Animals Protection and Game Regulations, 1930 (Amendment No. 2).

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on him by the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations by way of amendment to the Animals Protection and Game Regulations, 1930 (hereinafter called "the principal regulations").

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Animals Protection and Game Regulations, 1930, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and form part of the principal regulations.

2. Clause (3) of Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding thereto the following proviso:—

"Provided that in the Auckland Acclimatization District licenses authorizing the holder thereof to take or kill both imported game and native game shall be in the form No. 1A in the Schedule hereto."

3. Clause (6) of the said Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding thereto the following proviso:—

"Provided that in the Auckland Acclimatization District the fee payable for a license to take or kill both imported game and native game shall be twenty-five shillings (25s.)."

4. The Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding thereto after form No. 1 the following form:—

"[Form No. 1A.

"LICENSE TO TAKE OR KILL IMPORTED GAME AND NATIVE GAME IN THE AUCKLAND ACCLIMATIZATION DISTRICT ONLY.

" , of , having this day paid the sum of twenty-five shillings (25s.) is hereby authorized to take or kill within the Acclimatization District of Auckland from the day of , 19 , to the day of , 19 (both days inclusive), subject to the provisions of the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22.

"This license does not authorize the holder thereof to take or kill imported game or native game on lands actually and exclusively used by any registered acclimatization society for acclimatization purposes, or on any sanctuary or public domain, or on any land excepted from the operation of the notification declaring an open season for the district.

Order in Council consenting to the Raising of Loans by certain Local Authorities and prescribing the Conditions thereof.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the several local authorities enumerated in the Schedule hereto, being desirous of raising the respective loans stated opposite their names therein, have respectively complied with the provisions of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council, as required by the said Act, should be given to the raising of the said loans:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the said Act, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising in New Zealand by the respective local authorities mentioned in the First Column of the said Schedule of the respective loans set out in the Second Column of the said Schedule, up to the respective amounts specified in the Third Column of the said Schedule, and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

1. The terms for which the said loans or any parts thereof may be raised shall be the respective terms (in years) stated in the Fourth Column of the said Schedule.
2. The rates of interest that may be paid in respect of the said loans or any parts thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate or rates exceeding the respective rates per centum per annum stated in the Fifth Column of the said Schedule.
3. The said local authorities shall, before raising the said respective loans or any parts thereof, make provision for the repayment thereof by establishing sinking funds under the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, or under such other statutory enactment as may be applicable in any respective case, and shall thereafter make payments to such sinking funds at intervals of not more than one year, at a rate or rates per centum which shall be not less than the respective rates stated in the Sixth Column of the said Schedule, such payments to be made in respect of every part of the said respective loans for the time being so borrowed and not repaid, the first such payment in each respective case to be made not later than one year after the first day from which interest to the lender or lenders is computed on any loan or part thereof so raised.

WHEREAS the several local authorities enumerated in the Schedule hereto, being desirous of raising the respective loans stated opposite their names therein, have respectively complied with the provisions of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council, as required by the said Act, should be given to the raising of the said loans :

PURSUANT to the Agriculture (Emergency Powers) Act, 1934, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Dairy Suppliers Regulations, 1936.

(2) Unless the contrary intention appears, terms or expressions used in these regulations shall have the meaning assigned to them by the Dairy-produce General Regulations, 1933 (hereinafter referred to as "the said regulations").

(3) These regulations shall come into force on the date of the publication hereof in the *Gazette*.

2. Where at any time after the 1st day of August, 1935, but during any period prescribed in clause 55 of the said regulations, in which any person, being the occupier of a supplying dairy has supplied milk or cream produced in his dairy to the owner or manager of any manufacturing dairy registered as a creamery, cheese-factory, or skimming-station, the owner of such manufacturing dairy—

(a) Ceases to purchase milk or cream produced in supplying dairies by reason of having disposed of the business of such manufacturing dairy to the owner of any other manufacturing dairy registered as a creamery, cheese-factory, or skimming-station, or to two or more of such owners; or

(b) Refuses to continue to purchase milk or cream produced by the said occupier in his dairy—

the following provisions shall, notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in paragraph (b) of the proviso to the said clause 55 of the said regulations, but subject to the other provisions of the said clause 55, apply, that is to say,—

(i) If the business aforesaid is acquired by one of such owners, the said occupier shall supply all milk or cream produced thereafter in the said supplying dairy during the said period to the owner or manager of the manufacturing dairy acquiring the business aforesaid.

