Intimating His Majesty's Assent to the Shipping and Seamen (Safety and Load-line Conventions) Act, 1935, and fixing Date of coming into Operation.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the Constitution Act it is provided that no Bill specially reserved for the signification of His Majesty's pleasure shall have any force or authority in New Zealand until the Governor-General shall signify either by speech or message to the Legislative Council and the House of Representatives, or by Proclamation, that such Bill has been laid before His Majesty in Council, and that His Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same:

And whereas a certain Bill intituled "An Act to make Provision for giving Effect in New Zealand to certain International Conventions relating to Shipping," the Short Title of which is "The Shipping and Seamen (Safety and Load-line Conventions) Act, 1935" (hereinafter called "the said Bill"), was passed by the Legislative Council and the House of Representatives, and was presented for His Majesty's assent to the Governor-General, and was reserved for the signification of His Majesty's pleasure thereon:

And whereas by the said Bill it is provided that the same shall come into operation on the day on which His Majesty's assent thereto is notified by the Governor-General by Proclamation published in the *Gazette*, or on such later date (being not later than three months after the date of publication of the Proclamation as aforesaid) as is specified in that behalf in the Proclamation:

Now, therefore, I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance of the provisions of the Constitution Act, do by this Proclamation signify and proclaim to all whom it may concern that the said Bill has been laid before His Majesty in Council, and that His Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Bill I do further declare and proclaim that the same shall come into operation on the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-six.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by section fourteen of the Counties Act, 1920, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the area described in the First Schedule hereto being now part of the County of Hauraki Plains shall be added to and form part of the County of Waikato; that the boundaries of the Counties of Hauraki Plains and

Waikato as so altered shall be those set forth under the respective headings in the Second Schedule hereto; that the area added as aforesaid to the County of Waikato shall be included in the Whangamarino Riding of the said county; and that the boundaries of the Whangamarino Riding as so altered shall be those set forth in the Third Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

AREA EXCLUDED FROM THE COUNTY OF HAURAKI PLAINS AND INCLUDED IN THE COUNTY OF WAIKATO.

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District, in Block VIII, Wharekawa Survey District, and Block II, Piako Survey District, bounded by a line commencing at the intersection of the north-eastern boundary of Section 1, Block VIII, Wharekawa Survey District, and the confiscation boundary-line; thence in south-easterly and south-westerly directions generally along the north-eastern boundary of Section 1 aforesaid, the north-eastern and south-eastern boundaries of Section 2, Block VIII, Wharekawa Survey District, and the southern boundary of Section 1, Block II, Piako Survey District, to the confiscation boundary-line; thence in a generally northerly direction along the confiscation boundary-line to the point of commencement.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

COUNTY OF HAURAKI PLAINS.

along the middle of that road to the north-western boundary of Section 3, Block IV, Hapuakohe Survey District, along that boundary and the north-eastern boundary of Section 1, Tainui Settlement, to the confiscation boundary-line; thence in a northerly direction generally along that line to Section 1, Block II, Piako Survey District; thence along the southern boundary of Section 1 aforesaid, the south-eastern and north-eastern boundaries of Section 2 and the north-eastern boundary of Section 1, both of Block VIII, Wharekawa Survey District, to the confiscation boundary-line; thence along that line to the mouth of the Pukorokoro Creek; thence easterly along the sea-coast to the middle of the Waihou River, the place of commencement.

COUNTY OF WAIKATO.

