IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Public Works Act, 1928, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth—subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto—hereby authorize the Auckland Transport Board (hereinafter referred to as "the licensee") to erect and maintain electric lines along the route described in the Schedule hereto for the purpose of supplying power to trackless electric cars.

ROUTE.

1. Lines for one-way traffic commencing at a point at the south-eastern corner of the intersection of Wyndham and Hobson Streets and proceeding southerly along Hobson Street to Victoria Street, thence along Victoria Street to Queen Street, thence along Queen Street to Wyndham Street, thence along Wyndham Street to the point of commencement.

2. Lines for two-way traffic commencing at the junction of Wyndham and Hobson Streets, where the one-way traffic line commences, and proceeding northerly along Hobson Street to Fanshawe Street, thence along Fanshawe Street to Halsey Street, thence along Halsey Street to the licensee's garage.

CONDITIONS.

1. This license is subject to compliance by the licensee with the *Electrical Supply Regulations, 1935*, and the *Electrical Wiring Regulations, 1935*, and to any regulations made or to be made in amplification or amendment thereof, or in substitution therefor.

2. The trolley-wires shall not be less than No. 3/0 S.W.G. hard-drawn solid copper or cadmium-copper wires, firmly attached to approved insulators, and erected on supports placed not more than 130 ft. apart.

Trolley-wire feeder cables, if carried overhead, shall be covered with weatherproof triple braiding: Provided that, where circumstances permit, the Minister may approve of bare conductors being used; and provided that where electric feeder-cables intersect the Post and Telegraph Department's lead-covered cables, vulcanized india-rubber insulation of not less than 600 megohm grade shall be substituted for weather-proof triple braiding.

Double insulation shall be provided between the positive and negative trolley-wires and between the positive trolley-wire and earth. Single insulation shall be provided between the negative trolley-wire and earth on all span wires and pull-offs.

The maximum difference of potential between the positive and negative trolley-wires, and between trolley-wire feeders and the ground shall not exceed 650 volts.

The spacing of trolley-wires shall be such as to prevent bridging by the trolley-wheel or pole.

The best means available shall be adopted for preventing the occurrence of undue sparking at the rubbing or rolling contacts in any place.

3. The conductors shall be carried on substantial and durable supports, which shall be designed to have a factor of safety of four in the case of steel, iron, or ferro-concrete, and five in the case of wood, calculated upon the ultimate strength of the material, assuming the wind-pressure to be 30 lb. per square foot upon a plane surface and 18 lb. per square foot upon a diametral plane upon a cylindrical surface.

4. The trolley-wire shall not in any part thereof be at a less height than 18 ft. from the surface of the ground.

5. (1) Where telegraph, telephone, or electric fire-alarm wires (hereinafter referred to as "the first-mentioned wires") are carried along either overhead or underground on one side of the road to be used by the trackless electric car, the said electric lines (either overhead or underground) of the trackless electric-car system shall be carried along on the other side thereof unless otherwise approved by the Minister of Telegraphs.

(2) At all points where it is necessary for the said electric lines to be carried across the first-mentioned wires, they shall be carried across and under the same at right angles if possible, and the first-mentioned wires shall be carefully insulated at the expense of the licensee over a sufficient length to prevent any contact in the event of accident to either line. Where the first-mentioned wires run parallel to and higher than the said electric lines, and the poles supporting the pull-off or span wires are on the same side of the road as those supporting the first-mentioned wires, and wherever it is considered that by reason of accident or otherwise there is a danger of the first-mentioned wires falling across the said electric lines or their supports, approved insulators, or other approved protective devices, shall be provided and erected by and at the expense of the licensee to the satisfaction of the Minister.

(3) Where poles are erected on both sides of the road, those on the one side of the road must comply with the requirements of the Minister of Telegraphs in order to provide reasonable facilities for their joint use.

6. The design of all poles, posts, standards, brackets, and other attachments used in connection with the said electric lines shall be subject to the approval of the Minister, and they shall be constructed in accordance with such approved design, and erected in such manner as is approved in writing by the Minister.

