WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of section one hundred and thirty-five of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1933, a petition was presented to the Governor-General praying that the area described in the said petition be constituted a new borough:

And whereas the provisions of the said section one hundred and thirty-five have been complied with in respect thereto, and the result of the poll taken on the proposal that the area should be constituted a new borough was in favour thereof:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1933, I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the area described in the Schedule hereto shall be constituted a borough under the said Act; that the name of such borough shall be the Borough of Opunake; and that the number of Councillors to be elected to the Council of the said borough shall be six, exclusive of the Mayor:

And I do further proclaim and declare that Clennell Nelson Thayer, of Opunake, shall be the Returning Officer to conduct the first election of Mayor and Councillors of the said borough; and that the said Clennell Nelson Thayer shall be the Town Clerk and the person to prepare the district electors roll for the purposes of the said first election:

And, lastly, I do proclaim and declare that the first election of Mayor and Councillors of the said borough shall be held on Friday, the eighteenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, and that the first meeting of the Council of the said borough shall be held on Thursday, the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, at half past seven o'clock in the afternoon, in the office of the Town Board, Opunake.

*Authorizing the Omarama Hall Committee to erect Electric Lines in Portion of the Township of Omarama.*

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Public Works Act, 1928, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby authorize the Omarama Hall Committee (hereinafter referred to as "the licensee") to lay, construct, put up, place, and use the electric lines described in the Schedule hereto on the following conditions.

#### CONDITIONS.

##### 1. PURPOSES OF LINES.

The said lines may be used for lighting, power, and heating purposes.

##### 2. LICENSE TO BE SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS.

The license hereby conferred is subject to compliance by the licensee with the Electrical Wiring Regulations, 1935, the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1935, and with all regulations made or to be made in amplification or amendment thereof or in substitution therefor.

The conditions directed to be implied in all licenses by the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1935, shall be incorporated in and shall form part of this license, except in so far as the same may be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

##### 3. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be in accordance with paragraph (j) of clause 21-01 of the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1935. The voltage of transmission over the lines hereby authorized shall be approximately 32 volts direct current.

##### 4. DURATION OF LICENSE.

Unless sooner determined, this license shall continue in force until the 31st day of March, 1957, or until electrical energy is available from an Electric-power Board or other general public source, whichever is the earlier.

#### SCHEDULE.

LINES adapted for supply as prescribed in these presents for the transmission of electricity leading from the Omarama Hotel, situated on Section 1, across the said Section 1 for a distance of approximately two chains to the Omarama Hall on the same section; all being situated in Block 1, Benmore Survey District, in the Land District of Otago; the electric lines at present proposed to be erected being more particularly delineated by means of red lines on plan P.W.D. 94954, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Public Works Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby grant to H. Baigent and Sons, Limited, Sawmillers, being a company incorporated or deemed to be incorporated under the Companies Act, 1933, and having its registered office at Waimea Street, Nelson (hereinafter referred to as "the licensee"), a license subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth to obstruct, impound, or divert the waters of All Nations Creek situated in Block XIII, Wakamarina Survey District, in the Land District of Marlborough, and to take and use therefrom for the purposes hereinafter set forth a stream of water not exceeding one-half of a cubic foot per second at any one time.

#### CONDITIONS.

##### 1. IMPLIED CONDITIONS.

The conditions directed to be implied in all licenses by the Water-power Regulations, 1934, shall be incorporated in and shall form part of this license except in so far as the same may be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

##### 2. LICENSE SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS.

This license is issued under the Water-power Regulations, 1934, and is subject thereto and to any regulations made or to be made in amplification or amendment thereof or in substitution therefor.

##### 3. UTILIZATION OF WATER AND LOCATION OF HEADWORKS.

Water shall be used under this license solely for the purpose of generating electricity up to a maximum capacity of 2 kilowatts at 230 volts direct current, and shall be taken from the creek at the point adjacent to the northern boundary of Section 4, Block XII, Wakamarina Survey District, indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 94904, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works.

