and an penalties and infertures that have been incurred pixed to the origin into three of this order in council shall are received and enforced as if this Order in Council had not been made: Provided that nothing in this Order in Council shall affect the provisions of section five of the Customs Acts Amendment Act, 1930, or section four of the Customs Acts Amendment Act, 1931, in respect of the imposition on any goods affected by this Order in Council of surtax or primage duty as the case may be.

- (e) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house breaking or pocket picking, forgery, uttering, or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues, and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908 : Provided always that the Executive Committee appointed by the New Zealand Racing Conference, upon being satisfied by evidence as to character and otherwise that any person who, by reason of any conviction, comes within the scope of this regulation, should have relief from the effect thereof, may grant exemption to any such person, and may at any time
