CONDITIONS.

1. IMPLIED CONDITIONS.

THE conditions directed to be implied in all licenses by the Water-power Regulations, 1934, shall be incorporated in and shall form part of this license, except in so far as the same may be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

2. LICENSE SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS.

This license is issued under the Water-power Regulations, 1934, and is subject thereto and to the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1935, and the Electrical Wiring Regulations, 1935, and to any regulations made in amplification or amendment thereof or in substitution therefor.

3. UTILIZATION OF WATER AND LOCATION OF HEADWORKS.

Water shall be used under this license solely for the purpose of generating electricity, and shall be taken from the stream at the point in Section 10, Block XII, Matiri Survey District, indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 90376, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works.

4. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF WORKS.

The licensee is hereby authorized, subject to the conditions hereof, to construct, maintain, and use the following works for the purposes of this license, the positions of the said works being indicated on the said plan P.W.D. 90376.

(a) Headworks consisting of an intake and water-race and pipe-lines leading to the water-wheel and power-house hereinafter referred to giving a static head of one hundred feet.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Public Works Act, 1928, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby authorize the Taumarunui Borough Council, subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth, to lay, construct, put up, place, and use electric lines within the areas described in the Schedule hereto, and doth amend the Order in Council dated the nineteenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 46 of the 22nd day of the same month, at page 1644, authorizing the Taumarunui Borough Council to erect electric lines in portions of the counties of Kaitieke and Taumarunui by deleting the words "21st day of February, 1933," in clause five of the conditions thereof, and substituting therefor the words "21st day of February, 1963."

CONDITIONS.

1. PURPOSES OF LINES.

The said lines may be used for lighting, power, and heating purposes.

2. LICENSE TO BE SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS.

The license hereby conferred is issued subject to compliance by the licensee with the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1935, and the Electrical Wiring Regulations, 1935, and with all regulations made or to be made in amendment thereof or in substitution therefor. The conditions by clause 27-11 of the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1935, directed to be implied in all licenses shall be incorporated in and form part of this license except in so far as the same may be expressly modified by or inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

3. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraphs (a) and (f) of clause 21-01 of the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1935. The generating voltage shall be approximately 3,300 volts between phases, and may if required be transformed up to 6,600 volts between phases for purposes of transmission throughout the licensee's area of supply.

4. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license, unless sooner lawfully determined, shall continue in force until the 21st day of February, 1963.

5. TIME FOR SUBSTANTIAL COMPLETION OF WORK.

The time for completion of the new works hereby authorized shall be a period of two years from the date of this license.

6. CHARGES FOR ELECTRICAL ENERGY.

The charges for electrical energy shall not exceed 1s. per unit for lighting purposes and 6d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes: Provided that "lighting purposes" shall include the operation of motor-generators for lighting purposes; and provided further that if accounts are paid within fourteen days of the due date the charges shall not exceed 9d. per unit for lighting purposes and 4½d. per unit for motor-power, cooking, and heating purposes. In the case of wholesale supply the charges shall not exceed £16 per kilovolt-ampere of maximum demand per year plus ½d. per unit. "Wholesale supply" for this purpose shall be held to be a supply in respect of which the consumer shall guarantee to pay not less than £180 per year.

7. ACCOUNTS AND CHARGES.

The licensee shall so keep its accounts as to show separately the expenditure and revenue in respect of all premises supplied with electricity in pursuance of this license.

Notwithstanding anything in the provisions of clause 6 hereof, if not less than 25 per cent. of the consumers whose

premises are outside the borough boundary at any time represent to the Minister that the licensee is charging for the supply of electrical energy at a rate which is returning an excessive profit, after allowing for the creation of a reasonable reserve fund, the Minister shall have power to cause such inquiry and investigation of the licensee's books and accounts as he may deem necessary; and if, after such inquiry and investigation, he is of opinion that unreasonably high profits are being made, having regard to all surrounding circumstances and conditions and to the nature of the undertaking, the Governor-General may, on the recommendation of the Minister, from time to time reduce or otherwise amend the rates permitted to be charged to consumers under this license.

And whereas by sections sixty-two to sixty-six, both inclusive, of the said Act the Governor-General in Council is empowered to determine the constitution of any such Island Council, and to make other provisions with respect thereto:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Cook Islands Act, 1915, and of every other power and authority enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby declare and determine as follows:—

1. There is hereby established in and for the Island of Mitiaro a Legislative Council to be called the Island Council of Mitiaro (hereinafter referred to as "the Council").

