And whereas by the said section thirteen it is further provided that the Governor-General, by the Order in Council giving his consent to the conversion of existing securities by a local authority, may make such provisions as he thinks fit with respect to all or any of the matters specified in the said section, and that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, every Order in Council under the said section shall have the force of law as if enacted in the said Act, anything to the contrary in any other Act or in any regulations made under the said Act or any other Act notwithstanding :

And whereas it is provided by section twenty of the Finance Act (No. 2), 1935, that, notwithstanding the limitation of time prescribed by section fifteen of the said Local Authorities Interest Reduction and Loans Conversion Act, 1932-33, an Order in Council may be issued at any time under the aforesaid section thirteen of that Act, as extended by section twelve of the Local Authorities Interest Reduction and Loans Conversion Amendment Act, 1934, making provision for the conversion, with the consent of the holder, of any securities whether or not they are existing securities to which the said Local Authorities Interest Reduction and Loans Conversion Act, 1932-33, applies :

And whereas the Oamaru Harbour Board (being a local authority within the meaning of the said Act) has issued securities in respect of the loan specified in the First Schedule hereto :

And whereas the said local authority, being desirous, with the consent of the holder of such securities of issuing new securities in conversion thereof, has complied with the provisions of Part II of the said Act, and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General to such conversion should be given as required by the said Act, and that by this Order the provisions hereinafter set forth should be made with respect to the matters specified in the said section thirteen :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the issue by the said local authority of new securities in conversion of any existing securities to which this Order applies, and with respect to such conversion doth hereby make the following provisions.

PRELIMINARY.

1. This Order may be cited as the Oamaru Harbour Board Loan Conversion Order, 1937.

2. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires,—

“The Act” means the Local Authorities Interest Reduction and Loans Conversion Act, 1932-33 :

“The date of conversion” means the date specified in clause five of this Order :

“Existing securities” means debentures or other securities issued in respect of the loan specified in the First Schedule hereto, but, except as provided by clause eleven hereof, does not include any such existing security directed by the said clause eleven to be cancelled.

“The local authority” means the Oamaru Harbour Board :

“Local fund” has the same meaning as in Part V of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926 :

“New securities” or “new debentures” means securities or debentures issued in accordance with this Order in conversion of existing securities to which this Order applies.

APPLICATION OF ORDER.

3. This Order shall apply to all existing securities issued in respect of the loan specified in the First Schedule hereto.

SPECIAL RESOLUTION OF LOCAL AUTHORITY.

4. (1) If the local authority so resolves by a resolution passed and confirmed as provided by subsection two of section nine of the Act, it may, with the consent of the holder of the existing securities to which this Order applies, and subject to and in accordance with the provisions of this Order, issue new securities in conversion of such existing securities.

(2) The following provisions of this Order shall come into force if such a resolution is passed and confirmed as aforesaid, but not otherwise :

Provided that a certificate signed by the Chairman of the local authority and published in the *Gazette* to the effect that such a resolution has been duly passed and confirmed shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein certified.

DATE OF CONVERSION.

NOTICE TO HOLDERS OF EXISTING SECURITIES.

6. The local authority shall cause a notice in the form numbered (1) in the Second Schedule hereto, together with a copy of this Order, to be forwarded by registered letter not later than the date of conversion to every holder of existing securities to which this Order applies.

CONSENT TO CONVERSION.

7. The consent of the holder of the existing securities to the conversion thereof in accordance with this Order shall, if given, be signified in writing not later than the date of conversion, and when given shall be irrevocable.

NEW SECURITIES.

8. The aggregate amount of principal secured by the new securities to be issued in conversion of existing securities to which this Order applies, together with interest thereon computed at the rate of four per centum per annum, shall be repaid by equal half-yearly instalments over a period of fifteen years, the first half-yearly instalment to fall due and be paid on the first day of October, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, and subsequent half-yearly instalments to fall due and be paid on every first day of April and first day of October thereafter, the last half-yearly instalment to fall due and be paid on the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and fifty-two.

9. (1) New securities for the amount of each half-yearly instalment referred to in the preceding clause shall be issued in the form of debentures in the form numbered (2) in the Second Schedule hereto.

(2) All new debentures shall be numbered consecutively, and as between the holders thereof shall rank equally.

(3) Every new debenture shall be signed by the Chairman, countersigned by the Treasurer or some other officer appointed by the local authority for the purpose, and sealed with the common seal of the local authority.

PLACE FOR PAYMENT OF PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST.