##### 4. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF WORKS.

The licensee is hereby authorized, subject to the conditions hereof, to construct, maintain, and use the following works for the purposes of this license, the positions of the said works being indicated on the said plan P.W.D. 94904:—

- Headworks consisting of an intake, water-race, and pipe-lines leading to the water-wheel and power-house hereinafter referred to, giving a static head of approximately 80 ft.
- A power-house situated on Section 5, Block XIII, Wakamarina Survey District, with all necessary equipment, including water-turbines, generators, transformers, lightning-arresters, switchboards, switches, and other appliances for generating electricity.
- Tail-race leading from the power-house to waste land adjacent to the Wakamarina River.

##### 5. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraph (d) of clause 21-01 of the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1935. The generating voltage and the transmission voltage shall be approximately 230 volts direct current.

##### 6. DURATION OF LICENSE.

Unless sooner determined, this license shall continue in force until the 31st day of March, 1958.

##### 7. RENTAL.

For the purpose of assessing the annual rental payable in respect of this license, the licensee may install a suitable maximum demand indicator to the satisfaction of the Inspecting Engineer of the Public Works Department, and, failing such installation, the rental shall be assessed on the maximum generating capacity of the plant installed. The present plant is rated at 2 kilowatts, and falls within the classes described in paragraph (b) of clause (2) of Regulation 6 of the Water-power Regulations, 1934.

“That the Waimea County Council, being the local authority having control of the roads within the Waimea County, by resolution declares that the provisions of section one hundred and twenty-eight of the Public Works Act, 1928, shall not apply to the south-western side of the portion of Parker's Road fronting part Section 85, Block III, Waimea Survey District, marked A-B and coloured red on plan prepared by F. I. Ledger, Registered Surveyor, and dated February, 1937” ;

subject to the condition that no building or part of a building shall at any time be erected on the land fronting the south-western side of the portion of Parker's Road (described in the Schedule hereto) within a distance of thirty-three feet from the centre-line of the said portion of road.

SCHEDULE.

THE south-western side of all that portion of Parker's Road, in the Nelson Land District, County of Waimea, fronting part Section 85, Block III, Waimea Survey District. As the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked P.W.D. 95194, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, and thereon coloured red.

“That the Dunedin City Council, being the local authority having control of the streets in the City of Dunedin, by resolution declares that the provisions of section one hundred and twenty-eight of the Public Works Act, 1928, shall not apply to the undermentioned portions of streets, viz.,—

“(a) The south-western side of portion of Cornhill Street, abutting on Lots 31, 32, and part 33, Deeds Plan 24, Township of Ferguslie, being part Sections 1 and 2, North-east Valley Survey District ; and

“(b) The north-eastern side of portion of Carlyle Street, abutting on Lots 54 and 55, Deeds Plan 24, Township of Ferguslie, being part Sections 1 and 2, North-east Valley Survey District” ;

subject to the condition that no building or part of a building shall at any time be erected on the land fronting the south-western side of the portion of Cornhill Street, or fronting the north-eastern side of the portion of Carlyle Street (described in the Schedule hereto), within a distance of twenty-five feet from the centre-lines of the said portions of streets.

SCHEDULE.

THE south-western side of all that portion of street, situated in the Otago Land District, City of Dunedin, known as Cornhill Street, fronting Lots 31 and 32, and part Lot 33, Deeds Plan 24, Township of Ferguslie.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section twenty-five of the Naval Defence Act, 1913, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby amend and supplement the regulations referred to in the Schedule hereto as shown therein.

## SCHEDULE.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE GOVERNMENT AND PAYMENT OF THE NEW ZEALAND DIVISION OF THE ROYAL NAVY, 1929.**

DEFINITIONS of terms and abbreviations : Cancel, and substitute—

Minister : The Minister of Defence.

Naval Board : The Naval Board of administration constituted under the Acts.