All that area in the Auckland Land District, bounded by a line commencing in the middle of the Waikato River at its confluence with the Whangamarino River; thence up the middle of the Whangamarino River, the Maramarua River, and the Matangi Stream to its intersection with the Mercer-Pukorokoro Road; thence easterly along the middle of that road to Allotment 82, Parish of Koheroa, and along the western and northern boundaries of that allotment to the Firth of Thames at the mouth of the Pukorokoro Creek; thence in a southerly direction generally along the confiscation boundary-line to Section 1, Block VIII, Wharekawa Survey District; thence along the north-eastern boundary of Section 1 aforesaid, the north-eastern and south-eastern boundaries of Section 2, Block VIII, Wharekawa Survey District, and the southern boundary of Section 1, Block II, Piako Survey District, to the confiscation boundary-line, and along that line to the northernmost point of Tahuroa No. 4 Block, Block IX, Maungakawa Survey District; thence south-easterly along the north-eastern boundaries of Tahuroa Nos. 4 and 3 Blocks aforesaid; thence south-easterly and north-easterly along the south-western boundaries of Lot 1 and the south-eastern boundaries of Lot 2 on plan 20705, deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Auckland; thence south-easterly along the eastern boundaries generally of Tahuroa No. 1 Block, Sections 26s, 72s, and 71s, Te Miro Settlement, to the westernmost corner of Section 23s, Te Miro Settlement; thence along the western boundaries of Sections 23s and 24s, Te Miro Settlement, to the north-western corner of the last-mentioned section; thence along the northern boundaries of Section 24s aforesaid and Kiwitahi Nos. 2E and 1D Blocks to the north-eastern corner of the last-mentioned block; thence southerly along the eastern boundaries of Kiwitahi Blocks Nos. 1b, 1c, and 1f, Te Konehu and Tawahakapuoro Blocks, to the south-eastern corner of the last-mentioned block; thence south-westerly along the south-eastern boundaries of the Maungakawa Block and Sections 6s, 5s, and 3s, Te Miro Settlement, and the south-eastern boundary of the Sanatorium Reserve to the confiscation boundary-line; thence south-easterly along that line to the Opuahau Trig. Station; thence south-westerly along the south-eastern boundary of Section 8, Hautapu Parish, to the Karapiro Stream; thence down the Karapiro Stream to the eastern boundary of the Borough of Cambridge; thence northerly, westerly, and southerly along the borough boundaries to the middle of the Waikato River; thence down the middle of the Waikato River to a point in line with the eastern boundary of the Borough of Hamilton; thence to and along that boundary and the northern boundary of the borough to the middle of the Waikato River; thence down the middle of the Waikato River to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary of the Borough of Ngaruawahia; thence to and along the south-eastern, north-eastern, and northern boundaries of that borough and the production of the same to the middle of the Waikato River; thence down the middle of that river to a point in line with the southern boundary of the Borough of Huntly; thence to and along the southern, eastern, and northern boundaries of the said borough and a production of the said northern boundary to the middle of the Waikato River; thence generally down the middle of that river so as to include within the said boundaries all islands in the said river to its confluence with the Whangamarino River, the place of commencement.

THIRD SCHEDULE.

10. **Officers eligible for Enrolment.**—(1) Officers on the Active List or who have resigned their commissions in the Imperial or a Dominion Royal Naval Reserve may apply to transfer to or for enrolment in the Royal Naval Reserve (New Zealand Division), subject to the conditions laid down in article 1, paragraph (1), and if entered shall be given commissions or warrants in the rank for which they are eligible.

(2) Officers on the Retired or Emergency List of, or who have resigned their commissions in, the Royal Navy or the Naval Forces of a Dominion, or in the Reserves of these Naval Forces, and officers who have resigned their commissions in the Imperial or in a Dominion Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, may apply for enrolment in the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve (New Zealand Division). The rank granted to officers entered under this paragraph will be governed by the particular requirements of the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve (New Zealand Division) at the time of entry.

16A. **Qualifications for Command of an Auxiliary Vessel—Executive Officers, Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve.**—(1) To be eligible for the command of an Auxiliary Vessel an Executive Officer, R.N.V.R., must have the following qualifications:—

- (a) Be not below the confirmed rank of Lieutenant.
- (b) (i) Have passed the examination in navigation and chart work for Master, Home Trade Ships (N.Z.); or (ii) be in possession of a Certificate for pleasure yachts in New Zealand waters.
- (c) Pass an examination in Seamanship (including Signals) and Pilotage, and satisfy the examining officers that he has sufficient practical experience.
- (d) Be recommended by the Officer Commanding the Flotilla or vessel in which he is serving or in which he last served.

