Altering Proclamation of Maori Council Districts.

[L.S.] GALWAY, Governor-General.
A PROCLAMATION.

PURSUANT to section three of the Maori Councils Act, 1900, I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby alter the Proclamation dated the second day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-six, and published in the *Gazette* on the ninth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-six, at page 701, by substituting for the boundaries set out in the Schedule thereto in respect of the Taumarunui and Maniapoto Districts the boundaries set out in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

TAUMARUNUI DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Auckland, Taranaki, and Wellington Land Districts bounded by a line commencing at Hikurangi Trig. Station No. 1387; thence north-westerly along a right line to Pukepoto Trig. Station; thence south-westerly along a right line in the direction of the eastern termination of the confiscation-line to the Ohura River; thence down the Ohura River to the Wanganui River, and down the Wanganui River to the southern boundary of the Kaitieke County; thence along the southern and eastern boundaries of the Kaitieke County, as described in *New Zealand Gazette*, 1927, page 1959, to the Wanganui River; thence down the Wanganui River to its confluence with the Waipari Stream; thence north-easterly along a right line to the Waituhi Trig. Station; thence north-westerly along a right line to Hikurangi Trig. Station, the point of commencement.

MANIAPOTO DISTRICT.

All that area in the Auckland and Taranaki Land Districts bounded towards the north generally by the left bank of the Waikato River from its confluence with the Kopokorahi Stream to the south-eastern boundary-line of Wharepuhunga Block; thence by the south-eastern boundary-line of the

said Wharepuhunga Block to Tapororoa; thence by the south-western boundary-line of Wharepuhunga Block aforesaid to the Mangatutu Stream; thence by the said Mangatutu Stream to its confluence with the Puniu River; thence by the left bank of the said Puniu River to the northern boundary-line of the original Mangauika Block (No. 6210); thence by the northern boundary of the said Mangauika Block to Mahaukura; thence by the northern boundary-line of the forest reserve to its north-western corner; thence by a right line to the north-eastern corner of Section 3, Block I, Pirongia Survey District; thence by the northern boundary-lines of Sections 3, 2, and 1 of the said Block I, the northern boundary-line of Section 1, Block IV, Kawhia North Survey District, and the northern boundary-line of Pirongia West Block (No. 6221) and of Mangaora Block to Kawhia Harbour; thence by a right line across Kawhia Harbour to the north-eastern corner of Taharoa "A" Block (No. 6206A) on Kawhia Harbour; thence by the eastern and south-eastern boundary-lines of the said Taharoa "A" Block to the Taharoa "B" No. 1 Block (No. 6206B); thence by the north-eastern, south-eastern, and southern boundary-lines of the said Taharoa "B" No. 1 Block to the mouth of the Waihekura Stream on the west coast; thence towards the west by the ocean to Parinihi (White Cliffs); thence towards the south by the confiscation boundary-line to its eastern termination; thence along a right line in the direction of the confluence of the Ongarue and Taringamutu Rivers to the Ohura River; thence along the northern boundary of the Taumarunui Maori Council District hereinbefore described to its intersection by a right line running from the confluence of the Ongarue and Taringamutu Rivers to Trig. Station No. 1389 (Moutere); thence along that line to Trig. Station No. 1389 (Moutere) aforesaid; thence by a right line to Trig. Station 1390 (Pureora); thence by a right line to the confluence of the Waikato River and the Kopokorahi Stream, the place of commencement.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto necessary for the maintenance of the said slipway at the site shown on the plan marked M.D. 5633.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the company shall pay to the Minister the sum of £1, and thereafter an annual sum of £2, in advance, payable on the 1st day of April in each year, the proportionate part of such rental in respect of the period from the 27th day of April, 1937, until the 31st day of March following to be paid on the company being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. All persons shall at all reasonable times and upon payment of the proper dues have free and full liberty to use the said slipway and all rights of ingress and egress thereto and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all persons in the Government service acting in the execution of their duties, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, over, and out of the said slipway without payment.

6. The company shall maintain the above-mentioned slipway in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at the company's own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said slipway and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last-known registered office of the company in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such slipway requiring the company within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the company shall with all reasonable speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the company to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The master of all vessels discharging ballast at the said slipway shall have all such ballast taken away and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved by the Minister or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the 27th day of April, 1937, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the company shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, and the company may be required to remove the slipway at the company's own cost, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the company three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last-known registered office of the company in New Zealand.

