GALWAY, Governor-General. [L.S.] A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the Marriage Act, 1908, I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage districts known as the Ohaeawai and Bay of Islands districts and do problem and desires that the tenteric and desires that the tenteric and desires that the standard control of the contro districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into two marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows:—

OHAEAWAI DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the North Auckland Land District bounded ALL that area in the North Auckland Land District bounded by a line commencing at the northernmost corner of Section 1, Block XI. Kaeo Survey District; thence south-easterly along the Main North Road to the road forming the northeastern boundary of Section 17, Block XVI, Kaeo Survey District; thence along that road to the road forming the northern boundary of Pungaere No. 10 Block; thence easterly generally along that road and the northern boundary of Pungaere No. 10 Block to the Waipapa Stream; thence down that stream to a point in line with the road intersection down that st eam to a point in line with the road intersection on the eastern boundary of Section 1, Block VI, Kerikeri Survey District; thence to and along the eastern side of the road forming the eastern boundary of the said Section 1 to the north-western corner of Section 2, Block VI, Kerikeri the north-western corner of Section 2, Block VI, Kerikeri Survey District; thence along the northern and eastern boundaries of said Section 2 to the Kapiro Stream; and thence down the middle of that stream to Kerikeri Inlet; thence by the shore of Kerikeri Inlet to the north-eastern boundary of O.L.C. 17 (L.T. plan 6702); thence along the north-eastern and south-western boundaries of O.L.C. 17 and the eastern boundary of O.L.C. 3 (L.T. plan 14667) to its junction with the Waipapa-Puketona Road; thence along that road to the Waitangi River; thence along the Waitangi and Wairuhe Rivers and the Otao and Ngatahuna Streams to the western boundary of the Kawakawa Parish; Streams to the western boundary of the Kawakawa Parish; thence southerly generally along that boundary to the northwestern corner of Section 163, Kawakawa Parish; thence western corner of Section 163, Kawakawa Parish; thence westerly alorg a right line to the north-eastern corner of the Tuwhakino Elock; thence along the north-western boundary of that block to the south-eastern corner of Waiwhariki No. 2c Block; thence north-westerly along the north-eastern boundary of Waiwhariki No. 2c and the north-western boundary of Waiwhariki 2a Blocks to the north-western corner of the last-mentioned block; thence along the road forming the north-en boundary of the last-mentioned block to the north-eastern boundary of the Puketapu 1B Block; thence north-westerly along that boundary to the southeastern corner of Section 25s, Remuera Settlement; thence along the southern and western boundaries of Section 25s

aforesaid to the Tarahi Road; thence across that road and aforesaid to the Tarahi Road; thence across that road and westerly along its northern side to the south-eastern corner of Section 20s, Remuera Settlement; thence along the eastern and northern boundaries of Section 20s and the southern boundary of Section 14s, Remuera Settlement, to the road (Pokapu) forming the western boundary of the said Section 14s; thence northerly along that road to the road forming the southern boundary of Section 3 on plan 8111, deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Auckland; thence across that road and along the north-eastern boundary of the Omapere Parish to Kerikeri Road; at Auckland; thence across that road and along the northeastern boundary of the Omapere Parish to Kerikeri Road; thence along a right line to the confluence of the Waipapa River and the Mangapukahukahu Stream; thence up the Waipapa River to the western boundary of Block XIV, Kaeo Survey District; thence northerly along that boundary to the southern boundary of the Pupuke Parish; thence north-easterly along that boundary and the south-eastern boundary of the Matawherohia Parish to the southern boundary of Section 1, Block X, Kaeo Survey District; thence along the southern boundary of the said Section 1 to its south-eastern corner; thence along the western thence along the southern boundary of the said Section 1 to its south-eastern corner; thence along the western boundary of Mokau No. 2B to its northernmost corner; thence along the north-eastern boundaries of Mokau Nos. 2B and 2A and the northern boundary of Mokau No. 1 to the Ketetawa Stream; thence up the Ketetawa Stream and easterly along the northern boundary of O.L.C. 28 to the western boundary of Section 2, Block XI, Kaeo Survey District: thence along the western boundary of Sections District; thence along the western boundary of Sections 2 and 1, Block XI aforesaid, to the northernmost corner of the said Section 1, the point of commencement.

BAY OF ISLANDS DISTRICT.

All that area in the North Auckland Land District bounded by a line commencing at the north-western corner of Section 7, Block VIII, Kaeo Survey District; thence along the north-western boundary of that section to the Takou River; 7, Block VIII, Kaeo Survey District; there along the middle of the Takou River; thence down the middle of the Takou River to the sea; thence easterly, southerly, and westerly generally along the sea-coast to the mouth of the Kapiro Stream; thence along the northern boundary of the Ohaeawai District hereinbefore described to the road forming the northern boundary of Section 17, Block XVI, Kaeo Survey District; thence westerly and northerly generally along that road to the northernmost corner of Section 1, Block XI, Kaeo Survey District; thence easterly along the northern boundaries of Sections 30, 32, and 14, Block XII, Kaeo Survey District, to the south-western corner of Section 3, Block VIII, Kaeo Survey District; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of O.L.C. 803 to the Opokorau Stream; thence up the Opokorau Stream to its intersection with the south-western boundary of Section 7, Block VIII, Kaeo Survey District; thence along the south-western and western boundaries of that section to its north-western corner, the point of thence along the south-western and western boundaries of that section to its north-western corner, the point of commencement.

