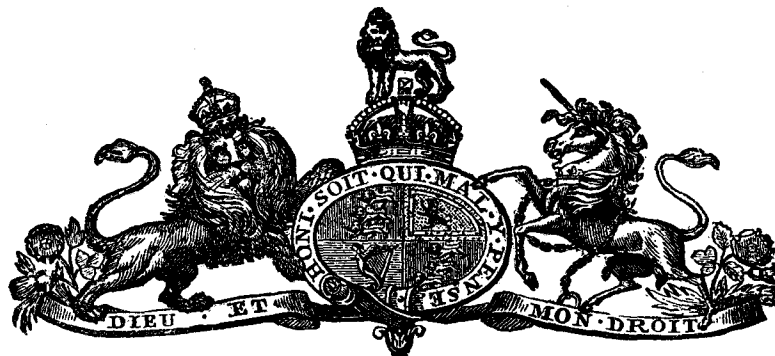

THE RIGHT HON. M. J. SAVAGE PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Order in Council made on the twenty-seventh day of February, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five, and subject to the determinations as to borrowing and repayment therein set out, consent was given to the raising by the Dunedin Drainage and Sewerage Board (hereinafter called "the said local authority") of an amount of one hundred and fifty thousand pounds (£150,000), being part of certain unexercised loan authorities more particularly set out in the said Order in Council, of which amount the sum of one hundred thousand pounds (£100,000) has not yet been raised:

And whereas it is provided by clause seven of the said Order in Council of the twenty-seventh day of February, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five, that no moneys shall be borrowed under the authority of the said Order in Council after the expiration of two (2) years from the date thereof, and it is not now lawful or competent for the said local authority to borrow any moneys to which the said Order in Council relates except in accordance with the provisions of an Order in Council that may be made under section eleven of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926:

And whereas the said local authority is desirous of raising a further portion—thirty thousand pounds (£30,000) (hereinafter called "the said sum")—and it is expedient to authorize the said local authority to borrow on the conditions hereinafter mentioned the said sum of thirty thousand pounds (£30,000):

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section eleven of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf; doth hereby consent to the raising in New Zealand by the said local authority of the said sum or any part thereof for the said purpose for which the said loan was authorized, and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

(1) The term for which the said sum or any part thereof may be borrowed shall be fifteen (15) years.

(2) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said sum or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate exceeding three pounds ten shillings (£3 10s.) per centum per annum.

(3) The said sum or any part thereof together with interest thereon shall be repaid by equal annual or half-yearly instalments extending over the term as determined in (1) above.

(4) The payment of such instalments shall be made in New Zealand, and no such instalment shall be paid out of loan-money.

(5) The rate payable for brokerage, underwriting, and procuration fees in respect of the borrowing of the said sum or any part thereof shall not in the aggregate exceed one-half per centum of any amount raised.

(6) No moneys shall be borrowed under this consent after the expiration of two years from the date hereof.

Tar-sealing Supplementary Loan of £1,500, 1936.

IN pursuance and in exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, and of all other powers (if any) it thereunto enabling, the Westport Borough Council hereby resolves as follows:—