(ii) If the business aforesaid is acquired by two or more of such owners, the said occupier shall upon receipt of a notice in writing signed by such owners supply all milk or cream produced thereafter in the said supplying dairy during the said period to the owner or manager of the manufacturing dairy specified in that behalf in such notice.

(iii) If in refusing to continue to purchase milk or cream produced by the said occupier in his dairy the owner of such manufacturing dairy is acting in pursuance of an agreement in writing in that behalf made with the owner of any other manufacturing dairy registered as a creamery, cheese-factory, or skimming-station, the said occupier shall, upon receipt of a notice in writing signed by one or other of such owners (being the parties to any such agreement), supply all milk or cream produced thereafter in the said supplying dairy during the said period to the owner or manager of the manufacturing dairy specified in that behalf in such notice.

The Dairy Factories (Licensing) Regulations, 1936.—(Notice No. Ag. 3367.)

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Agriculture (Emergency Powers) Act, 1934, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke the Dairy Factories (Licensing) Regulations, 1935, made under the said Act on the twelfth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five, and published in the *Gazette* on the sixteenth day of the same month, at page 1935, and doth hereby make the following regulations in lieu thereof.

REGULATIONS.

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Dairy Factories (Licensing) Regulations, 1936.

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the date of the publication hereof in the *Gazette*.

(3) In these regulations, unless inconsistent with the context,—

"Director" means the Director of the Dairy Division of the Department of Agriculture;

"Minister" means the Minister of Agriculture.

(4) All licenses, registers, and generally all acts of authority which originated under the regulations hereby revoked and are subsisting or in force on the coming into operation of these regulations shall enure for the purposes of these regulations as fully and effectually as if they had originated under the corresponding provisions of these regulations, and accordingly shall, where necessary, be deemed to have so originated.

2. These regulations shall apply to all premises used as dairy factories with the exception of premises the buildings of which on the coming into force of these regulations are and continue to be duly registered pursuant to the Dairy-produce General Regulations, 1933, and which are not after the coming into force of these regulations totally or substantially rebuilt, whether on the same or any other site, or altered whether structurally or by way of additions thereto, and the plant erected in which is not after the last-mentioned date so altered or extended as to increase the manufacturing capacity of the premises.

3. (1) No person shall use as a dairy factory any premises to which these regulations apply unless such person is the holder of a license in that behalf in respect of such premises granted pursuant to these regulations.

(2) No person, being the holder of a license in respect of any premises licensed as a dairy factory under these regulations, shall use such premises contrary to any term or condition specified in the license.

4. (1) Every person desiring to obtain a license in respect of premises to which these regulations apply shall make application in writing to the Director in or to the effect of the form numbered 1 in the Schedule hereto.

(2) Except as provided by the next succeeding subclause hereof, every such application shall be accompanied by plans of the existing or proposed building and/or proposed alterations, together with particulars of the site on which the building is or is to be erected, and of the materials to be used in the carrying-out of any proposed work.

(3) The requirements of subclause (2) of this clause shall not apply in the case of premises duly registered on the coming into force of these regulations under the Dairy-produce General Regulations, 1933, the plant erected in which is proposed or intended to be so altered or extended as to increase the manufacturing capacity of the premises without a total or substantial rebuilding or alteration whether structurally or by way of additions thereto.

(4) In the case of an application for a license in respect of premises to which the last preceding subclause hereof applies, it shall be sufficient if the application contains particulars of the proposed alterations or extensions of the plant erected in the buildings comprised in the said premises as set forth in paragraph 10 of the said form numbered 1 in the Schedule hereto.

(5) If in the opinion of the Director any information or particulars required by the said form numbered 1 are insufficiently given the Director may require the applicant to furnish such further details, information, and particulars as the Director may think necessary.

5. (1) If the Director is of opinion that the application should be acceded to according to its terms he may, subject to compliance by the applicant with the provisions of the Dairy-produce General Regulations, 1933, as to registration of manufacturing dairies, forthwith grant a license to the applicant pursuant to these regulations in the form numbered 2 in the Schedule hereto.