Also all that area in the North Auckland Land District bounded on the west by the Ohaeawai District hereinbefore described from the Waitangi River to Kerikeri Inlet; thence easterly along Kerikeri Inlet to the Bay of Islands; thence by a right line to the northernmost point of Piercy Island off Cape Brett; thence southerly to and along the sea-coast to the northernmost corner of the Hikurangi District; thence south-westerly by the north-western boundary of the Hikurangi District as defined in New Zealand Gazette, 1911, page 1445, to the eastern boundary of the Kawa Kawa District as defined in New Zealand Gazette, 1906, page 2169; thence along the eastern and northern boundaries of that district to its north-western corner; thence along the north-eastern boundary of the Ohaeawai District hereinbefore described to the Waitangi River, the place of commencement.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the twenty-second day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1924, I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing registration districts known as the Ohaeawai and Bay of Islands districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into two registration districts the names whereof shall be the Ohaeawai and Bay of Islands districts, and the boundaries whereof shall be conterminous with the boundaries of the marriage districts bearing the same names as are set forth in a Proclamation of even date herewith, made under the provisions of the Marriage Act, 1908:

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the twenty-second day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven.

Altering the Boundaries of the Otago Central Electric-power District.

A PROCLAMATION.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, and of all other powers in anywise enabling me in this behalf, I, George Vere Arundell, Viscount Galway, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby alter the boundaries of the Otago Central Electric-power District so as to include the areas described in the Schedule hereto.

ALL that area in the Otago Land District, including portion of the Vincent County and a portion of the Lake County, bounded by a line commencing at a point being the northeast corner of Section 3, Block IV, Wakefield Survey District; thence in a west direction along the north boundary of the said Section 3, Block IV, Wakefield Survey District, to the block-line between the Cromwell and Wakefield Survey Districts; thence in a north-west direction along the northeast boundary of Run 245E to the most north corner of Run 245E; thence in a south-west direction along the northwest boundary of Run 245E, along the south-east boundary of Run 245E, along the south-east boundary of Run 245D to the block-line between Blocks V and VI, Cromwell Survey District; thence in a north direction along the block-line between Blocks V and VI and between Blocks VIII and IX, Cromwell, to the north-west corner of Block VIII, Cromwell Survey District; thence in an easterly

direction along the northern boundary of Block VIII to the morth-east corner of same; then in a north direction along the west boundary of Blocks II, IV, V, and VI, Tarras Survey District, to the intersection of the same with the southern boundary of Block II, Lower Wanaka Survey District; thence westerly along the southern boundary of Block II, Lower Wanaka Survey District, to the boundary between Lake and Vincent Counties; thence proceeding in a south-westerly direction; thence in a north-easterly direction and then in a westerly direction along the southern boundary of Lower Wanaka Survey District to a point being the south-eastern corner of Block XIX, Lower Wanaka Survey District; thence in a north-easterly, then in a northerly direction along the eastern boundary of the said Block XIX to its north-east corner; thence westerly along the north boundary of Blocks XIX and XVI to the north-west corner of Block XVI, Lower XIX and XVI to the north-west corner of Block XVI, Lower Wanaka Survey District; thence northerly along the western boundary of Block XV. Lower Wanaka Survey District, to the shore of Lake Wanaka; then generally in an easterly, then north-easterly, then south-easterly, then north-easterly, then north-easterly, then north-easterly, then northerly, then easterly following the southern shore of Lake Wanaka to a point being the north-eastern corner of Block XIV, Lower Wanaka Survey District; then northerly to a point on the opposite bank of the Clutha River in a line being an extension of the eastern boundary of Block XIV, Lower Wanaka Survey District; thence in a north-westerly. Lower Wanaka Survey District; thence in a north-westerly then in a north-easterly, then in a north-westerly, and northerly direction along the shore of Lake Wanaka to a point in a straight line with the boundary between Blocks VI and VIII, Lower Wanaka Survey District; thence easterly in a straight line to the north-west corner of Block VI, Lower Wanaka Survey District; then easterly along the north boundary of Block VI to the north-easterly corner of Block VI, Lower Wanaka Survey District; thence northerly along the western boundary of Lower Hawea Survey District to its north-west boundary of Lower Hawea Survey District to its north-west corner; then easterly along the northern boundary of said survey district to its intersection with Lake Hawea; then southerly, then easterly, then north-easterly along the shore of Lake Hawea to its intersection with the western boundary of Run 236, Lower Hawea Survey District; then in a southerly direction along the western boundary of Run 236 to the south-west corner of Run 236; thence north-easterly along the boundary between Run 236 and 236a to the north-east corner of Run 236a; then in a southerly direction along the easterly boundaries of Runs 236a, 236c, 236E, to its junction with the boundary of Run 236a, Lower Hawea Survey District; thence in an easterly direction along the northern boundaries of Runs 236c, 236H, Lower Hawea Survey District, and Run 2361, Cluden Survey District, to its intersection with and Run 2361, Cluden Survey District, to its intersection with the western bank of the Lindis River; thence generally in a southerly direction along the western bank of the Lindis River southerly direction along the western bank of the Lindis River to its intersection with the eastern boundary of Lower Hawea Survey District; thence southerly along the said boundary to its junction with the Wakefield Survey District; thence in a westerly direction along the northern boundary of the Wakefield Survey District to its junction with the northern boundary of Run 238L; thence in a south-westerly direction along the northern boundary of Run 238L to its junction with the content boundary of Run 238L to its junction with the eastern bank of the Clutha River; thence in a south-westerly direction along the eastern bank of the Clutha River to its intersection with the John Bull Creek; thence in a westerly intersection with the John Bull Creek; thence in a westerly direction across the Clutha River to the south-east corner of Section 3, Block IV, Wakefield Survey District, being the point of commencement, the said area being more particularly shown on plan marked P.W.D. 96725, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works, and thereon edged red.