2. The Council shall consist of five *ex officio* members and three nominated members.

3. The *ex officio* members of the Council shall be the following persons:—

- (i) The Resident Commissioner of Rarotonga for the time being:
- (ii) The Resident Agent of Mitiaro for the time being:
- (iii) The three Ariki of Mitiaro for the time being.

4. This Order in Council, so far as it establishes the Council and enables the Governor-General to appoint nominated members of the Council, shall come into force upon the making hereof, and in other respects shall come into force on the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-six.

Post Office Savings-bank Amending Regulations, 1935.

PURSUANT to the Post and Telegraph Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Post Office Savings-bank Amending Regulations, 1935.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and be deemed to form part of the Post Office Savings-bank Regulations, 1913, made under the Post and Telegraph Act, 1908, and enuring under the Post and Telegraph Act, 1928 (hereinafter called "the principal regulations").

3. These regulations shall come into force on the date of the publication hereof in the *Gazette*.

4. Regulations 22 and 44 of the principal regulations are hereby amended by deleting the words "Controller of Post Office Savings-bank" wherever they appear in such regulations, and substituting the words "Director of Accounts."

5. Regulations 13 and 14 of the principal regulations are hereby revoked, and the following regulation is substituted:—

"13. (1) Deposits may be made for the credit of any institution (not being a body corporate) of the following classes:—

"(a) A savings-bank established under the Savings-bank Act, 1908:

"(b) A society registered under the Building Societies Act, 1908, or Friendly Societies Act, 1909:

"(c) A society registered under the Trade-unions Act, 1908, or the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, or the Coal-mines Act, 1925:

"(d) An Education Board or a school committee established under the Education Act, 1914:

"(e) Such other body or society or class of bodies or societies not carried on for purposes of trade or profit as the Governor-General in Council from time to time specifies:

"Provided that no account shall be opened in the name of any institution of the classes aforesaid if an account is in existence opened by the trustees of such institution under the next succeeding clause of this regulation.

"(2) Deposits may be made for the credit of the trustees of any institution of the classes aforesaid:

"Provided that no account shall be opened by the trustees of such institution if an account is in existence opened by such institution under the last preceding clause of this regulation.

"(3) Deposits may be made for the credit of any corporate body not carried on for purposes of trade or profit:

"Provided that the Postmaster-General may exclude any corporate body from the provisions of this regulation if in his opinion the nature of its activities makes it undesirable that it should enjoy the benefit of being a depositor in the Post Office Savings-bank."

6. Regulation 21 of the principal regulations is hereby revoked, and the following regulation substituted:—

"21. (1) Before a first deposit is made by an institution of any of the classes set out in Regulation 13 hereof, there shall be forwarded to the Postmaster-General a printed or typewritten copy of the rules of the institution verified by the certificate of a responsible officer thereof or by statutory declaration, or in such manner as the Postmaster-General may in his discretion require.

"(2) A copy of any alteration made from time to time in the rules of the institution shall forthwith be forwarded to the Postmaster-General and be verified as aforesaid."

7. Regulations 30 and 31 of the principal regulations are hereby revoked, and the following regulations substituted:—

"30. (1) This regulation applies to an application to withdraw money deposited in the name of any institution of the classes set out in Regulation 13.

"(2) If the rules of the institution make provision to the effect that money in a bank account belonging to the institution may be withdrawn by persons (being not less than two in number) holding specified offices in the institution, then such application may be made by any persons for the time being holding such offices.

"(3) If the rules of the institution make provision to the effect that money in a bank account belonging to the institution may be withdrawn by persons appointed for that purpose in manner appointed by the rules, then such application may be made by the persons (not being less than two in number) so appointed.

"(4) In the absence of any such rules as aforesaid such application may be made by any persons (not being less than two in number) appointed from time to time for that purpose by a resolution of the institution or of the managing body thereof, or (if the institution be a corporate body), by an instrument under the common seal.

"(5) In the absence of any such rules or resolution as aforesaid an application to withdraw money deposited in the name of the institution shall be signed by the trustee or trustees (if there are not more than two trustees) of the institution for the time being, and if there are more than two trustees then by a majority of the trustees for the time being, and the persons so signing shall be deemed to be entitled to withdraw money so deposited.