Admiralty : Used comprehensively to indicate the Admiralty, London, and Naval Department, Wellington, in relation to Imperial ships and ships of the New Zealand Division respectively.

Ships of New Zealand Division : Ships maintained as a charge against Dominion funds.

Imperial ships (or units) : Ships maintained as a charge against Imperial funds.

Navy Office, Wellington : The postal address of the Naval Board.

Naval Secretary : Secretary to the Naval Board.

Flagship : Short title to denote the ship wearing the broad pendant of the Commodore Commanding.

King's Regulations : The King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions (1934) and subsequent amendments.

New Zealand Naval Regulations : The Regulations for the Government and Payment of the New Zealand Division of the Royal Navy.

Chapter I.—Cancel, and substitute—

## GOVERNMENT, ADMINISTRATION, AND GENERAL ORDERS.

**1. Designation of the Naval Forces of the Dominion.**—The ships and personnel comprising the New Zealand Naval Forces shall be described respectively as forming and belonging to “the New Zealand Division of the Royal Navy,” which shall be the official designation of the Force.

**2. Uniform of the Naval Forces of the Dominion.**—The uniform to be worn by all persons belonging to the New Zealand Naval Forces shall be that prescribed in the Uniform Regulations of the Royal Navy, with the exception that white duck caps or cap-covers shall be worn throughout the year.

**3. Government of the New Zealand Division of the Royal Navy.**—The New Zealand Division of the Royal Navy shall be subject to such Acts as have been or from time to time may be passed by the Dominion Parliament, and to such regulations in agreement therewith as may be made from time to time.

2. The Naval Defence Act, 1913 (reproduced in Appendix V), directs that the Naval Discipline Acts and the King's Regulations for the time being in force in relation to the King's Naval Forces shall, subject to that Act and to any modifications and adaptations prescribed by the Regulations, apply to the New Zealand Naval Forces.

3. In reading the King's Regulations in connection with their applicability to the New Zealand Division, the words “Dominion of New Zealand” are to be read in lieu of such words as “Home,” “United Kingdom,” “England,” and similar words wherever they occur. Whenever reference to the Admiralty or Departments thereof is necessary, reference is to be made to the Naval Board, Wellington; and where reference to the Commander-in-Chief or other Flag Officer is necessary, reference is to be made to the Commodore Commanding New Zealand Station.

Article 585, clause 2, of the King's Regulations shall be amended to read “limited to boys, and ratings under the age of eighteen years.” Article 540, Table II, punishment No. 20, shall be similarly amended.

4. Every officer of the New Zealand Division of the Royal Navy shall make himself acquainted with, and shall duly observe, obey, and, so far as he is able, enforce these regulations and such further regulations, orders, or instructions as may be issued by the Naval Board or with their authority.

**4. Applicability of the King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions, Admiralty Fleet Orders, &c.**—Where not inconsistent with these regulations the King's Regulations and Admiralty Fleet Orders, &c., shall apply to the New Zealand Division.

2. The King's Regulations and other instructions issued by the Admiralty, however, are not to be regarded as constituting any authority for expenditure in the New Zealand Division, except as provided for in these regulations.

3. All questions relating to pay and allowances not covered by the New Zealand Naval Regulations are to be submitted for the decision of the Naval Board before any payment is made.

4. Admiralty Fleet Orders, &c., will be issued from Navy Office, Wellington. Where in Admiralty Fleet Orders the supply of additional stores, fittings, &c., is authorized by the Admiralty and no provision has been made in the New Zealand Naval Defence estimates for such additional stores, fittings, &c., the matter is to be referred to the Naval Board before action is taken to obtain the stores, fittings, &c. When ships are refitting in England the High Commissioner for New Zealand has authority to approve the execution of authorized alterations and additions, provided the cost of each item does not exceed £100.

