ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 14th day of October, 1936.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Harbours Act, 1923, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby license and permit Wilhelm Gerald Hinrich Theodor Freese (hereinafter called "the licensee," which term shall include his executors, administrators, and assigns unless the context requires a different construction), to use and occupy all those parts of the foreshore and land below low-water mark shown as Site No. 7 on plan marked M.D. 7503, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, for the purpose of the use of the office as shown on the said plan for a term of fourteen years computed from the first day of October, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-six, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term—

"Foreshore" means such parts of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides :

"Low-water mark" means low-water mark at ordinary spring tides :

"Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark necessary for the construction of the office as shown on Site No. 7 of the plan M.D. 7503.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the licensee shall pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £5 in advance, payable on the 1st day of April in each year, the proportionate part of such annual rental in respect of the period from the 1st day of October, 1936, until the 31st day of March following to be paid on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, over, and out of the said office without payment.

5. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned office in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at the licensee's own cost, any lights that may be required by the Minister ; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

6. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said office and view the state of repair thereof ; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last-known address of the licensee in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such office, requiring the licensee, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the licensee shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

7. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

8. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the 1st day of October, 1936, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority ; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

9. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, and the licensee may be required to remove the office at the licensee's own cost,

without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last-known address of the licensee in New Zealand.

10. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which may be sustained by any vessel or boat in passing the office, or by contact therewith, and which may be occasioned by any default or neglect on the licensee's part.

11. In case the licensee shall—

(1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them ;

(2) Cease to use or occupy the said office for a period of thirty consecutive days ;

(3) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions ; or

(4) Become bankrupt or be brought under the operation of any law for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy—

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council and every right, power, or privilege may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceedings whatsoever ; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee and to all persons concerned or interested that this Order in Council, and the rights and privileges thereby conferred, have been revoked and determined.

12. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the licensee shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said office entirely from the site and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of revocation or expiry, as the case may be ; and, if the licensee fails so to do the Minister may cause the said office to be removed and the site so restored, and may recover from the licensee the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration.

13. The construction of the office shall be deemed to be an acceptance by the licensee of the conditions of this Order in Council.

Order in Council consenting to the Raising of a Loan of £259,000 by the Wellington City Council and prescribing the Conditions thereof.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 14th day of October, 1936.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the Wellington City Council (hereinafter called "the said local authority") being desirous of raising the sum of two hundred and fifty-nine thousand pounds (£259,000) to be known as "Wellington City Council Renewal Loan, 1937" (hereinafter called "the said loan"), for the purpose of repaying the Wellington City Consolidated Repayment Loan, £117,400, which matures on the twenty-eighth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, and the Wellington City Electric Tramways Street-paving and Town Hall Loan 1902 Repayment Loan, 1932, £168,300, which matures on the first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, has complied with the provisions of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council as required by the said Act should be given to the raising of the said loan :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the said Act, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising in London by the said local authority of the said loan up to the amount of two hundred and fifty-nine thousand pounds sterling (£259,000), and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows :—

(1) The term for which the said loan or any part thereof may be raised shall be twenty (20) years.

(2) No debenture issued under this authority shall be issued at a greater discount than one and one-half per centum of the nominal rate.

(3) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said loan or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate exceeding four pounds ten shillings sterling (£4 10s.) per centum per annum on the nominal amount of the debentures issued.

(4) The said local authority shall, before raising the said loan or any part thereof, make provision for the repayment thereof by establishing a sinking fund under the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, or under such other statutory enactment as may be applicable, and shall thereafter make payments to such sinking fund at intervals of not more than one year at a rate or rates which shall be not less than three pounds ten shillings (£3 10s.) per centum on the aggregate amount of the nominal value of debentures issued, the first such payment to be made not later than one year after the first day from which interest to the lender or lenders is computed on any amount so raised.

(5) No amount payable as either interest or sinking fund in respect of the said loan shall be paid out of loan-money.

(6) The payment of interest and repayment of principal in respect of the said loan shall be made in London.

