Authorizing the Coromandel Chamber of Commerce (Inc.), of Coromandel, to erect certain Electric Lines in the Township of Coromandel.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 27th day of January, 1937.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Public Works Act, 1928, and of all other powers in any-wise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby authorize the Coromandel Chamber of Commerce, being a body duly incorporated under the Incorporated Societies Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the licensee"), to lay, construct, put up, place, and use the electric lines described in the Schedule hereto on the following conditions.

CONDITIONS.

1. PURPOSE OF LINES.

The said lines may be used for lighting, power, and heating purposes.

2. LICENSE TO BE SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS.

The license hereby conferred is subject to compliance by the licensee with the Electrical Wiring Regulations, 1935, the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1935, and with all regulations made or to be made in amplification or amendment thereof or in substitution therefor.

The conditions directed to be implied in all licenses by the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1935, shall be incorporated herein and shall form part of this license except in so far as the same may be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

3. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be direct current, pursuant to paragraph (d) of clause 21-01 of the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1935.

4. VOLTAGE OF LINES.

Electrical energy shall be transmitted at a pressure of 32 volts between terminals in respect of the lines authorized in paragraph (a) of the Schedule hereto, and at a pressure of 230 volts between terminals in respect of the lines authorized in paragraph (b) of the said Schedule.

5. DURATION OF LICENSE.

Unless sooner lawfully determined, this license shall continue in force until the 31st day of March, 1958, or until electrical energy is available from an Electric-power Board or other general public source, whichever is the earlier.

WHEREAS there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned under the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), the Heathcote County Council (hereinafter called "the Council"), in which term is to be construed, unless the context requires a different construction, its successors or assigns, has applied to the Governor-General in Council for a license under the said Act to occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto, in the Heathcote Estuary at the foot of Mount Pleasant Road, Sumner, in order to maintain a jetty thereon erected in accordance with plan marked M.D. 5031, approved on the twenty-first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington :

And whereas it is, amongst other things, enacted by section nine of the said Act, that in harbours where there is no Harbour Board, the Governor-General in Council shall have all the powers, functions, duties, and authorities by the said Act conferred upon Harbour Boards :

And whereas there is no Harbour Board in the harbour of Sumner, and it is desirable that regulations should be made prohibiting fishing off the Mount Pleasant jetty and prohibiting the riding of bicycles thereon :

And whereas it is expedient that a license should be granted and issued to the Council under the said Act for the purpose aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the object for which the said license is required by the Council as aforesaid ; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the Council to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto, on which the jetty is erected, as shown on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, for

the purpose of maintaining the said jetty thereon, such license to be held and enjoyed by the Council upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the First Schedule hereto, and doth hereby make the following regulations set out in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the terms—

"Foreshore" means such parts of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides :

"Low-water mark" means low-water mark at ordinary spring tides :

"Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the parts of the foreshore and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto necessary for the maintenance of the said jetty at the site shown on plan marked M.D. 5031.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the Council shall on demand pay to the Minister an annual rental of 1s.

4. All persons shall, at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said jetty and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government Service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said jetty without payment.

6. The Council shall maintain the above-mentioned jetty in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at the Council's own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels : Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said jetty and view the state of repair thereof, and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the Council in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such jetty requiring the Council within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the Council shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The master of all vessels discharging ballast at the said jetty shall have all such ballast taken away and deposited above high-water mark at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. 12. The Council shall be liable for any injury which the said jetty may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the Council's part.

13. In case the Council shall—

(1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them ;

(2) Cease to use or occupy the said jetty for a period of thirty consecutive days—

then, and in either of the said cases, this Order in Council and every right, power, or privilege may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the Council or other proceedings whatsoever ; and publication in the *Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the Council and to all persons concerned or interested that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

14. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the Council shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said jetty entirely from the site and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of the revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and if the Council fails so to do, the Minister may cause the said jetty to be removed and the site so restored and may recover from the Council the cost incurred by the said removal and restoration.