5. *Public Revenues Act, 1926.*—The expenditure of money, stores, &c., the property of or under the control of the Government of New Zealand, is governed by the Public Revenues Act, 1926. Accounting officers and all others concerned are to make themselves conversant with this Act and with the Treasury Regulations and Instructions. Generally, cash and stores accounting procedures in the New Zealand Division will follow the lines of the King's Regulations as modified by the New Zealand Naval Regulations.

**5. Constitution of the Naval Board.**—The Naval Board is composed of the Minister of Defence (President), and the following members:—

(a) One or two persons (being executive officers of the Royal Navy) appointed from time to time by the Governor-General to be First and Second Naval Members.

(b) An Accountant Officer of the Royal Navy appointed from time to time by the Governor-General, to be Naval Secretary.

**6. Powers, Functions, and Duties of the Naval Board.**—The Naval Board shall be charged with the control and administration of all matters relating to the Naval Forces, upon the policy directed by the Minister, and shall be in executive command of the Naval Forces. The Governor-General may delegate to the Naval Board the functions, and commission it to execute the office, of Commander-in-Chief of the Naval Forces.

2. Except as prescribed, the members of the Naval Board shall act as a whole, but in this respect will regulate their own procedure.

3. The orders of the Board shall be issued over the signature of the Naval Secretary, or such other official as the Board may authorize to act for him.

4. All decisions of the Board which involve a matter of policy or important principle, an increased vote, or any new expenditure, shall be submitted for Cabinet approval.

5. The Naval Board shall have authority over the ships and personnel of the New Zealand Division of the Royal Navy wherever serving, but when such ships or persons are outside the limits of the New Zealand Station communications addressed to them, except on matters of administrative detail, will be forwarded through the usual channels to the Admiralty, or direct to the Commander-in-Chief or Senior Naval Officer under whose orders they may at the time be placed.

6. Similarly, when ships of the New Zealand Division are outside the limits of the New Zealand Station, all communications on matters of administrative detail are to be addressed to the Naval Board; other communications are to be addressed to the Commander-in-Chief or Senior Naval Officer under whose orders the ship is serving, but a copy is to be sent direct to the Naval Board for their information.

**7. Limits of the Naval Station of the Dominion of New Zealand.**—The following are the limits of the Naval Station, within which the operations of the New Zealand Naval Forces are controlled by the Dominion Government, acting through the Naval Board:—

North: From a point in 169° east longitude and 4° north latitude, along that parallel to the meridian of 180°, thence along that meridian to the northward to the parallel of 30° north, thence along that parallel to the meridian of 150° west longitude, thence southward along that meridian to the Equator, thence eastward along the Equator to the meridian of 120° west longitude.

East: From a point on the Equator in 120° west longitude along that meridian to the South Pole.

South: The South Pole.

West: From the South Pole along the meridian of 160° east longitude to 32° south latitude, thence along that parallel to the eastward to the meridian of 170° east longitude, thence to the northward along that meridian to 1° south latitude, thence along that parallel to the westward to 169° east longitude, thence along that meridian to the northward to 4° north latitude.

2. In the event of the Dominion Government desiring to send ships to a part of the British Empire outside the above limits they will notify the Admiralty, or the Naval Board responsible for the administration of a Dominion Naval Station. Similarly, should the Dominion Government desire to send ships to a foreign port on or off the New Zealand Station they will acquaint the Imperial Government in order that the necessary arrangements for the visit may be made through the Foreign Office.

3. Whilst at foreign ports Commanding Officers of ships of the New Zealand Division will obey any instructions they may receive from the Government of the United Kingdom through the Admiralty as to the conduct of any international matters that may arise, and they are to keep the Naval Board informed of all such instructions as may be received.

4. Should the Commanding Officer of a ship of the New Zealand Division have to put into a foreign port without previous arrangement on account of stress of weather, damage, or any unforeseen emergency, he is to report his arrival and reasons for calling to the Admiralty, to the officer in command of the station, the Naval Board, and to the Commodore Commanding New Zealand Station.