(7) No moneys shall be borrowed under this consent after the expiration of two years from the date hereof.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Order in Council made on the nineteenth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-six, and subject to the determinations as to borrowing and repayment therein set out, consent was given to the raising by the Wellington City Council (hereinafter called "the said local authority") of the sum of twenty-nine thousand four hundred pounds (£29,400) by a loan to be known as "Wellington City Sanitation Loan Repayment Loan, 1937" (hereinafter called "the said loan"):

And whereas the authority conferred by the said Order in Council has not yet been exercised, and it is expedient to vary certain of the determinations aforesaid in respect of the said loan:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby vary certain of the determinations aforesaid in respect of the said loan by prescribing that in lieu of making provision for the repayment of the said loan by establishing a sinking fund in respect thereof, the said local authority may raise the said loan upon terms of making the same, together with interest thereon, repayable by equal aggregate annual or half-yearly instalments extending over a period of fifteen (15) years.

Warrant authorizing the Minister of Public Works to construct a New Bridge over the Clutha River at Clydevale (together with Approaches thereto), and apportioning the Cost.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in me by section one hundred and thirty-five of the Public Works Act, 1928, and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling me in this behalf, I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand do hereby authorize the Minister of Public Works to construct the bridge (together with approaches thereto) described in the Schedule hereto; and I do also declare that the cost thereof, less such contribution as may be made thereto by the Government of New Zealand, shall be borne by the

Clutha County Council and the Bruce County Council in the following proportions—viz., the Clutha County Council shall pay sixty per centum and the Bruce County Council shall pay forty per centum of such cost respectively; and I do further direct that any contribution hereby required to be made as aforesaid by the Clutha County Council and the Bruce County Council shall be paid from time to time out of the funds of the said Councils within a period of one month after demand in writing made by or on behalf of the Minister of Public Works, and all such payments shall be made to the credit of the Public Account and bank receipts sent to the Accountant, Public Works Department, at Wellington.

Notice of Intention to issue an Order in Council changing the Reservation over Part of the Opotiki and Wairoeka Domain, Gisborne Land District.

GALWAY, Governor-General.

WHEREAS by section forty-one of the Public Reserves, Domains, and National Parks Act, 1928 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), it is provided that the Governor-General may from time to time by Order in Council, but subject to compliance with the requirements of subsection two of section seven of the said Act, declare that the land comprised in a public domain or part thereof shall cease to be subject to Part II of the said Act; and, further, may declare either that such land shall be a public reserve for the purposes of Part I of the said Act, or Crown land available for disposal by way of sale for cash under the Land Act, 1924:

And whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto is part of the Opotiki and Wairoeka Domain, but is not required for domain purposes, and it is expedient to change the purpose of the reservation over the said land to a site for an aerodrome:

Now, therefore, I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby give notice pursuant to subsection two of section seven of the said Act that it is my intention to issue an Order in Council under the provisions of section forty-one of the said Act declaring that the part of the Opotiki and Wairoeka Domain described in the Schedule hereto shall cease to be subject to Part II of the said Act, and shall be deemed to be a public reserve for the purposes of a site for an aerodrome.

NOBEL PEACE PRIZE.

ALL proposals of candidates for the Nobel Peace Prize, which is to be distributed 10th December, 1937, must, in order to be taken into consideration, be laid before the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament by a duly qualified person before the first of February of the same year.

Any one of the following persons is held to be duly qualified: (a) Members and late members of the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament, as well as the advisers appointed at the Norwegian Nobel Institute; (b) Members of Parliament and Members of Government of the different States, as well as Members of the Interparliamentary Union; (c) Members of the International Arbitration Court at the Hague; (d) Members of the Council of the International Peace Bureau; (e) Members and Associates of the Institute of International Law; (f) University Professors of Political Science and of Law, of History, and of Philosophy; and (g) persons who have received the Nobel Peace Prize.

The Nobel Peace Prize may also be accorded to institutions or associations.

According to the Code of Statutes, §8, the grounds upon which any proposal is made must be stated and handed in along with such papers and other documents as may therein be referred to.

According to §3, every written work, to qualify for a prize, must have appeared in print.

For particulars, *qualified persons* are requested to apply to the office of the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament, Drammensvei 19, Oslo.