10. The principal and interest in respect of new securities shall be payable at such place or places in New Zealand as may be directed by the holder.

APPLICATION OF EXISTING SINKING FUND.

11. (1) The existing sinking fund of the loan specified in the First Schedule hereto shall be applied by the Public Trustee as Commissioner thereof in accordance with the following provisions of this clause.

(2) All existing securities issued in respect of such loan and at the date of conversion held by the Public Trustee as Commissioner thereof shall be cancelled. Such cancellation shall be effected by the Commissioner or a person appointed by him for the purpose in the presence of an officer appointed by the Audit Office. On the cancellation of such debentures the liability of the local authority and of the Commissioner in respect of the debentures and of the moneys secured thereby shall forthwith cease.

(4) Interest up to the date of conversion on any existing securities cancelled or repaid in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this clause shall be paid by the local authority out of the local fund.

12. Regulations under the Naval Defence Act, 1913, amended.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 18th day of February, 1937.

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. M. J. SAVAGE PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section twenty-five of the Naval Defence Act, 1913, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby amend and supplement the regulations referred to in the Schedule hereto as shown therein.

SCHEDULE.

Regulations for the Government and Payment of the New Zealand Division of the Royal Navy, 1929.*Article 92*: Cancel, and substitute:—

92. *New Zealand Ratings*.—Ratings who have regularly joined or who have been permanently transferred to the New Zealand Division may be allowed twenty-eight days' leave per annum whilst serving on the New Zealand Station. For the purpose of leave, ratings whose Royal Navy engagements have expired and who continue to serve in the New Zealand Division under their loan agreements will be regarded as loan ratings. Ratings who proceed to Australia for courses in Royal Australian Navy Establishments not exceeding six months in duration will continue to be regarded as serving on the New Zealand Station for the purpose of leave. The procedure to be adopted where absence from New Zealand exceeds six months is laid down in paragraphs 4 and 5 below.

2. The leave year for New Zealand ratings is to commence on 1st April of each year.

3. Leave cannot be deferred from year to year, except that during the last three years of a man's engagement he may be given the option of deferring fourteen days of the authorized annual allowance of twenty-eight days' leave, such leave to be allowed to accumulate and taken at the end of his engagement.

4. New Zealand ratings who proceed to England for courses, or for "Interchange" service in the Royal Navy, and ratings who proceed to Australia for courses which normally exceed six months in duration, may be granted ten days' leave before departure from New Zealand. In addition, the proportionate amount of leave due to them in the current leave year, reckoned to the anticipated date of departure from New Zealand, may also be granted.

5. On return to New Zealand, the ratings specified in paragraph 4 may be granted foreign-service leave at the rate of fourteen days for each year, seven days for six months, and one day for each completed month in periods of less than six months, of absence from New Zealand, reckoned from the date of leaving New Zealand to the date of return, irrespective of any leave which may have been granted whilst absent from New Zealand. They may also be granted leave at the rate of twenty-eight days per annum (fourteen days for six months, and two days for each completed month in periods of less than six months) for the unexpired portion of the current New Zealand leave year, reckoned from the date of return to New Zealand—*e.g.*, a man returning to New Zealand on 1st May, in addition to his foreign-service leave, would be eligible for twenty-four days' leave before the subsequent 31st March.

6. In the event of ships of the New Zealand Division being detached for service in the Royal Navy, the scale of leave applicable to New Zealand ratings on departure from and on return to New Zealand is to be that laid down in paragraphs 4 and 5 above respectively.

7. *Training Establishment*.—Ratings under training in the Training Establishment at Auckland may be granted leave as follows—Fourteen days at Christmas, fourteen days at Easter, fourteen days in August, each year.

8. Ratings joining a seagoing ship from the Training Establishment for the first time may be granted twenty-eight days' leave in the current leave year if they join before receiving Easter leave, or fourteen days if after receiving Easter leave. Drafting leave is not to be granted to ratings about to be discharged to sea service.

Article 143 : Cancel clause 3, and substitute :—

3. After ninety-one days all pay is to cease (*i.e.*, including marriage and dependant's allowances and deferred pay, but excluding kit-upkeep allowance).

Article 233 : Cancel, and substitute :—

233. *Kits*.—Where not inconsistent with these regulations and other orders issued under the authority of the Naval Board, the King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions, and all other instructions issued by the Admiralty, regarding the issue, upkeep, and disposal of kits to ratings shall apply in the New Zealand Division.