**8. Boundaries of the Dominion of New Zealand.**—The following islands and groups of islands are included within the boundaries of New Zealand:—

- (a) All those lying between 33° and 53° south latitude and 162° east longitude and 173° west longitude.
- (b) The Kermadec Islands, lying between 29° and 32° south latitude and 177° and 180° west longitude.
- (c) The Cook Islands, comprising Rarotonga, Mangaia, Atiu, Aitutaki, Mitiaro, Taputea, Mauke, Hervey (Manuae), Palmerston, Pukapuka (Danger), Nassau, Rakahanga, Manahiki, Penrhyn (Tongareva), and Suvarov.
- (d) Niue (Savage) Island.

2. The following territories are administered by or on behalf of New Zealand:—

- (a) The Union Islands, consisting of the islands of Fakaofu, Nukunono, Atafu, and the small islands, islets, rocks, and reefs depending on them, are administered by the Administrator of Western Samoa under the authority of the Government of New Zealand.
- (b) The Ross Dependency, which comprises all islands and territories between 160° east longitude and 150° west longitude situated south of 60° south latitude, is a separate dependency of Great Britain, whose Governor is for the time being the officer who is administering the Government of New Zealand.

3. The Dominion also has the mandate for the islands of the Samoan or Navigator Group named Opolu and Savaii.

**9. Appointment of Commodore Commanding New Zealand Station.**—

The Commodore Commanding has authority and control over all H.M. Ships and Naval Establishments on the Station, being responsible to the Admiralty in matters relating to Imperial ships and Imperial Establishments, and to the New Zealand Naval Board in matters relating to ships of the New Zealand Division and Naval Establishments of the Dominion.

**10. Authority of the Commodore Commanding or of the Senior Officer present over Civil Establishments.**—The Commodore Commanding is to have authority and control over the Repair Yard, Armament Depots, and other Civil Establishments on the New Zealand Station in regard to the general transactions of the Service; but he is not to interfere with the management of any of those establishments where there are superintendents or officers in charge, unless in his opinion a particular and sufficient cause shall render it necessary, when he is to report to the Naval Board the nature of the order given, and his reasons for interfering. If a Superintendent or an officer in charge should consider that any public inconvenience is likely to arise from compliance with an order received from the Commodore Commanding, such Superintendent or officer in charge is to represent the same to him, stating the objections, after which, if the Commodore Commanding shall still direct his order to be complied with, it is to be obeyed without further delay or discussion, and the Commodore Commanding shall become wholly responsible to the Naval Board for the necessity of the

measure ; but the Superintendent or officer in charge on receiving the order, if he deem proper, may send to the Naval Board any observations upon it he may be desirous of submitting for consideration.

2. The authority of the Commodore Commanding under this article does not devolve upon the Senior Officer present in the port.

**11. Naval Officer in Charge, Auckland.**—The Naval Officer in Charge, Auckland, is also appointed to be Superintendent of the Naval Repair Yard. His appointment confers upon him—

- (a) The Command of all Civil Establishments at Devonport, Birkenhead, and Takapuna.
- (b) The Command of H.M.S. "Philomel", with her tenders and attached vessels.
- (c) The office of Director of Naval Recruiting.

2. As Superintendent of the Naval Repair Yard, as Commanding Officer of Civil Establishments, and in his office as Director of Naval Recruiting he will communicate direct with the Naval Board and with the recruiting authorities in the Dominion of New Zealand. On all other matters he will communicate with the Commodore Commanding.

3. If and when the Naval Officer in Charge requires the technical advice of the officers appointed for Squadron duties in the Flagship he will address a request to that end to the Commodore Commanding.

**12. Rank and Command.**—When Imperial ships and ships maintained by a Dominion, or several Dominions, meet, the senior officer will have the right of command in matters of ceremony, or international intercourse, or where united action is agreed upon, but will have no power to direct the movement of ships of the other service or services unless the ships are placed under his orders for the time being or are ordered to co-operate by mutual arrangement. Nothing in this paragraph shall, however, override the authority of the Commodore Commanding the New Zealand Station over Imperial ships placed under his command by the Admiralty.