- (1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty consecutive days;
- (3) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions; or
- (4) Become bankrupt or be brought under the operation of any law for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy—

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council and every right, power, or privilege may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensees or other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the *Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensees and to all persons concerned or interested that this Order in Council, and the rights and privileges thereby conferred, have been revoked and determined.

In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the licensees shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said wharf entirely from the site and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and, if the licensees fail so to do the Minister may cause the said wharf to be removed and the site so restored, and may recover from the licensees the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration.

15. The occupation of the wharf shall be deemed to be an acceptance by the licensees of the conditions of this Order in Council.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section nine of the Public Reserves, Domains, and National Parks Act, 1928, doth hereby declare that, from and after the day of the date hereof, the balance of the reserve described in the Schedule hereto shall become vested in the Waimakariri River Trust in trust for river-conservation purposes.

SCHEDULE.

By-laws for the Te Aroha Hot Springs Domain.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 21st day of January, 1937.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the Te Aroha Hot Springs Domain is subject to the provisions of the Tourist and Health Resorts Control Act, 1908, and it is expedient to make by-laws for the management and control of such reserve :

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the said Act and of all other powers and authorities in that behalf enabling him, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the by-laws made on the twelfth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, and amendments thereto made on the twenty-first day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, for the management and control of the said reserve, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following by-laws.

BY-LAWS.

TE AROHA HOT SPRINGS DOMAIN.

1. In these by-laws—

- “Minister” means the Minister of the Crown for the time being having the administration of the Tourist and Health Resorts Control Act, 1908 ;
- “General Manager” means the General Manager of the Department of Tourist and Health Resorts, and includes any person who may be acting for the General Manager ;
- “Officer in charge” means the person having the general charge and control (under the direction of the General Manager) of the domain ; and
- “The domain” means the land described in the Schedule hereto.

GENERAL.

2. The domain shall be open to the public between the hours of 6 a.m. and 10.30 p.m. daily free of charge, subject to the provisions of these by-laws : Provided that the General Manager may, if deemed expedient, declare the domain closed, and may direct that at specified times a charge be made for admission, such charge not to exceed the sum of 1s. for each person.

3. No person shall, without the authority of the General Manager or officer in charge, pick any flower, or break or destroy, injure or remove any plant, shrub, or tree growing in the domain ; and if any person commits a breach of this by-law he shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £5, in addition to paying for the damage done.

4. No person shall place, deposit, or leave any bottle or glassware (whether broken or whole), paper, straw, litter, dirt, rubbish, or any offensive or noxious matter of any kind within the domain.

5. No person shall wash any clothes in any thermal spring subject to these by-laws, or in any spring, stream, pool, water-race, channel, or reservoir within the domain, or place any soap, substance, article, or other thing therein.

6. (1) No horse, dog, or other animal will be allowed inside the domain, except as hereinafter provided ; and the owner of any horse, dog, or other animal shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £1 for each time such horse, dog, or other animal trespasses or is allowed to trespass within the domain.

(2) This by-law does not apply to horses drawing any carriage, nor to saddled horses, nor to dogs which are led by a cord or chain, passing through the domain.

7. No person shall ride a bicycle within the domain ; and any person so doing shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £1.

8. Except with the consent of the officer in charge, it shall be unlawful to hold a public meeting for any purpose whatever upon any portion of the domain. Every person who calls or assists in calling, or promotes or holds or is engaged in, and every person other than a constable or the officer in charge who is present at, any public meeting held in breach of this by-law shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding £5.

9. No person shall, without the written permission of the Minister for the time being having the administration of the said Act, or of the General Manager, carry or use any gun, rifle, or firearm, or use any net, engine, instrument, or device, or use any dog, for the capture or destruction of any bird or animal, or take or attempt to take the eggs or young of any bird within the domain. Any person acting in breach of or contrary to the provisions of this by-law shall upon conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding £20.

10. No person shall destroy, deface, or injure any inscription or any label attached to or connected with any tree, shrub, or other plant within the domain.

11. No person shall distribute any handbills or printed papers within the domain, except by permission of the officer in charge.