(2) In peace-time an officer will be eligible for command on mobilization if he has the qualifications enumerated in (a), (b), and (c), above and is recommended by an officer of the New Zealand Division of the Royal Navy not below the rank of Commander in Command under whom he has served for a period of not less than twenty-eight days' Naval training.

(3) Executive Officers who have qualified for command shall be distinguished in the Navy List by the letters "N.S." against their names.

(4) The examination referred to at (b) (i) of paragraph (1) will be conducted by the Marine Department. Officers will be examined at their divisional ports, those of the Auckland and Wellington Divisions when the ordinary Marine Examinations are held, and those of the Canterbury and Otago Divisions on convenient dates to be fixed as required by the local Marine Superintendents. The examination-papers will be set at Wellington. All arrangements for the examination will be made at Navy Office. The names of candidates should be forwarded not less than one month before the officers desire to sit.

(5) The result of the examination referred to at (c), paragraph (1), shall be reported by the senior officer conducting it to the Naval Secretary through the usual channels.

- (c) Has a good knowledge of Service customs and discipline, and is in all respects able and recommended to perform the ordinary duties of an officer of the New Zealand Division of the Royal Navy of similar seniority in the class of vessel in which he is serving.

(3) Officers who have been granted Watchkeeping Certificates shall be distinguished in the Navy List by "W.K." against their names.

- (c) Orders, decorations, and medals to be worn with undress (No. 5 dress) on all occasions when officers of the Royal Navy wear orders, decorations, and medals.

(a) To have attained two years' seniority as Sub-Lieutenant, including acting or probationary time :

- (b) To have served at least one year on articles in full charge of a watch for eight hours out of every twenty-four at sea while in possession of a First Mate's Certificate. Naval training in a seagoing vessel to be counted.
- (c) To be in possession of satisfactory records and reports of service for the period at (a), including a Watchkeeping Certificate from the Naval Authorities. Commanding Officers should furnish Navy Office with a copy of each Watchkeeping Certificate awarded.

Add new paragraph (4) :—

(4) Certain of the items mentioned in this article—*e.g.*, superfine cloth, distinction lace, buttons for making up clothing, and cap badges—are obtainable on repayment through the Accountant Officers of H.M. ships at the issuing prices authorized by current Navy Orders, or at invoice price in the case of special items.

Swords complete with knot and undress belt are maintained by the Accountant Officer, H.M.S. "Philomel," and will be issued on loan as required.

Article 115 : Cancel, and substitute—

115. To effect the better administration of the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve (New Zealand Division) the Naval Board shall be assisted by an Advisory Committee, whose members shall be appointed from time to time by the Naval Board and the names published in the Navy List.

118. **General.**—Officers of all branches below the rank of Commander on the Active List will, if qualified by the following regulations, be eligible for promotion to the higher ranks.

(2) The date of seniority of officers promoted will be the date on which their promotion was approved, unless directions are given to the contrary.

(3) Officers of all branches may be promoted either on the Active List or in retired rank if considered deserving of the advancement on account of specially good service, although they may not have all the necessary qualifications as defined below.

(4) The appointment of an officer as the Commanding Officer or as the Executive Officer of a Division will be by selection. An officer selected may be granted the rank of Commander or Lieutenant-Commander respectively; this rank may be granted irrespective of the officer's seniority on selection and whether he has previously held a commission in the R.N.V.R. or not.

Article 119 : Cancel, and substitute—

119. **Executive Officers.**—Probationary Sub-Lieutenants will usually be selected from ratings who have served not less than two years in the R.N.V.R. and are under the age of twenty-four. In special circumstances direct appointment may be approved.

(2) In special cases Probationary Lieutenants may be entered between the ages of twenty-five and thirty-two.

Article 120 : Cancel, and substitute—

120. **Obligatory Naval Training—Sub-Lieutenants, Lieutenants, and Lieutenant-Commanders.**—(1) *Probationary Sub-Lieutenants* : Fourteen days in a seagoing ship within two years of entry, either in one period of fourteen days or two periods of seven days each.