7. The licensee shall take all reasonable precautions in constructing, placing, and maintaining the said electric lines and other works of all descriptions, and also in working the undertaking so as not to injuriously affect by fusion or electrolytic action any gas or water pipes, sewers, drains, or conduits, or other pipes, structures, or substances, or to injuriously interfere with the working of any telegraph, telephone, electric-lighting, or electric fire-alarm lines or apparatus.

8. This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force until 31st March, 1947. Upon expiry of the said term, or upon sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

9. The licensee shall rectify to the satisfaction of the Minister of Telegraphs or the Minister of Railways any interference or disturbance caused by the erection or operation of the licensee's system that affects the satisfactory working of the telegraph-lines which are the property of the Telegraph or Railways Departments and which were erected prior to the licensee's lines.

10. Notwithstanding anything contained in the regulations incorporated herein, no extensions or lines other than those along the routes hereinbefore described shall be deemed to be authorized by this license.

11. No electric car shall be supplied with electric power from the lines hereby authorized to be erected unless the licensee first receives from the Minister of Public Works a warrant authorizing the use of that car.

The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the third Thursday in each month at eight o'clock p.m., in the Council Chambers at Queenstown or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Tuesday, the thirtieth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven.

2. The members of the Board shall at their first meeting, and thereafter at the annual meeting hereinafter mentioned, elect one of themselves to be chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

3. Special meetings may be convened by the chairman, provided that two days' notice of any such meeting is given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

4. Any three members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

5. If at any meeting the chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose one of their number to be chairman of such meeting.

6. If by resignation, death, incapacity, or otherwise the seat of any member shall be or become vacant, or if any member absents himself without reasonable cause from three consecutive meetings of the Board, the Governor-General shall have power to appoint any other person to be a member of the Board in his stead.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

8. The Board shall maintain the aerodrome as a public aerodrome and landing-ground for aircraft, and shall keep same available for aircraft generally without giving or granting to any individual or body any rights or privileges contrary to the use and maintenance thereof as an aerodrome for the benefit of the general air travelling public.

9. The Board shall have the right subject to the approval of the Minister of Lands (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister") to lease the aerodrome or any part thereof for such period and on such terms and conditions as may be approved by the Minister.

10. The Board shall not, without the consent of the Minister erect any fence, building, or other obstruction, or plant any tree or do any other thing on the aerodrome which might endanger or hinder or restrict the use thereof for aerodrome purposes.

11. The Board shall not allow cattle to graze on the aerodrome.

12. The Board shall, if directed in writing by the Minister so to do, remove or lower any building, pole, mast, or other structure erected on the aerodrome, or remove, lower, or trim any tree growing thereon.

13. The Crown shall have the right, privilege, and easement to enter on the aerodrome for the purpose of developing, constructing, and using the said aerodrome, and for that purpose shall have full power and authority by its servants, agents, and workmen to do such acts and construct all such works as are usual, necessary, and proper and to cut down and remove such trees as may be necessary for the purposes of making the said land suitable for an aerodrome.

14. The Board shall have prepared and submitted at an annual meeting to be held in the month of April in each year a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of March, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister of Lands as soon as possible after each annual meeting.

*Provisional Industrial Plan for the Re-organization of the Pharmacy Industry.*

PURSUANT to the provisions of section 9, subsection (3) of the Industrial Efficiency Act, 1936, I hereby give notice that a provisional industrial plan for the re-organization of the pharmacy industry has been prepared by the Bureau of Industry, and that the following are the material proposals contained in the plan :—

1. The plan aims at safeguarding the public interest by ensuring that standard quality drugs will be dispensed at reasonable prices by, or under the immediate supervision of, qualified pharmacists operating in pharmacies which are efficient as regards both dispensing and service.

2. The plan recognizes that the retention and stability of individual ownership and operation of pharmacies in New Zealand are essential, though it is considered that this recognition is not incompatible with the operation of company chain pharmacies properly controlled in accordance with principles and conditions set out in the plan.