12. No person shall trespass upon any portion of the domain within any enclosure which may be set apart for planting, or where the soil is loose, or upon any grass kept for lawns or ornamental purposes. Any person infringing this by-law shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £1.

13. No person shall light any fire within the domain.

14. Every person using or passing through the domain or any part thereof shall conform to and abide by these by-laws ; and if any person, while using or passing through the domain, or any portion thereof, commits any indecency or breach of the peace, or is guilty of any disorderly conduct, he shall be liable as for a breach of these by-laws.

GAMES.

15. The bowling-greens, croquet-lawns, and tennis-courts shall be open to players during such months and for such hours as are fixed by the General Manager.

16. (1) Charges shall be made for playing bowls, lawn tennis, and croquet as fixed and determined from time to time by the Minister. No person shall be allowed to play without first obtaining a player's ticket.

(2) Any person who is a season-ticket holder shall be liable to have his ticket cancelled if he causes a breach of any of these by-laws.

17. All playing-fees shall be paid in advance, and a ticket obtained.

18. Season tickets shall be obtained at the ticket office only, and must be submitted to the attendant for inspection on demand.

19. Single-game tickets and tickets for playing material shall be obtained at the ticket office, and must be given up to the attendant on demand.

20. Material for playing shall be obtained from the attendant, and players shall return it to him before leaving the domain.

21. Players shall not play more than one game or set when other persons desire to play.

22. Bowl-players shall deliver their bowls with both feet on a mat, and must not drop any bowl on the green.

23. Persons not engaged in the games shall not trespass on the bowling-greens, or croquet-lawns, or tennis-courts.

24. Persons wearing boots or shoes with nails or heels shall not be allowed on the bowling-greens, or croquet-lawns, or tennis-courts.

25. Any person behaving to the annoyance of others may be required by the officer in charge to leave the playing-grounds, and may be prohibited from again entering them.

26. The Department reserves the right to refuse to issue tickets to any person or persons. The officer in charge shall determine to whom tickets shall not be issued.

READING-ROOM AND LIBRARY.

27. The reading-room and library shall be open to the public free of charge during such hours as may be authorized by the General Manager.

28. The charges for subscribers to the library shall be as fixed and determined from time to time by the Minister.

29. A ticket shall be issued by the librarian to each subscriber on payment of the charges.

30. A subscriber, on receipt of a ticket and on compliance with these by-laws, shall be entitled to have the use of a book for a period not exceeding ten days. A subscriber shall not remove a book from the library until an entry has been made in the register with respect thereto.

31. Any person may read in the reading-room, free of charge, any book, paper, or periodical in the reading-room or library.

32. No person shall remove from the reading-room any book, paper, or periodical.

33. No person shall mark, mutilate, or damage any book, paper, or magazine, or read any newspaper for longer than fifteen minutes, or talk or make any noise or disturbance, or smoke or expectorate within the reading-room or library.

34. No child under the age of twelve years shall enter or remain in the reading-room or library unless in charge of an adult person.

35. Every person using the reading-room or library shall conform to these by-laws ; and if any such person, while using the reading-room or library, commits any breach of these by-laws or is guilty of any disorderly conduct, the officer in charge, or any person duly authorized by that officer, may (without prejudice to any proceedings for a fine) require any such person to abstain from doing any of the acts aforesaid, and forthwith to leave the reading-room or library. If any person refuses to leave the reading-room or library when requested so to do in pursuance of this by-law the officer in charge may eject that person or cause him to be ejected therefrom.

BATHS.

36. The hours of admission to the baths shall be as authorized by the General Manager. Admission shall be obtained by ticket only, and each bather shall present his or her ticket to the bath attendant, who shall clip and retain it. The charges for ticket for admission to the baths and for the use of towels shall be as fixed and determined from time to time by the Minister.

37. The Minister may fix a special scale of fees for residents using the baths. A “resident” shall be deemed to be any person who has signed a declaration before the officer in charge, a Justice of the Peace, or the Postmaster at Te Aroha, truly setting forth that he or she has resided for a period of at least six months within a radius of five miles from the Te Aroha Post-office. For the purposes hereof, the head of any household may sign one declaration for the whole of the inmates of that household, if the name of each person to whom the declaration applies is appended thereto.