"(6) The Postmaster-General may from time to time in his discretion require proof to his satisfaction by way of certificate from the chairman of a meeting, statutory declaration, and otherwise of the regularity of any election to office of an appointment of any person or of any instrument of appointment or other matter.

"(7) Every election and appointment of an officer or trustee of the institution appointed to withdraw moneys shall for the purposes of this regulation be deemed to continue in force until notice to the contrary is received by the Postmaster at the post-office where the account is kept.

"(8) The receipt of such persons as are according to the evidence for the time being in the hands of the Postmaster-General entitled to withdraw money deposited in the name of the institution shall be a good discharge to the Postmaster-General for any moneys so deposited.

"(9) The Postmaster-General may from time to time in his discretion require proof to his satisfaction of the identity of any person claiming to be entitled to withdraw money under this regulation, including verified specimens of the signature of such person.

"(10) The warrant issued on such application shall be made out in the names of the persons mentioned therein.

"(11) Notwithstanding the provisions of Regulation 32 and 32A, no person named in a warrant issued under this regulation shall be entitled to give any order or authority whether special or general for any other person to receive on his behalf the money specified in such warrant.

"31. (1) An application to withdraw moneys deposited for the credit of the trustees of any institution of the classes set out in clause (1) of Regulation 13 may be signed by the trustee or trustees (if there are not more than two trustees) of the institution for the time being, and if there are more than two trustees, then by a majority of the trustees for the time being, and the persons so signing shall be deemed to be entitled to withdraw money so deposited.

"(2) The clauses numbered respectively (6) to (11) of the last preceding regulation shall apply, *mutatis mutandis*, to the withdrawal of moneys under this regulation.

"31A. Any authorization, nomination, or appointment heretofore given under any regulation hereby revoked by an institution of the classes set out in Regulation 13 hereof, or by the trustees or officers of such institution relating to the withdrawal of moneys from an account in the Post Office Savings-bank, or relating to the persons authorized to effect such withdrawal, shall enure for the purposes of these regulations as if it had been given pursuant to Regulation 30 or Regulation 31 hereof as the case may require notwithstanding that it may not in all respects comply with the requirements of such last-mentioned regulation.

3. Clause (1) of Regulation 21 of the principal regulations, as amended by Regulation 4 of the Amendment No. 1, is hereby further amended as follows:—

SCHEDULE.

Regulations for the Government and Payment of the New Zealand Division of the Royal Navy, 1929.

Cancel Articles 340 to 344, and substitute the following:—

340. Duties of Officers in regard to Custody and Expenditure of Stores.—All officers responsible for the receipt, custody, issue, or expenditure of stores the property of, or under the control of, the New Zealand Government, are to make themselves conversant with the Public Revenues Act, 1926, and with Treasury regulations and instructions.

B

Where not inconsistent with these regulations and orders issued under authority of these regulations, the King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions and all other instructions issued by the Admiralty shall apply to the New Zealand Division.

341. Establishments.—The establishments of stores as laid down by the Admiralty are applicable to the New Zealand Division except as modified by the Naval Board. Articles in excess of establishment are not to be supplied or purchased without the prior sanction of the Naval Board. (See Article 4, clause 4.)

342. Valuation Allowances.—The valuation allowances for consumable naval stores for H.M. Ships as laid down by the Admiralty are applicable to the New Zealand Division.

343. Detailed instructions regarding stores and store accounts are contained in Navy Orders.

Regulations for the Government and Payment of the New Zealand Division of the Royal Navy, 1929.

Article 60:—

Clause 5: Cancel.

Clause 6, lines 2 and 3: Delete the words "other than to fill a vacancy in complement due to one of the causes referred to in clause 5."

Clauses 6, 7, 8, and 9 to be renumbered 5, 6, 7, and 8.

Insert new Article 64:—

64. Registration of Deaths.

(i) *New Zealand Personnel.*

(a) In New Zealand waters (where a death occurs on board one of H.M. ships when the ship is lying in a harbour in New Zealand, is on passage from one New Zealand port to another, or if the ship is arriving from beyond New Zealand and the death occurs immediately before arrival): It is the duty of the undertaker or person in charge of the funeral to register the death with the local Registrar (except after an inquest, when the Coroner is responsible), on the appropriate form, and to sign the register-book.