3. The plan recognizes that the relationship to the retail pharmacy industry of the wholesale druggists, manufacturing chemists, indentors, and representatives of overseas firms is important, but the operation of these industries is not brought within the scope of the plan as it is considered that the question of reorganization of any one of these industries should properly be the subject of a separate plan for the industry concerned.

4. The plan does not propose to introduce at the present stage an official drug tariff and standard dispensing fee, and to require the compulsory observance of same, although it is recognized that when practicable such a step should be taken.

5. The plan proposes—

- (i) To continue the present licensing system ;
- (ii) To grant licenses only to those persons or firms whose principal business is that of a pharmacy ;
- (iii) To consider applications for license from chain company pharmacies on their merits in common with other applications, having particular reference to the public interest and the social implications involved and in accordance with the principle set out in the plan, that extension of chain company pharmacy be so limited as to preserve the existence of individual pharmacy to a degree necessary to give adequate national health service ;
- (iv) To extend the disciplinary powers of the Pharmacy Board in relation to matters affecting the ethical and professional conduct of the industry ;



- (v) To reconstitute the Pharmacy Board so as to ensure the inclusion of two representatives of employee members of the Pharmaceutical Society, and also a member qualified in law;
- (vi) To set up a Pharmacy Plan Industrial Committee under Part III of the Industrial Efficiency Act to appoint a Director of Pharmacy and to carry out the plan, the committee to comprise seven members appointed as follows:—

- (vii) That the appointment of the Director of Pharmacy be subject to the approval of the Bureau of Industry;
- (viii) To provide for administration expenses and the development of any necessary compensation fund by the collection of levies from retail chemists on a broad basis of annual turnover;
- (ix) That the Industrial Committee shall—
- Make recommendations to the Bureau on the issue and transfer of licenses;
  - Investigate and formulate methods of improved buying for retail pharmacists;
  - Introduce a uniform system of prescription charges and supervise the observance of such charges;
  - Organize and administer, as the Government may require, the Pharmaceutical Section of any national health insurance scheme;
  - Act as an advisory Pharmaceutical Standards Committee in association with the New Zealand Standards Institute;
  - Conduct a survey and classification of pharmacies;
  - Arrange amalgamations and transfers, and make recommendations to the Bureau for the administration of the Compensation Fund;
  - Ensure an adequate supply of apprentices and also to ensure facilities for their training;
  - Take steps to co-ordinate merchandising methods and to modernize pharmacies;
  - Arrange for standard packing and simplification of stocks;
  - Promote goodwill advertising; and
  - Make recommendations for the control of quackery.
- (x) To confine to pharmacists the retail sale of all substances included in the British Pharmacopoeia or the British Pharmaceutical Codex, and governed by the Sale of Food and Drugs Act and regulations thereunder, except the schedule of substances given in the plan.
- (NOTE.—Provided that the list of substances set out in the specific group (a) may be subject to minor revision by the Government when making necessary regulations or enacting legislation accordingly.)
- (xi) To recommend to the Hon. the Minister of Health that all formulæ of proprietary medicines be registered.
- (xii) That no hawkers license be issued unless it is associated with or supported by the name of a substantial firm having a permanent place of business.

IT is hereby notified for general information that the Convention between the United Kingdom and Iraq regarding Legal Proceedings in Civil and Commercial Matters, signed at Bagdad on the 25th July, 1935, and in respect of which notifications were exchanged at London on the 18th November, 1936, has been extended to the Dominion of New Zealand pursuant to the provisions of Article 17 of the said Convention as from the 24th August, 1937.

The authority to which requests for service or for the taking of evidence are to be transmitted is the Supreme Court of New Zealand, and communications should be addressed to the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Wellington, in the English language.

The text of the said Convention is set out hereunder.

#### CONVENTION.

HIS Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland, and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, and His Majesty the King of Iraq, being desirous to render mutual assistance in the conduct of legal proceedings in civil and commercial matters which are being dealt with or which it is anticipated may be dealt with by their respective judicial authorities, have resolved to conclude a Convention for this purpose, and have appointed as their plenipotentiaries—

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland, and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India:  
For Great Britain and Northern Ireland:

Sir Archibald John Kerr Clark Kerr, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, his Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary at Bagdad; and

His Majesty the King of Iraq:

Nouri Pasha El Said, Minister for Foreign Affairs, Order of the Rafidain I Class Military.

