IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the Public Works Act, 1928, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby revoke so much of the Proclamation dated the twenty-fifth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirty, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 22 of the twenty-seventh day of the same month, at page 848, setting apart land in the Borough of Lower Hutt for the purposes of the Wellington-Napier Railway (Lower Hutt Valley Duplication) as affects the land described in the Schedule hereto.

(c) In the case of a supply for motor-power, heating, cooking, or any purpose other than lighting purposes other than a wholesale supply, a sum of 1s. per unit, reducible on payment within fourteen days of due date to 10d. per unit.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the Nuhaka Thermal-springs Reserve is subject to the provisions of the Tourist and Health Resorts Control Act, 1908, and it is expedient to make by-laws for the management and control of such reserve :

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the said Act and of all other powers and authorities in that behalf enabling him, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the by-laws made on the twelfth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, for the management and control of the said reserve, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following by-laws.

#### BY-LAWS.

##### NUHAKA THERMAL-SPRINGS RESERVE.

1. In these by-laws—

“ General Manager ” means the General Manager of the Department of Tourist and Health Resorts, and includes any person who may be acting for the General Manager :

“ Caretaker ” means the person having the general charge and control (under the direction of the General Manager) of the Nuhaka Thermal-springs Reserve :

“ The reserve ” means the reserve described in the First Schedule hereto, and includes any buildings or enclosures erected and to be erected within such reserve.

2. The hours at which the reserve shall be open to the public under these by-laws may be fixed from time to time by the General Manager.

3. No person shall enter any bathhouse without the permission of the Caretaker, nor without first paying the charge as prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto.

4. Persons suffering from skin-diseases shall not bathe in any baths, nor use any towels, except those specially set apart for their use. Any such person shall inform the Caretaker, before taking the baths, of the fact that he or she is so suffering.

5. No person shall wash or place in any bath any clothes, soap, substance, article, or thing.

6. No person shall occupy a bath for a longer period than twenty minutes at one time.

7. No person shall smoke or expectorate in any bath or bathhouse.

8. No dog shall be allowed on the premises of any bathhouse.

9. No person shall pick any flower, or break or destroy any plant, shrub, or tree growing in the reserve.

10. No person shall place, deposit, or leave any bottle or glassware (whether broken or whole), paper, straw, litter, dirt, rubbish, or any offensive or noxious matter of any kind in the reserve.

11. No horse, dog, or other animal shall be allowed within the reserve; and for each occasion on which any horse, dog, or other animal trespasses or is allowed to trespass in the reserve the owner of such horse, dog, or other animal shall be liable for breach of these by-laws. This by-law shall not, however, apply in the case of dogs which are led by a leash.

12. No person shall trespass upon any portion of the reserve which may be set apart for planting.

13. No person shall break, remove, deface by writing or marking, or otherwise injure or damage any rock or stone or silica within the reserve.

14. No person shall destroy, deface, or injure any inscription, or any label attached to or connected with any tree, shrub, or other plant.

15. No person shall bathe in any pool or stream within the reserve.

16. No person shall, without the written permission of the General Manager, carry or use any gun, rifle, or firearm, or use any net, engine, instrument, or device, or use any dog, for the capture or destruction of any bird or animal, or take or attempt to take the eggs or young of any bird in the reserve.

17. Every person using any bath shall conform to and abide by these by-laws; and in case any such person shall while using any such bath commit any indecency or breach of the peace, or be guilty of any disorderly conduct, or commit a breach of any of these by-laws, the Caretaker may (without prejudice to any proceedings for a penalty) require any such person to abstain from doing any of the acts aforesaid and forthwith to leave the premises or the reserve.

18. Any person behaving to the annoyance of any person shall, if requested by the Caretaker, immediately leave the reserve, and may be prohibited from again entering.

19. Every person who commits a breach of any of these by-laws shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such breach.

Amending Warrant defining the Limits of the Harbour of Havelock, Marlborough.

NOTE.—December was almost an ideal month in Wellington. The approximate mean temperature was 2.7° above normal, exactly as much above as it was below in the preceding month. Total bright sunshine amounted to 227 hours, which is 48 per cent. of the possible. There were two days on which no sunshine was registered. Rainfall was 5 per cent. above normal, falling mainly on two days—i.e., the 19th and 29th. Northerly winds predominated, and the mean daily run was below the average. Mean dew-point at 9 a.m., 55.7°; mean vapour pressure, 0.444 in.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR DECEMBER, 1935.

General.—December was a remarkably fine month. For the holiday-makers there was abundance of fine and warm weather, yet at the same time the man on the land, generally speaking, got just the conditions he desired. Temperatures were much above normal, and though the last few days were relatively cool there was no really cold spell. Rainfall was, in general, considerably below normal, but this was no drawback after the wet and cold spring. One or two good falls met all requirements in most districts. A fairly humid atmosphere and an absence of wind were favourable features which tended to minimize any lack of rain. Stock are reported to be in good fettle, and lambs fattening well. There is abundance of feed, and much hay and ensilage were made under favourable circumstances. Crops promise to be much above average. Conditions were favourable for shearing, but it is still somewhat behindhand.

Rainfall.—Rainfall was generally above average north of Kawhia and Tauranga and in parts of Taranaki, but elsewhere, except for isolated patches, it was very much below. Canterbury had only about 25 per cent. of the average.

Temperatures.—From Nelson and Marlborough northwards temperatures were generally from 2 to 4 degrees above average. To the southward the departures were still greater, rising to over 6 degrees in South Canterbury and Otago and to 7 degrees at Invercargill. In these latter parts it was the hottest December on record with the exception of that of 1934. Christmas was, in many places, the warmest recorded, and there were other very hot days.

Sunshine.—Nelson, Marlborough, and Canterbury had more than the average sunshine, but elsewhere conditions were fairly normal.

Pressure Systems.—The month was remarkable for the persistence of high pressure over the Dominion. Anticyclonic conditions prevailed continuously until the 12th, fine and warm weather being almost general throughout this period. There were slight disturbances on the 13th and 14th which caused scattered light to moderate rains and a few thunderstorms, but mainly in western districts and from Taranaki southwards.

The only vigorous depression affecting the country during the month was one which arose from the remains of a tropical cyclone which developed in the New Hebrides on the 14th. This depression passed down the west coast of the North Island and thence across the South during the period from the 17th to the 19th. It caused general rains, which were of very great benefit. Except eastern portions of the South Island almost all districts had heavy falls, and in North Auckland there was some flooding. Inland from Oamaru, also, there were some isolated very heavy rains. A north-easterly gale did some damage in Auckland Harbour on the 18th.

After another period of anticyclonic weather a moderate depression passed rather rapidly eastward between the 28th and 30th. Widespread rains again occurred, with heavy falls in many places, but the rain was not so general nor so long continued as in the previous depression. Rather cool weather followed till the end of the month.