Alterations to the Scale of Charges upon the New Zealand Government Railways.

IN pursuance of all powers and authorities enabling me under the Government Railways Act, 1926, and its amendments, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, I, Daniel Giles Sullivan, do hereby make the following alterations in the General Scale of Charges made on the 4th day of November, 1931, and published in the *Gazette* of the 13th day of November, 1931, and to the Goods—Local Rates Scale of Charges made on the 17th day of October, 1935, and published in the *Gazette* of the 18th day of October, 1935, in force on the New Zealand Government Railways open for traffic.

GENERAL SCALE OF CHARGES.

PASSENGERS.

20. School Season Tickets.

By adding to paragraph 2 the following :—

For students and scholars exceeding 20 years of age the surcharge payable will be based on one-thirteenth of the value of the ticket for each week or fraction of a week outside of the school term as fixed by the Education Department, subject to a minimum of 4s. 3d. first class or 2s. 3d. second class per week or fraction of a week.

21. Free School Season Tickets.

By omitting paragraphs 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5, and substituting in lieu thereof the following :—

1. Free second-class season tickets, available for each standard term of fourteen weeks as notified by the Education Department, may be issued to school pupils as hereinafter set forth, between the ages of 5 years and 10 years, residing at a distance of not less than 2 miles from the school and to school pupils of 10 years of age and over, but not exceeding 20 years of age, residing at a distance of not less than 3 miles from the school. The tickets will be available for distances not exceeding 60 miles, and are issuable as follows :—

- (a) To pupils attending the public primary schools or Native schools from railway-stations where there is no primary school in the vicinity, and only to the station in the vicinity of the nearest primary school.
- (b) To pupils who are holders of scholarships tenable at a district high school, secondary school, technical high school, or combined school, as defined by the Education Act, 1914, to enable them to attend any such school.
- (c) To pupils of secondary schools, of the secondary department of district high schools, of technical high schools, and of combined schools, as defined by the Education Act, 1914, and to holders of free places at technical classes or schools, to enable such pupils or free-place holders to attend one or other of such schools whichever is the nearest; provided that a free ticket may be issued to enable a pupil to attend a more distant school where in the opinion of the Director of Education suitable classes or courses of instruction are not provided at a school nearer to the pupil's place of residence.
- (d) To pupils attending private primary schools for primary instruction, private technical schools for technical instruction, or private secondary schools for secondary instruction, provided that the schools are registered as such in accordance with the Education Act, 1914, and provided further that in the case of a denominational school free tickets will be issued only from stations where there is no school of that denomination in the vicinity, and then only to the station in the vicinity of the nearest such school.
- (e) To pupils on the roll of a public or private primary or secondary school, or of a district high school, travelling to attend classes held at especially equipped manual-training centres and recognized under the regulations for manual instruction.

2. Where a school observes terms which do not coincide with the opening and closing dates as approved by the Education Department for the district in which such school is situated, a surcharge will be made in respect of any school season ticket the currency of which commences before or expires after the approved date, as the case may be, so that the period of the currency of such ticket is longer than would have been the case if the terms as approved by the Education Department had been observed. In all such cases the surcharge must be paid by the pupil at the time of issue of the ticket. Surcharges will be payable at the following rates :—

(b) The issue of a free school season ticket may be declined in any case where the Director of Education decides that the circumstances do not warrant the concession.

IT is hereby notified for public information that advice has been received that the Government of China have promulgated a notification which provides that cargo imported into China from 12th October, 1936, must be marked in such a way that the Customs authorities may be able to identify each package by its marks and numbers alone.

Each package must bear an individual number of a consecutive series and, in addition, a mark of distinctive design or a set of not less than three letters or a combination of a distinctive design and letters.

Numbering of individual packages will not be insisted on (providing the marks are sufficiently distinctive) for tinned plates and other articles intended solely for the use of the importing firm and not intended for re-export to another open port.

Cargo which does not comply with the requirements of the notification will have to be re-marked under Customs supervision on payment of a fee of sixteen dollars for four hours or part thereof.

Exporters in New Zealand of goods to China may obtain a copy of the notification on application to the nearest Collector of Customs.