2. Kit-upkeep allowance shall be payable at the rates promulgated in Navy Orders under the conditions specified in King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions, but shall not be credited for periods during which deferred pay is stopped under these regulations, except as follows :—

(a) During sentence of detention when uniform is required to be worn.

(NOTE.—Kit-upkeep allowance is not to be credited during sentences served in the Auckland civil prison.)

(b) When all pay is stopped on account of hospital stoppages (*vide* Article 143).

3. In view of the provisions of Article 236, which authorizes the issue of a civilian suit to ratings who are dismissed from H.M. Service, no uniform clothing is to be retained by men whose kits are ordered to be sold (King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions, Article 542).

4. Plain-clothes gratuity (King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions, Article 1602) is not payable in the New Zealand Division.

Article 235 : Cancel, and substitute :—

235. *Clothing Gratuities*.—Clothing gratuities shall be payable under the conditions specified in King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions at the rates promulgated in Navy Orders.

Article 236 : Cancel, and substitute :—

236. *Issue of Civilian Suit*.—When kits are sold under the provisions of King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions, Article 542, a civilian suit, the cost of which shall not exceed £3 10s., shall be issued prior to discharge. (See Article 233, clause 3.)

2. The cost of the civilian suit is to be charged against any credit standing to the rating's account on discharge.

**Regulations for the Royal Naval Reserve (New Zealand Division) and
Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve (New Zealand Division) (Officers).**

Article 16 : Cancel clause 3, and substitute :—

(3) As a general rule an officer should not be recommended until he has satisfactorily performed a total of at least six months' naval training at sea, and has completed gunnery, torpedo, and signal courses.

Article 64 : Cancel, and substitute :—

64. *Qualifications for Confirmation of Acting Sub-Lieutenant.*—In order to qualify for confirmation an Acting Sub-Lieutenant must—

- (a) Have attained one year's seniority as Acting Sub-Lieutenant.
- (b) Have served not less than one year at sea since promotion to Acting Sub-Lieutenant; service both in the Naval Forces and Mercantile Marine shall count towards the necessary period of one year's service at sea.
- (c) Have performed three months' naval training.
- (d) Have satisfactory records and reports of service for the period under subsection (b) of this article, including a certificate to the effect that he has kept a bridge watch at sea throughout the whole period, except during the three months' naval training referred to in subsection (c) of this article, either in charge or as "junior bridge-keeping officer of the watch."

Article 67 : Cancel, and substitute :—

67. *Obligatory Naval Training: Sub-Lieutenant and Lieutenant.*—The obligatory naval training of a Sub-Lieutenant and a Lieutenant shall consist of twenty-eight days training biennially, the first such period being performed within two years of completing the six months' training referred to in Article 62 of these regulations.

Article 113 : Cancel, and substitute :—

113. *Royal Naval Reserve Officers' Decoration.*—His Majesty the King has been graciously pleased to approve the award of the Royal Naval Reserve Officers' Decoration to officers of the Royal Naval Reserve (New Zealand Division) under such regulations as may be issued from time to time by the Governor-General in Council with the concurrence of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty.

The decoration will be awarded for the present under the regulations approved for the corresponding Reserve of the Royal Navy, but matters at the discretion of the Admiralty shall be at the discretion of the New Zealand Naval Board.

Applications for the award of the decoration should be addressed to the Navy Office, Wellington.

Article 136 : Cancel Note (a), and substitute :—

NOTE : (a) Probationary Surgeon Lieutenants, Surgeon Lieutenants, and Surgeon Lieutenant-Commanders, when undergoing training in H.M. Ships or Establishments, should, as circumstances of appointment permit, be instructed practically or verbally in the syllabus laid down. (See Appendix A IV.)

Article 141 : Cancel Note, and substitute :—

NOTE.—Whilst undergoing training, officers of the Accountant Branch, R.N.V.R., will be regarded as forming part of the staff of the Accountant Officer. They should be instructed in the practical duties of an Accountant Officer in accordance with the syllabus laid down. (See Appendix A V.)

Article 155 : Cancel, and substitute :—

155. *Volunteer Officers' Decoration.*—His Majesty the King has been graciously pleased to approve the award of the Volunteer Officers' Decoration to officers of the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve (New Zealand Division) under such regulations as may be issued from time to time by the Governor-General in Council with the concurrence of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty.

The decoration will be awarded for the present under the regulations approved for the corresponding Reserve of the Royal Navy, but matters at the discretion of the Admiralty shall be at the discretion of the New Zealand Naval Board.