12. The company shall be liable for any injury which the said slipway may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the company's part.

13. In case the company shall—

(1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;

(2) Cease to use or occupy the said slipway for a period of thirty consecutive days;

(3) Fail to pay the sum specified in clause 3 of these conditions;

(4) Be in any manner wound up or dissolved—

then, and in any of the said cases, this Order in Council and every license, right, power, or privilege thereby conferred may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the company or other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the *Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the company and to all persons concerned or interested that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

14. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the company shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said slipway entirely from the site, and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and, if the company fails so to do, the Minister may cause the said slipway to be removed and the site so restored, and may recover from the company the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration.

15. The occupation of the said slipway shall be sufficient evidence of the acceptance by the company of the terms and conditions of this Order in Council.

WHEREAS by subsection eight of section eight of the Small Farms (Relief of Unemployment) Amendment Act, 1933 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is enacted that the Governor-General may, by Order in Council, exempt any land-settlement society from land-tax payable under the Land and Income Tax Act, 1923, with respect to any lands specified in the said Order in Council, and for such period or periods as may be specified therein :

And whereas the Waikato Land Settlement Society, Incorporated, is a society within the meaning of the said Act :

WHEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto was by Warrant published in *Gazette* of the twenty-seventh day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, permanently reserved for a Native burial-ground: And whereas it is expedient that the control of the said reserve should be vested in a special Board as hereinafter provided :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section seventeen of the Public Reserves, Domains, and National Parks Act, 1928, doth hereby vest the control of the reserve described in the Schedule hereto, for the period of five years from the date hereof (unless previously amended or revoked under the said Act), in the undermentioned persons, namely,—

Karora Hohepa Moke,
Arawhiti Mehaka,
Raimona Heretaunga,
Patiti Paerau, and
Te Whainoa Raureti,

who are hereby constituted for that purpose a special Board by the name of the Moura Native Burial-ground Board (hereinafter referred to as "the Board"), with the powers and subject to the conditions hereinafter contained, that is to say :—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business at two o'clock p.m. on the first Saturday in the months of February, May, August, and November in each year, at Matata, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Saturday, the seventh day of August, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven.

2. The members of the Board shall at their first meeting elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

3. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, provided that two days' notice of any such meeting is given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

4. Any three members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

6. If by resignation, death, incapacity, or otherwise the seat of any member shall be or become vacant, or if any member absents himself without reasonable cause from three consecutive meetings of the Board, the Governor-General shall have power to appoint any other person to be a member of the Board in his stead.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

Royal Commission appointed to Inquire into certain Matters relative to the Management and Administration of the Napier Hospital, an Institution under the Control of the Hawke's Bay Hospital Board.

GEORGE THE SIXTH by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India :

To our Trusty and Loving Subjects EDWARD DARKER MOSLEY, Esquire, of Wellington, Principal Stipendiary Magistrate, SIR JAMES SANDS ELLIOTT, Kt.B., M.D., of Wellington, Medical Practitioner, and MISS CECILIA MCKENNY, R.N., of Pahiatua, retired : GREETING.

WHEREAS we are of opinion that inquiry should be made into certain matters relative to the management and administration of the Napier Hospital, an institution under the control of the Hawke's Bay Hospital Board :

Now, therefore, we, taking into consideration your impartiality, integrity, and ability, do hereby constitute and appoint you the said

Edward Darker Mosley,
Sir James Elliott, and
Cecilia McKenny

to be a Commission to inquire into and report as to the following matters, namely :—

1. Generally the circumstances in which between May and October, 1936, certain children, being patients in the Shrimpton Ward of the Napier Hospital, contracted the disease known as vulvo-vaginitis resulting from infection, and all matters relevant to the discovery, control, and treatment of the disease in these patients, and in particular—

- (a) The source of infection in each case :
- (b) The measures taken to guard against the inadvertent introduction of the disease into the hospital :
- (c) The measures taken to prevent the spread of infection in the hospital :
- (d) The care and treatment of the affected patients in the hospital ; and, in particular, whether in each case such treatment was in accordance with the instructions of the medical practitioner in attendance on the patient :
- (e) The notification by the authorities of the hospital to the parents of the children concerned of the fact that the disease had been contracted :
- (f) The steps taken to acquaint the parents with the nature of and any dangers attached to the treatment proposed to be given to patients, and to obtain the parents' prior consent thereto :
- (g) The immediate and contributory causes of the death of one of the affected patients :
- (h) The measures that have since been adopted to guard against the untoward recurrence of the disease in the hospital.