2. When Imperial ships and those belonging to one or more of the Dominion Naval Forces are taking part in combined exercises, all such ships will be under the command of the Senior Naval Officer present, or of the station within the limits of which the exercises are being carried out, but such Senior Naval Officer will not interfere in the internal organization of the ships of another service further than is absolutely necessary.

**13. Flags flown in Ships of the New Zealand Division.**—All ships of the New Zealand Division in commission shall wear the white ensign in the position laid down in the King's Regulations, and, at the jackstaff, the distinctive flag of New Zealand in place of the Union Flag.

2. The distinctive flags and pendants of Naval authorities shall be those authorized for the Imperial Naval Service.

3. The regulations regarding ensigns to be flown in other than His Majesty's Ships in commission are published from time to time in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

**14. Saluting-flags at Ceremonies ashore.**—The New Zealand flag shall be the saluting-flag at all reviews and ceremonial parades on shore within the boundaries of the Dominion, but the Union Flag is also to be flown at the saluting-point on occasions when a representative of His Majesty the King reviews the Dominion Forces.

2. "King's Colour": His Majesty the King has graciously approved the use of the King's Colour by the New Zealand Division of the Royal Navy under similar conditions to those approved for the Royal Navy.

3. The King's Colour is to be kept on board the ship wearing the broad pendant of the Commodore Commanding the New Zealand Station.

4. The King's Colour is to be paraded only under the circumstances laid down in King's Regulations, Article 116.

**15. Saluting-stations.**—The following stations in New Zealand are authorized to fire and return salutes:—

Auckland: North Head.

Wellington: Point Jerningham.

**16. Humane Society's Medals.**—With reference to King's Regulations, Article 171, clause 10, medals awarded by the Royal Humane Society of New Zealand and the Royal Humane Society of Australasia are authorized to be worn by members of the New Zealand Division of the Royal Navy as directed in the articles quoted, and notations of the awards of these societies are to be made in the "Medal" column of the service certificates of the men in question.

2. Applications which it is desired to make for an award for bravery in saving, or attempting to save, human life should be forwarded to the Royal Humane Society of New Zealand on the form issued by that society, for which application should be made to the Naval Secretary. There is, however, no objection to application being made to the Royal Humane

Society of the United Kingdom on behalf of men on loan from the Royal Navy, provided that not more than one society is approached in any individual case.

**17. Naval Discipline Act: Jurisdiction on Shore.**—The following place of recreation in New Zealand has been prescribed by the Naval Board under the provisions of section 46 of the Naval Discipline Act, as applied to the New Zealand Naval Forces by section 18 of the Naval Defence Act, 1913, subject to the modifications and adaptations prescribed by the Order in Council of 6th August, 1921 (Appendix VIII):—

Devonport (Auckland): Naval recreation-ground and recreation-rooms adjoining Calliope Dockyard.

**18. Communications with Naval Board: Other Services soliciting outside Influence.**—Attention is drawn to King's Regulations, Articles 13 and 875, relative to communication with other Services, and the submission of requests through proper channels.

2. The act of moving or attempting to move influence in support of applications of a personal nature, or for the purpose of presenting complaints, is contrary to discipline. Applicants should be careful therefore to make all such representations through the recognized official channel. It should be clearly understood that any other canvassing of influence will prejudice the application, and will be dealt with as an act to the prejudice of good order and naval discipline.

3. An attempt to obtain favourable consideration for any application on the part of serving officers or men, otherwise than through the normal official channels, will be regarded as an admission on the part of the applicant that his case cannot be upheld on its own merits.

#### APPENDIX V (b).

##### Naval Defence Amendment Act, 1936.

1936, No. 46.

AN ACT to amend the Naval Defence Act, 1913.

[31st October, 1936.]

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short Title.

1. This Act may be cited as the Naval Defence Amendment Act, 1936, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Naval Defence Act, 1913 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

Interpretation.