(b) Outside New Zealand waters: Under the authority of the Births and Deaths Amendment Act, 1930, the death of any officer or man of the New Zealand Naval Forces (other than officers and men on loan or interchange from the Royal Navy) will be registered in New Zealand wherever the deceased may have been serving at the time of death, and the Commanding Officer of the ship to which the deceased belonged should forward Form S. 544 to the Navy Office, where steps will be taken to effect formal registration of death.

The final column of Form S. 544 must be endorsed, when the death of an officer or man takes place on board one of H.M. ships or establishments, by the Medical Officer of that ship or establishment; or, when death takes place on shore, by the medical practitioner called in to attend the deceased.

(ii) *Loan Personnel.*

The death of any officer or man serving in the New Zealand Division on loan from the Royal Navy should be reported on Form S. 544 to the Registrar-General of Births and Deaths in England, Scotland, the Irish Free State, or Northern Ireland in accordance with the instructions on the back of the form, as required by K.R. & A.I., Art. 869.

Article 111: Cancel clause 4, and substitute:—

"4. The proper depot of Warrant Officers, R.N., and officers promoted therefrom, should be noted on Form S. 48 for the purpose of settlement of travelling-expense claims (King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions, Article 1655, clause 5)."

“(f) The Naval Board may require the complete renewal of all applications as and when considered desirable. On these occasions, the particulars given are to be compared with those on the forms in the possession of the Accountant Officer or attached to men’s service certificates. If any irregularities are found, the person concerned is to be called upon for an explanation, and any adjustments which may be necessary in the allowances already credited are to be effected in his account.”

Article 176, clause 1, line 3:—
Delete Article 160 and substitute Article 161.
Article 392: Cancel, and substitute:—

392. Medical Report on an Officer or Rating prior to discharge or reversion to the Royal Navy.—Before an officer or rating is finally discharged to the shore (whether he belongs to the New Zealand Division permanently or whether he is on loan, or on interchange), or before reversion to the Royal Navy on completion of a loan or interchange period, he is to be examined by the Medical Officer of his ship or Establishment, to determine whether he suffers from any disability either attributable to or aggravated by his service in the New Zealand Division of the Royal Navy.

Form N.Z.D. 50 is to be completed at this examination in accordance with the instructions on the form and forwarded by the Commanding Officer to Navy Office.

2. When personnel are found to be suffering from any disability, it will be necessary to obtain the services of a second medical officer. When no other ship is in company at ports on the New Zealand Station the local surgeon and agent should be employed. When a ship is paying off in England, application should be made for the services of a medical officer to be loaned from the Naval Barracks at the port where the ship is lying.

3. Medical officers are to exercise the greatest care in completing the form and to ensure that all details are correctly furnished.

The Naval Board should be in a position to know the exact nature and degree of any disability at the time of the examination; answers to questions 6 to 9 should be framed accordingly.

4. When officers and men who have served in the Royal Navy are discharged to the shore direct from H.M. ships of the New Zealand Division the form should be required in duplicate (one copy is required by the Admiralty).

5. Whenever invaliding papers are raised and a person is in fact invalided, Form N.Z.D. 50 is not required.

TARANAKI COUNTY COUNCIL.

SPECIAL ORDER MAKING AND LEVYING A CONSOLIDATED SPECIAL RATE.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by section 7 of the Local Authorities Interest Reduction and Loans Conversion Amendment Act, 1934, the Taranaki County Council hereby resolves as follows:—

"That, for the purpose of providing the interest, sinking fund, and other charges, or, as the case may be, instalment of principal and interest, on the non-convertible securities issued by the Taranaki County Council, the said Taranaki County Council hereby makes and levies a consolidated special rate upon the rateable value (on the basis of the unimproved value) of all rateable property of the district; such rate shall be made and levied on a differential basis for each of the several ridings of the district as follows:—

"(a) On all rateable property in the Mangorei Riding, a special rate of twenty-nine one-hundredths of a penny ($\frac{29}{100}$ d.) in the pound.

"(b) On all rateable property in the Waitara Riding, a special rate of eleven one-hundredths of a penny ($\frac{11}{100}$ d.) in the pound.

"(c) On all rateable property in the Omata Riding, a special rate of fourteen one-hundredths of a penny ($\frac{14}{100}$ d.) in the pound.