(2) *Sub-Lieutenants, Lieutenants, and Lieutenant-Commanders* : Seven days every year or fourteen days every alternate year.

Article 121: Cancel, and substitute—

121. Executive Officers—Attendance at Drills at Divisional Headquarters.—Every Executive Officer is required to qualify or requalify as “efficient” at Divisional Headquarters, and to do so he will be required to—

- (1) Carry out the following number of drills annually:—
 - (a) Probationary Sub-Lieutenant and Sub-Lieutenant: Thirty-six in number.
 - (b) Lieutenant and Lieutenant-Commander: Twenty-four in number.
- (2) Have attended the Annual Inspection unless specially exempted.
- (3) Have satisfied his Commanding Officer that he has a good knowledge of the subjects in which he has been instructed, and that he is generally proficient in the duties of an officer of his seniority and experience.

Article 122: Cancel, and substitute—

122. Promotion to Probationary Sub-Lieutenant from the Ranks.—

(1) Names of candidates for promotion to Probationary Sub-Lieutenant are to be forwarded to Navy Office by the Officer Commanding the Division. They are to be selected from ratings who by virtue of leadership and power of command are likely to make good officers. They must hold a leading rate or be eligible for advancement to Acting Leading Seaman, Acting Leading Signalman, or Acting Leading Telegraphist, but the primary consideration is potential officer-like qualities.

(2) Prior to promotion candidates who are finally selected will be required to undergo fourteen days' training (seven days obligatory and seven days voluntary) in one of H.M. Ships and to pass an examination in seamanship. (*Vide* Appendix A I.)

Article 123: Cancel, and substitute—

123. Promotion—Probationary Sub-Lieutenant to Sub-Lieutenant.—

(1) To be eligible for promotion to Sub-Lieutenant a Probationary Sub-Lieutenant will be required to have—

- (a) Served for one year as Probationary Sub-Lieutenant:
- (b) Passed a qualifying examination in Pilotage and chart work:
- (c) Performed fourteen days' training in a cruiser as Probationary Sub-Lieutenant and have been well reported on by the Commanding Officer:
- (d) Been recommended by the Commanding Officer of his Division.

(2) Probationary Sub-Lieutenants appointed direct will be required to pass an examination in Seamanship (*vide* Appendix A I) in addition to the qualification referred to in paragraph (1).

Article 124: Cancel, and substitute—

124. Promotion—Sub-Lieutenant to Lieutenant.—To be eligible for promotion to the rank of Lieutenant Sub-Lieutenants will be required to have—

- (a) Served for three years as Sub-Lieutenant, including probationary time:
- (b) Performed the requisite Naval training as Sub-Lieutenant, and have been well reported on by the Commanding Officers of the respective ships:
- (c) Passed qualifying examinations in Gunnery, Mine-sweeping, Depth Charges, and Signals (*vide* Appendix A II):
- (d) Been recommended by the Commanding Officer of his Division.

Article 125: Cancel, and substitute—

125. Naval Training of Executive Officers selected for Specialist Duties at Divisional Headquarters.—(1) With reference to article 35, table (ii), officers selected for specialist duties at Divisional Headquarters in Navigation, Mine-sweeping, Anti-submarine, and Signals will, as opportunity offers, receive additional Naval training so as to be instructed in the subject for which they are selected to specialize.

(2) Lieutenants selected for signal duties will be required to pass an examination in V/S and W/T (*vide* Appendix A III). The qualification “(S)” will be inserted in the Navy List against the names of officers who qualify.

Article 126: Cancel, and substitute—

126. Promotion—Lieutenant to Lieutenant-Commander.—Promotion will be granted automatically on attaining eight years' seniority as Lieutenant, provided that an officer has—

- (a) Performed the requisite Naval training.
- (b) Passed a qualifying examination in Navigation and Chart Work for the Command of an Auxiliary Vessel.

Article 135: Amend as follows:—

Subparagraph (a): Delete the words "nor more than thirty-two years."