Who, having communicated their full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed as follows:—

#### I.—PRELIMINARY.

##### Article 1.

(a) Except where the contrary is expressly stated, this Convention applies only to civil and commercial matters, including non-contentious matters.

(b) In this Convention the words—

- "Territory of one (or the other) High Contracting Party" shall be interpreted (a) in relation to His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland, and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, as meaning England and Wales and all territories in respect of which the Convention is in force by reason of extensions under Article 16 or accessions under Article 17; and (b) in relation to His Majesty the King of Iraq as meaning Iraq;
- "Persons" shall be deemed to mean individuals and artificial persons;
- "Artificial persons" shall be deemed to include partnerships, companies, societies, and other corporations;
- "Subjects of a High Contracting Party" shall be deemed to include artificial persons constituted or incorporated under the laws of the territory of such High Contracting Party;
- "Subjects of one (or of the other) High Contracting Party" shall be deemed (a) in relation to His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland, and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, to mean all subjects of His Majesty wherever domiciled, and all persons under his protection; and (b) in relation to His Majesty the King of Iraq, to mean all persons of Iraqi nationality.

#### II.—SERVICE OF JUDICIAL AND EXTRA-JUDICIAL DOCUMENTS.

##### Article 2.

(a) In Part II of this Convention the expression "country of origin" means the country from which the documents to be served emanate, and the expression "country of execution" means the country in which service of documents is to be effected.

(b) When judicial or extra-judicial documents drawn up in the territory of one of the High Contracting Parties are required by a judicial authority situated therein to be served on persons in the territory of the other High Contracting Party, such documents may be served on the recipient, whatever his nationality, by any of the methods provided in Articles 3 and 4 in all cases where such method of service is recognized by the law of the country of origin.

#### Article 3.

(a) A request for service shall be addressed and sent by a Consular Officer acting for the country of origin to the competent authority of the country of execution, requesting such authority to cause the document in question to be served.

(b) The request for service shall be drawn up in the language of the country of execution and shall state the names and descriptions of the parties, the name, description, and address of the recipient, and the nature of the document to be served, and shall enclose the document to be served in duplicate.

(c) The document to be served shall either be drawn up in the language of the country of execution, or be accompanied by a translation into such language. Such translation shall be certified as correct by a Consular Officer acting for the country of origin.

(d) Requests for service shall be addressed and sent—

In England, to the Senior Master of the Supreme Court of Judicature.

In Iraq, to the Ministry of Justice.

If the authority to whom a request for service has been sent is not competent to execute it, such authority shall (except in cases where execution is refused in accordance with paragraph (f) of this Article) of his own motion forward the request to the competent authority of the country of execution.

(e) Service shall be effected by the competent authority of the country of execution, who shall serve the document in the manner prescribed by the municipal law of such country for the service of similar documents, except that, if a wish for some special manner of service is expressed in the request for service, such manner of service shall be followed in so far as it is not incompatible with the law of that country.

(f) The execution of a request for service, duly made in accordance with the preceding provisions of this Article, shall not be refused unless (1) the authenticity of the request for service is not established, or (2) the High Contracting Party in whose territory it is to be executed considers that his sovereignty or safety would be compromised thereby.

(g) In every instance where a request for service is not executed by the authority to whom it has been sent, the latter will at once inform the Consular Officer by whom the request was sent, stating the ground on which the execution of the request has been refused or the competent authority to whom it has been forwarded.

(h) The authority by whom the request for service is executed shall draw up a certificate proving the service or explaining the reason which has prevented such service, and setting forth the fact, the manner, and the date of such service or attempted service, and shall send the said certificate to the Consular Officer by whom the request for service was sent. The certificate of service or of attempted service shall be placed on one of the duplicates or attached thereto.

#### Article 4.

(a) Service may be effected, without any intervention of the authorities of the country of execution by a Consular Officer acting for the country of origin, in any manner permissible by the law of the country of origin provided that no physical compulsion is used.