2. The circumstances surrounding the admission to the hospital on 29th April, 1937, and the treatment thereafter, of the son of Mr. F. W. Berry, Puketapu.

3. The circumstances in which on 21st July, 1936, a patient of the Hospital, Mr. S. J. Montgomery, was, prior to examination by X ray, given an injection of a chemical preparation known as neohydriol and suffered untoward effects from such injection.

4. The circumstances in which X-ray films taken in October, 1935, of Mr. R. Rells, at the time a patient of the hospital, could not when required subsequently be produced for reference, and, generally, the methods of recording, handling, storing, caring for, and making available for reference X-ray films the property of the Board.

5. The measures taken to detect symptoms of ill health among nurses (including pupil nurses) on the hospital staff and to care for those showing such symptoms, to regulate hours and days of duty of nurses, and, generally, to protect the health of nurses.

6. Whether any action of any member of the staff (including the Honorary Medical Staff) of the hospital or of any member of the Hospital Board has been or is detrimental to the discipline or effective co-operation of the nursing staff, and, generally, the organization, control, and supervision of the medical and nursing staff of the hospital and the carrying-out of their duties.

7. The organization, control, and supervision of the training of nurses at the hospital.

8. Generally any matters related to the management and administration of the said hospital arising out of any of the aforesaid particular matters; and we do further appoint you the said

to be Chairman of the said Commission :

And for the better enabling you, the said Commission, to carry these presents into effect, you are hereby authorized and empowered to make and conduct any inquiry under these presents at such times and places in the Dominion of New Zealand as you deem expedient, with power to adjourn from time to time and place to place as you think fit, and to call before you and examine, on oath or otherwise, as may be allowed by law, such person or persons as you think capable of affording you information on the subject of the inquiry hereby directed, and you are also hereby empowered to call for and examine all such books, papers, plans, documents, or records as you deem likely to afford you any information on the subject-matter of the inquiry hereby directed to be made, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all lawful means whatsoever, and to do all things and exercise all powers that might be done or exercised under the Commissions of Inquiry Act, 1908 :

And, using all diligence, you are required to report to me under your hands and seals, not later than the thirty-first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, your opinion as to the aforesaid matters, together with any recommendations you think fit to make in respect of the matters and things inquired into by you under and by virtue of these presents :

And you and each of you are strictly charged and directed that you shall not publish or otherwise disclose, save to me in pursuance of these presents or by my direction, the contents or purport of any report or recommendation so to be made by you :

And it is hereby declared that this Commission shall continue in full force and virtue although the inquiry be not regularly continued from time to time or from place to place :

And, lastly, it is hereby declared that these presents are issued under Letters Patent dated the eleventh day of May, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, and subject to the provisions of the Commissions of Inquiry Act, 1908 :

In witness whereof we have caused this Commission to be issued and the Seal of the Dominion of New Zealand to be hereunto affixed, at Wellington, in the said Dominion, this twenty-eighth day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, and in the first year of our Reign.

NOTES.—(a) "Not elsewhere included" appears as n.e.i.; "other kinds" as o.k.; "articles and materials suited for, and to be used solely in, the fabrication or repair of goods within New Zealand" as a. and m.s. (b) Articles marked thus † are revised decisions. (c) The rates of duty payable on goods set out hereunder have not been shown except in the case of goods classed under Tariff items 416, 448, and 449, and of goods admitted (under the provisions of section 11 of the Customs Amendment Act, 1927) at a rate of duty lower than that provided for in the First Schedule to the Customs Acts Amendment Act, 1934. Where goods are admitted under the provisions of section 11 aforesaid, the reduced rate is marked with an asterisk. (d) Steam-engines, gas-engines, oil-engines, and electric or other motors are not, unless otherwise indicated, to be regarded as parts of the machines with which they are imported.