Applications for the award of the decoration should be made by the Commanding Officer of the Division to which the officer belongs, and should be addressed to the Navy Office, Wellington.

IV. SYLLABUS FOR INSTRUCTION OF MEDICAL OFFICERS.

(New Zealand Naval Reserve Regulations (Officers), 1936, Article 136.)

The following is a syllabus for the instruction of Medical Officers, R.N.V.R., appointed for naval training in H.M. Ships and Establishments.

2. It has been drawn up on broad general lines as a basis for instruction, to be modified as necessary to meet the needs of each officer according to his previous experience.

3. Training in a naval hospital (or sick quarters) which is entirely a medical establishment is left to the discretion of the Medical Officer in Charge, but will, as far as the facilities available permit, include—

- (a) The routine of ward work.
- (b) The admission and discharge of patients.
- (c) The dieting of hospital patients.
- (d) The examination of recruits.
- (e) The method of keeping and rendering returns.
- (f) General health of staff (officers, nurses, and men).

Syllabus.

(1) Method of preparing Dressing-station: Selection of site. Division and separation of medical stores, stowage of emergency stores below the water-line. Provision of secondary lighting. Access to water-supply. Method of slinging bamboo stretchers in tiers. Drawing of emergency bedding.

(2) Transport of Wounded within the Ship: Use of the Neil Robertson stretcher in getting casualties up from boiler-rooms (caution to be exercised in the use of the airlock) and engine-rooms, and down from bridges and superstructures.

(3) Transport of Wounded Ashore and to other Ships: Use of the Service cot. Use of torpedo or other davit for lowering into boat. Provision of check-lines.

(4) Methods of Decontamination and Treatment of Gas Casualties: Selection and preparation of decontamination chamber. Accessibility of bathrooms. Space for dressing and treating casualties. Treatment of contaminated clothing. Decontamination of areas exposed to gas. Care of food and water supplies. Inspection of suspects.

(5) Keeping and rendering of Accounts and Returns: Method of labelling casualties. Reports of death. Necessary forms for sending cases to hospital. Demand for stores. Statistical returns.

(6) The Victualling of the Sick: Method of formation of a sick-mess. Drawing of money from Paymaster. Forms for expenditure of money drawn.

(7) The General Hygiene of a Ship: Chlorination of water. Efficiency of the ventilation. Airing of bedding. Extermination of vermin, rats, cockroaches, &c.

(8) The General Welfare and Health of Officers and Men: Vaccination, inoculations, weights, and chest examination. Mustering and examination of messes in cases where scabies and pediculosis have been found. Prophylaxis and treatment of V.D.

V. SYLLABUS FOR INSTRUCTION OF ACCOUNTANT OFFICERS.

(New Zealand Naval Reserve Regulations (Officers), 1936, Article 141.)

The following is a syllabus for the instruction of Accountant Officers, R.N.V.R., appointed for naval training. It has been drawn up on broad general lines as a basis for instruction, to be modified as necessary to meet the needs of each officer according to his previous experience.

Syllabus.

(1) Cash Duties: Sources of supply of money, &c. Cash-book, routine vouchers, and monthly cash account and summary.

(2) Pay Office: Ledger, entries in and closing of. Transfer-lists. Reports of movements of personnel. Allotments, remittances. Stationery and forms.

(3) Victualling, Clothing, Mess-traps: Sources of supply of provisions, clothing, mess-traps. **Standard ration and general mess systems of victualling.** Visit galley, preparing-room, servery, and bakery. Provision, clothing, and mess-trap books and accounts. Issue of provisions, clothing, mess-traps, &c. Manual of victualling (B.R. 93).

(4) Naval Stores: Principles and practice of central storekeeping system with special reference to forms S. 156, loan-lists for permanent stores, and test musters of stores. Instructions relating to the supply of naval stores in H.M. Ships (B.R. 4).

(5) Captain's Office: Service correspondence, registration, filing, and despatch of Captain's request-book. Service certificates. Punishment warrants. Naval Secretariat Handbook (B.R. 49).

(6) Cyphering Instruction: All Accountant Officers are, after confirmation as Paymaster Sub-Lieutenant, to be given as much instruction as possible in the syllabus laid down for officers of the Cypher Staff, to enable them to carry out routine duties efficiently under supervision and to qualify them for inclusion in the Cypher Staff.

During training the necessity for observing the strictest reticence on all matters connected with the work of the Cypher Staff is to be impressed on these officers.