(b) All documents served by a Consular Officer shall, unless the recipient is a subject or citizen of the High Contracting Party from whose territory the document to be served emanates, either be drawn up in the language of the country of execution or be accompanied by a translation into such language, certified as correct as prescribed in Article 3 (c).

(c) The fact that an attempt to effect service in accordance with this Article has failed does not preclude a request being subsequently made in accordance with Article 3.

#### Article 5.

(a) In any case where documents have been served in accordance with the provisions of Article 3, the High Contracting Party, by whose Consular Officer the request for service was addressed, shall repay to the other High Contracting Party any charges and expenses which are payable under the law of the country of execution to the persons employed to effect service, and any charges and expenses incurred in effecting service in a special manner. These charges and expenses shall not exceed such as are usually allowed in the courts of that country.

(b) Repayment of these charges and expenses shall be claimed by the competent authority by whom the service has been effected from the Consular Officer by whom the request was addressed, when sending the certificate provided for in Article 3 (h).

(c) Except as provided above, no fees of any description shall be payable by one High Contracting Party to the other in respect of the service of any documents.

### III.—TAKING OF EVIDENCE ON COMMISSION.

#### Article 6.

In Part III of this Convention, the expressions—

- (1) "Taking of evidence" shall be deemed to include the taking of the statements of a plaintiff, defendant, expert, or any other person on oath or otherwise; the submission to a plaintiff, defendant, expert, or any other person of any oath with regard to any legal proceedings; and the production, identification, and examination of documents, samples, or other objects.
- (2) "Witness" shall be deemed to include any person from whom any evidence, as defined above, is required to be taken.
- (3) "Country of origin" shall be deemed to mean the country by whose judicial authority the evidence is required, and the "country of execution" the country in which the evidence is to be taken.

#### Article 7.

When a judicial authority in the territory of one of the High Contracting Parties requires that evidence should be taken in the territory of the other High Contracting Party, such evidence may be taken, whatever the nationality of the parties or witnesses may be, in any one of the ways prescribed in Article 8 or 9.

#### Article 8.

(a) The judicial authority of the country of origin may, in accordance with the provisions of the law of his country, address himself by means of a Letter of Request to the competent authority of the country of execution, requesting such authority to take the evidence.

(b) The Letter of Request shall be drawn up in the language of the country of execution, or be accompanied by a translation into such language. Such translation shall be certified as correct by a Consular Officer acting for the country of origin. The Letter of Request shall state the nature of the proceedings for which the evidence is required, giving all necessary information in regard thereto, the names of the parties thereto, and the names, descriptions, and addresses of the witnesses. Letters of request shall also either (1) be accompanied by a list of interrogatories to be put to the witness or witnesses, or, as the case may be, by a description of the documents, samples, or other objects to be produced, identified, or examined, and a translation thereof, certified as correct in the manner heretofore provided; or (2) shall request the competent authority to allow such questions to be asked *visa voce* as the parties or their representatives shall desire to ask.

(c) Letters of Request shall be transmitted—

In England, by an Iraqi Consular Officer to the Senior Master of the Supreme Court of Judicature.

In Iraq, by a British Consular Officer to the Ministry of Justice.

In case the authority to whom a Letter of Request is transmitted is not competent to execute it, such authority shall (except in cases where execution is refused in accordance with paragraph (f) of this Article) of his own motion forward the Letter of Request to the competent authority of the country of execution.

(d) The competent authority of the country of execution shall give effect to the Letter of Request and obtain the evidence required by the use of the same compulsory measures and the same procedure as are employed in the execution of a commission or order emanating from the authorities of his own country, except that if a wish that some special procedure should be followed is expressed in the Letter of Request, such special procedure shall be followed in so far as it is not incompatible with the law of the country of execution.

(e) The Consular Officer, by whom the Letter of Request is transmitted, shall, if he so desires, be informed of the date when and the place where the proceedings will take place, in order that he may inform the interested party or parties, who shall be permitted to be present in person or to be represented, if they so desire, by barristers or solicitors or by any representatives who are competent to appear before the courts either of the country of origin or of the country of execution.