Article 136: At end of article add following notes:—

NOTES.—(a) Probationary Surgeon Lieutenants, Surgeon Lieutenants and Surgeon Lieutenant-Commanders, when undergoing training in H.M. ships or establishments, should, as circumstances of appointment permit, be instructed practically or verbally in the syllabus laid down.

(b) In order to stimulate their interest in the Service, apart from purely medical matters, Commanding Officers should arrange that all Medical Officers borne for training be given knowledge of the general working of a ship.

(c) Medical Officers of the rank of Surgeon Lieutenant and above who are considered to have sufficient Service experience may be employed during the period of training as Medical Guard Officer and on "stand-by" duties, &c.

Article 139:—

In sixth line after the word "experience" delete the word "and."

In last line, for "full-stop" substitute "comma," and add "and are nominated by the Commanding Officer of the Division concerned."

Article 141: At end add—

NOTE.—Whilst undergoing training officers of the Accountant Branch, R.N.V.R., will be regarded as forming part of the staff of the Accountant Officer. They should be instructed in the practical duties of an Accountant Officer in accordance with the syllabus laid down.

Article 150: Cancel, and substitute—

150. **Chaplain Branch.**—Officers may be entered as Probationary Chaplains with the same status as Chaplains in the Seagoing Forces. As a general rule the age of a candidate at entry shall not exceed forty.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 6th day of May, 1936.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the Cook County Council (hereinafter called "the said local authority") proposes to undertake certain capital works—namely, the metalling of the Bushy Knoll Road—for the benefit of a defined portion of its district to be known as the Bushy Knoll Road-metalling Special-rating area :

And whereas the said local authority being desirous, in lieu of raising the moneys by special loan for such works, of advancing the sum required therefor—namely, two hundred and sixty-two pounds (£262) (hereinafter called "the said sum")—out of its General Fund, pursuant to the provisions of section forty-five of the Finance Act, 1933 (No. 2), has complied with the provisions of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council, as required by the said Act, should be given to the advancing of the said sum :

RESOLUTION.

THE following regulations were laid before the members of the Opotiki Jockey Club (Incorporated) at a meeting held on the 7th day of April, 1936, at Opotiki, with a recommendation by the Chairman of such Club, Mr. R. A. Hedley, that the same be passed at once with a view to their approval by His Excellency the Governor-General in pursuance of the Gaming Act, 1908, section 33.

Mr. R. A. Hedley, the Chairman of such Club, and the meeting moved, and Mr. F. W. Reid seconded, and it was resolved, that such regulations should be adopted, and that the Chairman and Secretary be authorized to sign the same in authentication thereof.

The following are the regulations referred to:—

OPOTIKI JOCKEY CLUB.

REGULATIONS.

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Opotiki Jockey Club, a racing club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said club"), doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the Gate Pa Domain, situated in the district of Tauranga, and known as the Gate Pa Racecourse, while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

1. These regulations shall come into force on the date of the same being published in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

2. In these regulations the words "bookmaker," "racing club," and "race meeting" shall have the meanings ascribed to those terms respectively by section 2 of the Gaming Act, 1908.

3. The following persons shall be and are hereby excluded from the racecourse above described while the same is used or occupied by the said club for a race meeting, namely:—

- (a) Bookmakers:
- (b) Bookmakers' clerks, bookmakers' assistants, and bookmakers' agents:
- (c) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Association:
- (d) Common prostitutes and persons who habitually consort with thieves or persons who have no lawful visible means of support:
- (e) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house breaking or pocket picking, forgery, uttering, or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues, and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908:

Provided always that the Executive Committee appointed by the New Zealand Racing Conference, upon being satisfied by evidence as to character and otherwise that any person who, by reason of any conviction, comes within the scope of this regulation, should have relief from the effect thereof, may grant exemption to any such person, and may at any time revoke any such exemption without notice to such person, and without assigning any reason for such revocation.

The foregoing regulations of the Opotiki Jockey Club were made and passed by such club on the 7th day of April, 1936, and signed by the Chairman and Secretary.
