HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority contained in section three of the Land Drainage Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby alter the boundaries of the Thames Valley Drainage District by including in such district the area of land described in the First Schedule hereto; and doth hereby declare that the boundaries of the said drainage district, with such alteration as herein provided for, shall be those described in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

AREA INCLUDED IN THAMES VALLEY DRAINAGE DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District, bounded on the north-west, north, and east by the Thames Valley Drainage District as described in *New Zealand Gazette*, 1933, page 1859, from the south-eastern boundary of Section 5, as shown on plan 64, deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Auckland, to the south-eastern corner of Section 105, Matamata Settlement, Block VI, Tapapa Survey District; thence southerly along the western boundary of the Auckland-Rotorua Railway to the road forming the south-eastern boundary of Section 99, Block VI, Tapapa Survey District; thence south-westerly along the road forming the south-eastern boundary of Section 99, Block VI, and Section 98, Block IX, Tapapa Survey District, to the southernmost corner of the last-mentioned section; thence south-westerly along the road forming the south-eastern

Regulations under the Government Railways Act, 1926.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS section thirty-six of the Government Railways Act, 1926 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), is in the following terms: "There is hereby established within the Public Account a separate account to be called the Working Railways Account, which shall for all purposes be deemed to be the same account as that established by the same name under section three of the Government Railways Amendment Act, 1925":

And whereas section thirty-seven of the said Act specifies (*inter alia*) the moneys which shall be paid out of the Consolidated Fund into the Working Railways Account, and section thirty-eight thereof specifies (*inter alia*) the moneys which shall be paid out of the Working Railways Account into the Consolidated Fund:

And whereas by section thirty-nine of the said Act it is provided that any moneys in the Working Railways Account which in the opinion of the Government Railways Board are not required for the purposes of that Account may be invested in manner prescribed by section ninety-one of the Public Revenues Act, 1910 (now section ninety-seven of the Public Revenues Act, 1926):

And whereas section forty of the said Act makes provision whereby the Governor-General may, from time to time, by Order in Council—

- (a) Determine the rates of interest to be from time to time payable in terms of sections thirty-seven and thirty-eight of the said Act:
- (e) Determine the amount and the times and the manner of payment of the sums by the said Act authorized to be paid from the Consolidated Fund into the Working Railways Account, or from that Account into the Consolidated Fund:

- (f) Do any other thing necessary for the carrying out of the provisions of the said Act relative to the Working Railways Account:

And whereas it is necessary that the powers hereinbefore specified should be exercised:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the said section forty of the said Act, and of every other power and authority enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. The rate of interest payable under paragraph (a) of subsection one of section thirty-eight of the said Act—that is to say, on the total amount of capital moneys deemed to be expended in respect of the railways—shall be four and one-quarter per centum per annum.

2. (a) The rate of interest payable under paragraph (c) of subsection one of section thirty-eight of the said Act—that is to say, in respect of moneys advanced by way of loan from the Consolidated Fund—shall be four per centum per annum.

(b) Interest payable under paragraph (c) of subsection one of section thirty-eight of the said Act shall be computed from day to day on the amount of advances outstanding, and shall be payable quarterly on the last day of June, September, December, and March: Provided that when and so often as the advances are fully repaid the interest accrued thereon shall immediately become payable.

3. (a) For the purposes of paragraph (a) of subsection one of section thirty-eight of the said Act the total amount of capital moneys expended in respect of the railways shall be deemed to be the aggregate of the following sums:—

- (i) The amount of such capital moneys certified by the Controller and Auditor-General to have been expended in respect of the railways as at the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, reduced by the sum of ten million four hundred thousand pounds as prescribed by subsection two of section twenty-three of the Government Railways Amendment Act, 1931:
- (ii) The amount of moneys expended (including any imprest advances) on or after the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, as shown by the Treasury accounts, down to the last day of every month in respect of the vote of the Public Works Fund called "Railways Improvements and Additions to Open Lines" Vote:
- (iii) The amount of moneys, as recorded in the books of the Public Works Department, expended on or after the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, on lines which became a Government railway open for traffic within the meaning of the Government Railways Act, 1926, at any time prior to that date. For the purposes of this paragraph such moneys shall be treated as capital moneys from the last day of the month in which the expenditure was so recorded:
- (iv) The amount of moneys, as recorded in the books of the Public Works Department, expended whether before, on, or after the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, on lines which at any time on or after that date have or do become a Government railway open for traffic within the meaning of the Government Railways Act, 1926. For the purposes of this paragraph the moneys expended down to the date upon which a line becomes open for traffic shall be treated as capital moneys on such date, and the moneys subsequently expended on such line shall be treated as capital moneys from the last day of the month in which the expenditure was so recorded:
- (v) The amount of moneys expended on or after the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, as charges and expenses of raising by way of loan any moneys referred to in paragraphs (ii), (iii), and (iv) of this present clause three (subject to apportionment as allocated in the records of the Treasury in the case of loans raised partly for other purposes):
- (vi) The amount of Public Works administration and supervision charges incurred on or after the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, in respect of construction of railways as allocated in the records of the Treasury or Public Works Departments.
- (b) The total amount of capital moneys expended in respect of the railways determined in the manner prescribed by paragraph (a) of this clause shall be reduced by the amount of any moneys lawfully paid on or after the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, from the Working Railways Account down to the last day of every month to

the "Railways Improvements and Additions to Open Lines" Vote of the Public Works Fund in respect of the cost of assets worn out, abandoned, destroyed, or obsolete in the service of the Working Railways Department.