(2) If the Director is of opinion that the application should be acceded to in part but not wholly he shall give the applicant an intimation to that effect, and the applicant may elect to accept a license in accordance with the Director's intimation, and thereupon the Director shall, subject as aforesaid, forthwith grant a license to the applicant as aforesaid.

(3) If the applicant elects not to accept a license under the last preceding subclause hereof, or if the Director is of opinion that the application should be wholly refused, the Director may refer the application to a committee consisting of three persons who shall be appointed by the Minister.

6. In respect of any application referred to a committee pursuant to subclause (3) of the last preceding clause hereof, the committee shall make such investigations as it thinks fit and shall consider such representations as may be made to it by the owners of any other dairy factories in the locality, and shall report the result of its investigations to the Director.

In particular, the committee shall advise the Director upon the following matters in relation to the application:—

(a) Whether or not there is any economic necessity or justification for the establishment of such premises as a dairy factory or an additional dairy factory in the locality in which the premises are to be erected or for the carrying-out of the proposed work.

(b) The prospect of carrying on successfully the manufacture of dairy-produce in the premises sought to be licensed, and according to the capacity or proposed capacity of such premises having regard to all relevant circumstances.

(c) The probable or possible effect of competition from the premises sought to be licensed on the quality of the dairy-produce which might be manufactured therein, or in any dairy duly registered pursuant to the Dairy-produce General Regulations, 1933, and proposed to be used in connection therewith or in competing dairies duly registered pursuant to the said regulations.

(d) Whether in the opinion of the committee the application for a license should be acceded to either wholly or in part.

7. (1) Whenever the Director determines to refer an application to a committee he shall notify the applicant to that effect.

(2) The applicant shall forthwith lodge with the Director security for the payment of the costs of the committee's investigations in the sum of £50 by way of deposit or of bond with two approved sureties, or in such other form as the Director may deem sufficient.

(3) Until the security is completed by the applicant it shall not be obligatory to take any further steps towards setting up a committee or referring the application to the committee.

(4) If in the opinion of the committee the application should be acceded to either wholly or to an extent substantially greater than in accordance with the Director's intimation to the applicant under subclause (2) of clause 5 hereof, then the security given by the applicant shall forthwith be discharged.

(5) If in the opinion of the committee the application should be wholly refused, or should be acceded to to an extent not substantially greater than in accordance with the Director's intimation to the applicant under subclause (2) of clause 5 hereof, then the costs of investigation by the committee not exceeding the sum of £50 shall be borne by the applicant and may be raised out of the security given as aforesaid or recovered as a debt due to the Crown.

(6) A certificate under the hand of the Director setting out the costs of any such investigation shall be final and conclusive in all respects.

(7) Any question as to whether the opinion of the committee is upon the true construction thereof that an application should be acceded to to an extent substantially greater than in accordance with the Director's intimation to the applicant under subclause (2) of clause 5 hereof shall be referred to the Executive Commission of Agriculture whose decision shall be final and conclusive in all respects.

8. (1) In deciding to grant or refuse a license the Director shall take into consideration the report of the committee to which the application has been referred pursuant to subclause (3) of clause 5 hereof, and may, if he thinks fit, refer the application again to the committee for a further report, and in any case (whether the application has been referred to a committee or not) in which the Director is of the opinion that the application should be granted whether wholly or in part, the Director shall, subject to compliance by the applicant with the provisions of the Dairy-produce General Regulations, 1933, as to registration of manufacturing dairies, grant a license to the applicant pursuant to these regulations in the form numbered 2 in the Schedule hereto.

(2) Every such license shall authorize the licensee to use the premises specified in the license as a dairy factory pursuant to these regulations to the extent only of any term or condition in that behalf specified in the license.

9. In granting any license under these regulations the Director may impose as a term or condition of the license a term or condition limiting the purpose for which the premises specified in the license may be used, and fixing the maximum quantity of any specified kind of dairy-produce that may be manufactured in the licensed premises during any period or periods specified in that behalf in the license.

10. Any license heretofore granted under the regulations hereby revoked containing as a term or condition of the license a term or condition purporting to limit the purpose for which the licensed premises may be used, and/or to fix the maximum quantity and kind of dairy-produce that may be manufactured in the licensed premises during any period or periods specified in the license, shall be as valid and effectual as if such license containing the said term or condition had been granted under these regulations.

11. Any license may be revoked by the Director in writing addressed to the licensee in any of the following events:—

(a) If the licensee of the licensed premises so requests.

