*Amending Regulations relating to Registration-plates under the Motor-vehicles Act, 1924.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 22nd day of April, 1936.

Present :

THE HON. M. J. SAVAGE PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by section thirty-six of the Motor-vehicles Act, 1924, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Motor-vehicles (Registration-plate) Regulations, 1934, Amendment No. 3.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and deemed to form part of the Motor-vehicles (Registration-plate) Regulations, 1934 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal regulations").

3. These regulations shall apply to the licensing year commencing on the 1st day of June, 1936, and subsequent licensing years.

4. The forms numbered 1 and 3 set out in the Schedule to the Motor-vehicles (Registration-plate) Regulations Amendment No. 2 are hereby revoked, and the forms numbered 1 and 3 set out in the Schedule hereto are substituted therefor respectively.

5. Regulation 5 of the principal regulations as heretofore amended is hereby further amended as follows :—

(i) By revoking in subparagraph (i) of paragraph (a) the words "a series of numerals" and all words following them to the end of the subparagraph, and substituting therefor the following : "a series of numerals from 1,000 to 200,000 inclusive."

(ii) By revoking subparagraph (iii) of paragraph (a) thereof, and substituting the following :—

"(iii) For private-hire or rental cars, a series of numerals from 1 to 999 inclusive."

6. The principal regulations are hereby further amended by adding thereto the following additional regulation :—

"21. Every person who knowingly supplies false or misleading information in or concerning any application made in terms of these regulations, or omits or refuses to supply any information thereby required, shall be liable on conviction to a fine of £20."

*Education Act, 1914.—Regulations for Bursaries in Fine Arts.*

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 22nd day of April, 1936.

THE HON. M. J. SAVAGE PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Education Act, 1914, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations relating to bursaries in fine arts ; and, with the like advice and consent, doth prescribe that this Order shall come into force on the date of publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

## REGULATIONS.

1. For the purpose of training suitable persons to become teachers in fine arts in technical schools in New Zealand, the Director of Education (hereinafter referred to as "the Director") may in any year award a bursary in fine arts to any person who—

- (1) Is not over twenty-five years of age on the date specified in clause 2 of these regulations :
- (2) Has passed in at least four of the grouped art subjects of the Preliminary Examination for the Diploma in Fine Arts granted by the University of New Zealand :
- (3) Has resided in New Zealand for at least one year immediately preceding the date of application :
- (4) Is recommended by the controlling authority of a technical or a secondary school in New Zealand as being exceptionally worthy of assistance for the purpose of the bursary :
- (5) Produces satisfactory evidence of character, health, and suitability for the work of teaching.

2. An application for a bursary shall be made on the printed form supplied by the Director, and shall be lodged with the Director, together with the documents specified in the form, not later than 1st February in the year in which an award is desired.

3. A bursary shall be tenable at a School of Fine Arts recognized by the University of New Zealand for the purposes of the Diploma in Fine Arts and approved by the Director for the purposes of the bursary.

4. Subject to the provisions of clause 8 of these regulations, a bursary shall be tenable for three years ; provided that on the recommendation of the Principal or other supervising authority of the institution at which the bursary is held (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal") the Director may, in his discretion, extend the term of a bursary by a fourth year.

5. A bursary shall be held continuously ; provided that, subject to these regulations, the Director may in special circumstances and on the recommendation of the Principal approve of the suspension of a bursary during its currency for a period or periods not exceeding in all one year.

6. Except in special circumstances approved by the Director, a bursary shall not be tenable with or after the tenure of any other bursary or any scholarship, exhibition, studentship, or similar award.

7. (1) A bursar shall be entitled to receive a bursary allowance at the rate of £10 per annum.

(2) A bursar shall be entitled to attend, without payment of tuition fees, classes in any course of study approved by the Director for the Final Examination for the Diploma in Fine Arts ; provided that, except in special circumstances approved by the Director on the recommendation of the Principal, such free tuition shall not be given for more than one year in any subject at the same stage.

(3) A bursar who shows to the satisfaction of the Director that he is obliged to live away from his home or usual place of residence in order to attend classes in his approved course of study shall be entitled to receive a boarding allowance at the rate of £50 per annum.

(4) A bursar not in receipt of boarding allowance who shows to the satisfaction of the Director that he is obliged to travel more than four miles each way in order to attend the classes in his approved course of study shall be entitled to a refund not exceeding £10 in any year of his actual travelling-expenses so incurred.

(5) Any allowance approved under this regulation shall be payable by the Director in equal instalments at the end of each term upon receipt from the Principal of a report showing that the attendance, progress, diligence, and conduct of the bursar during the term have been satisfactory.

8. (1) A bursar shall regularly attend the classes in his approved course of study, make progress in the work of such course to the satisfaction of the Principal and the Director, and pass a major portion of the test allotted to the particular year of such course.

(2) On receipt from the Principal of an unfavourable report on the attendance, progress, diligence, or conduct of a bursar the Director may at any time determine the bursary.

(3) Except with the approval of the Director, a bursar shall not during the currency of the bursary engage in any employment or hold any position of emolument or profit.

9. All communications by a bursar on matters relating to the bursary shall be addressed to the Principal, who may make such recommendations to the Director on the subject-matter of any communication as he thinks fit.

10. The Director may, with the approval of the Minister of Education, relax the provisions of clause 1 of these regulations whenever it may appear that the purpose of the bursary cannot be effected otherwise than by such relaxation.
