A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section nine of section twelve of the Land Act, 1924, I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that from and after the date hereof the land comprised in the piece of closed road described in the First Schedule hereto, being land which is adjacent to the Takahue Domain described in the Second Schedule hereto, shall be deemed to be added to the said Takahue Domain.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the North Auckland Land District, containing by admeasurement 3 roods 6·7 perches, more or less, being Section 56, Block XV, Takahue Survey District, and being formerly an area of road closed by Proclamation published in *New Zealand Gazette*, 1935, page 553. As the same is more particularly delineated on a plan marked L. and S. 1/331, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Lands and Survey, at Wellington, and thereon bordered purple. (North Auckland plan 27783s, blue.)

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the Marriage Act, 1908, I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage districts known as the Napier and Hastings districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into two marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows:—

NAPIER DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Hawke's Bay, Wellington, Auckland, and Gisborne Land Districts, bounded on the north by the 39th parallel of south latitude from the Taharua River to a point due north of the source of the Waikare River; thence along a right line to the source of that river; thence down the middle of that river to the sea; thence by the sea to the mouth of the Ngaruroro River; thence up the middle of the Ngaruroro River to its confluence with the Waitio Stream; thence up the middle of the Waitio Stream to the eastern boundary of Section 5s, Crownthorpe Settlement; thence northerly generally along that boundary to Matapiro Road forming the northern boundary of the said Section 5s; thence westerly and northerly along the middle of Matapiro Road to Waitara Stream; thence up the middle of Waitara Stream to a point in line with the north-western boundary of Lot 2 on plan 4022 deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Napier; thence along the north-western boundaries of Lots 2 and 1 on said plan 4022 to the north-western corner of the last-mentioned lot; thence along the western boundaries of said Lot 1 and the western boundaries of Lot 3 on plan 2360 deposited as aforesaid to the Ngaruroro River; thence up the middle of the Ngaruroro River to the Taruarau River; thence up the middle of the Taruarau River to the south-eastern corner of the Mangaohane No. 1j Block; thence along a right line to Otupae Trig. Station; thence along the summit of the Ruahine Range to Maropea Trig. Station; thence along a right line to the source of the Maropea Stream; thence down the middle of the Maropea Stream to the Rangitikei River; thence up the middle of the Rangitikei River to the point where it is intersected by a right line running between Trig. Station No. 27, Motumatai, and Trig. Station No. 26, Tawaki Tohunga; thence along that right line to the said Tawaki

Tohunga; thence along a right line to Trig. Station No. 65A; thence along a right line running through Trig. Station 68A to the middle of the Mohaka River; thence up the middle of the Mohaka and Taharua Rivers to the 39th parallel of south latitude, the place of commencement.

HASTINGS DISTRICT.

All that area in the Hawke's Bay and Wellington Land Districts bounded on the north by the Napier District hereinbefore described, from the summit of the Ruahine Range to the sea at the mouth of the Ngaruroro River; thence by the sea to a point in line with the northern boundary-line of Lot 2 on plan 3216 deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Napier; thence to and along the northern boundary of the said Lot 2 and the northern boundary of Lot 1 on plan 3215 deposited as aforesaid to the north-western corner of the last-mentioned lot; thence along the eastern boundaries of Sections 6, 5, and 4, Block III, Oero Survey District (Elsthorpe Settlement), to the north-eastern corner of the last-mentioned section; thence westerly along the northern boundary of Section 4 aforesaid to the Hawea Stream; thence down the middle of the Hawea Stream to the Tuki Tuki River; thence up the middle of the Tuki Tuki River to the Papanui Stream; thence up the middle of the Papanui Stream to the Te Aute - Patangata Road; thence along the middle of the Te Aute - Patangata Road to the Te Aute Road; thence along the middle of the Te Aute Road to a point in line with the north-eastern boundary of the college land; thence along the north-eastern boundary of that land and the north-eastern boundaries of Section 1, Block XV, and Section 1, Block XIV, Maraekakaho Survey District, to the north-western corner of the last-mentioned section; thence along a right line to the intersection of the north-western boundary of S.G.R. 1, Block X, Maraekakaho Survey District, with the Manga-o-nuku River; thence to and up the middle of that river to its source; thence along the northern and north-western boundaries of Block III, the north-western boundaries of Block I, Block V, and again of Block I to the middle of the Mangamauku River; thence up the middle of that river to its source; thence along a right line to the confluence of the Makaroro River with the north branch of the Waipawa River; thence along a right line in the direction of Aorangi Trig. Station to the summit of the Ruahine Range, the place of commencement.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the first day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five.

WHEREAS by Article X of the agreement ratified and confirmed by the Trade Agreement (New Zealand and Canada) Ratification Act, 1932, it was provided that the said agreement should be brought into force upon a date to be agreed upon between the Governments of Canada and of New Zealand:

And whereas by the said Act it is provided that the date on which the said agreement is brought into force in accordance with Article X thereof shall be notified by the Governor-General by Proclamation:

And whereas by Proclamation made on the twenty-third day of May, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, and published in the *Gazette* on the same day, at page 1321, it was proclaimed and notified that the said agreement should come into force on the twenty-fourth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two:

And whereas by the said Article X it was further provided that the said agreement should remain in force for a period of one year:

And whereas the period for which the said agreement should remain in force has from time to time been extended:

And whereas it has been mutually agreed by His Majesty's Government in the Dominion of Canada and His Majesty's Government in the Dominion of New Zealand that the said agreement should be further extended as hereinafter appears:

And whereas by the said Act it is further provided that any agreement modifying the said agreement may be given effect to by Order in Council under the Customs Amendment Act, 1921:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the Customs Amendment Act, 1921, and subsection two of section two of the Trade Agreement (New Zealand and Canada) Ratification Act, 1932, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby order and direct that the operation of the said agreement shall be extended for a period of six months from the twenty-fourth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five.

RULES.

1. These rules may be cited as the Court of Review Fee Rules, 1935.
2. These rules shall come into force on the date of publication hereof in the *Gazette*.
3. The Court fees set out in the Schedule hereto shall be payable in respect of the proceedings of the Court of Review therein referred to.
4. The said fees shall be taken and paid by means of adhesive stamps affixed to the document (or leading document) to be filed in the respective proceeding.
5. The necessary stamps shall be so affixed when the document is presented for filing.
6. No fee shall be payable in respect of any application made or document filed by an Adjustment Commission or by a trustee appointed under the said Act.