(f) The execution of a Letter of Request which complies with the preceding provisions of this Article can only be refused—

- (1) If the authenticity of the Letter of Request is not established;
  - (2) If, in the country of execution, the execution of the Letter of Request in question does not fall within the functions of the judiciary;
  - (3) If the High Contracting Party in whose territory it is to be executed considers that his sovereignty or safety would be compromised thereby.
- (g) In every instance where a Letter of Request is not executed by the authority to whom it is addressed, the latter will at once inform the Consular Officer by whom it was transmitted, stating the grounds on which the execution of the Letter of Request has been refused, or the competent authority to whom it has been forwarded.

(h) When a Letter of Request has been executed, the competent authority to whom it was transmitted or forwarded shall send to the Consular Officer by whom it was transmitted the necessary documents establishing its execution.

#### Article 9.

(a) The evidence may also be taken, without the intervention of the authorities of the country of execution, by a Consular Officer acting for the country of origin.

(b) The Consular Officer may request individuals named by the court of the country of origin to appear before him to give evidence. The attendance and giving of evidence before him shall be entirely voluntary and no measures of compulsion shall be employed.

(c) Requests to appear issued by a Consular Officer shall, unless the recipient is a subject of the High Contracting Party for whose judicial authority the evidence is required, be drawn up in the language of the country of execution or be accompanied by a translation into such language.

(d) The evidence may be taken in accordance with the procedure recognized by the law of the country of origin, and the parties will have the right to be present in person or to be represented by barristers or solicitors of that country or by any representatives who are competent to appear before the courts either of the country of origin or of the country of execution.

#### Article 10.

The fact that an attempt to take evidence by the method laid down in Article 9 failed owing to the refusal of any witness to appear or to give evidence does not preclude a request being subsequently made in accordance with Article 8.

#### Article 11.

(a) Where evidence is taken in the manner provided in Article 8 the High Contracting Party, by whose judicial authority the Letter of Request was addressed, shall repay to the other High Contracting Party any expenses incurred by the competent authority of the latter in the execution of the request in respect of any charges and expenses payable to witnesses, experts, interpreters, or translators, the costs of obtaining the attendance of witnesses who have not appeared voluntarily, and the charges and expenses payable to any person whom such authority may have deputed to act, in cases where the law of the country of execution permits this to be done, and any charges and expenses incurred by reason of a special procedure being requested and followed. These expenses shall be such as are usually allowed in similar cases in the courts of the country of execution.

(b) The repayment of these expenses shall be claimed by the competent authority by whom a Letter of Request has been executed from the Consular Officer by whom it was transmitted when sending to him the documents establishing its execution as provided in Article 8 (h).

(c) Except as above provided, no fees of any description shall be payable by one High Contracting Party to the other in respect of the taking of evidence.

#### IV.—JUDICIAL ASSISTANCE FOR POOR PERSONS AND SECURITY FOR COSTS.

##### Article 12.

The subjects of one High Contracting Party resident in the territory of the other High Contracting Party shall not be compelled to give security for costs in any case where a subject or citizen of such other High Contracting Party would not be so compelled.

##### Article 13.

(1) The subjects of one High Contracting Party shall enjoy in the territory of the other High Contracting Party a perfect equality of treatment with subjects of the latter High Contracting Party as regards free legal assistance for poor persons.

(2) The provisions of this Article apply to criminal as well as to civil and commercial matters.

#### V.—GENERAL PROVISIONS.

##### Article 14.

Any difficulties which may arise in connection with the operation of this Convention shall be settled through the diplomatic channel.

##### Article 15.

The present Convention, of which the English and Arabic texts are equally authentic, shall be subject to ratification. Ratifications shall be exchanged in London. The Convention shall come into force one month after the date on which ratifications are exchanged, and shall remain in force for three years after the date of its coming into force. If neither of the High Contracting Parties shall have given notice through the diplomatic channel to the other not less than six months before the expiration of the said period of three years of his intention to terminate the Convention, it shall remain in force until the expiration of six months from the date on which either of the High Contracting Parties shall have given notice to terminate it.