(7) General: Paymaster Lieutenant-Commanders and Paymaster Commanders when under training are to understudy the Accountant Officer of the ship, as they are eligible to be placed in sole charge on mobilization.

Newly entered officers should be instructed in the rudiments of naval etiquette, discipline, and general organization as soon as possible after joining.

An attempt should be made to give Probationary Paymaster Sub-Lieutenants and Probationary Paymaster Lieutenants a rudimentary knowledge of all the duties of an Accountant Officer. After confirmation, instructions should be confined to one or two definite sections of the syllabus.

Regulations for the Royal Naval Reserve (New Zealand Division) (Men).

Article 7 : Cancel, and substitute :—

Classes C and D.

7. Classes C and D will be composed of men of the following branches, who will be enrolled between the ages stated :—

Article 16 : Cancel, and substitute :—

16. *Engine-room Artificers.*—Fitters, coppersmiths, boilermakers, and enginesmiths not holding a Board of Trade certificate of competency or a certificate of competency granted under the New Zealand Shipping and Seamen Act, 1903, will be enrolled as Engine-room Artificers, 5th Class, provided they possess the qualifications required in the case of an Engine-room Artificer, 5th Class, entering the seagoing service.

An Engine-room Artificer, 5th Class, will be advanced to Engine-room Artificer, 4th Class, on completion of his first period of fourteen days' training, if recommended by the Commanding Officer and Engineer Officer of the ship in which the training is performed. Subsequent advancement will be as stated in the next paragraph.

Article 31 : Cancel, and substitute :—

31. Other ratings will be entered in the lowest man's ratings of their branch existing in the seagoing forces, thus—

Artificer (Engine-room, Electrical, Ordnance, Shipwright)	Engine-room (&c.), Artificer, 5th Class.

Article 32 : Cancel, and substitute :—

32. *Artificers.*—Men who are fully qualified workmen in one of the following trades will be eligible for enrolment as Engine-room Artificers, 5th Class, Electrical Artificers, 5th Class, or Ordnance Artificers, 5th Class.

The proportion in each trade of the total number of Engine-room Artificers to be enrolled will be as follows :—

Fitters	70 per cent.
Boilermakers	20 per cent.
Smiths and coppersmiths	10 per cent.

Candidates will be required to possess the qualifications for Engine-room, Electrical, or Ordnance Artificers, 5th Class, and to pass a technical examination as required by the King's Regulations.

Article 35 : Cancel, and substitute :—

35. *Writers and Supply Assistants.*—Clerical and/or accountant experience of at least one year will be required for entry as a Writer Probationer or Supply Probationer.

Article 36 : Cancel, and substitute :—

36. *Sick-berth Attendant.*—The possession of a first-aid certificate of competency will be required of candidates for entry as Probationary Sick-berth Attendant.

Article 37: Cancel clauses (8) and (10), and substitute :—

(8) *Engine-room Artificers, Advancement of.*—Engine-room Artificers, 5th Class, will be eligible for advancement to 4th Class on completion of first period of fourteen days' training if recommended by the Commanding Officer and Engineer Officer of the ship in which the training is performed. Engine-room Artificers, 4th Class, will be eligible for advancement to 3rd Class upon obtaining R.N. stokehold and engine-room certificates. Further advancement will be governed by the same regulations as for the seagoing forces.

(10) *Electrical and Ordnance Artificers, Artisans, Writers, Supply, and Sick-berth Ratings, Advancement of.*—The advancement of the following ratings will be governed by the regulations applicable to the seagoing forces :—

Engine-room Artificers will be allowed to volunteer for a period of training not exceeding six months in each period of enrolment in order to enable them to qualify for advancement. Subsequent periods of compulsory training during that term of enrolment may be waived when the period of voluntary training exceeds three months.

Article 58: Cancel, and substitute :—

58. *Long-service and Good-conduct Medals.*—His Majesty the King has been graciously pleased to approve the award of Long-service and Good-conduct Medals to be granted to reservists of the New Zealand Royal Naval Reserves, Class "A" (Active), "B," "C," and "D," under such regulations as may be issued from time to time by the Governor-General in Council with the concurrence of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty.

2. The Long-service and Good-conduct Medals will be awarded for the present under the regulations approved for the corresponding Reserve of the Royal Navy, but matters at the discretion of the Admiralty shall be at the discretion of the New Zealand Naval Board.

