IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the Public Works Act, 1928, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle-line of a road desired to be constructed over Block XI, Mimi Survey District—viz., a deviation of the Auckland-Wellington via Taranaki Main Highway, Clifton County Division, Pukearuhe Junction-Mokau Section—shall be that defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto.

WHEREAS it is provided by the one-hundred-and-sixty-eighth section of the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), that the Governor-General may from time to time, by Order in Council, authorize any local authority or Harbour Board to reclaim from the sea areas, not exceeding five acres in extent, in any case where he considers that the reclamation will not affect navigation and is for the benefit of the public:

And whereas the Tauranga Harbour Board (hereinafter called "the Board") is desirous of reclaiming from the sea certain land in Tauranga Harbour, and the said reclamation is of such a nature as aforesaid, and the Board has applied to the Governor-General in Council for an order authorizing the execution of the said harbour-works:

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor-General in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation, and is for the benefit of the public:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby authorize and empower the Board to reclaim from the sea in Tauranga Harbour the area of land shown on plan marked M.D. 7442, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, such reclamation to be carried out and constructed in accordance with plan marked M.D. 7442, subject to the provisions of the said Act.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the twenty-ninth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine, and published in the *Gazette* of the first day of August of that year, certain areas in the Canterbury and Westland Land Districts were declared to be a national park under and subject to the provisions of Part III of the Public Reserves, Domains, and National Parks Act, 1928, and named the Arthur Pass National Park :

And whereas by section eight of the Reserves and other Lands Disposal Act, 1930, and by Orders in Council dated the third day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, and the eleventh day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, and published in the *Gazette* of the fifth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, and the fourteenth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, respectively, certain further areas in the Canterbury Land District were added to the said Arthur Pass National Park :

*Amending Regulations under the Slaughtering and Inspection Act, 1908—  
(Notice No. Ag. 3390.)*

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Slaughtering and Inspection Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations in further amendment of the regulations under the Slaughtering and Inspection Act, 1900, enuring under the said Act, made on the fifth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and two, and published in the *Gazette* on the same day, at page 1221 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal regulations").

REGULATIONS.

1. (1) In these regulations the term "amending regulations" means the regulations made under the said Act on the 6th day of January, 1933, and published in the *Gazette* on the 12th day of the same month, at page 13.

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the date of the publication hereof in the *Gazette*.

2. Clause 12 of the principal regulations, as replaced by clause 1 of the amending regulations, is hereby revoked, and the following clause substituted therefor:—

"12. No alterations or additions shall be made to any slaughterhouse during the currency of any license issued in respect thereof except with the approval of the Inspector."

3. Subclause (1) of clause 19 of the principal regulations, as replaced by clause 2 of the amending regulations, is hereby revoked, and the following subclause substituted therefor:—

"19. (1) In addition to the foregoing fees there shall be payable in respect of stock slaughtered in an abattoir or meat-export slaughterhouse the inspection fees following, that is to say:—

" Provided that the inspection fees payable under this clause shall not be less than £10 in any month during which the Inspector was employed :

" Provided further, however, that notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding proviso, where the slaughter of stock in any meat-export slaughterhouse for the export slaughtering season in any year commences within seven days before the termination of a month, or ceases within seven days after the commencement of a month, and the inspection fees payable in accordance with the scale prescribed in this clause in respect of the stock slaughtered in any such month would not exceed the sum of £10, then, in such case, the fees payable shall be calculated in accordance with the scale prescribed in this clause, but shall not be less than an amount equal to an average charge of £1 in respect of each day on which the Inspector is employed."

And whereas the district known as the "Awatere Rabbit District" has been constituted under and for the purposes of the said Act:

And whereas the Board of the said district has, pursuant to the said section thirty-one of the said Act, requested that the boundaries of its district be altered and redefined, and it is deemed expedient to give effect to such request:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the said Act, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby alter and redefine the boundaries of the said district so constituted as aforesaid, and doth hereby declare that the boundaries of the said district shall be those set forth in the Schedule hereto, and doth further declare that this Order in Council shall take effect on the date of the publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

PURSUANT to the Agriculture (Emergency Powers) Act, 1934, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations for ensuring the proper feeding and maturity of calves sold or offered for sale for slaughter for human consumption.

REGULATIONS.

- (1) These regulations may be cited as the Calves (Sales for Slaughter) Regulations, 1936.
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the date of the publication hereof in the *Gazette*.
2. These regulations shall apply to all calves sold or intended for sale for the purpose of being slaughtered for human consumption the live weight of which is less than 100 lb.
3. (1) No person, whether as principal or agent, shall sell or offer for sale any calf to which these regulations apply unless such calf has been properly and sufficiently fed daily from birth and has been so fed not earlier than four hours before the time of its actual removal from his premises in pursuance of a sale or a contract or intended contract of sale.  
(2) For the purposes of this clause the act of any person in placing any calf to which these regulations apply at or adjacent to any entrance to his land or premises or other customary place (whether on his own land or premises or not) at which calves are exposed for sale shall be deemed to be an offer to sell that calf.
4. In any proceedings brought against any person for failing properly and sufficiently to feed any calf to which these regulations apply the burden of proof that such calf has been fed as required by these regulations shall lie on the defendant.
5. No person, whether as principal or agent, shall purchase, drive, or convey any calf to which these regulations apply which appears to be unfit by reason of weakness or immaturity to be driven or conveyed to the place at which it is intended to be slaughtered for human consumption.
6. Proceedings for any offence against these regulations may be instituted by any constable or any Inspector appointed under the Stock Act, 1908, or under the Slaughtering and Inspection Act, 1908, or by any person acting on behalf of any society established for the prevention of cruelty to animals.
7. Every person who commits a breach of these regulations shall be liable to a fine of £5.

"(9) All losses upon realization of investments shall be charged against the Investment Fluctuation Reserve so far as the same extends."

"Investment Fluctuation Account."

5. Form No. 1 in the First Schedule to the principal regulations is further amended by inserting in the form of balance-sheet immediately following the line "Fund as per Revenue Account," the following additional line:—

Provided, however, that only diving-machines which are for the time being licensed pursuant to the provisions of Part III of the principal regulations shall be permitted to fish for pipi pearls. No additional fee shall be payable.