4. Interest on surplus moneys of the Working Railways Account invested in terms of section thirty-nine of the said Act shall be paid to the Working Railways Account as and when received by the Treasury.

5. Any securities in which any of the balances of the Public Account may from time to time lawfully be invested pursuant to section thirty-nine of the Public Revenues Act, 1926, are hereby declared to be securities in which any moneys in the Working Railways Account may be invested in manner prescribed by section ninety-seven of the Public Revenues Act, 1926, pursuant to section thirty-nine of the Government Railways Act, 1926.

6. This Order in Council shall be deemed to have come into operation on the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five, in substitution for the Order in Council made under the Government Railways Amendment Act, 1925, on the twenty-second day of February, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, which, together with all amendments thereto, shall be deemed to have been revoked as on and from the said first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 21st day of

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Dairy Industry Act, 1908, His
 Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with
 the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby
 make the following regulations in further amendment of the
 regulations relating to the inspection and registration of dairies
 in force under the said Act made on the twenty-fourth day of
 December, one thousand nine hundred, and published in
 the *Gazette* on the tenth day of January, one thousand nine
 hundred and one, at page 66 (hereinafter referred to as "the
 principal regulations").

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations shall come into force on the date of
 the publication hereof in the *Gazette*.

2. The principal regulations are hereby amended by
 inserting, following Regulation 21 thereof, as inserted by
 amending Order in Council under the said Act made on the
 21st day of December, 1925, and published in the *Gazette*
 on the 7th day of January, 1926, at page 19, the following
 additional regulation:—

"21A. (1) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in
 the last preceding regulation, it shall be lawful for any dairy
 company within the meaning of the Dairy Industry Act, 1908,
 to sell cream obtained by the company from a dairy which
 has not been registered under these regulations subject to the
 following conditions:—

"(a) Such cream shall be either—

"(i) Cream to which has been assigned the grade of 'Finest'
 pursuant to the provisions in that behalf of the
 Dairy-produce General Regulations, 1933; or

"(ii) Cream taken from milk to which has been assigned
 the grade of 'Finest' pursuant to the provisions in
 that behalf of the last-mentioned regulations.

"(b) Such cream shall be pasteurized so as to conform to
 the standard of pasteurized cream contained in the regulations
 made under the Sale of Food and Drugs Act, 1908, on the
 20th day of August, 1935, and published in the *Gazette* on the
 22nd day of the same month, at page 2339.

"(c) Every package containing such cream shall be labelled
 in conformity with the regulations for the time being in
 force under the Sale of Food and Drugs Act, 1908.

"(d) Every sale of cream under this regulation shall be
 subject in all respects to the provisions of the Health Act,
 1920, the Sale of Food and Drugs Act, 1908, and all regulations
 thereunder respectively for the time being in force.

"(e) Nothing contained herein shall authorize a failure to
 comply with clause 2 of the Dairy-produce General Regula-
 tions, 1933, so far as the provisions thereof may be applicable
 to the circumstances.

"(2) Subject to compliance with the Health Act, 1920, the
 Sale of Food and Drugs Act, 1908, and all regulations there-
 under respectively for the time being in force, any person to
 whom any pasteurized cream is sold under the authority of this
 regulation may resell such cream for human consumption."

Classification of Assistant Teachers in Technical Schools and of Manual-training Teachers.

THE following lists of assistant teachers employed in technical schools, combined schools, recognized technical classes and recognized manual-training classes, or classified for employment in such schools or classes, are issued under the authority of the Minister of Education in accordance with the regulations relating to technical schools, recognized technical classes, recognized manual-training classes, and combined secondary and technical schools, made by Orders in Council dated the 10th November, 1925, and 25th September, 1931.

Under the heading "Division" is shown the division and class in which the teacher is classified.

The class of salary corresponding with the class and division in which the teacher is placed is given in the Schedule to the aforementioned regulations.

Attention is drawn to the regulations relating to appeals of teachers against their classification and grading, under which any teacher who considers he has good grounds for objection to his classification may lodge an appeal to reach the Director of Education not later than forty clear days after the publication of this list in the *New Zealand Gazette*—*i.e.*, such appeals must reach the Director not later than 21st January, 1936, and must contain an explicit statement of the grounds on which the appeal is based.

NOTE.—In the last column of the classification list T.S. stands for "Technical School," E.B. for "Education Board," S. of A. for "School of Art," Int. for "Intermediate School (or Department)," and C.S. for "Combined School."