3. For purposes of the award of these medals the corresponding classes of the Reserves of the Royal Navy shall be deemed to be as follows :—

New Zealand Reserve.	Corresponding Reserve of the Royal Navy.
Class "A" (Active)	Royal Fleet Reserve.
Classes "B" and "C"	Royal Naval Reserve.
Class "D"	Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve.

4. The designs of the medals (and ribbons) will, for the present, be similar to the medals awarded to reservists of the Royal Navy, but the inscription on the rim of the medal will bear the distinctive initials of the Royal Naval Reserve of the Dominion.

5. Applications by ratings in Classes "A" (Active), "B," and "C" for the award of these medals should be addressed to the Navy Office, Wellington.

Applications for awards to Class "D" reservists are to be forwarded by Commanding Officers of Divisions to Navy Office.

Article 109 : Cancel, and substitute :—

109. *Enrolment on Discharge from Seagoing Forces.*—Men who, on completion of their engagements in the seagoing forces, do not desire to re-engage therein, should, if recommended for enrolment, be encouraged to join Class A of the Active Reserve, if eligible. Those who elect to join the Active Reserve will be required to make application on form N.Z.D. R. 2A (see Navy Order No. 566), as in the case of other candidates, the application form—completed except for the certificate of enrolment—being forwarded to the Registrar as in the case of other candidates. Provided vacancies exist, the Registrar will complete the enrolment and issue a certificate of service in the Reserve and a copy of the regulations. All such cases of provisional enrolment should be included in the return to be forwarded by Article 88.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR JANUARY, 1937.

General.—Though the rainfall was below normal in parts of the South Island the weather was generally humid, and January was a wet month, especially in the North Island. The humid conditions favoured the growth of pasture, which is still abundant—in many places, indeed, superabundant. Stock, consequently, are in good condition, and the milk-yield has been well maintained. Feed remains rather soft, however, and lambs have not fattened very well. The cool weather, too, has been rather unfavourable for crops of most kinds. Shearing, which had been held over in some districts by the wet weather, was still further delayed, and haymaking was interfered with. White butterflies have been rather more numerous again. Unusually low pressures prevailed throughout the month, which was more stormy and windy than most Januaries.

Rainfall.—The whole of the North Island, with the exception of parts of Taranaki, had more than the average rainfall. North Auckland had more than double, and between Hawke's Bay and the Bay of Plenty, also, it was very wet. In the South Island, though it was generally a wet month, the total falls were below normal in Nelson and parts of North Canterbury and Otago.

Temperatures were below normal over almost the whole country, the departure being generally about 2° F. Hastings and Hanmer Springs, however, were warmer than usual, doubtless owing to the Föhn effect in the strong westerly winds. About the middle of the month a few frosts were recorded, and snow fell to rather low levels on the mountains.

Sunshine was above normal at Wellington and in eastern districts of the South Island, but elsewhere was below it. Blenheim had 277.2 hours, Lake Tekapo 272.7, and Nelson 255.2.

Pressure Systems.—On the 1st a depression was passing away eastward and the weather was still disturbed over the Dominion. Rain was widespread. Some heavy falls occurred on both coasts of the North Island, but particularly in the north-east.

On the 5th a vigorous disturbance came from the Tasman Sea and a centre of low pressure moved from west of the Auckland Peninsula south-south-easterly across the North Island. Strong easterly or north-easterly winds to gales blew over the North Island, while westerly gales followed in the central provinces. Heavy rain was general.

Between the 9th and the 12th there was a series of westerly depressions which affected principally the South Island and southern portions of the North.

On the 14th a cyclonic depression which had developed in the North Tasman Sea moved southwards from near Norfolk Island across the North Island and finally filled up on the 16th. On the 14th to 15th easterly gales in the Auckland Province did considerable damage. Heavy rain was again general over the North Island, and some flooding occurred in North Auckland and southern Hawke's Bay. Dannevirke had 8.25 inches of rain on the 16th.

After a brief interval of anticyclonic weather, a series of very deep westerly depressions crossed the South Island between the 19th and 23rd. In the south the barometer fell below 29 in. Westerly gales were experienced in many places and heavy rain fell in the west and south.

The last storm of the month began as a tropical cyclone in the northern New Hebrides and passed, a week later, in a south-easterly direction down the east coast of the Auckland Peninsula on the 29th and 30th. Strong easterly winds and heavy rain occurred in eastern and northern parts of the North Island. Exceptionally high tides were recorded at Whangarei. At the same time a westerly depression passing in the south brought heavy rain to the west coast of the South Island.
