WHEREAS by Order in Council made on the eighteenth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and thirty, consent was given to the raising by the Manawatu-Oroua Electric-power Board (hereinafter called "the said local authority") of the sum of fifty thousand pounds (£50,000) by a loan to be known as "Electrical Reticulation and Power Supplementary Loan, 1930" (hereinafter called "the said loan"), of which the amount of twenty-three thousand eight hundred pounds (£23,800) has not been raised:

And whereas by section nine of the Local Authorities Interest Reduction and Loans Conversion Amendment Act, 1934, the authority conferred by the said Order in Council was revoked in so far as it had not been exercised, and it is not now lawful or competent for the said local authority to borrow any moneys to which the said Order in Council relates except in accordance with the provisions of an Order in Council that may be made under section eleven of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926:

And whereas it is expedient to authorize the said local authority to borrow on the conditions hereinafter mentioned the sum of five thousand pounds (£5,000) (hereinafter called "the said sum") being part of the moneys to which the said Order in Council relates:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926, and by section nine of the Local Authorities Interest Reduction and Loans Conversion Amendment Act, 1934, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the borrowing in New Zealand by the said local authority of the said sum or any part thereof for the purpose for which the said loan was authorized, and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

(1) The term for which the said sum or any part thereof may be borrowed shall be (15) fifteen years.

(2) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said sum or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate exceeding three pounds ten shillings (£3 10s.) per centum per annum.

(3) (a) The said sum together with interest thereon shall be repaid by thirty equal payments of one hundred and seventy-four pounds seventeen shillings and threepence (£174 17s. 3d.), one of such payments to be made at the end of every half-year commencing from the date on which the said sum is borrowed. Each such half-yearly payment shall be applied firstly in payment of interest computed at the rate of three pounds ten shillings (£3 10s.) per centum per annum on the amount of the principal for the time being outstanding at the beginning of each such half-year and the balance of such half-yearly payment in reduction of such principal.

(b) By a payment at the end of the fifteenth year from the date of the borrowing of the said sum of a sum equal to the

amount to which the principal has been reduced in accordance with the preceding paragraph (a) hereof after payment of the aforesaid thirty (30) half-yearly payments.

(4) The payment of such instalments shall be made in New Zealand, and no such instalment shall be paid out of loan-money.

(5) The rates payable for brokerage, underwriting, and procuration fees in respect of the borrowing of the said sum or any part thereof shall not in the aggregate exceed one-half per centum of any amount raised.

(6) No moneys shall be borrowed under this consent after the expiration of two years from the date hereof.

4. All persons shall, at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have full liberty to use the said wharves and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said wharves without payment.

6. The Council shall maintain the above-mentioned wharves in good order and repair.

7. The master of all vessels discharging ballast at the said wharves shall have all such ballast taken away and deposited above high-water mark or at such places as may be approved by the Minister or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years computed from the date hereof unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority ; and the Council shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

10. In case the Council shall—

(1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them ;

(2) Cease to use or occupy the said wharves for a period of thirty consecutive days—

then, and in either of the said cases, this Order in Council and every right, power, or privilege may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the Council or any other proceeding whatsoever ; and publication in the Gazette of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the Council and to all persons concerned or interested that this Order in Council and the license, rights, and privileges thereby conferred have been revoked and determined.

In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the licensee shall pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of 10s. in advance, payable on the 1st day of April in each year, the proportionate part of such rental in respect of the period from the 1st day of January, 1937, until the 31st day of March following to be paid on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. All persons shall at all reasonable times and upon payment of the proper dues have free and full liberty to use the said barge-landing and all rights of ingress and egress thereto and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all persons in the Government service acting in the execution of their duties, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, over, and out of the said barge-landing without payment.

The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned barge-landing in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at the licensee's own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said barge-landing and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last-known address of the licensee in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such barge-landing requiring the licensee within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the licensee shall with all reasonable speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The master of all vessels discharging ballast at the said barge-landing shall have all such ballast taken away and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved by the Minister or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the 1st day of January, 1937, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, and the licensee may be required to remove the barge-landing at the licensee's own cost, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. 12. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which the said barge-landing may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the licensee's part.

13. In case the licensee shall—

(1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;

(2) Cease to use or occupy the said barge-landing for a period of thirty consecutive days;

(3) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions;

(4) Become bankrupt, or be brought under the operation of any law for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy—

then, and in any of the said cases, this Order in Council and every license, right, power, or privilege thereby conferred may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the *Gazette* of an order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee and to all persons concerned or interested that this Order in Council and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred have been revoked and determined.

other local authority the Governor-General may, by Order in Council, grant, for a period not exceeding twenty-one years, the control of such part or parts thereof as he thinks fit to any local authority, Domain Board, or persons acting as trustees for the inhabitants of the locality, upon such conditions as may be prescribed in the Order:

And whereas the foreshore hereinafter described is not vested in any Harbour Board or other local authority, and the Akitio County Council (hereinafter called "the Council") has applied to the Governor-General in Council for the control thereof:

And whereas it is desirable that the control should be granted to the Council:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby grant to the Council the control of the foreshore as described in the First Schedule hereto, and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

ALL that portion of the foreshore in Akitio County, commencing at the southern side of the mouth of the Akitio River, opposite Section 25, to the northern boundary of Section 38, as is shown coloured yellow on plan marked M.D. 7547 and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term—

"Foreshore" means all land between high-water mark of ordinary spring tides and low-water mark of ordinary spring tides:

"Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to that part of the foreshore as defined in the First Schedule hereto.

3. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress out and over the said foreshore without payment.

4. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or with any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provision of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder and that are or may hereafter be in force.

5. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall not apply to those portions of the foreshore required for securing the shore-ends of any telegraph cables that are at present or may be at any time laid down within the said area of foreshore.

6. The Council may enclose any part or parts of the foreshore described in the First Schedule hereto for the purpose of holding athletic sports or games, and may by by-law fix a charge for admission to such enclosed part or parts: Provided that the total number of days on which such enclosures are made shall not exceed six in any one year.

7. The Council may, subject to the provisions of section 171 of the Harbours Act, 1923, erect, or license, or permit the erection of, bathing-sheds or boat-sheds on the foreshore described in the First Schedule hereto, and may make by-laws regulating the use thereof, and may fix charges for such use: Provided that the funds so received shall be expended in improving the foreshore for the benefit of the public.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Council to remove, or cause to be removed, any stone, sand, shingle, or shells without the consent of the Minister being first obtained.

9. By-laws made by the Council under the said Act in respect of the foreshore shall not have effect unless and until approved in writing by the Minister.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for twenty-one years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Council six calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last-known address of the Council in New Zealand.

THE following estimated average yields per acre of wheat, oats, and barley for the season 1936-37 have been compiled from reports furnished by Stock Inspectors of the Department of Agriculture throughout the Dominion, and are now published for general information.

The above estimates may be compared with last season's actual average yields, which were: Wheat, 35.63 bushels; oats, 42.61 bushels; and barley, 36.08 bushels.

In accordance with the above estimates, the total yield of wheat for the season 1936-37 should be approximately 7,150,000 bushels, as against an actual yield of 8,859,223 bushels for the season 1935-36.

The area from which oats were threshed for the five seasons ending with 1935-36 averaged 21 per cent. of the total area under that crop. Assuming that a similar proportion is threshed this year, the total yield of grain should be approximately 2,700,000 bushels, as against an actual yield of 3,302,642 bushels for the season 1935-36.

On a similar assumption in regard to barley, the total yield of grain should be approximately 675,000 bushels, as against an actual yield of 745,380 bushels for the season 1935-36.