2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires,—

“Board” means the Naval Board of New Zealand established under this Act:

“Commissioners” means the Lords Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom:

“Minister” means the Minister of Defence.

Naval Secretary.

3. (1) The Governor-General may from time to time appoint an officer of the Accountant Branch of the Royal Navy to hold office during his pleasure as Naval Secretary.

(2) The Naval Secretary shall exercise such powers and perform such duties under the principal Act as the Minister from time to time determines.

(3) The person holding office as Naval Secretary at the passing of this Act shall be deemed to have been appointed under this section.

Establishment of Naval Board.

4. (1) There is hereby established a Board to be called the Naval Board of New Zealand (hereinafter referred to as the Board).

(2) The Board shall consist of—

(a) The Minister, who shall be the Chairman of the Board:

(b) One or two persons (being executive officers of the Royal Navy) to be from time to time appointed by the Governor-General and to hold office during his pleasure:

(c) The Naval Secretary.

(3) The powers of the Board shall not be affected by any vacancy in the membership thereof.

(4) Subject to the provisions of any regulations under the principal Act, the Board may regulate its own procedure.

Functions of Naval Board.

5. The Board shall have such powers, functions, and duties in relation to the Naval Forces and naval establishments and the administration of the principal Act as may

from time to time be prescribed by regulations under that Act, and shall have all such other powers as are reasonably necessary for the effective performance of its functions and duties.

Conferring powers on Minister and Auckland Harbour Board in relation to Naval Base at Auckland.

6. (1) The Minister (acting on behalf of the Crown) and the Auckland Harbour Board may from time to time make, enforce, and perform such contracts as they think fit with each other and with the Commissioners and any other persons in relation to the Calliope Dock at Auckland and any land adjacent or near thereto, and any real or personal property, works, and services in connection therewith.

(2) Without limiting in any way the general powers hereinbefore conferred, it is hereby expressly declared that contracts may be made under this section for all or any of the following purposes:—

- (a) Providing for the transfer by the Auckland Harbour Board to His Majesty the King for naval defence purposes of the land described in the Schedule to this Act, together with all the wharves, jetties, landing-places, and buildings, and all or any of the chattels situated thereon:
- (b) Providing for the maintenance, improvement, equipment, and operation of the Calliope Dock, and for the construction, maintenance, improvement, equipment, and operation of other works in connection with the dock:
- (c) Providing for the provision by the Auckland Harbour Board, the Minister, or any other person, of water, electrical energy, compressed-air services, crane services, and other services in connection with the Calliope Dock, and for the terms and conditions on which the dock and such services shall be available, and in particular for the granting to the Crown and to the Commissioners of a right to the use of the dock and to any such services in priority to any other person:
- (d) Providing for the granting to the Crown and to the Commissioners of rights of way, easements, options to purchase, and other rights in respect of the Calliope Dock and of any real or personal property, works, and services in connection therewith belonging to the Auckland Harbour Board or any other person; and, in particular, providing for the assumption by the Minister of possession and control of the dock and of all real or personal property, works, and services of the Auckland Harbour Board in connection therewith in such circumstances and upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon:
- (e) Providing for the granting to the Commissioners and to the Auckland Harbour Board of rights of way, easements, options to purchase, and other rights in respect of any real or personal property, works, and services belonging to the Crown in relation to the Calliope Dock and the adjacent land:
- (f) Providing for the payment of monetary consideration by and to any parties to the contracts, whether by way of capital moneys (payable in one sum or by annual or other instalments), or by way of annual or other periodical payments, or otherwise howsoever:
- (g) Generally providing for the administration of the Calliope Dock and the land described in the Schedule to this Act, and of any other land added thereto and of all real or personal property, works, and services in connection therewith, and for the rights and liabilities in relation thereto of the respective parties to the contracts.

#### SCHEDULE.

##### LAND TO BE TRANSFERRED TO THE CROWN BY THE AUCKLAND HARBOUR BOARD.