##### Article 16.

(a) This Convention shall not apply *ipso facto* to Scotland or Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands, or the Isle of Man, nor to any of the colonies, overseas territories, or protectorates of His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland, and the British Dominions beyond the seas, Emperor of India, nor to any territories under his suzerainty, nor to any mandated territories in respect of which the mandate is exercised by his Government in the United Kingdom, but His Majesty may at any time while this Convention is in force, under Article 15, by a notification given through his Ambassador in Iraq, extend the operation of the Convention to any of the above-mentioned territories.

(b) Such notification shall state the authorities in the territory concerned to whom requests for service under Article 3 or Letters of Request under Article 8 are to be transmitted, and the language in which communications and translations are to be made. The date of the coming into force of any extension shall be one month from the date of such notification.

(c) Either of the High Contracting Parties may, at any time after the expiry of three years from the coming into force of an extension of this Convention to any of the territories referred to in paragraph (a) of this Article, terminate such extension on giving six months' notice of termination through the diplomatic channel.

(d) The termination of the Convention under Article 16 shall, unless otherwise expressly agreed to by both High Contracting Parties, *ipso facto* terminate it in respect of any territories to which it has been extended under paragraph (a) of this Article.

##### Article 17.

(a) The High Contracting Parties agree that His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland, and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, may at any time, while the present Convention is in force, either under Article 15 or by virtue of any accession under this Article, by a notification given through the diplomatic channel, accede to the present Convention in respect of any other member of the British Commonwealth of Nations whose Government may desire that such accession should be effected, provided that no notification of accession may be given at any time when His Majesty the King of Iraq has given notice of termination in respect of all territories to which the Convention applies. The provisions of Article 16 (b) shall be applicable to such notification. Any such accession shall take effect one month after the date of its notification.

(b) After the expiry of three years from the date of the coming into force of any accession under paragraph (a) of this Article, either of the High Contracting Parties may, by giving six months' notice of termination through the diplomatic channel, terminate the application of the Convention to any country in respect of which a notification of accession has been given. The termination of the Convention under Article 15 shall not affect its application to any such country.

(c) Any notification of accession under paragraph (a) of this Article may include any dependency or mandated territory administered by the Government of the country in respect of which such notification of accession is given, and any notice of termination in respect of any such country under paragraph (b) shall apply to any dependency or mandated territory which was included in the notification or accession in respect of that country.

*Declaring Areas to be Closely Populated Localities for the Purposes of the Motor-vehicles Amendment Act, 1936, Section 3.*

IN terms of section 3 of the Motor-vehicles Amendment Act, 1936, the Minister of Transport does hereby declare the respective areas described in the Schedule hereto to be closely populated localities for the purposes of the said section to the intent that a person driving any motor-vehicle on any road, street, or other place to which the public have access therein, shall be subject to the maximum speed-limit of thirty miles an hour fixed by the said section.

It is hereby notified for public information that the Hon. the Minister of Customs has decided to interpret the Customs Acts in relation to the undermentioned articles as follows:—

NOTES.—(a) "Not elsewhere included" appears as n.e.i.; "other kinds" as o.k.; "articles and materials suited for, and to be used solely in, the fabrication or repair of goods within New Zealand" as a. and m.s. (b) Articles marked thus † are revised decisions. (c) The rates of duty payable on goods set out hereunder have not been shown except in the case of goods classed under Tariff Items 416, 443, and 449, and of goods admitted (under the provisions of section 11 of the Customs Amendment Act, 1927) at a rate of duty lower than that provided for in the First Schedule to the Customs Acts Amendment Act, 1934. Where goods are admitted under the provisions of section 11 aforesaid, the reduced rate is marked with an asterisk. (d) Steam-engines, gas-engines, oil-engines, and electric or other motors are not, unless otherwise indicated, to be regarded as parts of the machines with which they are imported. (e) Surtax as provided for in section 5 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act, 1930, or primage duty as provided for in section 4 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act, 1931, as the case may be, is payable in addition to the duties set out hereunder.
