#### CONDITIONS.

#### 1. Purposes of Lines.

THE said lines may be used for lighting, power, and heating purposes

#### 2. License to be subject to Regulations.

The license hereby conferred is subject to compliance by the licensee with the Electrical Wiring Regulations, 1935, the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1935, and with all regulations made or to be made in amplification or amendment thereof or in substitution therefor.

The conditions directed to be implied in all licenses by the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1935, shall be incorporated herein and shall form part of this license except in so far as the same may be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

#### 3. System of Supply.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraph (a) of clause 21–01 of the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1935.

#### 4. GENERATING VOLTAGE.

Electrical energy shall be generated at a pressure of 400 voltsbetween phases.

#### 5. DURATION OF LICENSE.

Unless sooner lawfully determined, this license shall continue in force until the 31st day of March, 1958, or until electrical energy is available from an Electric-power Board or other general public source, whichever is the earlier.

#### 6. CHARGES ON SALE.

#### Maximum Charges.

(1) The licensee shall not in respect of electrical energy distributed under the authority of this license make any charges exceeding those set out hereunder:-

(a) In the case of a supply for lighting purposes other than a wholesale supply, a sum of one shilling per unit, reducible on payment within fourteen days of due

date to ninepence per unit:

(b) In the case of a supply for motor-power, heating, cooking, or any purpose other than lighting purposes, a sum of sixpence per unit, reducible on payment within fourteen days of due date to fourpence halfpenny per unit.

#### Minimum Charges.

(2) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions, the licensee may in the case of any supply make such minimum charge as may be authorized by regulations.

#### Intervals of Payments.

(3) Payment shall not be demanded from any consumer on dates at intervals apart of less than twenty-one days.

#### Definitions.

(4) For the purposes of this regulation-

"Lighting purposes" includes the operation of motor generators for lighting purposes and the charging of batteries or accumulators used solely or principally for lighting purposes.

(1) The master, owner, or agent of every vessel shall give to the wharfinger or other person deputed by the Council one or more copies, as the wharfinger or such other person may reasonably require, of the bills of lading, freight-lists, or manifest of the goods, or other proper account of all goods intended to be landed from the vessel, and the name or names of the experience to whom such goods are intended to be of the consignees to whom such goods are intended to be delivered. Such bills of lading, freight-lists, manifests, or other accounts shall contain full particulars of the number of items, weights, or measurements of such goods, according as freight is payable thereon by number, weight, or measurement.
- (2) Every person exporting goods from the county shall, before shipping such goods, deliver to the wharfinger, or other person deputed by the Council, a full and true account of all such goods, containing full particulars of the number of items, weights or measurements of such goods, according as freight is payable thereon by number, weight, or measurement.
- 6. All dues on inward goods must be paid on the delivery from wharf of goods landed on the wharf and on goods not so landed at the time they are landed on shore, and on outward goods before they are shipped.

#### Notes on the Weather for February, 1937.

General.—Though there were no very violent storms the weather during February was unsettled and very cold for the time of year. The total rain was much below normal in the northern and eastern portions of the North Island, but there was sufficient in most places to keep the soil moist. In Hawke's Bay and the Gisborne districts, however, the westerly winds accentuated the rainfall failure and dry conditions prevailed. Stock are generally in good condition, but have done rather better in the areas where the rainfall was low than elsewhere. It was too cold for animals really to thrive well, and in much of the South Island the softness of the feed has led to various digestive troubles and considerable losses of lambs. The milk-yield is being well maintained. In Taranaki and the Manawatu the heavy rains were confined, principally, to a few days towards the end of the month, but in the South Island they began earlier and produced adverse conditions for harvesting, which has been delayed somewhat. In parts of Canterbury there are signs of sprouting of wheat in some of the crops. Several frosts were experienced, and these, combined with the general lack of warmth, were unfavourable to many small crops. Tomatoes, in particular, have suffered considerably. There is still an abundance of pasture, and supplies of winter feed are assured for most districts.

Rainfall.—In Taranaki, western Wellington, and the whole of the South Island, with the exception of a portion of North General.—Though there were no very violent storms the weather during February was unsettled and very cold for the

Rainfall.—In Taranaki, western Wellington, and the whole of the South Island, with the exception of a portion of North Canterbury, the month was a very wet one indeed. Most of Taranaki and Nelson had between two and three times the normal rainfall, while in parts of Otago and Southland even greater departures were experienced. Hawke's Bay and much the greater part of the Auckland Province had very low totals. In the Wairarapa conditions were more varied, but the departures from average generally small.

The month was one of the coldest Fabruaries hitherto experienced. Many temporatures were experienced.

Temperatures.—The month was one of the coldest Februaries hitherto experienced. Mean temperatures were everywhere much below normal, the departures increasing from about two degrees in the far North to about four at Wellington and over most of the South Island.

and over most of the South Island.

Sunshine.—At most places there was less sunshine than usual, though where the rainfall was below average the sunshine differed little therefrom. Tauranga had 220·1 hours and Napier and Lake Tekapo each 218·8.

Pressure Systems.—The month began with a fine spell while an anticyclone passed slowly eastwards across the country. From the 6th to the 8th there came a series of westerly depressions the effects of which were felt mainly in the South Island, heavy rain falling in western and southern districts. After a very brief interval a fresh and a very long series began to pass. As the first of these depressions, a rather intense one, approached on the 10th, north-westerly gales occurred in the middle portion of the Dominion. By the 11th winds had changed to west or south-west, and from that date until the 18th winds from

these directions continued to prevail, and were frequently strong. During the whole of this period an anticyclone remained centred over the Tasmanian region, while pressure to the east was low. General rains occurred, with heavy falls over the South Island and about Wellington. From the 10th to the 14th the atmosphere was particularly unstable, and thunder and hailstorms were very numerous. On the 10th a small tornado occurred near Opunake, while on the 13th a waterspout was seen from Levin. Snow fell on the ranges, and there were a number of frosts during the period.

A fine spell followed, and the anticyclone previously mentioned finally moved eastward across the Tasman Sea and the Dominion. On the 23rd, however, another unsettled spell commenced. The pressure remained high at Chatham Islands but rather low over New Zealand, while another intense anticyclone developed over Tasmania. Again there was general rain, with very heavy falls from Taranaki southwards. Flooding occurred in Taranaki, western Wellington, the Waimakariri River, and in Otago and Southland. In parts of the last-mentioned provinces the floods were very severe.