(b) If during the period of twelve months immediately preceding such revocation the licensee of the licensed premises has been convicted of any offence under these regulations or under the Dairy Industry Act, 1908, or the Sale of Food and Drugs Act, 1908, or any regulations for the time being in force under either of those Acts.

(c) If in the opinion of the Director there has been a substantial breach of or non-compliance with any term or condition of the license or of these regulations.

12. (1) No person being the holder of a license in respect of any premises licensed as a dairy factory under these regulations shall, except with the prior approval in writing of the Director, make or permit or cause to be made—

(a) Any alterations whether structural or by way of additions to the buildings comprised in the licensed premises; or

(b) Any alteration to or extension of the plant erected in the said buildings, being an alteration or extension designed to increase the manufacturing capacity of the licensed premises.

(2) The provisions of clauses 4 to 7 (both inclusive) hereof shall, so far as the said clauses are applicable, apply, *mutatis mutandis*, to any application under this clause for approval of any alterations to the buildings comprised in any licensed premises, or of any alteration or extension of the plant erected therein being an alteration or extension designed to increase the manufacturing capacity of the licensed premises, as if such application were an application for a license under these regulations.

13. Every member of a committee appointed pursuant to these regulations may be paid such fee not exceeding £2 2s. as may be considered reasonable by the Minister for each day or part of a day on which he is engaged on the business of the committee together with all reasonable and actual expenses incurred by him in respect of his attendance on the business of the committee.

14. (1) The Director shall cause a register to be kept of every license issued under these regulations.

(2) A copy certified by the Director of any entry in the register shall be *prima facie* evidence of such entry and of the facts appearing therein, and a certificate under the hand of the Director of the absence of an entry in the register shall be *prima facie* evidence of the facts stated in such certificate.

15. (1) The holder of any license in respect of any premises licensed as a dairy factory under these regulations who desires to transfer such license shall make application for a transfer of the license in writing to the Director in or to the effect of the form numbered 3 in the Schedule hereto.

(2) Every such application shall be accompanied by the license to which the same relates.

(3) The Director on receipt of such application shall, upon being satisfied as to the facts, endorse on the license the words "Transferred to [Full name and address of transferee]," and shall sign such endorsement, and shall thereupon record the transfer in his register accordingly, and forward the license duly endorsed as aforesaid to the new licensee in respect of the premises mentioned in the license.

(4) A license so endorsed shall enure for the purposes of these regulations as if it had been issued to the transferee named therein.

16. (1) Every person who uses as a dairy factory any premises to which these regulations apply and who is not the holder of a license in respect of such premises granted pursuant to these regulations commits an offence and is liable to a penalty of £5 for every day on which such premises are so used.

(2) Every holder of a license in respect of premises licensed as a dairy factory under these regulations who uses such premises contrary to any term or condition specified in his license commits an offence and is liable to a penalty of £5 for every day on which such premises are so used without prejudice to the power of revocation set out in clause 11 hereof.

(3) Every holder of a license in respect of premises licensed as a dairy factory under these regulations who, without having obtained the approval in writing of the Director thereto, makes or commences to make or permits or causes to be made—

(a) Any alterations whether structural or by way of additions to the buildings comprised in his licensed premises; or

(b) Any alteration or extension of the plant erected in the said buildings being an alteration or extension designed to increase the manufacturing capacity of the licensed premises;

commits an offence and shall be liable (without prejudice to the powers of revocation set out in clause 11 hereof) to a penalty of £5 for every day on which such premises are used as a dairy factory after any such alteration, addition, or extension is commenced and before the Director's approval of such alteration, extension, or addition has been duly issued.

And whereas the Land Board of the North Auckland Land District has duly passed a resolution recommending that portion of the Pukewhau Kauri-gum Reserve and portion of the Puketotōe Kauri-gum Reserve, as described in the Schedule hereto, be exempted from the operations of the Kauri-gum Industry Act, 1908, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation:

Now, therefore, I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by section one hundred and sixty-two of the Land Act, 1924, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby order and declare that the portion of the Pukewhau Kauri-gum Reserve and the portion of the Puketotōe Kauri-gum Reserve as described in the Schedule hereto, shall, from the sixth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-six, cease to be subject to the Kauri-gum Industry Act, 1908.
