vegetation, and a good supply of winter feed is assured. The only extensive area still suffering from a shortage of rainfall is North Canterbury. Parts of the southern Wairarapa, also, are still dry. Stock generally are reported to be in good condition, and the milk yield has recovered. There was much dull and damp weather in the first part of the month on the east coast of the North Island north of Hawke's Bay, and this had an adverse effect on sheep, a considerable amount of facial eczema being reported. Crops have done better than seemed probable earlier in the season.

Rainfall.—Except in the Auckland and Hawke's Bay Provinces the first half of the month was very dry, but in the latter half there were general rains, with heavy falls at most places. In Central and especially North Canterbury the total rain was below average. Hawke's Bay and parts of the interior of the North Island also had less than normal. On the west coast of the South Island conditions were irregular, but on the whole did not differ greatly from average. Over the rest of the country there was an excess. Many places in North Auckland, Taranaki, Nelson, Marlborough, and Otago had double the average.

double the average.

Temperatures were again considerably above normal, the departures ranging mainly between 1.5° and 3°. The one exception was Hawke's Bay, where the mean for the month was below the average. Some snow fell on the mountains on the 26th and 27th, but most of it subsequently disappeared. A few light frosts were recorded.

Sunshine.—Sunshine was unusually abundant on the West Coast and in the far southern portions of the South Island. On the east coast of the North Island, from Hawke's Bay northward, there was a considerable deficit, and this probably accounted for the low temperatures in that area. Elsewhere the totals did not differ greatly from normal.

Pressure Systems.—In the first part of the month there was very little storm activity over the Dominion. On the 3rd and 4th a depression moving from the north past East Cape caused heavy rains north of Hawke's Bay and in parts of the Bay of Plenty area.

Bay of Plenty area.

Between the 10th and the 14th a depression passed slowly by the northern extremity of the North Island and was responsible for north-easterly gales and heavy rains in most of the Auckland Province. Very severe flooding occurred in North Auckland.

The first general rains were associated with a rather complex storm system which was active over the country from the 15th to the 19th, the 17th being generally the wettest day. Floods occurred again in North Auckland and Taranaki, while few districts escaped very heavy falls.

From the 12th to the 17th pressure was high to the east of New Zealand, at Chatham Islands, a state of affairs which had characterized the dry weather of the early part of the summer. After the 17th, however, there was a definite change and

weather of a westerly type has since predominated.

Further general rains occurred during the passing of another series of depressions between the 24th and 27th. Very heavy falls were experienced from Taranaki and Wellington southwards. Taranaki had its third series of floods within five weeks. There was some flooding, also, in Southern Otago and Southland.

Many thunderstorms were recorded during the month, especially in the Auckland Province, and some were very severe
