All motor-spirits sold at any time after the coming into force of these regulations under the following names, brands, or descriptions—namely, Power Chief, Texaco 400, Shell, Big Tree, Plume, Atlantic, and Europa—are hereby declared to belong to the class of standard grade motor-spirits.

All motor-spirits sold after the coming into force of these regulations under the following names, brands, or descriptions—namely, Super Power Chief, Super Shell, Super Plume

Ethyl, and Atlantic Ethyl-are hereby declared to belong to

the class of premium grade motor-spirits.

4. These regulations shall apply only to the area specified in the Schedule hereto, and the wholesale prices set out in clauses 6, 7, 8, and 9 hereof shall be the prices charged for delivery within that area to a purchaser, either in containers helding not here they 40 gallers are in hill. holding not less than 44 gallons or in bulk into underground

tanks.

5. The maximum price at which a wholesaler may sell standard grade motor-spirits shall be 1s. 7d. per imperial

gallon.
6. The maximum price at which a wholesaler may sell premium grade motor-spirits shall be 1s. 8d. per imperial gallon.

The maximum wholesale price of standard grade motorspirits to a purchaser taking at least 400 imperial gallons a month for use in his own business or businesses and not for resale shall be 1s. 7½d. per imperial gallon unless the purchaser owns his own pump, in which case the maximum wholesale price shall be 1s. 7d. per imperial gallon.

8. The maximum wholesale price of premium grade motorspirits to a purchaser taking at least 400 imperial gallons a month for use in his own business or businesses and not for resale shall be 1s. 84d. per imperial gallon unless the purchaser.

resale shall be 1s. 8½d. per imperial gallon unless the purchaser owns his own pump, in which case the maximum wholesale price shall be 1s. 8d. per imperial gallon.

9. The maximum and the minimum price at which a reseller may sell standard grade motor-spirits shall be 1s. 10d. per imperial stallers.

10. The maximum and the minimum price at which a reseller may sell premium grade motor-spirits shall be 1s. 11d.

The price of bread shall be the standard price thereof on the 8th day of February, 1936—that is to say, in respect of every locality the current price at which on that day bread of the same nature and quality was saleable in that locality when sold in the same quantity and on the same terms as to payment, delivery, and otherwise;

Provided that the price of bread in the localities mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be 10d. per 4 lb. loaf and 5d. per 2 lb. loaf when sold by way of sale by retail for cash over counter at stores or when sold by way of sale by retail for cash at bakehouse, and the price when sold by way of sale by wholesale to stores shall be 9d. per 4 lb. loaf and 4½d. per 2 lb. loaf.

4. Notwithstanding anything in this Order in Council, the Minister may by order made and published by him in such manner as he thinks fit authorize the sale of bread in any specified locality at a price exceeding or less than the standard price aforesaid by such amount as the Minister thinks fit; and nothing in this Order in Council shall apply to the sale of bread in that locality in accordance with the authority so granted by the Minister.

SWITZERLAND (EXTRADITION: COMMONWEALTH OF AU-TRALIA AND NEW ZEALAND) ORDER IN COUNCIL, 1935.

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 20th day of December, 1935.

Present:

THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 (33 & 34 Viet., c. 52) whereas by the Extradition Acts, 1870 (33 & 34 Vict., c. 52) to 1932 (22 & 23 Geo. 5, c. 39) it was, amongst other things, enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified pected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a treaty was signed on the 26th day of November, 1880, between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and the Swiss Federal Council for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which treaty was amended by a Convention signed on the 29th day of June, 1904:

And whereas the said treaty and Convention were duly

ratified.

And whereas under the provisions of Article 3 of the Supple-

And whereas under the provisions of Article 3 of the Supplementary Convention signed on the 19th day of December, 1934, between His Majesty and the Swiss Federal Council for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, the terms whereof were recited in the Switzerland (Extradition) Order in Council, 1935, and are as follows:—

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland, and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, and the Swiss Federal Council, desiring to make further provision for the reciprocal extradition of fugitive criminals, have resolved to conclude a Supplementary Convention to this end, and for this purpose have appointed as their plenipotentiaries—

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland, and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India:

For Great Britain and Northern Ireland—

Sir Howard Kennard, His Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary in Switzerland;

The Swiss Federal Council—

M. Giuseppe Motta, Federal Counsellor, Chief of the Federal Political Department;
Who, having communicated to each other their full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed as follows:—

Article 1.

From the date of the coming into force of the present convention, Article 2 of the Extradition Treaty signed at Berne on the 26th November, 1880, shall be amended by the addition of the following clause:-

"Extradition may also be granted at the discretion of the High Contracting Party applied to in respect of any other crime or offence for which, according to the laws of both of the High Contracting Parties for the time being in force, the grant may be made.

Article 2.

The foregoing amendment shall apply to extradition proceedings between Switzerland on the one hand, and, on the ceedings between Switzerland on the one hand, and, on the other hand, the following territories of His Majesty, that is to say, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, Newfoundland, British Colonies, British Protectorates to which the Extradition Treaty of the 26th November, 1880, applies, and mandated territories to which the said treaty has been or may be extended, and in respect of which the mandate is exercised by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

Article 3.

The High Contracting Parties agree that His Majesty the King may accede to the present Convention in respect of any other member of the British Commonwealth of Nations whose Government may desire that such accession be effected, by a notice given to that effect by the appropriate diplomatic representative of His Majesty at Berne. From the date that such notice comes into effect the amendment set forth in Article 1 shall apply to extradition proceedings between Switzerland on the one hand and the territory of the member of the Commonwealth concerned on the other hand.

Any notice given under the first paragraph of this Article in respect of any member of the British Commonwealth of Nations may include any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty and is exercised by the Government of the member concerned.

The present Convention shall be ratified. The ratifications shall be exchanged in London as soon as possible.

Article 5.

The present Convention shall enter into force three months after the exchange of ratifications, and shall have the same duration as the Extradition Treaty of the 26th November,

In faith whereof the above-named plenipotentiaries have signed the present Convention and have affixed thereto their