A resident's family commutation ticket shall be available for the use of members of one household only.

38. Persons suffering from skin-diseases must not bathe in any baths or pools, nor use any towels, except those specially set apart for their use ; every such person must inform the ticket-issuer before taking the baths of the fact that he or she is so suffering. Any person failing to furnish such information shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £10.

39. No person shall wash any clothes in any bath or swimming-pool subject to these by-laws, or place any soap, substance, article, or other thing in any such bath or pool.

40. No person shall place or leave any bottle or glassware (whether broken or whole), paper, straw, litter, dirt, rubbish, or any offensive or noxious matter of any kind, in any bathing-house, bath, or pool subject to these by-laws.

41. No dog shall be allowed on the premises of any bath or swimming-pool. The owner of any dog found on such premises shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £1.

42. Every person using any bath or swimming-pool subject to these by-laws shall conform to and abide by such by-laws; and if any person while using any such bath or swimming-pool commits any indecency or breach of the peace, or is guilty of any disorderly conduct, or commits a breach of any of these by-laws, the officer in charge, or any person duly authorized in writing by the officer in charge, may (without prejudice to any proceedings for a fine) require any such person to abstain from doing any of the acts aforesaid and forthwith to leave, or, in default thereof, may eject that person, or cause him to be ejected, from the premises.

PENALTY.

43. Except where otherwise specially provided, every person who commits a breach of or fails to observe the provisions of any of these by-laws shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding £5.

And whereas it is expedient to alter and redefine the boundaries of the said district, and to define a new district:

Now, therefore, I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and authority conferred upon me by the Judicature Act, 1908, do hereby declare that on and from the first day of February next the boundaries of the Sheriff's District of Auckland shall be as described in the First Schedule hereto; and I do hereby define the said district to be a Sheriff's district under the said Act; and I do further define the district described in the Second Schedule hereto to be, on and from the first day of February next, a Sheriff's district under the said Act.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

THE SHERIFF'S DISTRICT OF AUCKLAND.

ALL that area in the North Auckland and Auckland Land Districts bounded towards the north generally by the North Auckland Sheriff's District hereinbefore described from the mouth of the Kaipara Harbour to the mouth of the Mangawai Harbour; thence towards the east and north-east generally by the sea from the mouth of the Mangawai Harbour to Cape Runaway; thence along a right line to the summit of Mount Hikurangi; thence along a right line to Kapua Trig. Station; thence along a right line to Arowhana Trig. Station; thence along a right line to Tuanui-o-te-Kahakaha; thence along

a right line passing through Trig. Exempting Crown Lands from certain Provisions of the Mining Act, 1926.

And whereas it is desirable that the Crown land specified in the Schedule hereto shall, subject to all existing registered mining privileges, be exempted from the provisions of subsection (b) of section sixty-six of the Mining Act, 1926:

Now, therefore, I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by section twenty of the Mining Act, 1926, and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling me in that behalf, do hereby exempt the land particularly described in the Schedule hereto from the provisions of subsection (b) of section sixty-six of the Mining Act, 1926, subject to all existing registered mining privileges; and do also hereby declare that such exemption shall take effect from the date of the publication of this notice in the *Gazette*.

SCHEDULE.

Notifying the proposed Exchange of Crown Land in the North Auckland Land District for other Land.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and sixty of the Land Act, 1924, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor-General, whenever he deems it expedient in the public interest, to grant in fee-simple any area of Crown land which is subject to the provisions of the Land Act, 1924, in exchange for the fee-simple of any other land, and on any such exchange to pay or receive any sum by way of equality of exchange:

And whereas, in the opinion of the Governor-General, it is expedient to exchange the Crown land described in the First Schedule hereto for the land described in the Second Schedule hereto, and the owner of the land described in the Second Schedule has agreed to such exchange:
